YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels extended their winning streak to five games. **Zach Morgan** brought home **Turner Hill** with a sacrifice fly to give Richmond a 1-0 lead in the fourth. Altoona answered with an RBI single by Javier Rivas in the fifth to even the score. In the seventh, the Curve took a 2-1 lead with a solo homer by Shawn Ross. **Sabin Ceballos** hit a go-ahead, two-run single in the bottom of eighth to give the Flying Squirrels a 3-2 lead. **Cameron Pferrer** pitched two scoreless innings to finish the game. **Greg Farone** started for Richmond and allowed one run over 4.1 innings with five strikeouts.

WELCOME TO CARMAX PARK: This week marks the inaugural series at CarMax Park, the Flying Squirrels' new home stadium. A groundbreaking ceremony was held on September 6, 2024. The announcement of the name, "CarMax Park," was held on September 4, 2024, at The ballpark is situated next to The Diamond, which was home to the Flying Squirrels from 2010-2025 and hosted Minor League Baseball in Richmond dating back to 1985. Professional baseball was played in that spot dating back to 1954 with the opening of Parker Field. CarMax Park can house nearly 10,000 fans and will serve as a year-round events venue for the Richmond region.

GRAND OPENINGS: Richmond's professional baseball teams have now called five ballparks home dating back over a century to the 1920s. In the official inaugural games at the previous homes, the Richmond teams went 0-4. Mayo Island Park, which was later named Tate Field, opened with a 6-5 loss by the Richmond Colts, then members of the Virginia League, to the Petersburg Goobers on April 21, 1921. On April 25, 1942, the Piedmont League-edition of the Richmond Colts lost to the Durham Bulls, 14-4, in the first game at Mooers Field. Parker Field hosted its first official game on April 20, 1954, with a 5-4 Richmond Virginians loss to the Rochester Red Wings. The Diamond opened on April 17, 1985, and the Richmond Braves lost to the Syracuse Chiefs, 2-1. CarMax Park's opener on Tuesday broke the streak with a 3-2 Flying Squirrels win over the Altoona Curve.

HOME SWEET HOME: The Flying Squirrels are now 10-6 all-time in their home openers, including a 3-2 mark against the Curve. Tuesday was the team's first win in a home opener since 2023. All 16 home openers have sold out, with the largest crowds in franchise history coming in the first home games of the 2018 and 2019 seasons at The Diamond with 9,845 fans. Tuesday's inaugural game at CarMax Park drew 9,585 fans.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play the fourth of a six-game series against the Altoona Curve, Double-A affiliate of the Pittsburgh Pirates, in the first home series of the 2026 season. The Flying Squirrels are looking to extend their winning streak to six games. The 5-1 start matches the team's best record through six games in franchise history, even with 2021. A win tonight would match the 2021 season as the best start through seven games with a 6-1 record. That year's team opened the season with an 8-1 record through nine games. The Curve are looking for their first win of 2026.

MEET THE TEAM: This year's season-opening Flying Squirrels roster including 19 players who have previously played in Richmond. There are nine players who have made their Richmond debuts this season, including **Maui Ahuna**, **Charlie Szykowny**, **Mitch White**, **Darien Smith**, **Greg Farone**, **Logan Martin**, **Cesar Perdomo** and **Dylan Carmouche**. Each of the newcomers also made their Double-A debuts this season. Of the 28 players, 11 were acquired by the Giants in the MLB Draft, five were signed by the Giants as international free agents, five were signed by the Giants from independent teams, four were acquired via trade and three were signed as non-drafted free agents.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS went 56-79-1 in 2025, which was sixth in the Eastern League Southwest Division. They went 21-46-1 in the first half before posting a 35-33 record in the second half, finishing 3.5 games out of first place in the division. This year, they opened the season taking two-of-three on the road against Erie last weekend.

THE CURVE had the third-best record in the Southwest Division last season, going 69-68. They went 30-38 in the first half, which was fifth in the division. In the second half, Altoona finished 39-30 in a tie for first place in the division and clinched the second-half's postseason spot, earning a playoff berth for the first time since 2018. The Curve opened this season being swept at home in three games by Harrisburg last weekend. This year's Altoona roster features three players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Pirates prospects list, including C Omar Alfonzo (No. 13), RHP Christian Curtis (No. 15) and 2B Duce Gourson (No. 21). MLB.com's top-30 Pirates prospects list features four Altoona players, including Alfonzo (No. 15), Curtis (No. 22), Gourson (No. 27) and 1B Callan Moss (No. 29).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander **Joe Whitman** makes his second start of the season. He made his season debut on Saturday at Erie and allowed four runs over 3.2 innings in a no-decision. He started 26 games for the Flying Squirrels last season. In his first Double-A campaign, Whitman ranked tied for second in the Eastern League in games started, fifth in strikeouts (124) and eighth in innings pitched (117.1). He was named EL Pitcher of the Week for a perfect outing against Somerset on May 3 at The Diamond, retiring all 18 batters he faced while recording 10 strikeouts. He also recorded 11 strikeouts at Binghamton with five scoreless frames pitched on May 21. Whitman closed his season with seven scoreless innings on September 12, tying the longest outing of his career. Whitman was selected in the second round of the 2023 MLB Draft by the Giants out of Kent State, where he was the MAC Pitcher of the Year that season. Before transferring to Kent State near his hometown of Akron, Ohio, Whitman pitched at Purdue. Entering 2025, Whitman was ranked by Baseball America as the No. 8 Giants prospect and No. 7 by MLB.com. **For more on Whitman, see page two.**

