"FUN IS GOOD" FACTOIDS

SAINTS FRUSTRATED BY I-CUBS IN GAME TWO LOSS: The St. Paul Saints matched a club record by leaving 15 baserunners stranded as they fell 10-5 on Wednesday afternoon at Principal Park. After throwing up zeros in the first two frames, Saints starter Cory Lewis was burned for his leadoff walk to nine-spot hitter Dixon Machado in the third. With two outs, Jonathon Long roped a run-scoring triple that made it 1-0. Iowa would hang a four-spot in the fourth, cashing in on back-to-back walks by Lewis to open up the inning, with Machado and Cubs top prospect Matt Shaw delivering with RBI singles to chase Lewis. Alex Speas came on and allowed two inherited runners to score that were charged to Lewis' final line. The Twins No. 11 prospect finished 3.1 innings, allowing five runs on four hits while walking five and striking out three. With Iowa leading 5-0, the Saints got on the board courtesy of a one-out RBI double from Mickey Gasper, extending his hitting streak to eight straight games with St. Paul. Gasper finished 1-for-5, BB, lowering his batting average to .400. Ten of his 18 hits with the Saints have now gone for extra bases. Carson McCusker drove in a second run with a sacrifice lineup making it 5-2, but that's as close as the Saints would get. Iowa put up another four runs in the fifth. The Saints made it interesting with three hits in the ninth and brought the potential tying run to the on-deck circle, but came up short. Ryan Fitzgerald collected his first career four-hit game with a 4-for-5 showing, including two doubles. The Saints out-hit the I-Cubs 12-9 and matched a season-high with 10 walks drawn.

THE SAINTS ARE HOT: Despite Wednesday's loss, the Saints have still won 11 of their last 14 games, the 3rd-best winning percentage (.786) among all 120 full-season minor league clubs since Sunday, April 27, trailing only Lehigh Valley (12-3) & Rocket City (12-3). Over the past 14 games, the Saints have been outscored 74-76 (-2). St. Paul's team batting average of .292 (4th), 21 team home runs (5th), and team OPS of .868 (5th) are all top-5 among all 120 full-season minor league teams in that span.

CHICKS DIG THE LONGBALL: After hitting just 7 homers in their first 12 games of the season, which ranked tied for the second-fewest in the International League at the time, the Saints have touched off for 37 round-trippers in their last 25 games, which rank third in the minors in that stretch, trailing only to Charlotte (40) and Sugar Land (39). St. Paul had left the yard at least once in eight straight games, a season-long streak for the club, until going homerless the past two days.

HEY MICKEY, YOU'RE SO FINE: Saints utility man Mickey Gasper was named the International League Player of the Week for the previous week. After being optioned by the Twins for the second time this year on May 5, Gasper hit .478 (11-23) with two doubles, four homers, and six RBI in six games last week vs Buffalo. His 11 total hits and 4 homers were both tied for the most in minor league baseball last week and his .571 OBP, 1.087 SLG%, and 1.658 OPS were all the highest among hitters with at least 20 AB in MiLB last week. The New Hampshire native now has six homers in 12 games in a Saints uniform this year, already halfway to his career-high total set last season in the Boston organization between Double-A and Triple-A. Gasper has quite simply been one of the best hitters in the minors the last two years. Since the start of 2024 with the Boston org, he ranks as the 2nd best hitter in MiLB by both OPS and wRC+ (weight runs created plus, where 100 is league average, a ballpark and league adjusted measure):

McCUSKER MCCRUSHING: Saints outfielder Carson McCusker is crushing the ball to open the season and is currently tied with six others for 2nd in the minors in home runs (Sugar Land's Shay Whitcomb leads w/ 13 after hitting five in the last 3 games) and ranks 3rd in Triple-A in average exit velocity to start the year (see below). On Sunday afternoon, he drilled a 115.0 mph laser over the left field wall, recording the fifth-hardest batted ball in Saints franchise history. McCusker now has the three hardest hit balls by a St. Paul hitter this season and six of the top-10, including three batted balls that rank among the top-10 in exit velocity in Saints history. The 6-8 slugger is the first batter in St. Paul Saints franchise history with double-digit homers before the end of May. The Sparks, Nevada also saw a career-long 12-game hitting streak come to an end on Saturday, the longest by a St. Paul batter so far this year, and a span in which he hit .423 (11-26) with 2 HR, 2 doubles, and 6 RBI.

