**SUNDAY:** The Flying Squirrels lost to the SeaWolves, 4-0, to close a 12-game road trip. Kevin McGonigle hit an RBI triple in the first and later scored on a sacrifice fly by Justice Bigbie for a 2-0 lead. Those were the only two runs allowed over five innings by starter **Nick Zwack**. Ben Malgeri hit a two-run homer in the sixth for a 4-0 lead. Richmond was held to five hits.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play the opener of a six-game series against the Altoona Curve, Double-A affiliate of the Pittsburgh Pirates. This series is the second of three between the two teams this year. In Altoona from June 18-22, the Flying Squirrels went 3-2 for their first series win of 2025. One of the games was canceled. The two teams will also meet for six games in Altoona from September 2-7, Richmond's final road trip of the season.

PACKING THE HOUSE: This season the Flying Squirrels are averaging 6,556 fans per home game, which leads Double-A and ranks seventh among all 120 MiLB clubs. Their average of 7.290 in the season's first month was the highest April attendance in franchise history. Last year, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in average (6,595) and total (435,295) attendance. Among the 120 MiLB teams, the Flying Squirrels were 10th in average attendance. It was the third straight year the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A clubs in average and total attendance, which had not been done prior to 2022. Last year's total attendance was the highest since 2013 (434,769) and the fourth-highest average in team history.

**THE FLYING SQUIRRELS** are in second place in the Southwest Division second-half standings, 1.5 games behind Altoona. They won last week's series in Erie, going 4-2, to cap a 6-6 road trip. After going 10-2 from July 4-20, they dropped six of seven from July 22-30 before going 6-4 in their last 10 games dating back to August 1. Of Richmond's 64 losses this season, 36 of them have been by two runs or less (23 by one, 13 by two). Their 23 one-run losses are tied for the most in the EL, even with Reading. Richmond's +16 run differential in the second half is third-best in the league.

**THE CURVE** are leading the Southwest Division second-half standings by 1.5 games over the Flying Squirrels. They split last week's six-game series against the Yard Goats in Altoona. Altoona roster features six players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Pirates prospects, including INF Termarr Johnson (No. 7), RHP Antwone Kelly (No. 12), RHP Wilber Dotel (No. 13), OF/INF Mitch Jebb (No. 20), OF/1B Esmerlin Valdez (No. 22) and C Omar Alfonzo (No. 25). MLB.com's top-30 Pirates prospects list features five Altoona players, including Johnson (No. 6), Valdez (No. 15), Jebb (No. 18), Alfonzo (No. 19) and Dotel (No. 28).

FOR RICHMOND: Right-hander Trystan Vrieling makes his 12th Double-A start of the season and his second with the Flying Squirrels. It his also his second career start against Altoona. He last pitched in his Giants organization debut last Wednesday at Erie and allowed one run in five innings of work. The one run scored in the bottom of the sixth inning. On August 1, he was traded to the Giants from the Yankees as part of the package for reliever Camilo Doval. In July, he went 1-0 with a 2.41 ERA (5 ER/18.2 P) in five starts. Last season, he made his professional debut against the Flying Squirrels on April 7 at TD Bank Ballpark to close opening weekend and threw five scoreless innings, allowing two hits with six strikeouts. He was named Eastern League Pitcher of the Month last April after starting his professional career 2-1 with a 1.88 ERA (5 ER/24.0 iP) in four starts. He finished the 2024 season leading the Eastern League in wins (13) and ranked second in innings pitched (147.1) and sixth in strikeouts (132). Vrieling was selected by the Yankees in the third round of the 2022 MLB Draft out of Gonzaga. For more on Vrieling, see page two.

FOR ALTOONA: Right-hander Antwone Kelly makes his eighth Double-A start and his first against the Flying Squirrels. He last pitched last Wednesday against Hartford and threw five scoreless innings, allowing two hits. He began the season with High-A Greensboro and went 1-1 with a 3.03 ERA in 14 starts. After posting a 1.80 ERA in four High-A June starts, he was promoted to Double-A Altoona on June 24. A native of Aruba, Kelly signed with the Pirates in 2021. He is currently ranked as the No. 12 Pirates prospect by Baseball America.

DON'T RUN ON RICHMOND: The Flying Squirrels' catching unit of Adrián Sugastey, Zach Morgan and Onil Perez have combined to catch 55 stolen base attempts this season, which first among the 30 Double-A teams and leads the Eastern League. Sugastey leads all Double-A catchers with 39 runners caught stealing. Sugastey has set a franchise record for the most caught stealing in a season in Flying Squirrels history, passing Jackson Williams' mark of 35 set in 2015 with his 36th on July 26 against Portland. For his career with Richmond, Sugastey's 52 runners caught stealing for his career is third-most in franchise history, trailing **Eliezer Zambrano** (53, 2010-2017). The SeaWolves have only attempted two stolen bases in this week's series.

