**SUNDAY:** The Flying Squirrels lost to the RubberDucks, 16-7. Akron scored four runs in the second to pull ahead, 4-0. In the top of the third, **Bryce Eldridge** hit an RBI single and **Sabin Ceballos** knocked a two-run single to close the score to 4-3. Akron scored three in the fourth and six in the fifth to stretch the lead to 13-3. **Aeverson Arteaga** worked a bases-loaded walk and **Diego Velasquez** drove in three with a double to pull the score to 13-7. The RubberDucks added three runs in the seventh.

**TODAY'S GAME:** The Flying Squirrels play the opener of a six-game road series against the Somerset Patriots, Double-A affiliate of the New York Yankees. The two teams meet again at Somerset from July 29-August 3. The Flying Squirrels and Patriots met last season for two series. Richmond opened the year at Somerset dropping two-of-three from April 5-7. The Patriots won five-of-six at The Diamond from June 25-30.

PACKING THE HOUSE: Last year, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in average (6,595) and total (435,295) attendance. Among the 120 MiLB teams, the Flying Squirrels were 10th in average attendance. It was the third straight year the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A clubs in average and total attendance, which had not been done prior to 2022. Last year's total attendance is the highest since 2013 (434,769) and the fourth-highest average in team history. April 4 marked the 15th consecutive Opening Night sellout, marking every home opener in franchise history to date. This year, the Flying Squirrels are averaging 7,347 fans per home game, which ranks second among all 120 MiLB clubs.

**THE FLYING SQUIRRELS** went 2-4 in last week's home series against Chesapeake after going 2-4 in the previous week's road series at Harrisburg. In the Eastern League, the Richmond offense is tied for fourth in hits (142), fifth in batting average (.225), 10th in runs (61), ninth in total bases (201), 11th in doubles (23), tied for eighth in homers (12), 11th in RBIs (52), ninth in walks (62) and first in strikeouts (144 - fewest). The Richmond pitching staff is ninth in ERA (4.27).

**THE PATRIOTS** split last week's home series against the Hartford Yard Goats. They opened the season dropping two-of-three at Hartford before splitting a home series against Reading and dropping four-of-six at Altoona the following week. The Somerset offense leads the Eastern League in homers (23), doubles (46) and SLG (.402). Somerset's roster features four of Baseball America's top-30 Yankees prospects, including OF Spencer Jones (No. 6), C/IB Rafael Flores (No. 10), RHP Cam Schlittler (No. 14) and RHP Clayton Beeter (No. 21). There are also four players ranked in MLB.com's top-30 Yankees prospects list, including Jones (No. 2), Schlittler (No. 10), Flores (No. 15) and Beeter (No. 20).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander John Michael Bertrand makes his fifth start of the season and the third of his career against the Patriots. He last pitched last Wednesday at Akron and allowed two runs over five innings in a loss. In 2024, he started on Opening Day at Somerset and surrendered four runs (three earned) over five innings in a no-decision. He also threw five innings and allowed four runs against the Patriots at The Diamond on June 26, 2024. Bertrand started on Opening Day for the Flying Squirrels on April 4 against Akron, becoming the first pitcher to start back-to-back season openers for the Flying Squirrels. Last year, he was named the Flying Squirrels' Pitcher of the Year after going 7-9 with a 4.32 ERA in 28 outings (27 starts). Bertrand also won the team's Community Service Award. He made two starts with Triple-A Sacramento to close the season. For the year, Bertrand led all Eastern League pitchers with 10 scoreless starts, all at least five innings. He also led all MiLB pitchers defensively in assists (31) and ranked second in total chances (38). He finished the season ranked first among all MiLB pitchers in double plays induced (23), five ahead of the next closest pitcher. Bertrand was named Eastern League Pitcher of the Week twice last year, first for throwing seven perfect innings against the Baysox on April 27 and then for working six hitless innings in Bowie on May 23. Entering 2025, he is rated by Baseball America as having the best control in the Giants system for the second straight year. Bertrand began his collegiate career at Furman University in South Carolina before playing his final two seasons at the University of Notre Dame. He was selected by the Giants in the 10th round of the 2022 MLB Draft. For more on Bertrand, see page two.

FOR SOMERSET: Right-hander Brendan Beck makes his fourth start of the season for the Patriots and his first against the Flying Squirrels. In his three starts this year, he has combined for 15 scoreless innings, allowing five hits with 13 strikeouts. Beck was selected by the Yankees in the second round of the 2021 MLB Draft out of Stanford. After having Tommy John surgery, he did not make his professional debut until 2023. That year, he posted a 1.59 ERA in 10 outings, including nine with High-A Hudson Valley. He missed all of the 2024 season. Brenden Beck is the younger brother of former Flying Squirrels pitcher **Tristan Beck**, who was the team's home-opener starter in 2021 and 2022 and is currently with Triple-A Sacramento.

**DON'T RUN ON RICHMOND:** The Flying Squirrels' catching unit of **Adrián Sugastey** and **Zach Morgan** have combined to throw out 14 stolen base attempts this season, which is first among all 30 Double-A teams and ranks tied for ninth among the 120 MiLB teams. Sugastey is tied for first in Double-A with eight runners caught stealing, which leads the EL. Morgan is second in

**BRYCE IS BACK:** Northern Virginia native **Bryce Eldridge** returned to the Richmond roster last Tuesday after missing the start of the season with an injury. He hit a solo home run in his first plate appearance of the year. The 20-year-old first baseman played at four levels in the Giants organization in his first full professional season last year, including nine games with Richmond in September. For the year in 116 games, Eldridge hit .291 with 23 homers and 92 RBIs. He is ranked by Baseball America as the No. 11 prospect in baseball. Eldridge is also the fifth Virginia-born player to suit up for the Flying Squirrels in franchise history.

