RAIN, RAIN GO AWAY: The Skeeters and Chihuahuas were scheduled to play a doubleheader on Monday but the first game was postponed due to inclement weather. The doubleheader was scheduled due to a postponement of Saturday's game. The makeup date for the Skeeters and Chihuahuas postponed game Monday is to be determined.

LAST NIGHT: Framber Valdez threw four scoreless innings in the second outing of his MLB rehab assignment in a 7-2 Skeeters win. Blake Taylor began his MLB rehab assignment and tossed a scoreless inning of relief. Jose Siri paced the offense with four RBIs, including a three-run homer.

REHAB ASSIGNMENTS: Right-hander Jake Odorizzi is scheduled to make his second rehab start with the Skeeters on Monday. He made the first start of his rehab stint on 5/18 at Round Rock, throwing 57 pitches through three innings. Odorizzi has not appeared with the Astros since being placed on the 10-day IL on April 25 with a right pronator muscle strain.

HEY SIRI: Jose Siri leads Minor League Baseball with 28 RBIs this season. He's also tied for third in Triple A West with five home runs and is second in OPS (1.223). Siri drove in seven runs on 5/13 at Round Rock, which set a Skeeters franchise record and are tied for the most by a Triple A player this season. He has driven in three or more runs in five of 14 games this season. The rest of the Skeeters offense combined has six games of three-or-more RBIs.

DE LA DINGER: Bryan De La Cruz has three home runs over his last four games and has at least two hits in four of his last five games. De La Cruz is hitting .478 (11x23) with three home runs and six RBIs over the five-game stretch. De La Cruz is seventh in Triple A with a .397 batting average this season.

THREE'S COMPANY: The Skeeters have won three straight games through their first three home games at Constellation Field this season. They've outscored El Paso 18-8 over the three-game stretch.

'FRAM'BULOUS: Framber Valdez has now thrown six straight scoreless innings across his two rehab stints. He's also allowed just two hits over his last six innings. The six-inning scoreless streak is the longest by a Skeeters pitcher this season. Valdez logged 54 pitches in his second rehab start compared to 47 pitches in his first start on 5/17 in Round Rock.

PLAY THE HITS: The Skeeters lead MiLB with a .325 batting average. They also lead Triple A and are tied for second in MiLB with 176 hits. The Skeeters have four players in the top 10 in batting average in Triple A West: Siri (2, .404), De La Cruz (4, .397) Meyers (9, .360), Papierski (10, .359).

BEAT THE STREAK: Jake Meyers is amidst a 12-game hitting streak (.360, 18x50), which is tied for the third-longest active streak in Triple A. Bryan De La Cruz is riding an 11-game hitting streak (.442, 23x52), which is tied for the fifth-longest Triple A streak.

CLOSE TO HOME: Based on approximate mileage, the Skeeters are located second-closest to the stadium of their parent club out of Triple A teams. The St. Paul Saints are located approximately 11 miles from Minnesota's Target Field.

MAJOR TALENT: The Skeeters roster features eight players with Major League service time: OF **Ronnie Dawson**, IF **Alex De Goti**, RHP **Jake Odorizzi**, RHP **Nivaldo Rodriguez**, RHP **Peter Solomon**, C **Garrett Stubbs**, LHP **Blake Taylor**, IF **Abraham Toro**, LHP **Framber Valdez**, RHP **Hector Velazquez**. All but Velazquez have appeared at the Majors with the Astros.

PROSPECT POWER: The Skeeters have nine players ranked as Astros top-30 prospects (per MLB Pipeline): RHP **Shawn Dubin** (No. 11), RHP **Peter Solomon** (No. 14), RHP **Jojane Torres** (No. 20), RHP **Brett Conine** (No. 23), RHP **Austin Hansen** (No. 24), RHP **Nivaldo Rodriguez**, (No. 25), OF **Ronnie Dawson** (No. 29).

PUT IT ON THE MANTEL: **Ronnie Dawson**, **Alex De Goti** and **Peter Solomon** each made their Major League debuts with the Astros this season. Dawson went 1x5 with a run through 3 G, De Goti went 2x6 with a run and RBI through 6 G and Solomon tossed a scoreless 2 IP in relief, allowing just one hit and striking out two.

VS. EL PASO: The Skeeter and Chihuahuas are set to meet 24 times this season and both are members of the East Division of Triple A West. El Paso became the first-ever visiting Triple A team at Constellation Field on May 20. The Skeeters visit Southwest University Field in El Paso for the first time for a six-game series beginning on June 17

ROAD TRIP: The Skeeters went on their first road trip as a Triple A franchise from May 6-18, visiting Albuquerque and Round Rock. The Skeeters finished the road trip 7-5. They won seven of the first eight games on the road trip before dropping the final four games.

