TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels host the final Opening Night at The Diamond and begin their 15th season against the Akron RubberDucks, Double-A affiliate of the Cleveland Guardians. It is the second consecutive year the Flying Squirrels open their home slate against the RubberDucks.

STARTING OFF: The Flying Squirrels are 6-8 all time on Opening Day since the franchise's first season in 2010. They are 5-2 when they open the season at home (compared to 1-6 on the road). In their all-time home openers, the Flying Squirrels are 9-5 in their home openers. They faced Akron in their home opener last year and lost, 2-1. This year marks the first time the Flying Squirrels and RubberDucks have met to open a season. Richmond is 3-6 all-time on Opening Day against American League affiliates and 2-1 against Eastern League Western/Southwest Division opponents.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS went 64-74 last season, missing the postseason for the first time since 2021. For the year, Richmond hitters ranked fifth in the Eastern League in batting average (.238), fourth in hits (592), third in doubles (230), fourth in triples (26), 11th in homers (88) and 11th in stolen bases (123). Flying Squirrels pitchers ranked eighth in the league in ERA (4.22) and fourth in strikeouts (1,281). The 2024 Flying Squirrels used 64 different players, setting a new franchise record.

THE RUBBERDUCKS posted the best record in the Eastern League last year, going 80-58. They were eliminated by eventual-champion Erie in the Southwest Division Series. This year's Akron team includes four players ranked in MLB.com's top-30 Guardians prospects, including Travis Bazzana (No. 1), Cooper Ingle (No. 7), C.J. Kayfus (No. 8) and Austin Peterson (No. 30).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander **John Michael Bertrand** makes his second consecutive Opening Day start for the Flying Squirrels and the second of his professional career. Last year, he was named the Flying Squirrels' Pitcher of the Year after going 7-9 with a 4.32 ERA in 28 outings (27 starts). Bertrand also won the team's Community Service Award. He made two starts with Triple-A Sacramento to close the year. For the year, Bertrand led all Eastern League pitchers with 10 scoreless starts, all at least five innings. He also led all MiLB pitchers defensively in assists (31) and ranked second in total chances (38). He finished the season ranked first among all MiLB pitchers in double plays induced (23), five ahead of the next closest pitcher. Bertrand was named Eastern League Pitcher of the Week twice last year, first for throwing seven perfect innings against the Baysox on April 27 and then for working six hitless innings in Bowie on May 23. Entering 2025, he is rated by Baseball America as having the best control in the Giants system for the second straight year. Bertrand began his collegiate career at Furman University in South Carolina before playing his final two seasons at the University of Notre Dame. He was selected by the Giants in the 10th round of the 2022 MLB Draft. **For more on Bertrand, see page two.**

FOR AKRON: Right-hander Tommy Mace begins his third season with the RubberDucks. He spent all of 2024 with Akron, going 8-7 with a 3.71 ERA. He finished the year ranked fifth in the Eastern League in ERA, tied for first in games started (27), fourth in innings pitched (145.2), seventh in BAA (.236) and fourth in WHIP (1.22). For his Double-A career with Akron, Mace is 12-12 with a 4.23 ERA in 42 games (36 starts) dating back to when he joined the team in June 2023. Mace was selected by the Cleveland Guardians in the second round (69th overall) of the 2021 MLB Draft out of the University of Florida.

HOWELL AT THE MOON: **Carter Howell** was named the 2024 Flying Squirrels Player of the Year in his first Double-A season. He spent all of last year in Richmond. For the season, he led the Eastern League in doubles (30) and triples (7). He also led the Flying Squirrels in batting average (.272), on-base percentage (.347), slugging percentage (.391), OPS (.738), hits (121), walks (47), extra-base hits (40), total bases (174), runs (64) and stolen bases (15).

FAMILIAR FACES: This year's season-opening Flying Squirrels roster includes 22 players who have previously played for the Flying Squirrels. There are six players who will make their team debuts, including **Aeverson Arteaga**, **Sabin Ceballos**, **Manuel Mercedes**, **Rodolfo Nolasco**, **Braxton Roxby** and **Joe Whitman**. Roxby, acquired from the Reds in a trade earlier this year, is the only newcomer with previous Double-A experience.

