GOOD TO BE BACK: The Omaha Storm Chasers play their first game since Sept. 2, 2019, when they completed their 2019 campaign with a 6-0 win over Round Rock to finish the season with a 59-80 record. The span of 610 days between games marks the longest stretch without professional baseball in Omaha since before the inception of the Omaha Royals in 1969. There were seven years between professional baseball games from when the Omaha Dodgers folded in 1962 to the Omaha Royals' first game in 1969. There was no 2020 Minor League Baseball season due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

WELCOME TO TRIPLE-A EAST: As a result of the reorganization of Minor League Baseball, the Omaha Storm Chasers are part of a newly-formed league, Triple-A East. The league, which combines teams from the previous Pacific Coast League, International League, Double-A Southern League, and independent American Association, is comprised of 20 teams split between three divisions: Midwest, Southeast, and Northeast. Omaha plays in the Midwest Division along with Columbus (CLE), Indianapolis (PIT), Iowa (CHC), Louisville (CIN), St. Paul (MIN), and Toledo (DET). There will be limited inter-divisional play in 2021 to reduce travel. As a result, Omaha will only face teams in the Midwest Division in 2021.

THE NEXT WAVE: Omaha's Opening Day roster includes seven of the Kansas City Royals top 30 prospects, per *Baseball America*, including **RHP Jackson Kowar** (4), **OF Kyle Isbel** (6), **RHP Carlos Hernández** (15), **RHP Ronald Bolaños** (18), **OF Edward Olivares** (19), **INF Lucius Fox** (22), and **RHP Scott Blewett** (25). Each member of the Storm Chasers current starting rotation (Kowar, Hernández, Blewett, Bolaños) is a top-30 prospect.

FOR OMAHA: **RHP Jackson Kowar** makes his Triple-A debut as the Opening Day starter for Omaha. He ranks as the No. 4 prospect in the Kansas City Royals organization and the No. 83 prospect in all of baseball according to *Baseball America*. While this is Kowar's first start at Werner Park, he made three appearances (two starts) at TD Ameritrade Park with the University of Florida across two College World Series appearances for the Gators in 2017 and 2018. In 2017, he recorded the final outs of the College World Series with 1.2 innings of relief to clinch the Gators' first national title. In 2018, he struck out 13 across 6.2 scoreless innings in a win over Texas in what was his final collegiate start. This is Kowar's second full season of professional baseball after he was drafted with the 33rd overall pick in the 2018 MLB Draft. In 2019, Kowar made 26 starts between High-A Wilmington and Double-A Northwest Arkansas, striking out 144 and walking 43 in 148.1 innings with a 3.52 ERA in 26 starts.

FOR ST. PAUL: Left-hander Andrew Albers makes his return to professional baseball in the United States after pitching for the Orix Buffaloes in Japan's Nippon Professional Baseball League in 2018, 2019, and 2020, posting a 4.02 ERA across 48 appearances (266.1 IP) between those three years. Albers, who was originally drafted by the San Diego Padres in the 10th round (315th overall) in the 2008 MLB Draft out of the University of Kentucky, pitched for the Minnesota Twins Triple-A affiliate in Rochester in 2013 and 2014. He made his Major League debut on Aug. 3, 2013 against the Kansas City Royals, tossing 8.1 shutout innings against a lineup that featured former Chasers **Lorenzo Cain**, **Eric Hosmer**, **Billy Butler**, **Alex Gordon**, **Justin Maxwell**, and **Mike Moustakas**.

BACK AT THE HELM: **Brian Poldberg** embarks on his seventh season as the manager for the Omaha Storm Chasers and his 21st season as a manager overall. The Carter Lake, IA, native has a 1,283-1,353 (.486) all-time record as a manager, which includes a 408-439 (.482) record with Omaha. Poldberg is one of two managers in Omaha franchise history to eclipse 400 wins, joining the franchise's all-time wins leader, **Mike Jirschele** (995), who managed the team for 14 seasons ('94-'97, '03-'13). During his playing career, Poldberg spent parts of three seasons as a catcher for the Omaha Royals from 1983-1985.

WERNER PARK: 2021 marks the 10th season of Storm Chasers baseball at Werner Park since the ballpark opened in 2011. Since then, 63 players have gone from playing for the Storm Chasers to making their Major League debut with the Kansas City Royals, including 2021 Storm Chasers **Jake Newberry** (2018), **Kelvin Gutierrez** (2019), **Bubba Starling** (2019), **Nick Dini** (2019), **Gabe Speier** (2019), **Erick Mejia** (2019), and **Scott Blewett** (2019).

PARTNERSHIP EXTENDED: The Omaha Storm Chasers and Kansas City Royals extended their partnership this offseason, continuing the longest affiliation at the Triple-A level in all of Minor League Baseball and the second-longest affiliation overall (Reading/Philadelphia - since 1967, Lakeland/Detroit - since 1967). Omaha and Kansas City have been partners since 1969, the first season for both organizations.
