TODAY'S GAME: The Rancho Cucamonga Quakes (Single-A, Los Angeles Angels) can tie their longest win streak of the season at four games as they approach the midway point of their series against the Ontario Tower Buzzers (Single-A, Los Angeles Dodgers). Last night, the offense totaled seven runs across the sixth and seventh innings to see off a late Tower Buzzers comeback in a 10-7 win. This evening, LHP Derek Clark starts for Rancho Cucamonga opposite RHP Adriano Marrero for Ontario in his Single-A debut.

ABOUT THE TOWER BUZZERS: The Ontario Tower Buzzers, founded in 2026, are in the midst of their inaugural season. As part of a three-team affiliation exchange last offseason, they took over as the new Dodgers Single-A affiliate while the Quakes re-affiliated with the Angels and the Inland Empire 66ers (Single-A, Seattle Mariners) rejoined the Mariners organization. Former Rancho Cucamonga skipper and Dodgers "Captain of Player Development" John Shoemaker is Ontario's first-ever manager, spending his 51st season in the Dodgers organization and 47th as a coach. The team's name draws inspiration from the city's aviation heritage and proximity to Ontario International Airport, celebrating the "buzz" of the airport and region. The name and mascot, Maverick, also reference the line from the 1986 movie *Top Gun* where Tom Cruise's character of the same name states to "buzz the tower." Last week, the Tower Buzzers secured their first-ever playoff berth, clinching the Second Half South Division championship.

WEATHERING THE STORM: Last week, the Rancho Cucamonga Quakes handled their business with ease against the Lake Elsinore Storm (Single-A, San Diego Padres), taking five of six games to close out their home schedule. Over the course of the series, starting pitching shouldered the bulk of the load. Trey Gregory-Alford twirled a shutout six-inning quality start on Wednesday, allowing just one hit and two walks while striking out four batters, earning California League Pitcher of the Week honors. Ubaldo Soto added a quality start of his own two days later, permitting just one run on three hits, also fanning four to win his third consecutive start. Derek Clark and Angel Rivero both tossed five innings of two-run ball on Thursday and Saturday, keeping Rancho Cucamonga in either game. Offensively, the Quakes averaged 7.7 runs per game, highlighted by a pair of double-digit run performances. They played eight runs over the first two innings on Wednesday, including a seven-run second, on the way to a 14-1 victory, and in the finale, seven runs across the second and third innings helped erase an early seven-run deficit, completing the team's largest comeback of the season to grab a 16-13 win.

HOW DEREK'S BEEN DEALING: Over the last three months, Derek Clark has stepped up to become the workhorse in the Rancho Cucamonga rotation. Not only has the left-hander tossed at least five innings in each of his last 12 starts, but he has also spun six quality starts, including three straight from July 31st to August 13th. Additionally, he twirled seven innings twice, becoming the only Quake this season to go that deep into a start, allowing just three earned runs over that 20-frame span. In his August 13th outing against the Ontario Tower Buzzers, he reached even new heights, fanning 12 hitters to beat Major League rehabber Grayson Rodriguez's (11) previous record. Over the course of the 2026 season, Clark has posted statistics which rank amongst the California League's best. Not only does he lead the league in innings pitched (117.0), he is tied for the top spot in wins (8) while also placing second in WHIP (1.27) as well as third in strikeouts (126), and in ERA (4.77).

PLAYOFF TIME IN CALIFORNIA: In the final week of the 2026 season, the California League playoff picture is all but finalized, but still one spot remains for two teams to claim. On August 30th, the Ontario Tower Buzzers clinched the Second Half South Division title, setting the bracket for the South Division Championship Series starting on Tuesday, September 8th. They will face the First Half champion Lake Elsinore Storm in a best-of-three series for the right to advance to the California League Championship Series. In the North Division, the San Jose Giants (Single-A, San Francisco Giants) have secured first place in the Second Half standings, but by having already won First Half championship, the corresponding playoff place will go to either the Fresno Grizzlies (Single-A, Colorado Rockies) or Stockton Ports (Single-A, Athletics).

THE NEW RANCHO RED WAVE: At the start of August, the Quakes experienced significant roster turnover. Early-season stalwarts such as Hayden Alvarez, Keyvn Castillo, Dylan Jordan, Fulton Lockhart, Kendrey Maduro, Jaren Warwick, and Ryland Zaborowski were all promoted to High-A and joined the Tri-City Dust Devils. Meanwhile, two members of the Los Angeles Angels 2026 draft class, Gavin Grahovac and Jaxon Willits, are amongst the next group of prospects in Rancho Cucamonga alongside Mikey Cascino, Andres Cova, T.J. Ford, C.J. Gray, Jeffery Heard, Joswa Lugo, and Marco Vega, who returns following a brief stint with the Quakes in May. Later on, Angel Rivero and Jhon Almonte entered the fray, joining the team during their last two series against the Visalia Rawhide (Single-A, Arizona Diamondbacks) and Lake Elsinore Storm respectively.

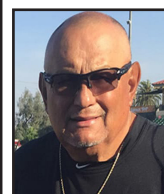
