LAST TIME OUT: In an 8-3 loss to Great Lakes, the TinCaps drew their largest crowd of the season with 5,504 fans in attendance. After the game, fans got to go on the field for autographs with the team.

K-INGS: TinCaps pitchers lead the Midwest League in K/9 (10.7).

**BULLPEN ACES:** Fort Wayne's relief group is top-5 in the MWL in ERA (3.69) and opponent batting average (.231). The bullpen leads the league with 129 strikeouts.

**DEFENSE:** As a team, the TinCaps have only committed 14 errors, the second fewest in the 12-team MWL... TinCaps catchers rank 2<sup>nd</sup> in caught stealing % at 30% (the league average is 19%). **Ethan Salas** ranks 2<sup>nd</sup> in the circuit having thrown out 6 runners trying to steal, while **Anthony Vilar** has caught 4 runners, which ranks 4<sup>th</sup>.

STREAKS: A pair of TinCaps have been getting on-base for over a week straight. Devin Ortiz owns a 13-game on-base streak dating back to April 14 (5<sup>th</sup> longest active streak in the MWL). Nik McClaughry has reached base in 8 straight contests.

**PUT SOME ICE ON IT:** Both **Nik McClaughry** and **Nerwilian Cedeño** have been hit by 3 pitches, the 3<sup>rd</sup> most in the MWL.

**HOMER BUSH JR:** Second in the MWL in stolen bases (10). The speedster swiped 4 bags in this past series against Great Lakes.

TYLER ROBERTSON: Leads the MWL with 4 sacrifice bunts and ranks 4<sup>th</sup> in doubles (6).

**GRIFFIN DOERSCHING**: In the MWL, ranks 8<sup>th</sup> in home runs (3).

**UNLUCKY:** Nerwilian Cedeño has the 4<sup>th</sup> lowest batting average on balls in play (BABIP) in the MWL at .211. On average, balls in play go for a hit about 30% of the time. Nik McClaughry has the league's 9<sup>th</sup> lowest BABIP at .241.

**RALLY CAPS:** The TinCaps have overcome a deficit in 5 of their first 8 wins this season, including their last 3.

**CLOSE CALLS:** Of Fort Wayne's first 14 games, only 1 was decided by more than 3 runs. The 'Caps have played 7 1-run games, 5 2-run games, and 2 3-run games.

## More News, Notes & Season Storylines

PROSPECTS: Catcher Ethan Salas isn't just the top-rated Padres prospect, he's also the top catching prospect in baseball, according to MLB.com. They also rank Salas as the No. 8 overall prospect. Starting pitcher Dylan Lesko is the top righty in San Diego's system and MLB.com's 9<sup>th</sup> best RHP across the sport. Meanwhile, outfielder Homer Bush Jr. (No. 11), righty Braden Nett (No. 22) and lefty starter Jagger Haynes (No. 24) are also "top 30" guys for the Padres. Baseball America included outfielder Tyler Robertson and first baseman Griffin Doersching on their pre-season "top 40." BA also highlighted reliever David Morgan on a list of prospects who impressed during spring training... Baseball America has ranked Fort Wayne's roster as 1 of the 10 most talented in all of MiLB.

WEATHER WOES: 3 of the first 7 home dates at Parkview Field were rained out... Friday's game was also delayed by more than 70 minutes due to rain.

AROUND THE SYSTEM: 17-year-old Leo DeVries debuted with Single-A Lake Elsinore last Tuesday.

15th ANNIVERSARY: This season marks a decade and a half of TinCaps baseball at Parkview Field. During the year, the team is celebrating with special edition jerseys for select home games, among other promotions.

BACK AT PARKVIEW FIELD: Last Wednesday, in partnership with the American Red Cross, a blood drive was held at the ballpark.

FUN FACT: The first game in Fort Wayne's franchise history was April 10, 1993 on the road against the Waterloo Diamonds (then a Padres affiliate). Waterloo's starting second baseman was **Homer Bush Sr.**, who went on to be a MWL All-Star... The current voice of the Dragons, **Tom Nichols**, was on the radio call for the Wizards then.

PREMEIR PLAY: Lucas Dunn's 10<sup>th</sup>-inning diving catch and outfield assist from left field on Opening Day at Great Lakes was 1 of 5 finalists for MiLB's Premier Play of the Week.

**AROUND BASEBALL:** MLB.com's No. 1 ranked prospect, **Jackson Holliday**, made his debut with the Orioles earlier this month. His uncle, Josh, is the head coach at Oklahoma State, where TinCaps first baseman **Griffin Doersching** played as a grad student in 2022. At the time, former MLB All-Star **Matt Holliday** was a volunteer assistant coach, and Jackson, as a high schooler, was often around.

ATTENDANCE CONTEXT: Parkview Field's Opening Day crowd of 4,422 was the largest Opening Day gathering here since 2017 (when Opening Day fell on a Saturday). The TinCaps had the largest crowd of the night in the MWL.

260 TO THE SHOW: Since Fort Wayne's franchise was founded in 1993, the club has had 222 alumni go on to reach the big leagues, including 36 on Opening Day rosters in MLB this year. The list features All-Stars like Fernando Tatis Jr. (2017), Trea Turner (2014), Max Fried (2013-14), David Bednar (2016-17), Ty France, and Miles Mikolas (2010), plus rookies Jackson Merrill and Graham Pauley (2023).

**CONSECUTIVE POSTPONEMENTS:** Before April 10-11, Fort Wayne hadn't had consecutive home games postponed since May 30-31, 2006. That was at Memorial Stadium. Parkview Field opened in 2009. **Ethan Salas** was born June 1, 2006.

WHAT'S NEW AT PARKVIEW FIELD: During the off-season, as part of a \$1.2 million project to comply with MLB specifications, Parkview Field's playing surfaced was replaced. Additionally, the front steps of the ballpark were improved, as was the flooring of the PSM Treetops, while other areas of the yard were freshly painted... New concessions options include popcorn in a batting helmet, elote, and Bloody Marys.

## **About Parkview Field**

- BACKGROUND: In 2007, the Fort Wayne City Council approved the Harrison Square Project to build a new ballpark downtown as well as other amenities.
- **DEBUT:** Opening Day for Parkview Field took place on April 16, 2009. The TinCaps played in front of a sold-out crowd and beat the Dayton Dragons 7-0.
- **CAPACITY: 8.100**
- **RECORD CROWD:** 9,508 (July 4, 2019)
- **DIMENSIONS:** 336 feet to the left-field foul pole... 377 feet to left-center field... 400 feet to straightaway centerfield... 383 feet to right-center field... and 318 feet to the right-field foul pole.
- WALLS: Range from 10 feet tall, from center to right-center field, up to 15 feet tall in the outfield corners as well as a small section of left-center
