**TODAY'S GAME:** The Curve continue their 25th anniversary season, opening a 6-game set at Richmond.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Altoona's series finale with Reading was rained out, allowing the Curve to secure a series win over the Fightins.

**MAGGI TIME:** INF **Drew Maggi** became the 198th alumni in franchise history to reach MLB when he pinch-hit for the Pirates on Wednesday, April 26 against the LA Dodgers. RHP **Cody Bolton**, the 199th in franchise history, also made his major league debut on Saturday, April 29 against the Nationals with two scoreless innings of relief.

**WE'LL TAKE TWO:** Altoona leads all Double-A teams with 23 double plays turned. The Curve are also 1st in HR (21) and 4th in team OPS (.714).

**HAMMERING HANK:** C **Henry Davis** recorded his first career multi-homer game on Sunday, April 23 against Bowie. His first inning solo shot traveled an estimated 460 feet and he added a second solo trip around the basepaths to lead off the sixth inning. Since April 12 (12G) Davis is batting: .310/.463/.762/1.225 with 1 2B, 6 HR, 113 RBI, 10 BB and 4-4 SB. His name is all over the Eastern League leaderboards entering play on Tuesday, May 2: T-1st in HR (6), 3rd in RBI (15), 4th in OBP (.452), 1st in SLG% (.655), 1st in OPS (1.107), T-8th in BB (15).

**NOTHING SULLEN:** Altoona righty **Sean Sullivan** has started his Double-A career with 11.2 scoreless innings across three starts, the longest stretch since **Roansy Contreras** began the 2021 season with 18.2 scoreless frames.

**GRAND MARSHAL GORSKI:** OF **Matt Gorski** smashed the 48th Grand Slam in Altoona's franchise history on Tuesday, April 18 in a 6-1 in over Bowie. It was the first Grand Slam for the Curve since **Connor Kaiser** mashed one on July 13, 2021 against Binghamton.

**DINGER TIME:** Altoona matched their franchise record with 6 home runs hit on Wednesday, April 12 at Erie. **Lolo Sanchez**, **Mason Martin** 2x, **Henry Davis**, **Matt Fraizer** and **Andres Alvarez** each homered in a 17-6 win over the SeaWolves. Altoona set the record on July 11, 2014 at Harrisburg. Altoona swatted 9 home runs across the first two games of their series at Erie after hitting just 1 home run in their 3-game series with New Hampshire to open the season. Martin's 2-homer game was the 120th in franchise history and 4th time he's done it with Altoona, 10th time in his career.

**PROSPECT PARTY:** The Curve roster features several top Pirates prospects according to MLB Pipeline led by No. 3/No. 57 overall C **Henry Davis**, No. 6 INF **Liover Peguero**, No. 11 RHP **Jared Jones**, No. 17 OF **Matt Gorski**, No. 20 RHP **Kyle Nicolas**, and No. 23 OF **Matt Fraizer**.

**THE SQUIRRELS THAT FIGHT:** Dennis Pelfrey returns for a second season as Richmond skipper after leading the Flying Squirrels to a First Half Title and a playoff appearance in 2022. The Squirrels roster features several top Giants prospects according to MLB Pipeline including: No. 7 OF **Luis Matos**, No. 10 RHP **Mason Black**, No. 13 RHP **Landen Roupp**, No. 17 RHP **Carson Seymour**, No. 26 RHP **Randy Rodriguez**, and No. 27 RHP **Ryan Murphy**. Also returning to the Squirrels roster is 2022 Eastern League Strikeout Champion - RHP **Kai-Wei Teng**.

**THE FIRST FIGHTIN ON THE MOUND:** Carson Seymour takes the ball in the series opener for Richmond after his scheduled start on Sunday was rained out at Bowie. Seymour is ranked by the No. 17 prospect in the Giants system by MLB Pipeline and was acquired by the Giants along with INF **J.D. Davis**, LHP **Nick Zwack** and LHP **Thomas Szapucki** in exchange for 1B **Darin Ruf** in August of 2022. Seymour played one season of collegiate baseball at Dartmouth and two seasons at Kansas State before the Mets picked him in the 6th round in 2021. He features a mid-90's fastball with a good change-up and curveball.

