Today: It's the fourth game of a six-game set (and the 22nd game of a 24-game season series) between the Lansing Lugnuts and the Great Lakes Loons. The Nuts have lost the first three games of the series, dropping their Dow Diamond record to 2-7 and their overall record vs. Great Lakes to 7-14. A Lugnuts loss would officially eliminate Lansing from playoff contention.

Last Night: Loons 7, Lugnuts 2. In the 3rd inning, **Daniel Bucciero** slashed an RBI double amid a game-tying two-run rally... and that was it for the Lugnuts' base hits, getting out-hit 11-1. Still, the game was tied 2-2 until a **Mitch Myers** run-scoring throwing error on a pickoff attempt in the 6th. The Loons added two runs apiece in the 7th and 8th for coziness.

On the Air: Jesse Goldberg-Strassler and the Voice of Central Michigan University, **Adam Jaksa**, deliver the call on milb.streamguys1.com/lansing, while **John Vicari** and **Brad Tunney** call the game on Bally Live and MiLB TV.

On Deck: The Nuts play the Loons through Sunday, wrapping up the road schedule, before returning home September 1-6 to welcome in Fort Wayne and conclude the season.

LUG-NOTES

History: The Nuts set a new franchise record with their 43rd loss on the road last night, breaking the dubious mark set by the 1999 team (which starred **Corey Patterson** and **Carlos Zambrano**, lost only 25 games at home, finished 73-67, went to the postseason, swept Michigan in two games, and was eliminated in the divisional championship round by Wisconsin).

Home and Road: The Nuts have lost 11 of their last 13 road games while winning 13 of their last 15 home games.

- The Lugnuts have outscored the opposition by 49 runs at home, averaging a league-leading 6.12 runs per home game. Lansing is also the hardest team in the league to strike out at home, averaging only 7.8 K per game. On the road, the Nuts are averaging 4.16 runs per game and have struck out the 3rd most times, averaging 10 K per game.

- Triple slash splits, home - .256 / .372 / .393, .765 OPS, vs. road - .229 / .328 / 325, .653 OPS.
- Pitching-wise, the Lugnuts' staff has issued the fewest walks (226, 3.9 per game) at home, but that changes on the road (285, 4.6).

Two for the Price of One: The Lugnuts lead all of High-A in turning double plays, 118.

Who's Streaking:

- Jake Reinisch** went 0-for-3 with a walk yesterday, extending his team-high on-base streak to 36 games. Reinisch is batting .292 with a .444 OBP and a .508 slugging pct. during the streak, with 35 base hits and 31 walks.
- Daniel Bucciero** went 1-for-5 with a double to extend his own on-base streak to 23 games. Bucciero is batting .259 with a .400 OBP and a .407 slugging pct. during the streak, with 21 base hits and 18 walks.

New Addition: Pitcher **Chen Zhong-Ao Zhuang** joins the Lugnuts this week on Minor League rehab assignment from Triple-A. He is scheduled to start on Sunday. The Taiwanese right-hander, affectionately nicknamed "Z Man," posted a 2.56 ERA in nine appearances spanning 31 2/3 innings with the Lugnuts in 2024, with a remarkable 3:29 BB:K ratio. He spent all of 2025 in Double-A Midland (6-11, 4.08 ERA, 145 K in 145 2/3 IP) and was added to the A's 40-man roster entering 2026. But Zhuang landed on the 7-day IL from May 4-30 and was designed for assignment on July 31, going back on the Injured List (right elbow) on August 6.

Organizational Showdown: The A's and Dodgers' MiLBers are meeting up in the California League (Stockton Ports vs. Ontario Tower Buzzers), the Midwest League (Lansing Lugnuts vs. Great Lakes Loons) and Texas League (Midland RockHounds vs. Tulsa Drillers).

Scoreboard check: The Lugnuts and Ports lost yesterday, but the RockHounds won 4-2 behind 4 1/3 shutout innings from **Steven Echavarria**, who struck out seven; the Dodgers lead the A's for the week, 6-3.

