TACOMA TAKES ANOTHER

Round Rock fell 8-4 on Saturday night. The E-Train received a leadoff homer from CF Dustin Harris to quickly take a 1-0 lead. In the home half, Rainiers CF Leody Taveras singled home 2B Samad Taylor to even the score at one apiece. Tacoma took the lead in the second inning. After a one-out walk for RF Victor Labrada, 3B Jack López ripped a two-run home run and the home team held a 3-1 advantage. In the sixth inning, SS Richie Martin belted a triple to start things off for the Express before a single for C Konner Piotto cut the Rainiers lead at 3-2. Round Rock loaded the bases and 1B Justin Foscue hit into a double play but scored Piotto to tie the game. In the eighth, Foscue ripped a two-out solo homer and Round Rock had their first lead since the first inning at 4-3. Tacoma came right back in the home half. After a leadoff homer from 1B Tyler Locklear tied the game at four, the Rainiers loaded the bases for López with two outs. His single scored two to extend the lead at 6-4. Singles from DH Rhylan Thomas and C Harry Ford each tallied a run and the lead was 8-4 as Tacoma RHP Jesse Hahn threw a scoreless ninth for the victory.

SUPAK SUNDAY

RHP Trey Supak is slated for his third start on Sunday. On Tuesday, Supak went 2.1 innings in a loss while allowing four earned runs on five hits with two walks and three strikeouts. In 184 appearances since his professional debut in 2014, he owns a 3.90 ERA (334 ER/790. IP).

TIME TO SNAP THIS

The Express dropped their fifth straight game and they have lost their last 10 at Cheney Stadium along with 11 of their last 12 dating back to the end of 2024. They have gone 2-12 in 14 series in Tacoma since 2006 with a record of 18-44. With a loss today, Round Rock will be swept in a six-game series for the first time since July 25-30, 2023 at El Paso and just the third time in club history.

A HAPPY HARRIS

OF Dustin Harris extended his hitting streak to seven games. He has a hit in 14 of 17 games this month. He finished 1-for-3 with a homer, an RBI, a run scored, a walk and a strikeout yesterday. In July, Harris is slashing .329 (23-70)/.422/.529/.951 with two doubles, four homers, eight RBI, 13 runs scored, 10 walks and 11 strikeouts. He is now three stolen bases away from the most in club history.

HOW ABOUT HAUVER?

OF Trevor Hauver had his 32-game on-base streak snapped on Thursday night. Hauver has reached base in 50 of 55 games this year and 76 of his last 82 games going back to the end of 2024. Since August 16, 2024, he leads the PCL in on-base percentage (.421) and is fourth in OPS (.940).

EXPRESS MANAGER DOUG DAVIS

The 2025 season marks Round Rock Express Manager Doug Davis's third season with the E-Train. In 2024, Davis secured his 800th win as a manager on July 12 at Reno. In his first season with the Express in 2023, he guided the E-Train to a PCL Second Half title and the club's first playoff appearance since 2019. The team's 89 total wins were the most regular-season wins in franchise history and just the seventh 80-win campaign in club history. Davis oversaw the longest winning streak in franchise history when the Express won 14 consecutive games from August 8-23.

Prior to Round Rock, Davis spent two seasons as the manager for the Scranton Wilkes-Barre RailRiders, the New York Yankees Triple-A affiliate. Davis brings over 25 years of coaching experience to the Express dugout. Since he began coaching in 1995, he has led a minor league team for 10 total seasons and has accumulated a career 744-665 record. He spent the 2003-2004 seasons as the bench coach for the Florida Marlins, where he won the 2003 World Series.



In two seasons as the manager for Scranton Wilkes-Barre, Davis led the RailRiders to a combined record of 158-119. Last season, he helped oversee a pitching staff that led all Triple-A teams with a 3.89 ERA. Prior to his time as skipper, Davis spent three years in three different roles with Scranton Wilkes-Barre from 2017-2019. In 2017, he was the defensive coach before moving over to bullpen coach in 2018. In 2019, Davis was named the bench coach.

Before joining the New York Yankees organization, Davis spent 11 years in the Toronto Blue Jays system in a variety of roles. Before he was named manager of the RailRiders in 2021, Davis hadn't held a manager title since 2008. He has also been a minor league field coordinator for the Montreal Expos (2001) and Florida Marlins (2002, 2005). His coaching career began in the Yankees system in 1995.

A catcher and infielder in his playing days, Davis was a ninth-round selection by the California Angels in the 1984 MLB Draft. He played professionally for 11 seasons between the Angels, Rangers and Kansas City Royals organizations. He appeared in seven games in the big leagues and tallied six games in 1988 with the Angels, while appearing in one game for the Rangers in 1992. He is a native of Bloomsburg, Pennsylvania.