## TODAY IN CURVE HISTORY

2014 - **Alen Hanson** and **Gift Ngoepe** open the game at Erie with back-to-back home runs, the first time the Curve have hit consecutive homers to begin a game. The Curve won the contest, 9-4, during the first ballgame of a doubleheader. (morning game with 11:06 first pitch)

2015 - **Tyler Glasnow** and **Josh Bell** lead the Curve to a 2-0 win over Erie. Glasnow was nearly unhittable and allowed just a single hit over six scoreless inning and struck out seven. Glasnow sat down the first 14 hitters he faced and a two-out single in the fifth was his lone baserunner. Bell went 3-4 and knocked in both Curve runs.

## CAREER NOTES

**2023:** Was a non-roster invitee to Pirates Spring Training... Named Altoona's Opening Day starter, the first Opening Day nod of his professional career... Finished 6.0 innings for the second time in his Pirates MiLB career (8/10/22 @ Binghamton) on 4/18 vs. Bowie allowing just 3 hits, 2 walks and 3 strikeouts... Allowed 2 HR for 5th time in career on 4/25 @ Reading, allowed 7 unearned runs...

**2022:** Was a non-roster invitee to Pirates Spring Training... Allowed 2R or fewer in 19-of-24 outings during the season... Finished the season 12th among Pirates MiLB with 101 K's, also ranked T-4th in BB (47)... Was one of 3 Curve pitchers w/ 100+ K's (Mlodzinski, Ortiz), marking just the fourth time in franchise history that Altoona had 3 pitchers with 100+ K's in the same season... Threw 8.2 scoreless innings to start the season, holding opponents to a .077 batting average against before allowing 6 runs on 6 hits, including 2 HR (4 total) in the second inning of his third start of the season on 4/23 vs. New Hampshire... Threw 5.0 scoreless innings on 4/29 at Akron pitching in front of dozens of family and friends. Canal Park is just 35 minutes from his native Massillon, OH... Threw 14.2 scoreless innings in road games to start the year... His 31 strikeouts in May were tied for 6th-most by an Eastern League Pitcher (Burrows also had 31 K's in May)... Placed on IL on 6/4 (shoulder) and activated on 6/25, was the first time in his life that he's missed a start due to injury... Placed on Temporary Inactive List on 7/1 to be the Best Man in his older brother's wedding, activated on 7/6... Allowed just 2 baserunners in a season-best 6.0 inning outing on 8/10 at Binghamton... Wrapped up his campaign with one of his best outings of the season tossing 5.2 scoreless innings with six strikeouts against Reading, combined with Nick Dombkowski and Austin Roberts on the team's fifth shutout win of the season...

**2021:** Made his professional debut splitting the season between High-A Beloit and Double-A Pensacola in the Marlins system... Combined to go 6-4 with a 4.18 ERA in 21 appearances, 20 starts... Led all Marlins minor leaguers with 136 strikeouts, ranked second in walks with 49, and sixth in the organization with 99.0 innings pitched... Began the season with High-A Beloit and went 2-0 with a 2.79 ERA in four starts in the month of May, struck out 28 batters in 19.1 innings pitched... Struck out a career-high 11 batters in his fourth professional start on May 28 against Peoria, also allowed five hits and walked two in 4.1 innings... Made his Double-A debut with Pensacola on July 27 and fired 5.0 no-hit innings against Mississippi with eight strikeouts... Turned in a dominant month of August with Pensacola allowing just six runs in 25.2 innings pitched, good for a 2.10 ERA... Turned in three straight scoreless starts totaling 16.2 innings between August 10-24... Went a career-high 6.2 innings on August 24 at Mississippi on just 79 pitches... Traded by the Miami Marlins to the Pittsburgh Pirates on November 29, 2021 along with RHP Zach Thompson and OF Connor Scott in exchange for C Jacob Stallings...

**CURVE CUTS:** Kyle Todd Nicolas... Attended Jackson High School in Ohio where he led the Polar Bears to a 30-2 record and state Championship as a senior... Was named Prep Baseball Report's Ohio Player of the Year in 2017... First team all-state and Federal League Co-Player of the Year as a senior... Went 8-0 with a 0.50 ERA and 78 strikeouts in 56 innings pitched in 2017. Threw 7.0 innings, struck out seven batters and held Lakota West to one run in the 5-1 state semifinal victory... Also played basketball for three years... Was high school teammates with Tigers prospect Dillon Dingler, they both played baseball and basketball for Jackson High School and won state championships in Baseball and Basketball as seniors... Kyle's father, Todd, coached the basketball team... His father played baseball at Youngstown State... Earned his degree from Ball State in Business Administration in three years... Signed with the Marlins for a bonus of \$1,129,700... Road roommates with OF Connor Scott in 2021 in Beloit, rooms with him now in Altoona and on road trips with the Curve...
