This is the continuation of the Lugnuts' two-week Ohio trip following a series split at Dayton last week. The Nuts are 1-9 this year in Lake County after losing the first four games.

Last Night: Captains 6, Lugnuts 4. **Pedro Pineda** and **Myles Naylor** homered for a second straight day and Naylor added an RBI triple, but **Jackson Humphries** struck out ten in five innings and **Tommy Hawke** and **Dean Curley** each went deep to help Lake County prevail

On the Air: **Adam Jaksa** and **Jesse Goldberg-Strassler**, the Nuts' broadcast tandem since 2019, deliver the call on milb.streamguys1.com/lansing.

On Deck: The Lugnuts play in Eastlake through tomorrow, then head into the All-Star Break. The next home game is six days away, beginning a three-game mini-series July 17 through July 19 against the Fort Wayne TinCaps, opening a stretch of nine home games in ten days.

LUG-NOTES

Draft Day: With the 8th overall pick in the 2026 Draft, the Athletics selected Georgia Tech Yellow Jackets outfielder **Drew Burress**, the 2024 NCAA D1 Freshman of the Year and 2025 First Team All-America. Burress, hailing from Houston County, Ga., came out of high school as the No. 2 prospect in Georgia after winning two state championships and tying the state record for RBIs (73). Burress batted .357/.484/.720 in 179 career games at Georgia Tech, with 60 doubles, seven triples and 60 home runs, walking (160) more than he struck out (122). With the 47th selection, the A's turned to southpaw **Mason Edwards**, who struck out 169 batters in 95 2/3 IP for USC, going 8-0, 2.07 in 17 GS.

Encore Performance: **Steven Echavarria**, tonight's Nuts starter, was ranked No. 6 on Baseball America's Top 10 Hottest MLB Prospects on the hot sheet last week, noting Echavarria's 2 GS, 9 2/3 IP, 7 H, 2 ER, 2 BB and 12 K on June 30/July 5 at Dayton.

Cooperstown Bound: A member of the very first Lugnuts lineup on April 5, 1996, **Carlos Beltrán** went on to be voted 1999 American League Rookie of the Year, was named a nine-time All-Star, and won three Gold Gloves, two Silver Sluggers, the Roberto Clemente Humanitarian Award, and the 2017 World Series during a 20-year MLB career. On July 27, Beltrán will be inducted into the National Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown.

Pinch-Skipper: Lugnuts manager **Javier Godard** takes his annual break this week – each member of the coaching staff gets one week off during the year – and is replaced as interim manager by **Tim Esmay** ("Ez-may") the Athletics' quality control and field coordinator. Esmay formerly served as the head coach at Arizona State University, taking the Sun Devils to four NCAA Regionals, two Super Regionals and the 2010 College World Series, then managed Winston-Salem in 2015, Great Falls from 2017-2019, and the Arizona Complex League A's in 2024-2025.

Prospecting: The Nuts' roster has four players on MLB Pipeline's Top 30 rankings of A's prospects: No. 15 (**Steven Echavarria**), No. 17 (**Zane Taylor**), No. 22 (**Nate Nankil**) and No. 29 (**Nathan Dettmer**). Baseball America's re-ranking of A's prospects placed Echavarria at No. 16, Zane Taylor at No. 18 and **Nathan Dettmer** at No. 21.

Lugnut All-Stars: Among the 2026 MLB All-Stars are 2017 Lugnut **Vladimir Guerrero, Jr.** (Toronto Blue Jays first baseman, A.L. All-Star starter at first base, who announced he will sit out the ASG, replaced by the A's **Nick Kurtz** in the starting lineup); 2019 Nut **Otto López** (Miami Marlins shortstop, N.L. reserve); and 2022 Nut **Mason Miller** (San Diego Padres closer).

Lugnut Future Star: 2025 Lugnuts shortstop **Leo De Vries** is on the American League All-Star Futures Game roster alongside fellow Athletics prospect / Midland RockHounds southpaw **Jamie Arnold**. De Vries competed in the Futures Game last year, too, when he was in the Padres' organization... and struck out on three pitches against fellow 2025 Lugnut **Gage Jump**.

