NAOMI SILVER

PRESIDENT/CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER/CHIEF OPERATING OFFICER

Naomi Silver has served the ballclub as President, CEO and COO since 2010 after having previously served in various other board capacities. She oversees the day-to-day operation of the ballclub, strategic planning, government relations and various other areas of the business. She is the daughter of late Morrie E. and Anna B. Silver.

Naomi's first involvement with the Wings in the late 1980s led to her assuming her current role. Under her leadership, the Red Wings have grown to be one of the most respected Minor League organizations around.

She has been recognized nationally in the world of baseball having been named Baseball America's Minor League Executive of the Year in 2008 and the Rawlings Woman of the Year in 1994. Locally, Naomi has been recognized with the 2019 Rochester Business Journals Icon Award, the Young Women's College Prep Leadership Award in 2017, Nazareth College's Woerner Kollmorgen Award in 2016, the Public Relations Society of America's CEO of the Year in 2012, and St. John Fisher's Sports Manager of the Year in 2008. She serves on the MLB/MiLB Governance Committee, the boards of the United Way, Monroe Community College Foundation, Boys and Girls Club of Rochester, University of Rochester Medical Center, Rochester Downtown Development Corporation, Rochester Broadway Theater League, and KeyBank Advisory board. Naomi is also a member of the Frontier Field Walk of Fame and Red Wings Hall of Fame.

Naomi is the mother of two, Morrie II, 25, and Desirée, 20.

DAN MASON

GENERAL MANAGER

Dan Mason has served as General Manager of the Rochester Red Wings since 1995 while he has worked in various capacities, including Director of Group Sales, Promotions and Assistant GM, since 1990.

Under his direction, the Red Wings have been honored nationally by several outlets, including the 2008 Ongoing Excellence Award, given to organizations that consistently perform at a high level and have no need for a turnaround, by Ballpark Digest, the Baseball America Triple-A Bob Freitas Award, presented to the organization which demonstrates long-standing excellence of operations in the ballpark and front office, and the Larry MacPhail Award, in recognition of outstanding performance in the area of promotions, both in 1997. The team has also been honored with the Prism Award, exemplifying excellence in sport franchise management, by the University of Massachusetts in 2006 and the John H. Johnson President's Award, presented annually to the National Association club best exemplifying the standards of the complete baseball franchise, in 2004. Mason has been honored three times as International League Executive of the Year: 1996, 1997 and 2012.

Dan is the past president of the Rochester Press Radio Club and a former board member of McQuaid Jesuit High School, Hillside Family of Agencies and Compeer. He currently serves on the board for the Monroe County Sports Commission and Zweigles.

Dan is a 1985 graduate of McQuaid Jesuit High School in Rochester and a 1989 graduate from the University of Notre Dame. Dan and his wife Sheila have two children, Cameron, 23, and Anna, 21.

GARY LARDER

CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD

Gary Larder is the longest serving Director in Rochester Community Baseball's history and has held every Officer position, including that of President/CEO from 2000-09. He was inducted into the Red Wings Hall of Fame in 2007 and currently serves as Corporate Chairman. A charter-inductee in the Rochester chapter of the National Beta Gamma Sigma Honorary Finance Society, Gary is a retired financial executive from Xerox Corporation. He currently serves on the Executive Committee on the Board of Trustees at Houghton College. Gary was the recipient of the 2017 Bowie Kuhn Award presented to an individual, team or organization who demonstrates support of the Baseball Chapel program in professional baseball.



THE SILVER LEGACY



Local music store owner and real estate developer **MORRIE SILVER** came to the rescue of professional baseball in Rochester in the winter of 1956-57, when the St. Louis Cardinals decided to sell their fledgling Triple-A franchise. Silver, whose true passion was serving his community, organized a stock drive to buy the Red Wings and keep them in the Flower City.

There were 8,222 shareholders who purchased the club, a number that has been retired on the left-center field fence at Frontier Field, and Silver became the largest shareholder of them all. The 1957 season was the first community-owned season for the Red Wings, who remained a Cardinals affiliate through the 1960 season.

Silver became the first president of Rochester Community Baseball, Inc., running the day-to-day operation of the club. The Brighton native stayed at his post until “retiring” after the 1968 season and moving his family to Miami Beach, Florida. He was actually still at the helm over all aspects of the club while in Florida until he passed away in 1974. Red Wing Stadium, meanwhile, the home of the Red Wings since 1929, was renamed Silver Stadium on August 19, 1968.

