"FUN IS GOOD" FACTOIDS

STORM CHASERS CLAP BACK IN GAME FIVE: Despite a pair of home runs from Diego Cartaya and Ryan Fitzgerald, the Saints saw their three-game win streak come to an end on Saturday afternoon at CHS Field. Cartaya's 384-foot blast to left field snapped an 0-for-13 to start his St. Paul tenure and is the longest tracked home run by a Saints hitter so far this year; it gave St. Paul an early 3-0 lead after two that they would relinquish with a four-run top of the fourth. Fitzgerald's first round-tripper as a Saint was a two-run shot in the fourth that tied the game at five apiece, but SS Harold Castro would untie the game with a two-run homer in the sixth, capping a 4 RBI day for the former Detroit Tiger. Randy Dobnak gave the Saints a much-needed five innings less than 24 hours after using five relievers in a bullpen game, but allowed five runs in a no-decision. Jarret Whorff was effective in his Saints debut save for a mistake pitch to Castro; he otherwise struck out five of 11 batters faced before being recalled to Double-A Wichita after the game.

FORGET ABOUT THE CURVEBALL, RICKY...GIVE 'EM THE HEATER!: The Saints have crushed fastballs to begin the season and rank [second in the International League](#) as a team by weighted on-base average (wOBA), trailing only the Louisville Bats (CIN). The Saints are hitting .337 (66-196, 2nd in IL) while slugging .480 (4th in IL) with a 22.4% whiff-rate on the hard-stuff. Five of the seven St. Paul home runs have come vs fastballs so far this season. Conversely, the Saints rank 12th in team wOBA against non-fastballs (.274). Some of the Saints' best hitters against the fastballs early are listed below:

MCCUSKER MASHING: Saints outfielder Carson McCusker is crushing the ball to open the season and currently ranks 3rd in Triple-A in average exit velocity to start the season (see below), averaging 98.1 mph on his batted balls this year. The 6-8 slugger has crushed two game-winning homers, his first two of the season, during the homestand and also tallied a single that was tattooed for an exit velocity of 112.9 mph, the third hardest-hit ball by a Saint so far this season. McCusker now has three of the top-5 hardest hit balls by a St. Paul hitter this season and four of the top-10, including a 114.2 mph single on April 2 in Columbus that ranks 9th in exit velocity in Saints history. Since making his Triple-A debut on August 24 last season, his average exit velo is [tops among Saints hitters with at least 25 AB during that stretch](#) (91.9). Now just 32 games into his short Triple-A tenure, he already has seven batted balls registered at 110 mph or harder (three so far this season).

NO CHEAP ONES: After producing ten "hard hit" balls on Saturday afternoon against Omaha, the Saints now rank [1-5th in the International League in average exit velocity](#) with an 88.7 mph average as a team. In Friday, March 28th's season opener, the Saints lineup produced a season-high 14 "hard-hit" balls, defined by Statcast as any batted ball 95 mph or above, and have had at least 6 in 10-of-11 contests so far this year. Carson McCusker (3x), Emmanuel Rodriguez, and Jair Camargo (2x) have all have peaked with exit velocities over 110 mph already this year, all ranking among the [top-100 hardest hit balls in the International League](#) this season.

GET IN THE GAP, BALL!: Despite the Saints' eye-popping exit velos (see above), it hasn't necessarily translated to a ton of power yet this season. Before Thursday, the Saints ranked second-to-last in the International League with 15 extra-base hits and 14th/20 in slugging% (.340). After cracking 11 in the past three games since, the Saints still rank [just among the bottom-4 in the IL in XBH](#) (.26) and 9th in SLG% (.385). The Saints are bottom-6 in the league in HR (7) even after hitting six out of the ballpark the past four games entering Sunday.

START ME UP: The Saints starting rotation has gotten off to a tremendous start to the year, spinning a 2.64 ERA among starters that ranks third in Triple-A and second in the International League. If you throw out David Festa's rocky outing on April 4 in game two of a doubleheader in Columbus (3.1 IP, 5 ER), the Saints starting staff have a 1.76 ERA (8 ER, 41.0 IP). The rotation went off with a bang to start the season when David Festa, Zebby Matthews, and then Andrew Morris all went at least 5.0 shutout in three consecutive starts, the first time in Saints history that three consecutive St. Paul starters have done so (It's only the [second time ever](#) that Saints starters did not allow a run in three consecutive games with the last coming from June 29-July 1, 2023 when Randy Dobnak and Blayne Enlow threw 5.0 shutout in back-to-back games before Dallas Kuechel went 4.1 scoreless the following night, all against Gwinnett).