RUNNING INTO OUTS: The Saints are just 29-of-44 (65.9%) in stealing bases as a team this year, making them the 4th-least efficient team in Triple-A in stealing and bottom-15 in the minor leagues (they currently rank 109th out of 120 full-season teams). The Minnesota Twins are also bottom-5 in the majors in stolen-base% (73.5%) in the majors and Double-A Wichita are bottom-25 in the minors as well (72.4%).

"I'M JUST LOOSENING MY ARM": Saints utility-man Jefferson Morales now has five outfield assists on the year, which places him 1-4th in baseball (majors & minors), trailing only the Guardians' Steven Kwan (6), Baltimore's Tyler O'Neill (6), & Hub City's Anthony Gutierrez (6). He's already just the 6th-ever Saint with at least five OF assists in a season, joining Jimmy Kerrigan (2x, 9-2021, 6-2021), Mark Contreras (2x, 8-2022, 5-2021), DaShawn Keirse, Jr. (7, 2024), Jake Cave (6, 2022), Matt Walrner (5, 2023).

THE STARS OF TOMORROW, TODAY: The Saints' current roster features eight of Minnesota's Top-30 prospects according to MLB.com and nine according to Baseball America. The Saints tout four of Minnesota's top-10 prospects on the MLB Pipeline list: OF Emmanuel Rodriguez (No. 2, MLB.com, No. 2 BA), RHP Zebby Matthews (-/4), RHP Marco Raya (6/8), RHP Andrew Morris (9/10), RHP Cory Lewis (11/20), INF Payton Eeles (23/17-currently on 7-day IL), RHP Travis Adams (22/22), C Diego Cartaya (24/21), & C Jair Camargo (-/23). Rodriguez checks in at the No. 19 on the MLB Pipeline's top-100 prospects and No. 37 on Baseball America's top-100 list.

TWINS REPORT: The Minnesota Twins (23-20) have won ten straight, MLB's longest win streak of the season, after a doubleheader sweep in Baltimore yesterday. RHP Chris Paddack (1-3, 4.76) gets the ball this afternoon and is coming off a three-start stretch where he's allowed 5 ER in 17.1 IP (2.60 ERA). Down on the farm, Double-A Wichita (20-15) have won four of their last five games. High-A Cedar Rapids (20-14) have dropped back-to-back to Peoria (STL) at home. Low-A Fort Myers (16-19) snapped a 6-game skid with a win at Jupiter (MIA) last night.

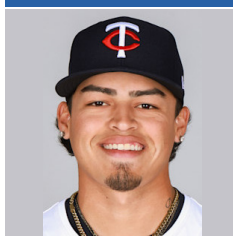

LAST APPEARANCE: Started Friday at CHS Field against Buffalo and saw seven straight Bisons batters reach to start the night, including the first 6-in-a-row on hits, including a three-run homer by Blue Jays #3 prospect Orelvis Martinez. Following a walk to Rainer Nunez, induced a double-play off the bat of Christian Bethancourt, before giving up a double and retiring the 10th batter he faced in the inning to complete one frame. Threw 12 cutters (34%), 7 curveballs (20%), 6 changeups (17%), 5 sweepers (14%), 4 four-seamers (11%), 1 sinker. Generated four whiffs.