BERI BOMBS: Victor Bericoto hit his ninth homer of the season in the second game of the August 1 doubleheader at Somerset, which leads active Richmond players for the year. It was the 31st homer of his Flying Squirrels career, moving him into third place on the franchise's all-time home run list, passing **Jarrett Parker** (2013-14). He is now two homers behind **Jacob Heyward** (2019, '21-22) for second place on the list and six behind **Ricky Oropesa's** (2013-16) franchise record of 37. He also drove the 118th RBI of his Richmond career in the first game of Friday's doubleheader, moving him ahead of **Hunter Cole** (2015-17) for second place on the franchise's all-time RBI list. Bericoto now has 124 career RBIs with Richmond, trailing only Oropesa's record of 165. In 10 August games, Bericoto is batting .303 (10-for-33) with a homer, two doubles and seven RBIs.

UNTUCK: Tyler Myrick recorded his 10th save of the season in Wednesday's 6-3 win at Erie. It was his second straight day clos ing out a save. For the year, he is tied for the league lead in saves. It was the 22nd save of his Flying Squirrels career, moving him into a tie for fifth place on the franchise's all-time saves list with **Josh Osich** (2013-16). His next save will tie him with **Rafael Cova** (2010) for fourth on the franchise's all-time saves list with 23. Myrick has converted six of his seven save attempts since July 1 over 11 appearances. He picked up his first win of the season on July 25 against the Sea Dogs, working the final four outs. Since June 28, Myrick has posted a 1.23 ERA (2 ER/14.0 IP) in 12 appearances.

KING OF THE HILL: In his last 10 games since July 30, Turner Hill is batting .406 (13-for-32) with two doubles, three walks, one RBI and seven runs scored. On Saturday night at Erie, he tied his Double-A career high with four hits and set a Double-A career high with three runs scored.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, Diego Velasquez is ranked sixth in walks (53) sixth in hits (95) and 10th in OBP (.357). **Turner Hill** is tied for fifth in triples (5). **Seth Lonsway** is seventh in ERA (3.52). **John Michael Bertrand** is third in innings pitched (105.0), third in ERA (2.91), eighth in WHIP (1.27) and eighth in BAA (.242). **Jack Choate** is tied for fourth in strikeouts (103), fifth in ERA (3.38), seventh in BAA (.230) and 10th in WHIP (1.31). **Joe Whitman** is seventh in strikeouts (97). **Tyler Myrick** is first in saves (10)

**TOP SKIPPER:** Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 244 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship.

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features four players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including Bo Davidson (No. 4), Diego Velasquez (No. 8), Joe Whitman (No. 9) and Jack Choate (No. 28). John Michael Bertrand is rated as having the best control in the Giants system. **Adrian Sugastey** is ranked as the top defensive catcher. **Aeverson Arteaga** is rated as the best defensive infielder and best infield arm. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features three Richmond players, including Davidson (No. 5), Whitman (No. 14) and Velasquez (No. 21).

1971: The Richmond Braves beat the Tidewater Tides, 10-9, at Parker Field. After Richmond led by six runs at one time, the Tides evened the score with four runs in the seventh to tie the score, 7-7, capped with a homer by Chico Diaz. In the bottom of the ninth, Hank McGraw knocked a bases-loaded single to win the game. 1990: The Richmond Braves beat the Columbus Clippers, 6-5, at The Diamond. Columbus held a 5-1 lead entering in the ninth inning before Alan Mills allowed two hits, four walks and five runs. Rico Rossy hit a two-run single to close the score to 5-3. A throwing error brought home two runs to tie the game. Bruce Crabbe won the game with a line drive off the left-field wall with one out. The win capped a three-game sweep for the R-Braves. 1997: The Richmond Braves beat the Pawtucket Red Sox, 1-0, at The Diamond. Bret Saberhagen started for the Pawsox working his way back from a shoulder injury. The two-time Cy Young Award winner had not pitched in the minors prior to 1997 since his first professional season in 1983. Randall Simon hit a two-out double and scored the game's only run on a single by Tommy Gregg in the sixth inning. Richmond starter Tom Thobe allowed two hits and a walk over seven inning. Brad Clontz covered the final two innings to finish the shutout. 2012: The Flying Squirrels beat the Bowie Baysox, 1-0, at The Diamond. Juan Perez won the game with a one-out single in the bottom of the 10th inning, brining in Ryan Cavan after hit leadoff double.
