Last Time Out: The Binghamton Rumble Ponies fell to the Portland Sea Dogs 9-6 in the series opener on Tuesday night at Mirabito Stadium. Rowdey Jordan clocked a three-run triple and Drew Gilbert blasted his first home run as a member of the Mets' organization.

Hey Now, Hayden: Catcher **Hayden Senger** is currently riding a season-high five-game hitting streak and he's recorded three-straight multi-hit games. He had an RBI double and single last night. Over his five-game hitting streak, Senger is hitting .500 (9-for-18) with a 1.526 OPS. He has two home runs, three doubles, four runs batted in and five runs scored over that span. Senger has hit safely in eight of his last nine games with 14 hits over that span.

Just Drew It: Outfielder **Drew Gilbert** crushed his first home run as a member of the Mets' organization last night with a solo homer in the eighth inning. It was Gilbert's 13th overall home run this season and seventh in Double-A (6 with High-A Asheville, 6 with Double-A Corpus Christi). The 22-year-old is currently riding a three-game hitting streak. In his past five games for the Ponies, Gilbert is hitting .333 (6-for-18) with a .400 on-base percentage.

Action Jackson: Infielder **Jeremiah Jackson** has reached base safely in 10 of his first 11 games with Binghamton. He singled and walked last night, and also scored a run. Jackson hit a three-run homer on Saturday night, which was his second long ball of the series at Somerset. He crushed his first home run as a member of the Mets' organization on Wednesday, with a go-ahead two-run homer. The former second-round pick in 2018 hit 15 home runs with Double-A Rocket City this year and now has 17 total homers.

Steady Stuart: Right-hander **Tyler Stuart** leads all qualified pitchers in Minor League Baseball with a 2.12 ERA this season. Stuart has only allowed 24 earned runs over 101.2 innings across High-A Brooklyn and Double-A Binghamton. The 23-year-old allowed a career-high seven runs and five earned runs in his last start at Somerset and still holds the minor league-leading ERA. In three starts at Mirabito Stadium: 1-0, 1.35 ERA, 20 IP, 16 H, 3 ER, 3 BB, 11 K. In his last home start, Stuart threw seven scoreless innings against New Hampshire with three hits and five Ks.

Last Start: Stuart allowed seven runs and five earned runs on seven hits over one-plus inning of work on Thursday at Somerset. It was his shortest start of the season and a career-high in runs and earned runs allowed in a start.

2022: Stuart was drafted by the Mets in the sixth round of the 2022 MLB Draft out of Southern Miss. Stuart made three total appearances and two starts across the Florida Complex League and Low-A St. Lucie after being drafted.

BACKGROUND: Stuart is currently ranked as the Mets' No. 7 pitching prospect and No. 16 overall prospect in the organization, by MLB Pipeline. Stuart did not pitch for the first two seasons at Southern Miss, redshirting in 2019 and not seeing action in the shortened 2020 season. He was primarily a reliever, making 35 appearances and four starts across 2021 and 2022. As a redshirt junior in 2022, Stuart pitched to a 4-0 record in 22 appearances and four starts, while holding a 3.38 ERA. He tossed 1.2 scoreless innings against LSU in the Hattiesburg Regional last season, across two outings for the regional champions. Stuart was a three-sport standout in high school in baseball, football, and basketball. He broke Herscher High School's all-time receiving record in football with 2,064 yards, including a 793-yard and 10-touchdown senior campaign. Was second on the team in scoring, while leading the team in rebounds and assists as a senior in basketball. He was First Team All-State and a Collegiate Baseball Second Team All-American to end his three-year varsity baseball career.

Reid Brignac - Manager - 2nd season with Binghamton - 4th year in the Mets organization.

In 2022, Brignac led a team that saw five players make their major league debut with the Mets after starting the season with the Rumble Ponies (Francisco Álvarez, Brett Baty, Jose Butto, Nate Fisher, and Bryce Montes de Oca), tied for the second-most in franchise history. This past fall, Brignac was one of two Mets staff members selected to be a part of the Arizona Fall League coaching staff, serving as the manager of the Peoria Javelinas. Following his retirement as an active player in 2018, Brignac was the manager of the St. Lucie Mets (Low-A) in 2021 before coming to Binghamton last year. Sager previously spent twenty seasons with the Detroit Tigers organization, including six seasons as the pitching coach with Triple-A Toledo.