**HAMMERIN' JAIRO:** In the first game of Saturday's doubleheader, **Jairo Pomares** gave the Flying Squirrels a 4-1 lead in the sixth with a three-run homer. It was his fourth homer of the year, which is tied for third-most in the Eastern League this season. Last year, Pomares led the team with 12 homers. Eight-of-his-10 RBIs this year have come on home runs.

**GO, DIEGO, GO: Diego Velasquez** is riding a nine-game hitting streak, which is the third-longest current streak in the Eastern League and tied for the fourth-longest in the EL this season. In those nine games since April 18, Velasquez is batting .394 (13-for-33) with a homer, two doubles, five RBIs and six runs scored. In his 62 games with Richmond dating back to last year, Velasquez is batting .309 (68-for-220).

PLAY THE HITS: The Flying Squirrels have collected 151 hits through their first 20 games this season, which is the fifth-most in the Eastern League. The team is batting .227 (151-for-664), which is tied for fifth-highest in the league. However, the Richmond offense is batting .197 (34-for-173) with runners in scoring position, which is 10th the league. In last week's series, the Flying Squirrels 1200 (8-for-40) with runners in scoring position, including going 1-for-17 in the second game of Saturday night's

WHERE DID THESE GUYS COME FROM?: There are players from six different counties on the Flying Squirrels' roster, including the United States (22 players), Venezuela (2), the Dominican Republic (1), Cuba (1), Panama (1) and Puerto Rico (1). Among the 21 American-born players, 12 different states are represented, including North Carolina (3), Florida (3), Ohio (3), California (3), Michigan (2), Pennsylvania (2), Minnesota (1), North Dakota (1), Rhode Island (1), Texas (1), Indiana (1) and Virginia (1). There are 12 players who joined the Giants organization out of the MLB Draft, five were signed as non-drafted free agents, four as international free agents, four who were picked up in trades, one who was claimed in the minor-league phase of the Rule 5 Draft and two signed as MiLB free agents. For 22 players, the Giants were their original affiliated organization and seven have played with other major-league organizations.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, Victor Bericoto is seventh in batting average (.319), fifth in OBP (.439), first in SLG (.496) and second in OPS (1.035). Jairo Pomares is tied for third in homers (4) and tied for seventh in total bases (33). Jack Choate is sixth in strikeouts (25). Seth Lonsway is sixth in innings pitched (20.2) and 10th in WHIP (0.97).

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster includes seven players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including Bryce Eldridge (No. 1), Joe Whitman (No. 10), Diego Velasquez (No. 13), Sabin Ceballos (No. 16), Trent Harris (No. 26), Aeverson Arteaga (No. 27) and Jack Choate (No. 28). There are also seven players ranked in MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list, including Eldridge, (No. 1), Whitman (No. 7), Harris (No. 11), Velasquez (No. 15), Arteaga (No. 16), Ceballos (No. 23) and Choate (No. 27). Eldridge is also ranked No. 11 overall by Baseball America and No. 22 by MLB.com.

# THIS DATE IN RICHMOND

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1956: The Richmond Virginians beat the Rochester Red Wings, 3-1, in the first game of a doubleheader at Parker Field. Jim Coates started on the mound and picked up his first Triple-A win. The only run surrendered was on a homer by Gene Green in the second. Coates answered with a go-ahead homer in the bottom of the inning. In the second game, the Virginians led 5-0 before the Red Wings rallied with two outs in the seventh and eventually won 7-5 in nine innings. 1966: The Richmond Braves beat the Toronto Maple Leafs at Parker Field, 4-1, for the team's first-ever win after opening their inaugural season 0-6. Lee Bales broke a 1-1 tie with a bases-loaded walk in the seventh. Two more runs scored in the eighth on an error. Larry Maxie threw a complete game for Richmond. 1977: The Richmond Braves beat the Syracuse Chiefs, 7-4, at Parker Field. The score was tied 4-4 om the bottom of the ninth with two outs. Bob Beall and Rob Belloir each reached on singles before pinch-hitter Hank Small won the game with a three-run homer. 1982: The Richmond Braves swept a doubleheader over the Syracuse Chiefs at Parker Field. In Game 1, Jerry Keller hit a walk-off single in the eighth for a 5-4 win. In Game 2, Richmond took a 5-0 lead with a two-run triple by Brook Jacoby, a sac fly by Paul Zuvella, an RBI single by Gerald Perry and a solo homer by Terry Harper. Perry added a homer in the fifth to move the lead to 6-4. Richmond held off another Syracuse rally in the seventh. 2019: The Flying Squirrels beat the Bowie Baysox, 3-2, at Prince George's Stadium. Logan Webb started for Richmond and struck out 10 over six innings, allowing one run. Heath Quinn broke a 1-1 tie with a solo homer in the eighth, but Bowie's Zach Jarrett tied the game in the bottom of the eighth. In the top of the ninth, Johneshwy Fargas hit a go-ahead solo homer. Sam Wolff struck out two in the ninth to close the save. Jalen Miller also had a solo homer for Richmond.