NOW HERE'S A STOREY: Mickey Storey is entering his third year as the manager of the Astros Triple A affiliate. He led Round Rock to the best record in Triple A in 2019 (84-56) and to the Pacific Coast League Finals. Storey got his first managerial job in the Astros system in 2018 with Class A Quad Cities, winning the Western Division of the Midwest League. Storey appeared at the MLB level with the Astros in 2012 and the Blue Jays in 2013 as a right-handed pitcher. He still holds numerous career pitching records for Florida Atlantic University. He finished his career second all-time in strikeouts, tied for second in wins and finished top 10 in strikeouts per nine innings, games started, fewest walks per nine innings and innings pitched. REST OF THE CREW: Joining Mickey Storey on his staff are pitching coach Erick Abreu, hitting coach Ben Rosenthal and development coach Sean Connole. John Gregorich and A.J. Smith are the Skeeters' athletic trainers and Hazael Wessin is the team's strength and conditioning coach. Abreu is in his eighth season with the Astros organization and his first as the organization's Triple A pitching coach. Rosenthal is in his fifth season with the Astros and third as the hitting coach for their Triple A affiliate. Connole is in his second season with the Astros and his first as the development coach for the team's Triple A affiliate.

A LITTLE ABOUT US: Through their first nine seasons, the Skeeters played in the independent Atlantic League of Professional Baseball. They won the Atlantic League Championship in '16 and '18 and appeared in the post-season in five of nine seasons. The Skeeters still hold the Atlantic League single-season record for wins (95) and winning percentage (.679) from their '13 season. The Skeeters have been managed by former Major Leaguers Gary Gaetti (2012-17) and Pete Incaviglia (2018-20). As an independent team, the Skeeters went 601-502. Notable people to appear for the Skeeters include: LHP Scott Kazmir, RHP Roger Clemens, IF Rafael Palmeiro, Tracy McGrady, IF James Loney, C Derek Norris, OF Willy Taveras and RHP Felipe Paulino

WHERE TO FIND US: All 120 Skeeters games can be seen on MiLB.TV and can be heard by visiting the "Listen Live" at sugarlandskeeters.com. Gerald Sanchez has been tabbed as the voice of the Skeeters for the 2021 season. Sanchez, a native of Victoria, Texas, has over a decade of experience broadcasting University of Houston and Rice University baseball, as well as high school athletics around the Houston area.

HOMESTAND HIGHLIGHTS: The Skeeters will play 12 games in 13 days for their first homestand of the season, going from May 20-June 1. The Skeeters gave away replica Jose Altuve jerseys to the first 3,000 fans in each of their first three home games. The Skeeters welcome the Albuquerque Isotopes for the second half of the homestand, going from May 27-June 1. The Skeeters will be giving away Alex Bregman "Intentional Walk" bobbleheads to the first 1,500 fans in attendance on May 29. The Skeeters will also be giving away "Boys of Summer" posters featuring Skeeters players to the first 1,500 fans on May 30.

On This Day In Skeeters History

MONDAY, MAY 24, : Former Houston Astros outfielder Willy Taveras and Patrick Palmeiro, son of former Major League All-Star Rafael Palmeiro, combined to drive in five runs as the Skeeters came back for a 5-3 win over the Bridgeport Bluefish on the road. The Skeeters trailed 2-1 heading into the eighth inning but a two-run double from Patrick Palmeiro and RBI single from Taveras put the Skeeters out in front for good. Former Major League right-hander Josh Geer got the start for the Skeeters and threw five scoreless innings before handing over to the bullpen. The win helped the Skeeters salvage a split of the four-game series in Bridgeport.

REHAB START: Jake Odorizzi is set to make his first rehab start with the Skeeters on Monday against the Express. Odorizzi, who signed a two-year contract with the Astros on March 8, has made three starts with the Astros this season, going 0-2 with a 10.13 ERA. He made his last start on April 24 against Los Angeles (AL). He was placed on the 10-day IL on April 26 with a right pronator muscle strain.

NEW GUY: Odorizzi signed a two-year contract with the Astros on March 8. The Astros are the fourth team the 31-year old has appeared with at the Major League level, joining Kansas City (2012), Tampa Bay (2013-17) and Minnesota (2019-20).

ON THE MEND: Made just three starts for Minnesota during the pandemic-shortened 2020 season due to three separate stints on the IL (right intercostal strain, chest contusion, right middle finger blister).

HEY NOW: Was selected to his first career All-Star Game in 2019 with Minnesota ... He did not pitch in the game due to being on the IL

RECORD YEAR: In 2019, Odorizzi finished tied for eighth in the American League in wins (15), finished sixth in ERA (3.51) among AL pitchers with at least 150.0 IP, was eighth in opponent batting average (.234), 10th in strikeouts per nine innings (10.08) and 11th in strikeouts per walk (3.36) ... Set career highs in wins, strikeouts (178), FIP (3.39), opponents slugging percentage (.371) and OPS (.671), K/9 and SO/BB ratio ... Was named AL Player of the Week on May 5 ... Recorded 900th career strikeout on 7/2/19 at Oakland ... Surpassed 1,000 innings pitched on 8/21/19 at Chicago (AL) ... Won career-high 10 straight decisions (4/13-6/15), which was the fourth longest in Minnesota history

HEY ROOKIE: Led Major League rookies in starts (31) and strikeouts (174), and finished second in innings (168) in 2014 with Tampa Bay ... Was named the Rays Outstanding Rookie ... Finished eighth in American League Rookie of the Year voting.