FOR ALTOONA: Right-hander Peyton Stumbo makes his first start of 2026 and his second appearance of the year. He last pitched last Friday against the Senators and threw 3.1 scoreless innings, allowing two hits with three strikeouts. He split the 2025 season between Low-A Bradenton and High-A Greensboro, going 1-6 with a 4.30 ERA in 25 outings, including 21 starts. Stumbo was selected by the Pirates in the 20th round of the 2023 MLB Draft out of Nevada.

DON'T RUN ON RICHMOND: The Flying Squirrels' catching unit of **Adrián Sugastey**, **Zach Morgan**, **Onil Perez** and **Drew Cavanaugh** combined to catch 74 stolen base attempts last season, which ranked first among the 30 Double-A teams and led the Eastern League by 20 over Hartford (54). Sugastey led all Double-A catchers with 50 runners caught stealing. He set a franchise record for the most caught stealing in a season in Flying Squirrels history, passing Jackson Williams' mark of 35 set in 2015 with his 36th on July 26 against Portland. For his career with Richmond, Sugastey's 66 runners caught stealing is the most in franchise history, passing Williams' (2010-11, '15) previous mark of 59.

TAKE A WALK: **Diego Velasquez** worked 70 walks last year, which was the second-most in a season in Flying Squirrels franchise history, passing Hayden Cantrelle's 2023 mark (66). Jacob Heyward set a the record with 80 walks in 2019. Velasquez was second in the Eastern League in walks last season, trailing only Reading's Aidan Miller (73). This year, he has five walks in his first four games played. His 91 career walks with Richmond are 10th in franchise history.

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 265 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23, 2025. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship.

PACKING THE HOUSE: In 2025, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in total (446,679) and average (6,768) attendance for the fourth consecutive season. The average attendance was the highest in the franchise's history. Tuesday's inaugural game at CarMax Park had been sold out for more than a month, marking the 16th consecutive home-opener to sell out for the Flying Squirrels.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, **Dayson Croes** is first in hits (11), tied for fifth in total bases (15) and seventh in batting average (.407). **Turner Hill** is tied for first in triples (2), tied for fifth in runs (6) and tied for second in RBIs (7). **Diego Velasquez** is third in OBP (.563). **Jonah Cox** is sixth in hits (6) and tied for second in steals (6). **Drew Cavanaugh** is tied for first in doubles (4), tied for third in extra-base hits (5) and tied for fifth in runs (6). **Maui Ahuna** is tied for fifth in runs (6). **Jack Choate** is tied for first in wins (2). **Greg Farone** is first in strikeouts (13) and fifth in innings pitched (9.0). **Tyler Vogel** is tied for first in saves (2).

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features three players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Bo Davidson** (No. 3), **Diego Velasquez** (No. 24) and **Joe Whitman** (No. 25). **Adrián Sugastey** is rated by Baseball America as the top defensive catcher in the Giants organization and **Jonah Cox** is rated as the top defensive outfielder. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features three Richmond players, including Davidson (No. 7), **Maui Ahuna** (No. 20) and Whitman (No. 26).

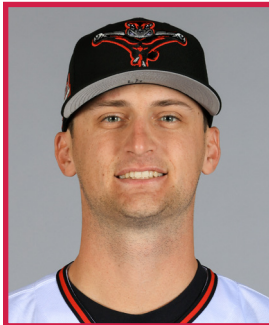
THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1994: In his first start of the season, left-hander Brad Woodall allowed eight hits scattered over six innings, combining with reliever Judd Johnson for an 11-hit shutout in a 6-0 R-Braves win over the Toledo Mud Hens at The Diamond. Lance Parrish had three hits for Toledo. **2008:** Scott Throman broke his 0-for-20 start to the season with a two-run, go-ahead single in the seventh inning for a 2-1 R-Braves win over the Buffalo Bisons at The Diamond. Charlie Morton started for Richmond and threw 5.2 innings, allowing one run on two hits. Richmond manager Dave Brundage was ejected before the seventh inning for arguing the strike zone with plate umpire Mike Estabrook. **2015:** The Flying Squirrels beat the Bowie Baysox, 1-0, at The Diamond. Jack Snodgrass allowed one hit over five scoreless innings. Stephen Johnson, Phil McCormick and Josh Osich finished the shutout. Blake Miller drove in the game's only run with a groundout in the second.
