MAY 15TH IN LUGNUTS HISTORY

2018: The Lugnuts beat the Dragons in a walk-off for the second straight day, capturing their seventh straight win, 10-9, on Yeltsin Gudiño's RBI single off Ryan Nutof in the bottom of the tenth. It was also the Lugnuts' third straight walk-off victory over the Dragons dating back to April 27th's series finale. The Lugnuts had blown a 9-3 lead, allowing six runs in the eighth inning.

2019: 19-year-old catcher Gabriel Moreno was a smash in his Lugnuts debut, homering in his first at-bat, delivering a tworun single in the fourth inning, tripling in the eighth and finishing 3-for-5, and Rafael Lantigua drew a bases-loaded, four-pitch walk in the bottom of the ninth in a 7-6 win over West Michigan.

In a Nutshell: Enters second season in the Midwest League... started Lugnuts' third game of the year, April 6 at Fort Wayne, and fanned eight TinCaps in four hitless innings... April 19 at Wisconsin: tossed the first complete game of the season in the Midwest League, firing six innings in the series finale, : 75 pitches, 47 strikes, seven hits, two runs, one walk, one strikeout, in a 2-0 loss – the Lugnuts' only loss of the series.

No-No History: Facing the Cedar Rapids Kernels on June 13, 2024, relieved Jake Garland to open the 6th inning and tossed 2 2/3 hitless innings, walking one and striking out three, as part of the Lugnuts' 8-0 combined no-hitter of the Kernels... it was the 4th no-hitter in franchise history as well as the first home no-hitter since 2003.

No. 3 starter in 2019; 2019 Collegiate Baseball Player National Pitcher of the Week (Feb. 18), tossing six no-hit innings with 11 strikeouts; ranked 7th in the Big Ten in ERA (2.72)... No. 2 starter in 2020 before season was halted early due to the pandemic: 2-0, 3.00, 4 GS, 21 IP, 24 K, 5 BB... signed with the Athletics following the shortened five-round draft.

International Stage: With lowa, took part in the 2017 World University Games in Taipei City, winning a silver medal (fell to Japan in the gold medal contest)... part of the first American team to ever advance to the gold medal game as well as the first American team to ever medal, period... team finished 5-2, losing only to Japan... started five games, four at first base, one at pitcher.
