**Columbus Clippers LHP Parker Messick (0-0, 0.00) vs. Worcester Red Sox RHP Liam Hendriks (NR)**

***Tit for Tat*** - The Worcester Red Sox and the Columbus Clippers (AAA-Cleveland) – who exchanged last-inning victories last night during a make-up doubleheader – play game three of their 6-game series at Polar Park tonight at 6:05 pm. This evening’s game is live on NESN+ and on NASH 98.9 FM and the rest of the WooSox Radio Network. The WooSox G2 win last night, 5-4 snapped their season-high 3-game losing skid and ended a 5-game winning streak for Columbus who won G1, 6-5. The WooSox come into play tonight in 7<sup>th</sup>-place in the International League East division and 4½ games behind front-running Lehigh Valley while Columbus is atop the IL West division by 1-game over Iowa.

***Rolling Sevens*** – The doubleheader split last night featured late inning heroics on both sides. In the opener, the WooSox took a 5-2 lead into the top of the 7<sup>th</sup>-inning (the final scheduled inning of a doubleheader) only to see Columbus score 4 times on a 2-out grand slam by Will Brennan to stun the Sox, 6-5. In the nightcap, the Clippers again rallied during their final at-bat scoring a run in the top of the 7<sup>th</sup>-inning to tie the game at 4-4, but this time it was the WooSox who came up winners on a clutch 2-out RBI single by Tyler McDonough to pull out a 5-4 victory. It marked Worcester’s first win in a 1-run game this season as they are now 1-3 in that category on the young season.

***Return to Health*** - For the fifth time in their first 11 games to begin the season, the Worcester Red Sox starting pitcher tonight will be a rehabbing Boston Red Sox pitcher. This evening it will be veteran reliever **Liam Hendriks** who is expected to make a 1-inning start – his first of the season after going on Boston’s injured list on March 24 with right elbow inflammation. Hendriks made 7 relief appearances for the Red Sox during spring training going 2-0 with 1 save and a 9.95 ERA – 6.1 IP, 14 H, 7 R, 7 ER, 0 BB, 4 SO.

(RHP Lucas Giolito made his second rehab start with the WooSox last night in G2 of the doubleheader vs. Columbus following a start on April 2 at Jacksonville while RHP Brayan Bello has also made two rehab starts for the WooSox last week in Jacksonville on April 1 & April 6. He is slated to make another rehab start tomorrow night at Polar Park).

Hendriks made four relief appearances for the WooSox last August during an injury rehab assignment as he continued his comeback from Tommy John surgery just over one year prior (August 2, 2023). He went one scoreless inning apiece in those four outings for Worcester – 4 IP, 2 H, 0 R, 1 BB, 1 SO. He did not pitch for Boston last season.

Liam Hendriks, 36, signed a two year free agent deal with Boston in February of 2024 and this is his 15<sup>th</sup> season in Major League Baseball. The Perth, Australia native has pitched in 476 big league games (432 in relief) with the Twins (2011-13), Royals (2014), Blue Jays (2014-15), A’s (2016-2020), and White Sox (2021-23). His career record is 33-34, 3.82 but he has 116 saves including 114 saves from June of 2019 through the 2022 season which led the major leagues. He also has recorded 727 strikeouts in his 650 career big league innings. Liam was named Mariano Rivera American League Reliever of the Year in both 2020 and 2021. He is a three-time American League All-Star (2019, ’21-22). He has also been nominated for the Roberto Clemente Award five different times.

In December 2022, Hendriks was diagnosed with Stage 4 non-Hodgkin’s lymphoma, a blood cancer that he believes he had been pitching with during the 2022 season when he posted a 2.81 ERA with 37 saves in 58 games for the White Sox. After undergoing eight rounds of chemotherapy – which began in January of 2023 – and four rounds of immunotherapy, Hendriks completed his treatment on April 3 and announced he was cancer free on April 20, 2023. He began a rehab assignment on May 5 with Charlotte and returned to the majors on May 29. He appeared in five games for the White Sox, earning two wins and one save, before being sidelined with a torn ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow that forced him to miss the remainder of the 2023 season and led to Tommy John surgery on August 2, 2023. Liam will become the first Australian born player to appear for the Boston Red Sox.

**Hello, Columbus** – For the third straight year, the Columbus Clippers have come to Polar Park to take on the WooSox. This current 6-game set is even at a victory apiece and continues tonight & tomorrow both at 6:05 pm followed by weekend games on Saturday at 4:05 pm and Sunday at 1:05 pm. Worcester has not yet played in Columbus and at the Clippers' superb Huntington Park and won't until at least next year. Columbus has enjoyed their first two visits to Polar Park thus far. About two years ago they took 5 of 6 from the WooSox from April 11-16, 2023 scoring 54 runs total in their 5 victories that series. And last year, the Clippers and WooSox split a 6-game set last June 18-23. That too was a high-scoring affair as Columbus won games by scores of 16-4, 7-6, and 9-7 while the WooSox wins came by scores of 10-4, 6-2, and 2-0. Overall, the Clippers have out-scored the WooSox, 107-62 in the first 14 meetings between the clubs with Columbus owning a 9 game to 5 advantage.

