TODAY'S GAME: Albuquerque's late rally fell short yesterday, losing game two, 13-10, to the Space Cowboys. The club has dropped a season-high five-straight and eight of nine. The Isotopes haven't lost five in-a-row since losing eight-straight from Aug. 3-13, 2023 (season high) ... Lefty Josh Rogers is set to toe the rubber tonight while A.J. Blubaugh is expected to start for Sugar Land, making his Triple-A debut.

HITS: The Isotopes had 15 hits last night, their second most in a game this season (16, March 31 vs. El Paso). Nine went for extra bases, tied with the aforementioned contest for a campaign-best.

DOUBLE TROUBLE: The Isotopes connected on a season-high six doubles last night, their most in a contest since also swatting six Aug. 16, 2023, vs. El Paso.
SPACE COWBOYS: Since Sugar Land joined the PCL in 2021, the Skeeters/Space Cowboys have outscored Albuquerque 362272 across 41 meetings at Isotopes Park. Albuquerque has lost 11 of its last 13 meetings against the Space Cowboys.
SWIPIN' BAGS: Greg Jones swiped another bag last night. The club's 16 stolen bases (two caught stealing) are tied for the sixthmost in Triple-A (most: Scranton/Wilkes, 26).

OUT THE GATE: With an Isotopes loss tonight, they'll match the worst start in club history at 2-10 (also reached in 2021).

BY WAY OF THE K: Albuquerque struck out 12 times yesterday, their eighth game with double-digit punchouts. Their 123 strikeouts are second-most in Triple-A (most: Omaha, 130).
XBH: Jordan Beck connected on the Isotopes Triple-A-leading 10th triple of the year in the sixth inning last night. They have a three-bagger in six of the 11 games played this year. Additionally, the club's 31 doubles are tied for the most in Triple-A (also: Round Rock Express).

FIRST FRAME: Albuquerque has allowed a run in the first inning in four-straight games (13 runs) and six of their last seven.
ERROR 404: The Isotopes committed two errors last night, their fifth game with multiple miscues in a contest this season. They have made 14 of their 15 errors on the year in their last seven games. Their 15 miscues for the season are tied with the Norfolk Tides and Oakland Athletics for the most in professional baseball.

FOUR RIBEYES: Pedro Leon's four-RBI game was the fifth occurrence of an opposing player doing so against Albuquerque in 2024 (Brett Sullivan, Miguel Vargas - twice, Ryan Ward).

NEW GUY: Greg Jones connected on his first home run as a member of the Rockies organization yesterday, a solo blast to center in the seventh inning. He also stole a base; His seven swipes (one caught stealing) are tied for second-most in Triple-A . Of 19 batted balls, eight have a 100 -plus MPH exit velocity.
BOUCHIE THE BRUIN: Sean Bouchard recorded a single last night and has reached base in nine of 10 games in 2024 ... His four triples on the year are tied for the most in Triple-A while his nine extra-base hits are tied for fourth-most (three with 10 XBH).

FAN FAVORITE: Coco Montes registered his fourth multi-hit game of the year while also drawing two walks ( $2 x$ in 2024). Reached base four times for first time this season.
MR. VOLUNTEER: Jordan Beck connected on a triple to extend his hit streak to six games (6x23). He also has a hit in eight of 10 games played while reaching base in all 10 games ... Has reached base safely in 31 consecutive games, dating back to Aug. 18 with Double-A Hartford.

BECK EXIT VELO: Out of the 25 batted balls in play, 10 have been over 100-MPH.
IT'S ALL GOOD, MAN: Hunter Goodman doubled twice last night, the 12th time he has accomplished the feat and second this season (April 3 at OKC).... Has reached base in 20 of the 24 Triple-A games he's played while tallying a hit in 18 ... Of Goodman's 26 batted balls hit into play this year, 11 have an exit velocity over 100-MPH.
TRIPLE-A LEADER: Goodman's seven doubles on the year are tied for the most in Triple-A.
REAL SLIM SCHUNKY: Aaron Schunk was in a 3-for-35 drought entering last night, but went 2 -for-3 with a pair of doubles. It was his seventh career game with multiple two-baggers and first since July 23, 2023 at Sugar Land
TONY: Drew Romo tallied his first multi-hit game of the season last night, going 2 -for-5 with an RBI double.
EXIT VELO: Of the 21 batted balls registered at 100 MPH plus last night, the Isotopes recorded eight of them. Hunter Goodman's liner in the ninth inning was 108.4 MPH off the bat, the hardest-hit ball of the evening for any Isotope.
DOUBLE-DIGITS: Last night was the 80th game in Isotopes Park history featuring both clubs scoring in double-digits. Albuquerque is $40-40$ in such contests.

## NUGLE NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 20th year as a minor league manager and second guiding the Isotopes, the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1. Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

HOMETOWN KID: Jordan Pacheco begins his third season as the Isotopes hitting coach . An Albuquerque native and 2004 graduate of La Cueva High School, Pacheco then attended the University of New Mexico (2005-07), where he was one of the most prolific offensive players in school history (.384, 59 2B, 25 HR, 145 RBI) ... Drafted by Rockies in the 9th round in 2007 and made his MLB debut with Colorado in 2011.
CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his second season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games ( 24 starts) over five season with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) . 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins form 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his first year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... It's his second stop in Albuquerque after the former outfielder played in 33 games for the club and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona-the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the second-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 23) will host the second half winner (beginning June 25) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, Sept. 28.

BALLS AND STRIKES: The Automated Ball-Strike System (ABS), now in its third year in the Pacific Coast League, will be used for all Monday-Thursday games while the Challenge System, second year in the PCL, will be used for all Friday-Sunday contests.