Morrie’s wife, Anna “Bert” and his daughter Naomi, returned to Rochester in January 1975 to carry on Morrie’s legacy. Anna B. became the Chairman of the Board in 1982 and young Naomi started as an intern in 1988. Naomi’s primary task in her first year was handling stock transfers [i.e. when a deceased grandparent passes on his stock to a son or grandson]. Then in 1989, Naomi took over the operation of the team souvenir store.

Naomi would later work in the accounting department and in concessions, eventually forming a separate concessions entity in 1994, Rochester Community Baseball Enterprises. She also became the Red Wings’ voting member for the International League in 1993, the same year she began a lobbying effort for a new ballpark that would replace Silver Stadium. Frontier Field would later open in 1997, and the street along the west side of the ballpark was re-named Morrie Silver Way. Over the years, she continued to oversee accounting, the team store, office personnel, and the relationship with the Red Wings’ parent club, the Baltimore Orioles. Her son, Morrie Silver II, has also joined the organization in an official capacity as the Director of Communications & Baseball Information, a position he has held since the beginning of the 2022 season.

Naomi further continued her father’s legacy by serving as Vice President of the Board of Directors from 1989-99 and then as Chairman of the Board from 2000-10. She became the Red Wings’ President/Chief Executive Officer/Chief Operating Officer in 2010, a position she still holds to this day, overseeing all aspects of the club.

A statue featuring Morrie and a young baseball player stands in the courtyard that leads to the main entrance of Frontier Field, providing a permanent memorial of the civic leader and a meeting place for fans. The bronze figures, commissioned by sculptor Dejan Pejovic, was dedicated on July 25, 2007 in a ceremony that included Hall of Fame Manager Earl Weaver, Rochester’s Mr. Baseball Joe Altobelli, International League President Randy Mobley, and several political dignitaries from the city, county, and state.

Morrie’s legacy also is remembered on an annual basis with the Morrie Silver Family Scholarship. The scholarships are awarded by the Silver Family to employees of the Red Wings who are pursuing a full-time course study at an accredited 2- or 4-year college, university, or vocational school. Each applicant is considered on the basis of academic achievement, financial need, extracurricular activities, job performance and recommendations from supervisors. The selected recipients each receive \$5,000. Those employees who are selected for the scholarship show exemplary work ethic, solid academic achievement and a desire to continue their education to accomplish their goals.

Morrie was a charter inductee to the Red Wings Hall of Fame in 1989, 15 years after his passing. Anna Bert was inducted in 1998 and Naomi in 2007.



SEASON NOTES

- 🌀 **ROCHESTER SHOWED UP:** The Red Wings filled 432,580 seats this season at home, the most since 2019 (pre-pandemic) when 451,857 fans took in a ballgame...
 - 🌀 This mark includes a homestand that saw 47,901 fans come through the Frontier Field turnstiles from June 28 - July 3, the largest figure for a six-game homestand since 2019.
 - 🌀 Three home games had 10,000+ fans...2019 saw six such games.
 - 🌀 The highest attendance figure was recorded on June 4th when 10,635 fans took in a doubleheader, watching RHP Cade Cavalli work a one-run complete game in the first leg, winning 5-1, followed by the Wings losing game two by a score of 13-0...a day when the Wings went without a single extra-base hit.
 - 🌀 The Red Wings returned to Frontier Field on April 5 for their home opener and battled the Buffalo Bisons in front of 8,170 fans, the largest Opening Day attendance figure at Frontier Field since 2017's crowd of 11,343.

- 🌀 **ALL WE DO IS WIN...KINDA:** The Wings finished with a 67-81 record...The 67 wins are the most since 2019 when Joel Skinner's squad collected 70...since moving into Frontier Field in 1997, the Wings have posted 12 losing records...
 - 🌀 This marks the first time they have had exactly 67 wins since 1994 when they went 67-74 under manager Bob MISCIK.

- 🌀 **STREAKY BIRD:** The Wings went on a 9-game win streak from 5/7-5/15, for the first time since 1992, tying Columbus for the second-longest win streak among Minor League clubs in the 2022 season...the Red Wings outscored their opponents 57-28 during the streak...meanwhile, Rochester's bullpen surrendered just eight earned runs over 41.1 innings of work (1.74 ERA).