**Ten Pinned** – Worcester has played 10 games...only 140 to go! After 10 games they are 14<sup>th</sup> in the 20-team International League in Team Batting at .228, tied for 11<sup>th</sup> in runs scored (48) and 8<sup>th</sup> in HR (10). On the pitching side, the Sox 4.26 ERA is 12<sup>th</sup> in the league.

**A Winning Tradition** – The 2024 Worcester Red Sox went 79-71 to post a winning season for the fourth time in as many years of existence and for the third year in a row under returning WooSox manager Chad Tracy. Trace is only the second Red Sox Triple-A manager to ever post three consecutive winning seasons. Darrell Johnson did so from 1971-73 (the first two years when the Red Sox Triple-A club was in Louisville before moving to Pawtucket in 1973). Worcester finished 35-40 during the first half last year but then improved to 44-31 in the second half. Overall the 2024 WooSox went 40-34 at home and 39-37 on the road. The 2021 WooSox had a 74-54 record during their abbreviated inaugural season, the 2022 WooSox finished 75-73, and the 2023 club posted a 79-68 mark. Add it all up and the WooSox are 307-266 all-time for a .536 winning pct.

**Records Were Made to be Broken** – The 2024 WooSox set some team and individual modern Boston Red Sox Triple-A records (since at least 1973 when the Pawtucket Red Sox became the Red Sox AAA affiliate).

The WooSox **used 84 different players** last season to better the all-time Red Sox Triple-A record for players employed in a season (ironically set the year before with 79 by the 2023 WooSox). The 2024 WooSox also set a new all-time Red Sox Triple-A mark for player transactions in a season with **281 player moves** to pass the total of 271 from 2023 that was a record for less than a year.

The 2024 WooSox set new Boston Red Sox Triple-A records for **Most Runs** (they scored 869 runs to pass the previous record of 840 set by the Pawtucket Red Sox in 1996), **Most RBI** (808 RBI eclipsing the mark of 790 set by the PawSox in 1996), **Most Walks** (by batters) with 786 bettering the previous mark of 721 set by the '23 WooSox, **Most Hit by Pitch** (by batters) with 94 to break the previous record of 85 set in 2023, and **Most Left on Base** (WooSox had 1156 LOB to beat the 1121 LOB from the 2005 Pawtucket Red Sox),

The WooSox played 150 game last year to establish a new all-time Boston Red Sox Triple-A record for **Most Games Played** in a season (the 2022 WooSox held the record with 148 games played). WooSox batters set a Red Sox Triple-A record for **Fewest Intentional Walks** as Worcester received just one intentional walk all last season (Nick Sogard on June 23 vs. Columbus).

On the pitching side: Worcester matched the mark for **Fewest Complete Games** (only one last year by Grant Gambrell on April 24 at Toledo in G2 of a doubleheader) as the 2005, 2011, and 2018 PawSox and the 2021 WooSox also all had just one CG during those seasons.

**Runs in the Family** – Worcester had the 3<sup>rd</sup> best run differential in the league overall last season at +115 (865 runs scored and 750 runs allowed). Omaha, the 1<sup>st</sup> half and eventual IL champion, was a +136 while Scranton/Wilkes-Barre was +123.

**WooSox Batters Led the Way** – Worcester led all 20 International League clubs in a host of team offensive categories last season. The WooSox led the league with 869 runs scored (Scranton/Wilkes-Barre was next with 846 runs scored). The Sox also led the IL with 786 walks (Toledo was a distant 2<sup>nd</sup> with 676 walks). Worcester paced the league by a wide margin with an impressive .369 on-base pct. as the WooSox were the only team in the IL with an OBP of over .359 (Scranton/WB was 2<sup>nd</sup> at .358). Furthermore, Worcester had the 2<sup>nd</sup> best OPS in the league at .795 (Columbus was 1<sup>st</sup> at .804).

**Rankings** – Worcester finished 5<sup>th</sup> in the IL in team batting with a .259 average. On the pitching side, the Sox were 10<sup>th</sup> in team ERA (4.84). Sox pitchers allowed the 2<sup>nd</sup> fewest HR in the league (141 HRA while Nashville had 139 HRA). Defensively, the WooSox were 11<sup>th</sup> with a .979 field pct. (107 errors in 5126 total chances). And Worcester was 2<sup>nd</sup> in the IL with 1152 LOB behind only Gwinnett (1178 LOB).

**Close Encounters** - In games decided by one run or two runs last season, the WooSox were 23-33 (.411). When games were decided by 3 runs or more, the WooSox went 56-38 (.596).

**Comebacks and Last AB** – Worcester had 40 come-from-behind victories last season including 10 wins in their last at-bat of the game and 3 walk-offs. They suffered 18 losses during the opponent's final at-bat.