YOUNG GUNS: After making St. Paul's Opening Day roster following one appearance with the Saints to end last season, Raya is one of just six pitchers aged 22-years or younger to begin the 2025 season on a Triple-A roster. At 22 years, 7 months, and 21 days as of Opening Day, Raya is more than five years younger than the average pitcher at the Triple-A level this season. A LONG WAIT: A fourth-round pick in 2020, Raya had to wait a while to make his professional debut. After entering the year as a 1st Team Preseason All-American, his senior season at United South High School in Laredo, Texas was limited to just 18.0 innings in which he struck out 36 batters. His final high school outing was a complete-game, one-hit shutout. However due to the COVID-19 shutdown, followed by a right rotator cuff strain, Raya threw his first professional pitch on April 12, 2022, 670 days after hearing the Twins call his name in the Draft.

THAT'S MARK, WITH A K: Raya, who's full legal name is Marco Antonio Raya, goes by Mark, despite not having a "K" in his legal name. He said you'd have to ask his dad as to why --- he's listed as "Marco" everywhere on Major League Baseball's websites.

GOOD GENES: Athletes run in the Raya family. Mark's mother played college tennis, his father played baseball at Nixon, while his sister made it to regionals as a junior and senior at United South HS in hurdles. Raya's brother also holds the Texas A&M International career strikeout record (127) despite only pitching two years for the Dustdevils in Division 2.

LAST APPEARANCE: Pitched in relief behind Marco Raya and Ryan Jensen on Friday vs Buffalo. Entered the game in mop-up duty after each of the previous two St. Paul pitchers threw 30+ pitches in an inning apiece to start the night. Saw his 13.0-inning scoreless streak come to an end when he allowed a two-run homer to Will Wagner. Also gave up a leadoff shot to Will Robertson in the fourth, his first two home runs and first earned runs allowed this season. Threw 22 four-seamers (31%), 18 sweepers (25%), 17 sinkers (24%), and 15 changeups (21%). Generated 12 whiffs, one shy of his season-high, led by seven on the changeup. Recorded two strikeouts apiece on the changeup, four-seamer, and sweeper.

I'VE BEEN EVERYWHERE, MAN: Last season was a tumultuous year for the veteran right-hander, McCaughan. After spending the first seven years of his professional career with the Mariners, he was traded for cash after being designated for assignment in February 2024, and spent the season on the Triple-A/Major League shuttle. He was optioned to Triple-A on five separate occasions, and also recalled to the Majors five different times, splitting the season between the Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp and Miami Marlins, as well as the Columbus Clippers and Cleveland Guardians. After he was DFA'd by Miami and traded to Cleveland on May 9, the Guardians DFA'd him on June 30 and he was claimed off waivers on July by the Marlins, the same organization that had designated him for assignment less than two months earlier (he was optioned to Jacksonville and finished out the year appearing for both the Jumbo Shrimp and the Marlins). After signing with the Twins as a Minor League free agent in December, the Saints will mark the 10th different team that McCaughan has suited up for between the Majors and Minor Leagues.

A MEMORABLE FIRST GAME IN THE BIGS: Making his Major League debut as a 25-year-old, McCaughan realized a dream, making his Major League debut. The right-hander came on in extended relief for the Mariners on July 21, 2021 at Coors Field vs the Rockies. McCaughan managed to give up a run despite throwing five hitless innings; he worked around three walks without recording a strikeout, becoming only the third pitcher since the mound was moved to its current distance in 1893 to throw five hitless innings in his MLB debut, and the first in 54 years to do so (per the Elias Sports Bureau). The others to accomplish the feat were Bill Dillman on April 14, 1967 for the Orioles against the Kansas City A's, and Hank Borowy on April 18, 1942 for the Yankees vs the Red Sox. McCaughan retired Raimel Tapia for a lineout in the Bot 2 for his first Big League out, and faced the minimum through his first two innings of work with the help of a double-play. He took a no-decision as the M's lost 3-6.