- 🌀 **HISTORIC LOSING STREAK:** Rochester also had a franchise-record losing streak of 19 games from 7/16-8/10...the MLB record in the modern two-league era is 23 losses, which was achieved by the 1961 Philadelphia Phillies...during the streak:
 - 🌀 The Red Wings were outscored 129-74, and out-homered 27-19.
 - 🌀 16 of the 19 losses had been decided by three runs or less.
 - 🌀 Rochester ranked second to last in the International League in AVG (.235).
 - 🌀 Red Wings pitchers allowed the most earned runs (112) in the International League.
 - 🌀 The club was tied for the third-most errors (15) and had five multi-error games.

- 🌀 **A BETTER STREAK:** The Wings collected an extra-base hit in their first 51 games of the season, good enough for the fourth longest such streak in the International League this season...
 - 🌀 Rochester also collected a run in 51 consecutive games, not being shut out between April 6 - June 4...this was tied for the eighth longest streak in IL.

- 🌀 The Wings collected a walk in 70 consecutive games from June 15 - September 7, the seventh longest walk streak in the IL.
- 🌀 Rochester's 10-straight games without an error was tied for the second longest streak among IL teams, two off Indianapolis's 12-straight games of clean baseball.

- 🌀 **THE 700 CLUB:** Manager **MATT LECROY** eclipsed 700 managerial wins in 2022 when his Red Wings squad defeated Scranton/WB on June 17...the 11-year Minor League manager would accumulate 730 managerial wins by the season's end...LeCroy has collected 121 wins with Low-A Hagerstown, 68 wins with High-A Potomac, 425 wins with Double-A Harrisburg and 116 wins with Triple-A Rochester.
 - 🌀 LeCroy, in two seasons with Rochester, has amassed a 117-158 record (.425 win %)
 - 🌀 The former ACC Freshman of the year is the first Red Wings manager to post two losing consecutive losing records since Tom Nieto navigated the 2010 and 2011 Red Wing teams to a 53-91 and 49-95 record, respectively.
 - 🌀 Should the Wings finish under .500 in 2023 under LeCroy, he would join Athur Irwin in 1918-20 as the only manager in Rochester baseball history to post three seasons with records under .500.

- 🌀 **IL PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** Red Wings shortstop **LUIS GARCIA** was named the International League Player of the Week by the league on April 18th for his 4/12 - 17 effort, when he led the IL in hits (14), batting average (.519), and total bases (23) while slashing .519/.519/.852...the 14 hits picked up in the series against Buffalo was good enough to rank first in all of Minor League Baseball... after the shortstop failed to reach base on 4/19 against Lehigh Valley, his streak of reaching base in every game this season ended, along with his hit-streak which was capped at eight games.

- 🌀 **YOU PLAY IN A GAME AND YOU PLAY IN A GAME AND...:** When **ONIX VEGA** stepped to the plate on September 18th, he became the 78th player to have appeared in a game for Rochester which set the new franchise record for the fourth consecutive season...the Wings would go on to use a total of 81 players in 2022.
 - 🌀 The Red Wings ended the season having made 195 player transactions, also setting a franchise record.
 - 🌀 36 different players appeared for both the Red Wings and Washington Nationals in 2022 including four players who made their Major League debut.
 - 🌀 Vega, on the night he became the 78th player while also making his Triple-A debut, went 4-for-5 with a double.

- 🌀 **BIG RINGS:** The Red Wings Opening Day roster featured three World Series Champions...RHP **TYLER CLIPPARD** ('17 with HOU) and RHP **CARL EDWARDS JR.** ('16 with CHI-NL) joined OF **ANDREW STEVENSON** ('19 with WSH) as players with rings...Edwards, Jr. logged 2.2 IP in the 2016 Fall Classic, surrendering two runs, both earned, on four hits while striking out and walking a pair...Clippard, who was left off the 2017 roster, has found himself on the mound during the World Series but as a member of the losing Mets in 2015, where he appeared in

three games, allowing two earned runs on one hit, two base on balls, and a pair of strikeouts...Stevenson also was left off the World Series roster but did appear in the 2019 NL Wild Card game as a pinch runner, scoring on the infamous misplay by Milwaukee's outfield on a Juan Soto single which would eventually send the Nationals on to the divisional round of the playoffs and ultimately a World Series Championship.