**Daydream Believers** – Worcester had more success last season in day games (34-25) than at night (45-46).

**Series Matters** – Worcester went 11-8-8 in their 27 series last year (11 wins, 8 losses, and 8 splits) and they did not lose any of their last nine series last season after dropping 4 of 6 at Scranton/Wilkes-Barre from July 23-28. The WooSox finished 5-3-5 in their 13 home series compared to 6-5-3 in their 14 road sets.

**Players Aplenty** - The 2024 WooSox built on a pair of all-time Red Sox Triple-A records (previously set by the 2023 WooSox) as they made 281 player transactions during the 2024 campaign and set a new all-time Red Sox Triple-A record for players appearing in a single season. The WooSox used 84 different players in 2024 (37 position players and 47 pitchers) to better the mark of 79 players in 2023. Ironically, the 2021 WooSox broke a long-standing Red Sox Triple-A record when they used 72 different players to beat the 1995 Pawtucket Red Sox (during a strike year when replacement players were used for the first month+ of that season) and the 2006 PawSox who each employed 70 different players. When Chad Tracy made his Worcester debut in 2022, the WooSox quickly set a new record using 75 different players (that was immediately topped first in 2023 and again in 2024).

**WooSox to BoSox** - The WooSox sent 28 different players to Boston during the 2024 season (not counting rehab players). The list...INF David Hamilton, INF Romy Gonzalez, LHP Brennan Bernardino, INF/OF Bobby Dalbec, RHP Cooper Criswell, LHP Joe Jacques, LHP Cam Booser, C Tyler Heineman, RHP Zack Kelly, RHP Naoyuki Uwasawa, INF Enmanuel Valdez, INF/OF Jamie Westbrook, RHP Josh Winckowski, RHP Isaiah Campbell, LHP Bailey Horn, RHP Trey Wingenter, INF/OF Nick Sogard, RHP Brad Keller, RHP Chase Shugart, C/INF Mickey Gasper, RHP Greg Weissert, LHP Joely Rodriguez, LHP Rich Hill, RHP Luis Guerrero, RHP Richard Fitts, LHP Zach Penrod, INF Vaughn Grissom, and RHP Quinn Priester. Those 28 do not include OF Rob Refsnyder, RHP Nick Pivetta, OF Tyler O'Neill, OF Masataka Yoshida, RHP Chris Martin, OF Wilyer Abreu, 1B Triston Casas, INF Trevor Story, and RHP Lucas Sims who were all injury rehab recalls from Worcester to Boston in 2024.

**Sea Dog to Woofsters** – A total of 22 different players were promoted from Double-A Portland to Triple-A Worcester last season.

**PORTLAND SEA DOGS (AA) GAME RECAP** – The Portland Sea Dogs (4-1) lost for the first time on the young season last night, 4-1 at home to the New Hampshire Fisher Cats. Portland pitchers struckout 18 New Hampshire batters for the second straight game. Blake Wehunt was the starter and loser – 3.1 IP, 3 H, 2 R, 2 ER, 1 BB, 6 SO. Reidis Sena followed – 2 IP, 0 H, 0 R, 2 BB, 4 SO. Alex Hoppe – 2.2 IP, 3 H, 1 R, 1 ER, 0 BB, 5 SO and Jonathan Brand – 1 IP, 0 H, 0 R, 1 BB, 3 SO also worked. Mark Kolozsvary ripped an RBI single in the 4<sup>th</sup> inning to plate the only Portland run.

**WOOSOX PLAYER MOVES** – The Boston Red Sox today sent RHP **Liam Hendriks** to Worcester to begin an injury rehab assignment. See info on Liam, who will start tonight’s game, on page 1 of these Game Notes. The Red Sox also today transferred LHP **Brendan Cellucci** from Double-A Portland to Worcester.

Cellucci, 26, appeared in one game for the Sea Dogs this season...last Sunday (April 6) at Reading when he tossed 2.1 scoreless innings of relief – 2.1 IP, 1 H, 0 R, 0 BB, 2 SO. He spent most of last season with Portland going 7-3 with a 3.07 ERA and 4 saves in 30 relief appearances with 84 strikeouts in 58.2 innings. He did make 5 appearances for the WooSox late last season (0-0, 15.00). The Philadelphia native pitched at Tulane University and was Boston’s 12<sup>th</sup> round choice in the 2019 First-Year Player Draft.

In the last five days the WooSox have had four different players promoted to Boston. RHP Hunter Dobbins made his Major League debut on Sunday night and was the starter and winner for the Red Sox. RHP Robert Stock was selected to Boston on Monday and pitched in relief for the Red Sox that night before being designated for assignment on Tuesday. And on Tuesday the Red Sox called-up RHP Josh Winckowski and catcher Blake Sabol from Worcester. Both appeared during Boston’s game on Tuesday night at frigid Fenway.
