Tzu-Chen Sha struck out six in four scoreless one-hit innings of relief to earn the victory.

LUG-NOTES

A Season of Milestones: This season, the Nuts' 30th in Lansing, has seen the club pass 1,000 all-time players, 2,000 all-time wins, and 4,000 all-time games, and Carlos Beltrán became the first Lansing Lugnut to be inducted into the Hall of Fame.

Roll Call: The Lugnuts have suited up 54 different players this year, 26 position players and 28 pitchers (plus one scoreless inning from Gunner Gouldsmith), bringing the total to 1,012 players all time. The team record for most players used in one season: 55.

Climb the Ladder: 18 members of the 2026 Lugnuts have advanced to the upper levels of the minors...

- Ryan Magdic, Jake Garland, Devin Taylor and Davis Diaz have reached Triple-A Las Vegas.
- Nathan Dettmer, Jay Dill, Steven Echavarria, Jackson Finley, Ben Hansen, Blaze Pontes, Zane Taylor, Logan Sauve, Bobby Boser, Ali Camarillo, Jared Sprague-Lott, Nate Nankil and Pedro Pineda are with Double-A Midland.
- Kyle Robinson was traded to Pittsburgh, then swapped again to the Angels at the deadline; he is now with Double-A Rocket City.

Alum Spotlight: 21-year-old Steven Echavarria fanned seven San Antonio Missions (SD) in 5 2/3 scoreless innings last night in a 3-0 win.

Major League Lugnuts: Ten Nuts have made their MLB debuts this season: Daniel Susac for the Giants, Junior Perez for the White Sox, Eduardo Rivera for the Red Sox, Jack Weisenburger with the NY Mets, and Henry Bolte, Gage Jump, Kade Morris, Joshua Kuroda-Grauer, Tommy White and Yuniur Tur for the Athletics. 48 former Lugnuts have appeared in a Major League game this season, not including former Nuts managers / current MLB managers Clayton McCullough (Miami) and John Schneider (Toronto).

No Place Like Home: The Nuts have won 15 of their last 18 home games; their overall 36-25 home record is third best in the Midwest League, though their 20-45 road record is 11th in the 12-team MWL. The Lugnuts' home offense leads the league in averaging 6.18 runs/game, while the road offense ranks last with 4.22 runs/game.

Streaking:

- Jake Reinisch enters today on a 42-game on-base streak, batting .312 with a .467 OBP and a .532 slugging pct. during the streak, with 44 base hits and 39 walks. It is the longest active streak in the minors. Reinisch has at least one hit and one walk in each of his last six games and has drawn at least one walk in 12 straight games.
- Jared Davis has hit safely in his first 10 games with the Lugnuts since getting called up from the Arizona Complex League, going 2-for-5 with a single and a two-run triple yesterday. Davis is batting .400 (14-for-35) with seven walks (.500 OBP) overall, after bursting out of the gates with hits in his first five at-bats.

Formula for a Leadoff Hitter: After he went hitless in his first six High-A at-bats, Alex Fernandes has reached base in seven of his last 10 plate appearances, going 5-for-7 with five singles, two walks and a sacrifice fly, stealing two bases and scoring four runs. The 23-year-old Fernandes was signed by the A's in July out of San Jose State; this three-game stint with Lansing constitutes his pro debut.

Rodney's Night: On a "Go Green" Michigan State Night, Rodney Green, Jr. went 3-for-4 with a walk, snapping a spell in which Green had one hit in his last 20 at-bats. Moreover, the Berkeley native had been just 2-for-30 this year and 8-for-81 all-time against Fort Wayne pitching before last night.

Two for the Price of One: The Lugnuts lead all of High-A in turning double plays, 121. Fort Wayne is in 4th with 112 double plays.

SEPTEMBER 4 IN LUGNUTS HISTORY

2016: Juan Kelly's on-base streak ended at 34 games, as the Nuts lost 3-0 at Lake County and were eliminated from playoff contention.