🌀 **NO JEWELRY THIS YEAR:** With their September 10 loss, the Red Wings were mathematically eliminated from playoff contention as they fell to 58-76 on the year, ...this marks the 8th consecutive season the Wings have missed the playoffs, the second-longest playoff drought since at least 1933.

🌀 Following the Wings' Governors Cup Championship in 1997, the 2006 Wings were the next team to clinch a playoff bid, marking nine seasons without postseason play...the only span longer than the current drought.

🌀 Rochester held at least a share of first place in the International League-East for 40 days.

🌀 **SCARY HOURS:** Since 2005, the Red Wings are 10-4 on the ever-haunting Friday the 13th...on May 13, the Wings picked up a 6-4 win in Worcester, moving the club to 4-3 in Friday games and giving them their 10th win on Friday the 13th since 2005...RHP Jefry Rodriguez would get the start for Rochester (4.2 IP, 3 ER) and is listed at 6'6" tall, the same height as horror movie icon, Michael Myers.

🌀 **NO HOMER, NO WIN:** 20 games into the campaign the Wings posted a perfect 10-0 record when they hit a home run...conversely Rochester was also 0-10 when their offense keeps the ball in the yard during that 20 game stretch...

🌀 This streak would end a day later on 4/29, when Andrew Stevenson went deep in a 6-4 loss to the Mets.

🌀 **DECKED OUT BIRDS:** Three Red Wings received International League recognition this season...SS **LUIS GARCIA** won IL of the Week, RHP **CADE CAVALLI** was awarded IL Pitcher of the Week, and 3B **JAKE ALU** was named IL Player of the Month.

🌀 SS **LUIS GARCIA** was named the International Player of the Week on April 17 after leading the league in hits (14), batting average (.519), and total bases over the six game span from April 12-17...Garcia racked up two doubles, two triples, a home run to go along with five RBIs.

🌀 RHP **CADE CAVALLI** was awarded Pitcher of the Week on July 10 after allowing just two hits and striking out seven through seven innings on July 7 at LHV...Cavalli had retired the first 17 batters he faced in the outing, in a start that matched his longest of the year (three times).

🌀 3B **JAKE ALU** batted .409/.442/.761 and led the league in RBIs (25), total bases (67), slugging percentage (.761) and OPS (1.203) in the month of September...he ranked second among International League hitters in average (.409), hits (36) and home runs (7) and was fourth in doubles (8) and runs (21) over that span...Alu recorded 13 multi-hit games and hit safely in his last 14 games of the year.

- 🌀 **THRUWAY CUP CHAMPS:** The Red Wings secured the Thruway Cup for the 2022 season after owning a 25-19 record against Buffalo and Syracuse despite finishing four spots behind Buffalo in the International League-East.
- 🌀 Despite going 10-10 against Buffalo, the Wings out-homered the Bisons 18-14 in their 20 contests...the Wings were outscored by Toronto's top affiliate 99-92.
 - 🌀 Their 18 home runs against the Bisons ranks as the third most against any one opponent, having hit more against Syracuse (26) and Lehigh Valley (19).
 - 🌀 The Wings collected 136 runs to Syracuse's 101 scored in their 26 matchups...Rochester tripled nine times in their series against Syracuse while the Mets were able to collect a single three-bagger.
- 🌀 **PUNCHING TICKETS:** Under new pitching coaching **RAFAEL CHAVES**, Red Wings pitchers struck out a total of 1,341 batters, recording a new franchise record surpassing their 2019 total of 1,285 which they accomplished in 140 games...the 2022 squad recorded 1,291 in 141 games played, setting the new record with 9 games left in their season.
- 🌀 Their 2022 strikeout total was good enough for seventh most among International League teams, 80 punchouts behind first place Gwinnett (ATL).
 - 🌀 RHP **CADE CAVALLI** ranked 20th on the IL strikeout leaderboard with 104 tickets punched, two spots ahead of his teammate RHP **LOGAN VERRETT** who registered 102...the next closest Wing was LHP **ALBERTO BALDONADO** who ranked 53rd with 81.
 - 🌀 Through the first series of the year, Rochester led the IL, striking out 77 batters while walking just 18 in the season-opening set in Toledo.
 - 🌀 Their game-high strikeout total for their squad was recorded during the Toledo series when they punched out 19 Mud Hens on 4/7 in an 11 inning contest.
 - 🌀 Their 9-inning game-high for strikeouts was 18 strikeouts, which came against Syracuse on June 23 when they used seven arms to pick up the 10-9 win...this marked the most in a nine-inning game for Rochester since at least 2005.
 - 🌀 The Wings would collect the third most strikeouts among IL teams in the months of June (254) and August (252) while ranking dead last in the month of September (176).
 - 🌀 Cavalli and Verrett accounted for 23% of the strikeouts in June and 15% in August.
 - 🌀 The Wings collected 62 games where they struck out 10 or more batters in a game.
 - 🌀 From August 9 - 25, the Wings struck out nine or more batters in 15-straight games...if you remove their seven-strikeout performance on 8/26, the Wings would have stretched their streak to 18 consecutive games with 9+ strikeouts.
 - 🌀 Over their 8/9 - 8/25 stretch, they recorded a total of 159 strikeouts across those 15 games for an average of 10.6 punch outs a game.