THE STARS OF TOMORROW, TODAY: The Saints Opening Day roster features nine of Minnesota's Top-30 prospects according to MLB.com and ten according to Baseball America while also touting five of Minnesota's top-10 prospects on the MLB Pipeline list. The Twins prospects in the rankings include OF Emmanuel Rodriguez (No 2. MLB.com, No. 2 BA), INF Luke Keaschall (3/3), RHP Zebby Matthews (-/4), RHP Marco Raya (6/8), RHP Andrew Morris (9/10), RHP Cory Lewis (11/20), INF Payton Eeles (23/17), RHP Travis Adams (22/22), C Diego Cartaya (24/21), & C Jair Camargo (-/23). Both Rodriguez (19/37) and Keaschall (45/60) rank among the top-100 overall lists of both publications.

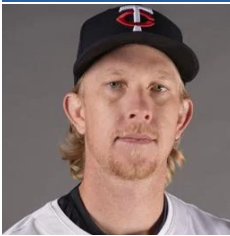

LAST APPEARANCE: Made his third relief appearance for the Twins after being called up on March 31 before making his debut with the Saints. Entered game with the Twins leading 7-5 in the Top 6th at Target Field last week Sunday. Gave up a single to Brendan Rodgers, coaxed a fly-out of Zach Dezenzo before walking Jake Meyers and getting Jose Altuve to pop out to first. Gave up an RBI single to Isaac Paredes before being replaced by Danny Coulombe on the mound. Was credited with a hold. Generate one swing-and-miss on his 22 pitches thrown.

I'VE BEEN EVERYWHERE, MAN: Last season was a tumultuous year for the veteran right-hander, McCaughan. After spending the first seven years of his professional career with the Mariners, he was traded for cash after being designated for assignment in February 2024, and spent the season on the Triple-A/Major League shuttle. He was optioned to Triple-A on five separate occasions, and also recalled to the Majors five different times, splitting the season between the Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp and Miami Marlins, as well as the Columbus Clippers and Cleveland Guardians. After he was DFA'd by Miami and traded to Cleveland on May 9, the Guardians DFA'd him on June 30 and he was claimed off waivers on July by the Marlins, the same organization that had designated him for assignment less than two months earlier (he was optioned to Jacksonville and finished out the year appearing for both the Jumbo Shrimp and the Marlins). After signing with the Twins as a Minor League free agent in December, the Saints will mark the 10th different team that McCaughan has suited up for between the Majors and Minor Leagues.

A MEMORABLE FIRST GAME IN THE BIGS: Making his Major League debut as a 25-year-old, McCaughan realized a dream, making his Major League debut. The right-hander came on in extended relief for the Mariners on July 21, 2021 at Coors Field vs the Rockies. McCaughan managed to give up a run despite throwing five hitless innings; he worked around three walks without recording a strikeout, becoming only the third pitcher since the mound was moved to its current distance in 1893 to throw five hitless innings in his MLB debut, and the first in 54 years to do so (per the Elias Sports Bureau). The others to accomplish the feat were Bill Dillman on April 14, 1967 for the Orioles against the Kansas City A's, and Hank Borowy on April 18, 1942 for the Yankees vs the Red Sox. McCaughan retired Raimel Tapia for a lineout in the Bot 2 for his first Big League out, and faced the minimum through his first two innings of work with the help of a double-play. He took a no-decision as the M's lost 3-6.

THIS GUY'S A REAL DIRTBAG, AND WE MEAN THAT AS A COMPLIMENT! Before being drafted in the 12th round of the 2017 Draft by the Mariners, McCaughan had a remarkable career for Long Beach State, where he pitched three seasons from 2015-17, accruing a 23-5 record and a sparkling 2.31 ERA with 234 strikeouts in 280.2 innings. McCaughan appeared on the Golden Spikes Award mid-season watch list as a sophomore in 2016 and earned 2nd-team All-American honors in both 2016 & 2017 from multiple outlets, becoming the first Long Beach State pitcher since Jared Weaver (2003-04) to do so in consecutive seasons. Long Beach's program compete in the Big West and are nicknamed "The Dirtbags," a moniker that dates back to 1989, when the then-head coach Dave Snow inherited a program in the doldrums. He put an emphasis on finding "hard-nosed players with something to prove" and drove his players to take a tough and gritty approach that included making diving plays, sliding hard into second, and generally dirtying the uniform. The nickname has stuck to this day. McCaughan is one of more than 60 former "Dirtbags" that have appeared in a Major League game, a list that includes Jason Giambi, Evan Longoria, Troy Tulowitzki, Jeff McNeil, and Jered Weaver.
