PLAYOFF BOUND

- The Omaha Storm Chasers won the International League 1st Half title with a 49-24 record and 3.5-game lead on second-place Syracuse to end the half, the best Minor League team in the 1st half of the 2024 season.
- Winning the first half in the league secures the Storm Chasers home field advantage in the International League Championship Series, a best-of-three series that will be played at Werner Park from September 24 to 26.
- This September will mark Omaha's first appearance in the playoffs since 2014, when the Chasers won their 2nd of back-to-back Triple-A National Championships.
- The Triple-A Omaha franchise has 17 playoff appearances in the last 55 years, including most recently four straight seasons: 2011 to 2014.

NOTES AND NUGGETS

INTO THE HISTORY BOOKS

Tuesday's 7-1 win over Louisville was Omaha's 87th victory of the season, to set a new Triple-A Omaha single-season franchise record.

- The previous wins record was held by the 1990 Omaha Royals that went 86-50 and won the Triple-A Classic 4 games to 1 over the International League's Rochester Red Wings ... this year is the 8th time a Triple-A Omaha club has won at least 80 games.
- The best winning percentage in Triple-A Omaha history is from the inaugural 1969 Omaha Royals at .607 (85-55) the only season with a winning % greater than .600.
- The 2024 Storm Chasers are on pace for 90 wins ... to set a new record for winning percentage in a regular season, the 2024 Chasers need to win at least two of the team's remaining four games, which move the team to 90 victories this season.

IN GOOD STANDINGS

- While the standings reset for the start of the 2nd half on June 25, Omaha's enters today 32 games over .500 with an overall 88-56 record (.611 winning percentage).
- Of 120 full season Minor League teams, Omaha's .611 winning percentage overall this year is the 5th-best in the Minors ... the Palm Beach Cardinals (Cardinals Single-A are the best team in Minor League Baseball at 83-47 (.638 winning %).
- 88 wins are tied for the 2nd-most of any team in Minor League Baseball this season, 3 behind Triple-A Sugar Land ... Omaha is 1 of 3 Minor League teams with 85+ wins.
- The Chasers were previously 1st or 2nd in the Minors in wins every day between May 25 and September 6 ... Omaha also held sole possession of the best winning percentage in full-season Minor League Baseball for 30 days, June 5 to July 5.

TOO CLOSE FOR COMFORT

- 84 of Omaha's 144 games this year have been decided by 3 runs or less (58%), including 33 of 56 losses in 2024 (59%), with 18 of 56 losses by just one run (32%).
- Omaha is 27-18 in 1-run games this season ... the Chasers have the 4th-most 1-run wins of any Minor League team ... Akron leads the Minors with 33 wins by 1 run.
- Omaha's 40 saves are the 2nd-most in the International League, the 3rd-most at the Triple-A level and rank tied 5th in Minor League Baseball.
- Evan Sisk's 14 saves overall this year rank 4th in the International League ... Evan has 12 of the team's last 13 saves ... his next save will make him the 15th pitcher in Triple-A Omaha history to save 15 games in a season ... the last to do so was Jesse Chavez, with 16 saves in 2011, which represents the Storm Chasers-era record.

I'M DIFFERENT, YEAH, I'M (RUN) DIFFERENT (IAL)

- Omaha has outsourced its opponents 774 to 631 this season, a +143 run differential.
- A +143 run differential this year ranks as the best mark both in the International League and at the Triple-A level, well ahead of Sugar Land (+116).
- Omaha is 8th in Minor League Baseball in run differential ... the Midland Rockhounds lead the Minors in run differential at +180 (674 to 494).
- The top run differential in Omaha history is the 1969 O-Royals at +163 (805 to 642).

RELIEF AID

- Omaha's bullpen has been one of the best across the entire Triple-A level in 2024.
- The Storm Chasers relievers lead all Triple-A bullpens with a 3.60 ERA, 1.32 WHIP and .217/.321/.341 opposing slash line ... the 217 opponents' batting average ranks tied 15th among all 120 full-season Minor League teams.
- Omaha's bullpen has combined to not allow a run in 41 games this year (11 times in August and already 5 times in 15 September games), roughly one in every 3.5 games in 2024 ... the bullpen also has 21 games without a walk this season, including 12 times in the 2nd half of the season.

COMEBACK KIDS

- Omaha has 46 come-from-behind wins this season, meaning over half (53%) of this year's wins have been games where the Chasers trailed at some point.
- Omaha has trailed for 3 innings or more in 17 of the 46 comeback wins.
- The Storm Chasers have 9 wins where the club had to overcome multiple deficits.
- Omaha has 13 victories in games where the Chasers trailed after the 6th inning.
- The Storm Chasers have come back from down as many as 5 runs to win and have overcome a 3+ run deficit to win on 13 occasions.
