# 2023 SCHEDULE

**NO MOUNTAIN HIGH ENOUGH:** After entering the 6th inning on Thursday night trailing 7-0, Somerset scored 11 unanswered runs over its final three trips to the plate to win 11-7. The seven-run comeback was the Patriots' largest deficit overcome since becoming the Yankees' Double-A affiliate in 2021.

HIGHLIGHTS

THE RACE IS ON: After three stolen bases on Thursday night, the Patriots have overtaken the Sea Dogs for the most stolen bases in the Eastern League, becoming the first team to 100. Every member of the Patriots' active roster has at least two stolen bases. Somerset is one eight teams in MiLB with 100+ SB, averaging 2.12 per game. After leading all of Double-A with 205 SB in 2022, this year the Patriots are on pace for 293 SB.

HE HITS THE BALL HARD, MAN: On Thursday night, Tyler Hardman's first career grand slam capped a seven-run comeback for the Patriots. It was Hardman's team-leading ninth home run of the season, which now ties him for sixth in the Eastern League. Hardman's 5 RBIs in the game matched the career high mark he set exactly two weeks ago during Somerset's last Thursday home game on 5/18 vs. Reading. RIDING DURBY: Along 17 Double-A games spanning 63 AB and 72 PA, Caleb Durbin has struck out twice. Between both levels he's played at this season, Durbin's 1.91 K/BB ratio ranks 1st in all of MiLB this season and his 6.5% K rate is the 2nd-best in all of minors. On the bases, Durbin's 25 stolen bases this year ranks 10th among all minor leaguers.

**EVERY ROSE HAS IT'S THORNS:** During his lone season with the Red Sox organization, Jeisson Rosario played 98 games for the Portland Sea Dogs in 2021 and hit .232 with 3 HR and a .642 OPS. Since being claimed off waivers by the Yankees in March of 2022, Rosario has spent all of the last two seasons playing for the Somerset Patriots. In 25 games against his former Portland team over the last two seasons, Rosario is 27-for-86 (.314/.438/.662) with 6 HR, 18 RBI, 14 R and a 1.100 OPS.

#### **RHP #18 BLANE ABEYTA**

**2022:** Spent all of 2022 with High-A Hudson Valley, tying for second on the team with 20 GS, ranking third on the team with 104.2 IP and fourth on the team with 88 K. Over his final 12 games of the season (nine starts) dating back to 6/28, he went 5-2 with a 2.93 ERA (58.1 IP. 53 H. 44 K. 30 BB).

**2021:** Split his professional debut season between Single-A Tampa and the FCL Yankees, combining to go 5-3 with a 5.37 ERA (55.1 IP, 43 H, 71 K, 35 BB, 4 HR) in 17 games (10 starts)... Was named the Low-A Southeast League Pitcher of the Week for the week of 9/5, after tossing six scoreless innings in his start on 9/3 at Bradenton (W, 6.0 IP, H, BB, 9 K). Across three starts from 8/20 - 9/3, Abeyta went 2-0 with a 0.57 ERA (15.2 IP, 4 H, 20 K, 6 BB, 0 HR). Following the season, he played for Surprise in the Arizona Fall League and went 1-1 with a 10.13 ERA (10.2 IP, 12 ER) in eight appearances.

**College:** Coming out of high school as a catcher, Abeyta transitioned to pitching upon beginning his college career at Modesto Junior College (CA) in 2018. Working as the team's closer during his freshman season, he went 1-0 with a 1.62 ERA and five saves over 16 appearances (16.2 IP, 15 H, 22 K, 14 BB). During his second season as a pitcher, he went 5-4 over 17 games (10 GS) with one save and a 4.55 ERA (65.1 IP, 70 H, 60 K, 27 BB). Following two seasons at Modesto, Abeyta transferred to the University of Nevada in 2020, leading the Wolfpack with two saves, closing out both of the team's wins in the COVID-19 shortened season.

**Personal Notes:** Lettered in both baseball and basketball at Ceres High School (CA). Was named an All-League performer at catcher and was Team MVP, batting .354.

**Career Notes:** Signed with the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent on June 20, 2020, following the COVID-19 shortened college season and MLB Draft.