Lugnut League Leaders:

- **Zane Taylor** leads the MWL in ERA (3.43), ranks 2nd in innings (76), 2nd in WHIP (1.28) and 5th in opponent avg. (.244).
- **Samuel Dutton** is 3rd in the league in innings (75 2/3), 5th in ERA (4.76) and 9th in WHIP (1.50).
- **Steven Echavarria** is 7th in innings (70 1/3), 3rd in lowest average (.234), 4th in WHIP (1.38) and tied for 4th in starts (15).

Home Run Heroes: **Myles Naylor** and **Pedro Pineda** have homered in each of the last two games. Naylor is batting .450/.522/.950 in his last five games (9-for-20, 6 R, 2 2B, 1 3B, 2 HR, 3 BB). This is his first time with home runs in consecutive games since April 15-16, 2025 in Stockton. Pineda did not hit his first home run this year until May 31, his 18th game of the season, and his second home run did not come until July 3rd, his 38th game. Pineda is batting .379/.486/.724 through nine games in July; this is his first time with home runs in consecutive games since June 22/24, 2025 in Stockton.

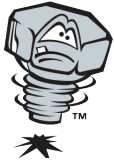

JULY 11 IN LUGNUTS HISTORY

2025: The Lugnuts drew eight walks from Dodgers prospect Maddux Bruns in 2 1/3 innings, jumped out to a 5-1 lead, and topped the Great Lakes Loons, 6-3, at Dow Diamond. Bruns hit Joshua Kuroda-Grauer with his first pitch of the game. On his second pitch, Kuroda-Grauer stole second and took third on a throwing error by catcher Frank Rodriguez, and the Lugnuts were on their way: three runs in the first on a Casey Yamauchi RBI double, a Bruns run-scoring balk and a Rodriguez run-scoring passed ball. Two innings later, Davis Diaz lined a two-run double off Bruns down the left field line to put the Lugnuts up 5-1. Lansing added one further run – via a run-scoring double play hit into by Ryan Lasko in the seventh inning – and then held on through a series of Great Lakes threats. The Loons stranded 12 runners against five Lugnuts pitchers, going 2-for-14 with runners in scoring position.

2026 Campaign: 2026 Lugnuts Opening Day starter... limited opposition to .195 avg. with 3.86 ERA in April, but allowed .260 avg. with 7.23 ERA in May, .263 avg. with 6.93 ERA in June, and .143 avg., 0.00 ERA (in 3 2/3 IP) in July... limiting lefties to .220 avg., righties to .247 (but .452 SLG)... allowing .323 avg. / .998 OPS in 1st inning... .214 avg. with bases empty, .261 with runners on base.

Gatorade, Not Gator: Echavarria posted a 0.28 ERA with 80 strikeouts in 50 innings as a senior at Millburn High School, allowing only one extra-base hit the whole season. He was named New Jersey's 2022-2023 Gatorade High School Baseball Player of the Year and the top prep prospect in the state. Initially committed to Oregon, he changed his commitment to the University of Florida as his senior year dawned, but then signed with the A's for \$3 million to head into professional baseball – the only New Jersey high schooler taken in the 2023 MLB Draft.

Pro Ball: After signing, Echavarria debuted in instructional league ball in 2023. He was slated to pitch in the 2024 Spring Breakout for the A's against the Giants, but the game was canceled due to rain. On May 2, 2024, Game 22 of the Stockton Ports' season, he made his official professional debut, starting against Visalia and working three scoreless innings before allowing two unearned run in the fourth... posted 9.00 ERA in six May starts (20 R/18 ER in 18 IP)... limited opposition to one run or fewer in nine of his final 13 starts of the year, including stretch from June 25-August 4 with just 2 ER allowed in 25 2/3 IP... best inning was the fourth inning: 3-for-26, .115 avg. against... base-stealers were successful in 11 of 13 attempts.