PACKING THE HOUSE: Last year, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in average (6,595) and total (435,295) attendance. Among the 120 MiLB teams, the Flying Squirrels were 10th in average attendance. It was the third straight year the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A clubs in average and total attendance, which had not been done prior to 2022. Last year's total attendance is the highest since 2013 (434,769) and the fourth-highest average in team history. Tonight marks the 15th consecutive Opening Night sellout, marking every home opener in franchise history to date. The Flying Squirrels are 45-29 all time in sellouts at The Diamond.

BOULEVARD TO THE BAY: Last season, 14 former Flying Squirrels players have reached the majors for the first time. That was the most in a season in franchise history. In 2014, 11 alumni made their MLB debuts, including **Joe Panik**, **Adam Duvall**, **Andrew Susac**, **Matt Duffy**, **Jackson Williams**, **Edwin Escobar**, **Hunter Strickland**, **Chris Dominguez**, **Gary Brown**, **Brett Bochy** and **Chris Heston**. The Flying Squirrels alumni to debut in the majors last season were **Erik Miller** (2023 Flying Squirrels), **Landen Roupp** (2022-23), **Kai-Wei Teng** (2022-23), **Nick Avila** (2022), **Randy Rodriguez** (2022-23), **Mason Black** (2023), **Gerson Garabito** (2021), **Spencer Bivens** (2023), **Raymond Burgos** (2023), **Hayden Birdsong** (2023-24), **Parker Dunshee** (2023), **Grant McCray** (2024), **Sandro Fabian** (2021) and **Trevor McDonald** (2024). **Christian Koss** (2024) made his debut for the Giants earlier this week as the first new former Flying Squirrel in the majors this year. Dating back to 2022, 23-of-the-last-26 Flying Squirrels alumni who have reached the majors have debuted with the San Francisco Giants, with Garabito (Rangers), Fabian (Rangers) and Dunshee (Braves) being the only exceptions. The 2023 season saw 10 former Flying Squirrels players debut in the big leagues, including a team-record five from that season's Richmond roster.

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster includes six players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Joe Whitman** (No. 10), **Diego Velasquez** (No. 13), **Sabin Ceballos** (No. 16), **Trent Harris** (No. 26), **Aeverson Arteaga** (No. 27) and **Jack Choate** (No. 28). There are also six players ranked in MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list, including Whitman (No. 7), Harris (No. 11), Velasquez (No. 15), Arteaga (No. 16), Ceballos (No. 23) and Choate (No. 27).

SMOLTZ RETURNS TO RVA: Hall of Fame pitcher **John Smoltz** returns to The Diamond tonight to help celebrate Opening Night and will throw out the ceremonial first pitch. Smoltz pitched at The Diamond with the Richmond Braves in 1987 and 1988. He joined the team as a 20-year-old prospect in 1987 after he was traded from the Tigers to the Braves for Doyle Alexander, taking the place of fellow future Hall of Fame pitcher Tom Glavine, who was called up to Atlanta for his MLB debut to replace Alexander. He made his Triple-A debut with Richmond at Tidewater immediately following the trade. Smoltz made his first start at The Diamond on August 22, 1987 and allowed one run over seven innings. He returned to the R-Braves to start the 1988 season. He made his first start of the season on April 11 in Old Orchard Beach, Maine and fired six no-hit innings, striking out nine, before being removed because of the cold weather and a pitch limit. After a brief slide in May and June, but posted strong starts beginning in late-June. On June 27 against Buffalo at The Diamond, he took a no-hit bid into the seventh inning in his first complete-game win. In his next start on July 2 against Syracuse, he threw another complete game, allowing one run, and set a Triple-A high with 11 strikeouts. On July 19, Smoltz faced Pawtucket at The Diamond. Prior to the game, Richmond manager Jim Beauchamp told him he was being promoted to join the Braves in the majors after his start. In his final game with Richmond, Smoltz threw five perfect innings on 46 pitches. That weekend, he made his MLB debut at Shea Stadium against the Mets, picking up the first of his 213 career wins and the first two of his 3,084 career strikeouts.

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

The Flying Squirrels shut out the Hartford Yard Goats, 1-0, on Opening Day at The Diamond in front of a crowd of 9,845, tied for the largest in franchise history. Logan Webb started on the mound and threw five scoreless innings. Fernando Abad, Melvin Adón and Sam Wolff each pitched an inning to finish the shutout. The game's only run scored on a double-play ground-out by Jalen Miller in the fifth.

"This is a good group of guys. From the last week or so in spring training when I finally got this group of guys together, it did have a little different feel to it, a little different vibe.