- 🌀 **SMOOTH CRIMINAL:** Rochester's 153 stolen bases as a team is the franchise's second most in a season, 27 off their record of 180 which they accomplished in 1944.
- 🌀 **ANDREW STEVENSON** led the team with 39 stolen bases on the year, one away from being the first Wing to steal 40 bases since Dallas Williams stole 51 in 1981.
 - 🌀 The Wings stole 153 bases and were caught 38 times, good for a 80.1% success rate.
 - 🌀 Their 153 swipes rank 6th in the International League, 39 behind first place Nashville (MIL).
- 🌀 **CRASHING IN INDY:** After the Wings dropped their lone series in Indianapolis (2-4) this season, the Wings have extended their series winless streak at Victory Field to 15 seasons, having not come away with a series victory since 2005 when they went 3-1 in a four-game set...the three winning pitchers from that series were Willie Eyre, Dave Gassner and Boof Bonser.
- 🌀 **FIRST HALF SOUTHPAW KILLERS:** The Wings posted an International League-best batting average versus southpaws prior to the All-Star break (90 games), batting .285 (241-for-847) and posting a 17-14 record when their opponent started a lefty on the hill, compared to a .246 (531-for-2160) batting average and 30-29 record versus right-handers.
- 🌀 The Wings would finish the year hitting .261 (355-for-1,358) and collect just two additional wins against lefty starters in the remaining 59 games, finishing with a 19-28 record when their opponent started a southpaw.
- 🌀 **THURS-YAY:** The Wings posted a 15-9 record on Thursdays, their best single-day record and one of two days when they posted a record above .500 (Sunday 13-11)...Rochester posted the most hits (234) of any International League team on Thursday's and ranked second in batting average, hitting at a .280 clip (234-for-836).
- 🌀 Heading into the All-Star break, Rochester ranked second in hits (148), total bags (253), and RBIs (93) while holding the crown for swiped bags (22) in the International League on Thursdays.
- 🌀 **2-OUT RAKERS:** Rochester posted a league-best batting average (.263, 432-for-1642) and hit total (432) with two outs...the Wings' 99 doubles with two outs in an inning is good enough for second most in the International League, just two of first place Indianapolis.
- 🌀 Entering the All-Star break, Rochester's 419 total bases and 56 doubles with two outs was good for fourth-most in the IL.
- 🌀 **OUR WORST NIGHTMARE:** Lehigh Valley slugger **DARICK HALL** logged eight homers against the Red Wings in his 17 games played, collecting 22 RBIs in the process...the lefty hit 28 homers in Triple-A in 2022...between Triple-A and MLB, Hall had homered off the Nationals or their farm hands 12 times in 25 games (four in MLB, eight in Triple-A).

🌀 **FOUR STRIKEOUTS, ONE INNING:** RHP **LOGAN VERRETT** struck out four batters in a single inning on May 12 against Worcester after the first strikeout of the inning allowed Ronaldo Hernandez to reach first base...after recording three more strikeouts in the bottom of the second, Verrett became the first Red Wing to record four punchouts in a single inning since Jeff Manship did it on July 17, 2012 against Norfolk, with one of those victims being former Red Wings outfielder, Lew Ford (played 95 games with ROC from '03-'07).