Major League Lugnuts: Ten former Nuts have made their MLB debuts this season: **Daniel Susac** for the Giants, **Junior Perez** for the White Sox, **Eduardo Rivera** for the Red Sox, **Jack Weisenburger** with the NY Mets, and **Henry Bolte**, **Gage Jump**, **Kade Morris**, **Joshua Kuroda-Grauer**, **Tommy White** and **Yunior Tur** for the Athletics. In all 48 Lugnuts have appeared in a Major League game this season.

Moving On Up: The Lugnuts have seen above-average roster movement, with 17 players moving to the upper levels of the minors...

AUGUST 28 IN LUGNUTS HISTORY

2011: Fort Wayne closer Kevin Quackenbush, a future Major Leaguer, had not allowed a run all year, but the Lugnuts capped off a wild 10-inning 5-3 victory at Parkview Field with a pair of runs against the TinCaps' fireman, headlined by a Marcus Knecht RBI double that scored a half-shoeless K.C. Hobson. Until this game, the 'Caps had defeated the Lugnuts in 10 of 13 meetings but the victory started a stretch of five straight wins for the Lugs over Fort Wayne – including the Eastern Division Finals.

2012: Lugnuts catcher Chris Schaeffer caught three Fort Wayne TinCaps stealing, plus a fourth 'Cap was picked off by reliever Phil Brua and caught stealing at third base, in a 7-6 TinCaps win at Cooley Law School Stadium. Fort Wayne had 18 hits, four by leadoff hitter Travis Jankowski. But, hey – at least they didn't steal any bases!

2022: 2021 third-rounder Mason Miller debuted with a 100-102 mph fastball, serving up a leadoff home run to Ben Metzinger on a 100 mph before setting down six in a row with four strikeouts. Jorge Juan relieved Miller and gave up a three-run homer to Brewers No. 1 prospect Jackson Chourio in a 5-2 loss at Wisconsin.

In a Nutshell: Dico replaced the released Devin Kirby-Williams in the Lugnuts' rotation, making his second straight start... this is his 50th career Lansing appearance and 16th career Lugnuts start.

Glory Days: Boasting a 96 mph fastball, Dicochea was highly regarded coming out of Sahuarita High School, ranked the No. 1 prep prospect in Arizona by Baseball America entering the 2019 draft... twirled a no-hitter in the state semifinals... signed for \$400,000... signed away from commitment to University of Arizona... senior year stats: 1.30 ERA, 54 IP, 24 H, 10 ER, 11 BB, 86 K... in addition to pitching, starred at shortstop... also from Tucson: Alex Verdugo, four-time All-Star Ian Kinsler, two-time All-Star J.J. Hardy, Cardinals All-Star catcher Tom Pagnozzi and Ron Hassey... in all, Tucson ranks second behind Phoenix in producing Major Leaguers from the Grand Canyon State.

Minor League Path: Dicochea opened his professional career in the 2019 Arizona League after signing, but his 2021 campaign was halted in Single-A Stockton due to injury on June 6 after only six appearances, five starts... returned from Tommy John surgery on August 12, 2022... opened 2023 as the Ports' No. 4 starter... promoted from Single-A Stockton to Lansing on June 13, 2023, to replace Jack Perkins and finished the season in the Lugnuts' starting rotation... opened the 2024 season on the Nuts' roster but was transferred back to Stockton on April 30 after four appearances... spent all of 2025 in Stockton.

From the Archives: When Dicochea first joined the Nuts in June 2023 had just been written by MLB.com A's beat writer Martín Gallegos a day earlier, quoting A's GM David Forst in including Dicochea's name among the top pitching prospects in the system (Royber Salinas, Gunnar Hoglund, J.T. Ginn and Joey Estes). Wrote Gallegos about Dicochea, "Dicochea, an eighth-round selection by the A's in the 2019 MLB Draft out of Sahuarita (Ariz.) High School, ranks just outside Oakland's Top 30 Prospects list. But his inclusion in that group from Forst speaks volumes about how highly he is viewed... Dicochea's development hit a snag early in his pro career after he underwent Tommy John surgery in 2021. Since his return from injury, the 22-year-old right-hander is taking a big step forward this season, showing off a fastball that consistently hits 95 mph along with a solid slider and a changeup he's recently added to his mix. A's assistant general manager and director of player personnel Billy Owens added, "He's off to a promising start. Averaging well over a strikeout per inning. Overall, his command has taken a step forward. He's definitely an interesting arm on the horizon."