Dominguez begins his 1st season as manager for the Somerset Patriots, 9th overall as a manager and 17th overall coaching in the Yankees organization. He spent the past two seasons (2021-2022) as a defensive coach for Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre and was assigned to the same post for 2020, before the minor league season was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Panama City, Panama native has managerial experience with the GCL Yankees (2016), DSL Yankees 1 (2011-15) and DSL Yankees 2 (2009-10). From 2012-2015, his teams finished at least 10 games over .500, including reaching the DSL semifinals in 2012 and 2015. An outfielder during his playing days, Dominguez signed with the Yankees as an undrafted free agent in 2001 and spread four minor league seasons for New York between the DSL and the GCL. #### GRAYSON CRAWFORD: Pitching Coach (1st year)

Grayson Crawford begins his 1st season with Somerset after making his professional coaching debut as the pitching coach for Single-A Tampa in 2022. Under his guidance, Tampa's Yordin Calderon hurled a seven-inning no-hitter for the Tarpons in his Single-A debut on May 25, 2022. #### JAKE HIRST: Hitting Coach (2nd year)

Jake Hirst returns for his 2nd season in Somerset and 5th with the Yankees. Under his guidance in 2022, the Patriots slugged a franchise record 205 HR, which led all Double-A teams and ranked 3rd in MilB. The team also led the Eastern League in TB (1,984), SLG (.445), and OPS (.779), while finishing 2nd in RBI (655) and OBP (.342). Prior to coming to Somerset, he served as hitting coach for Hudson Valley (2021) and the GCL Yankees West (2019-2020).

#### AARON BOSSI: Defensive Coach (2nd year)

Bossi returns for his 2nd season in Somerset. Under Bossi's leadership in 2022, Patriots infielder Jesus Bastidas was awarded a Minor League Gold Glove for his work at second base. Additionally, with Bossi leading Somerset's base-running program in 2022, Somerset paced all Eastern League teams with 205 stolen bases. Bossi made his coaching debut as Hudson Valley's defensive coach in 2021 and prior to that helped assist rehabbing players at the Yankees minor league complex.

Overall, Wells ranked among the Yankees' minor league leaders in HR (20, 4th) and RBI (65, 3rd). During his time playing for the Patriots in 2022, Wells lived at teammate Anthony Volpe's house in Watchung, alongside teammates Max Burt and Blake Perkins. Along Somerset's 2022 Eastern League Championship run, during the postseason Wells ranked 2nd on the Patriots in RBI (8), XBH (3), TB (12) and H (7), trailing only Jasson Dominguez in each category.

2021: In Wells' pro debut season during 2021, he combined to hit .264/.390/.476 in 103 games with an OPS of .886, 16
HR, 76 RBI and 82 R between Single-A Tampa (65 games) and High-A Hudson Valley (38 games). Wells ranked among the Yankees' minor leaguers in BB (2nd), R (2nd), RBI (3rd), OPS (4th), 3B (T-4th) and XBH (5th). Following the 2021 MiLB season, Wells played for the Surprise Saguaros of the Arizona Fall League. Across in 18 games during the fall, Wells ranked 6th in the AFL with a 1.034 OPS, adding 2 HR and 14 R. His 18 RBI were tied for the most of any catcher in the AFL. For his efforts, he was named an AFL Rising Star. He was recognized by Baseball America for having the "Best Strike-Zone Discipline" of any Yankees minor leaguer in 2021.

College: Wells spent two seasons with the University of Arizona Wildcats, playing in 71 games and hitting .357 with a 1.036 OPS with 7 HR, 74 RBI and 85 R. Among his honors while at Arizona, Wells was first named Pac-12 Freshman of the Year in 2019, when he was also a Freshman All-American honoree per Collegiate Baseball, Baseball America, NCBWA and Rawlings. In 2020, Wells was a Collgiate Baseball Second-team All-American and was named to the Buster Posey National Collegiate Catcher of the Year Award watch list (top NCAA catcher). During the summer of 2019, Wells played in the Cape Cod League with the Yarmouth-Dennis Red Sox. In 42 regular season games, where he was named a Cap Cod League All-Star starter, after hitting .308 with 7 HR, 26 RBI and 23 R. Wells was named a 2019 Cape Cod League Outstanding Pro Prospect.

#### **Personal Notes**

Wells spent his preps career at powerhouse Bishop Gorman High School in his hometown of Las Vegas, combining to hit .428 with 87 RBI and 85 during his preps career. He was named team captain and Most Valuable Player as a junior and senior. As a junior, Wells was the 2017 Nevada Gatorade Player of the Year. Upon graduating high school, Wells was originally selected by the Yankees in the 35th round of the 2018 MLB Draft. After electing to play college ball at Arizona, the Yankees selected him again in the first round of the draft two years later, 28th overall. For the second consecutive season, Wells is living with close friend and former teammate Anthony Volpe's family in Watchung, New Jersey.

#### **Career Notes**

Selected by the Yankees in the 1st round of the 2020 MLB Draft, making him the fourth Yankees catcher chosen first round of the MLB First-Year Player Draft since its inception in 1965, joining Anthony Seigler (2018), David Parrish (2000) and Thurman Munson (1968).