2022: Jorge Juan (4 IP) combined with Jack Owen (2 1/3), Shohei Tomioka (2/3) and Osvaldo Berrios (2 IP) to complete the third no-hitter in franchise history, 2-1 at South Bend. Lawrence Butler's home run in the first and Max Muncy's RBI double in the eighth supplied the Nuts' runs; the Cubs drew seven walks and scored their only run on a Berrios throwing error in the eighth.

2025: The Dayton Dragons were one strike away from a 3-0 win at Day Air Ballpark – and considering that they entered the night with a franchise record 15 straight wins (two shy of the Midwest League record) and then won the final three games afterward, they might have ended the year with 19 consecutive victories. But Cameron Leary lined a two-run single to left, Dylan Simmons tossed a game-tying wild pitch, and Pedro Pineda laced a go-ahead two-run single to left for a shocking 5-4 Lugnuts victory.

In a Nutshell: Dicochea replaced the released Devin Kirby-Williams in the Lugnuts' rotation, making his third straight start tonight... dazzled in his last outing, holding Great Lakes to one hit in five innings (an Emil Morales two-run homer to center), walking two and striking out three; 68 pitches, 37 strikes... this is his 51st career Lansing appearance... movie buff.

Blast From the Past: Dicochea's first and only start vs. Fort Wayne before today was on August 10, 2023: 4 IP, 5 H, 4 R, 2 BB, 3 K, allowing a home run to Jakob Marsee opening the game; retired Ethan Salas on a groundout to first, then allowed an RBI single to Salas in the 4th inning... the Lugnuts' lineup included future Major Leaguers Jacob Wilson, Daniel Susac, Junior Perez and Colby Thomas, and rallied back for a 7-4 win.

Glory Days: Boasting a 96 mph fastball, Dicochea was ranked the No. 1 prep prospect in Arizona by Baseball America entering the 2019 draft... twirled a no-hitter in the state semifinals... signed for \$400,000... signed away from commitment to University of Arizona... senior year stats: 1.30 ERA, 54 IP, 24 H, 10 ER, 11 BB, 86 K... in addition to pitching, starred at shortstop.

Minor League Path: Dicochea opened his professional career in the 2019 Arizona League after signing, but his 2021 campaign was halted in Single-A Stockton on June 6 after only six appearances, five starts... returned from Tommy John surgery on August 12, 2022... opened 2023 as the Ports' No. 4 starter... promoted from Single-A Stockton to Lansing on June 13, 2023, to replace Jack Perkins and finished the season in the Lugnuts' rotation... opened the 2024 season on the Nuts' roster but was transferred back to Stockton on April 30 after four appearances... spent all of 2025 in Stockton... has spent all of 2026 on the Lansing roster.

From the Archives: When Dicochea first joined the Nuts in June 2023, he had just been profiled by MLB.com A's beat writer Martín Gallegos a day earlier, quoting A's GM David Forst in including Dicochea's name among the top pitching prospects in the system (Royber Salinas, Gunnar Hoglund, J.T. Ginn and Joey Estes). Wrote Gallegos about Dicochea, "Dicochea, an eighth-round selection by the A's in the 2019 MLB Draft out of Sahuarita (Ariz.) High School, ranks just outside Oakland's Top 30 Prospects list. But his inclusion in that group from Forst speaks volumes about how highly he is viewed... Dicochea's development hit a snag early in his pro career after he underwent Tommy John surgery in 2021. Since his return from injury, the 22-year-old right-hander is taking a big step forward this season, showing off a fastball that consistently hits 95 mph along with a solid slider and a changeup he's recently added to his mix. A's assistant general manager and director of player personnel Billy Owens added, "He's off to a promising start. Averaging well over a strikeout per inning. Overall, his command has taken a step forward. He's definitely an interesting arm on the horizon."