🌀 **SHOW TIME CARL:** Right-hander **CARL EDWARDS JR.** had his contract selected by the Washington Nationals on May 10 after he dominated International League hitters, posting a 0.63 ERA on his way to retiring the last 15 batters he faced with Rochester (26 of last 28) through his 13 appearances with Rochester.

🌀 **NO NEW FRIENDS:** The Rochester Red Wings faced off against the St. Paul Saints, the Triple-A affiliate of the Minnesota Twins which was a title the Red Wings claimed for 17 seasons (18 years including '20)...the Saints' roster features five former Red Wings, including two coaches, who combine for 333 games played in a Wings uniform...Saints Manager and 2020 Red Wings Manager (COVID) Toby Gardenhire leads the group with 153 games played in a Red Wings uniform, having done so during the 2010 and 2011 seasons...Virgil Vasquez, Gardenhire's pitching coach, appeared in 16 games for the Red Wings during 2013-14...Jake Cave (107 games), John Andreoli (43 games), Caleb Hamilton (11 games), and recently-acquired Aaron Sanchez (3 games) round out the group who will be looking to inflict damage upon their former home...Co-Pitching Coach Cibney Bello also spent

🌀 **APRIL SHOWERS BRING MAY FLOWERS:** Red Wings pitchers went 12-11 in 23 April games, finishing with a 5.53 ERA, their highest ERA in a single month all season...over 197.0 innings pitched, the Wings gave up 194 hits, as 128 runs scored, 121 of which were earned..the Red Wings walked 114, 10 more than any other month...

🌀 Over 22.2 innings pitched, RHP **JACKSON TETREULT** pitched to a 5.56 ERA, while RHP Cade Cavalli posted a 6.23 ERA over 17.1 in four starts...RHP **LUIS REYES** gave up 22 runs over 12.1 innings pitched over four starts, an ERA of 15.32. RHP **JEFY RODRIGUEZ** allowed 12 to score over 13.0 innings pitched, a 8.31 ERA.

🌀 In total, these four starters posted a 8.25 ERA in 17 April starts and 64.4 innings.

🌀 **THE START OF THE END:** After going 35-19 in the first two months of the season and winning six of their nine series, the Wings would leave St. Paul on June 7 and start their historic downfall not winning a series again until mid-September...including their St. Paul series, the Wings would go on to go 2-9-6 in series to finish the year.

- 🌀 **CHASING HISTORY: ANDREW STEVENSON** picked up a pair of hits in a win on 9/24, including a triple, collecting his 149th and 150th hits of the year...his second knock of the day marked him as being the first Wing to collect 150 hits since James Beresford collected 153 in 2015...he would collect a hit in the final two games to finish the campaign with 152 knocks, just one shy of Beresford's mark.
- 🌀 Since 1960 (61 seasons), only two Wings have reached 170 hits in a season when Ozzie Virgil and Pete Ward collected 179 hits in 1963 and 1962, respectively.
 - 🌀 152 hits are the highest season hit total for Stevenson in his eight years of professional baseball.
- 🌀 **TRIPLE-TRIPLE:** Among his pair of knocks in the 9/24 win, LF **ANDREW STEVENSON** crushed a three-bagger, giving the Wings 38 on the year, good enough for second-most among International League teams...Rochester's 38 triples as a team is the most since 2009 when that Rochester squad had 40, ranking atop all IL teams...
- 🌀 The 2021 Wings had just 15 three-baggers.
- 🌀 **ANDREW HOMER-SON: ANDREW STEVENSON** posted career-high power numbers this season, hitting his 16th and final home run of the season on 9/22 in a win over Buffalo...with his homer coming off of RHP Casey Lawrence, 15 of the lefty's 16 long balls came against right-handed pitching, the most of any Red Wings this season, and just one shy from tying former Wings' OF Daniel Palka's total vs. righties last season.
- 🌀 **BEEN SEARCHING FOR THIS FEELING AGAIN:** With a win on 9/16 at home against Lehigh Valley, the Wings won five-straight games, a feat they accomplished just twice this season...the other came on 5/15, which was the final five games of a nine-game win streak...this marks their second-longest winning streak of the year, only behind that nine-game stretch from May 7 - 15.
- 🌀 With the win on May 15, the Wings clinched a series victory against the IronPigs...this marks the first series win for Rochester since they beat Buffalo four games to two in their 5/30-6/5 series (1-8-6 since).
- 🌀 **LIKE JORDAN '96, '97:** CF **ANDREW STEVENSON** and 2B **JECKSSON FLORES** collected back-to-back triples in the third inning of a loss to Syracuse on September 10, which marked the first time the Wings have done so since June 20th, 2008 when Denard Span and Jason Pridie did it against an Indianapolis Indians team which featured young prospect Andrew McCutchen...the Wings also lost that game by a one-run margin, 8-7...
- 🌀 This marked the Wings fourth multi-triple game of the year and first since 7/28.
 - 🌀 Stevenson recorded his 20th triple at the Triple-A level which came in his 365th game.
 - 🌀 This was Flores' second triple at this level which came in his 205th Triple-A game.
 - 🌀 At the time, the Wings held on to second place in the three-bagger category among IL teams with 33... they would finish the season in second place.