THIS GUY'S A REAL DIRTBAG, AND WE MEAN THAT AS A COMPLIMENT! Before being drafted in the 12th round of the 2017 Draft by the Mariners, McCaughan had a remarkable career for Long Beach State, where he pitched three seasons from 2015-17, accruing a 23-5 record and a sparkling 2.31 ERA with 234 strikeouts in 280.2 innings. McCaughan appeared on the Golden Spikes Award mid-season watch list as a sophomore in 2016 and earned 2nd-team All-American honors in both 2016 & 2017 from multiple outlets, becoming the first Long Beach State pitcher since Jared Weaver (2003-04) to do so in consecutive seasons. Long Beach's program compete in the Big West and are nicknamed "The Dirtbags," a moniker that dates back to 1989, when the then-head coach Dave Snow inherited a program in the doldrums. He put an emphasis on finding "hard-nosed players with something to prove" and drove his players to take a tough and gritty approach that included making diving plays, sliding hard into second, and generally dirtying the uniform. The nickname has stuck to this day. McCaughan is one of more than 60 former "Dirtbags" that have appeared in a Major League game, a list that includes Jason Giambi, Evan Longoria, Troy Tulowitzki, Jeff McNeil, and Jered Weaver.

LAST APPEARANCE: Made a spot-start in David Festa's turn in the rotation on Sunday vs Buffalo and threw a season-high 67 pitches. Although he issued a season-high three walks, navigated around the traffic efficiently into allowing back-to-back runners to reach to lead off the fourth, first on a double by Will Robertson followed by a walk to Orelvis Martinez. Both runners scored on Damiano Palmegiani's two-run single, tying the game at two apiece. Threw 23 sliders (34%), 19 four-seamers (28%), 12 cutters (18%), 7 sinkers (10%) and 6 changeups (9%). Generated six swings-and-misses, including striking out Josh Rivera on a cutter in the third for his lone "K" of the afternoon.

PITCHING LAB PAYING DIVIDENDS: Adams credits his success to a relationship built on trust with the Twins player development staff, who helped him add a cutter as well as convert his sweeper into a true slider with big swing-and-miss numbers (a 40.6% whiff-rate in four Triple-A appearances last season), helping him round out his six-pitch arsenal in 2024.

NOT ALL HEROES WEAR CAPES: Travis helped save the life of a stranger from a burning house in Fort Myers in March of 2024 during Spring Training. He heard a loud bang from the house across the street from where he was staying. He and another man ran out, and saw that the house was on fire. They started to bang on the door to see if anyone was inside. Three other people came out who knew the man inside and started yelling, "Howard, your house is on fire, get out!" Gaining entrance to the house was difficult because of so many objects around the outside of the house, but Travis went around the side of the house, tearing up a part of the fence down to get back to the area where another door was. He ended up opening the door, and safely escorting the man out of the burning building.

SIGHT-SEERS: Adams traveled through Kyoto, Osaka and the outskirts of Japan with fellow Twins minor leaguer Jaylen Nowlin following the 2024 season. It was a leisure trip, but the duo took time away from their vacation to travel two hours from Shibuya (on the outskirts of Tokyo) to meet their old coach in the Twins organization, Takashi Miyoshi (now a Minor League instructor with the Reds) at his youth clinic. Adams and Nowlin spoke to a group of 8-16 year olds about their journey through American baseball and the mental side of the game.

HORNET PRIDE: Adams played his college baseball at Cal-State Sacramento in the Western Athletic Conference. He was a three-year starter for the Hornets, regularly pitching as their Saturday night guy as a junior and forming a dynamic 1-2 punch atop the rotation with Scott Randall, who went nine picks after Adams in that summer's June 2021 Amateur Draft to the Pirates (the two have yet to face each other in a professional game entering the season). While at Cal-State Sacramento, Adams was known for his pinpoint control, issuing just 25 walks in 151.0 career innings, the lowest BB/9 rate in program history (min. 100 IP). The program has produced nine Major Leaguers entering the 2025 season, headlined by Rhys Hoskins and James Outman.