🌀 **I GOT FIVE 20 ON IT:** With his third-inning two-run bomb on July 26, 1B **JOEY MENESES** became the fastest Red Wing to reach 20 home runs in a season since Chris Colabello did so in just 69 games in 2013...the veteran is just three home runs away from his career-high of 23 bombs from his 2018 MVP-season...Meneses ended up finishing the July 26 contest going 2-for-5 with three RBI, marking his 27th multi-hit game this season (second most on club, Stevenson, 30)...the Mexico native ranked second in the International League in the home run category at the time, just one back of League Leader Tristan Gray (21, DUR)...

🌀 Meneses is the first player in the Nationals' affiliation era to hit 20 homers in a season for Rochester.

🌀 **LUIS VUITTON GARCIA:** Infielder **LUIS GARCIA** recorded an RBI in eight consecutive games, from May 5 - May 14, when he collected 12 total during the stretch...

🌀 The streak tied for second longest in the International League.

🌀 This is the longest RBI streak for a Red Wings since 2016 when Kennys Vargas collected an RBI in nine games (13 total).

🌀 **NOTHIN' BUT A 'G 'P THANG:** In a contest on 7/27, where the Wings donned the Cocos Locos identity, **JOSH PALACIOS** infield single in the third-inning extended his on-base streak to 28 games and his hit-streak to 15 games...both were the longest active streaks in the International League at the time...

🌀 Palacios's hitting streak would end at 18 games (25-for-69) which ranked as the second longest in the IL at the season's end while his on-base would end at 31 games, the 6th longest such streak in the IL.

🌀 **BLUE FACE, JOEY: JOEY MENESES'** fourth-inning base knock on July 22 marked his 100th hit of the season, good for second in the International League for hits through 91 games...this was his fourth year in affiliated ball with 100 hits in a season...in 10 years in affiliated baseball, Meneses has amassed 981 hits (909 in MiLB, 72 in MLB).

🌀 **KNOCKS:** It took the Red Wings just 86 games before two players amassed 90+ hits on the year (**JOEY MENESES, ANDREW STEVENSON**)...the 2021 Wings team finished the season with only two players with 90+ hits and it took 126 games for them to achieve this feat, making this year's accomplishment occur in 40 less games...the 2022 squad also has six different players with more than 60 knocks on the year (all at Triple-A level) compared to the 2021 squad's three.

🌀 The Wings would finish with three players collect 100 hits with Rochester as **JAKE NOLL** registering exactly 100 hits in his 103 games played before an injury ended his 2022 campaign.

- 🌀 **ONE FINAL RIDE:** Lehigh Valley sent RHP **AARON BARRETT** to the mound on the Fourth of July in his final game of his career...Barrett retires after 12 years of professional baseball, eight in MiLB and four in the Big Leagues (all w/ WSH)...the righty was also a member of the 2019 Nationals World Series team...the veteran spent last season with the Red Wings, posting a 2.22 ERA in over 24.1 innings of work.
- 🌀 **COMPLETE CAVALLI:** RHP **CADE CAVALLI** went the distance in game one of a doubleheader on June 4, allowing just a single run on five hits while striking out 10, throwing 93 pitches with 64 registering for strikes...Cavalli's 10-strikeout performance was the first since the Nationals became Rochester's Big League affiliate.
- 🌀 This would be the only complete game by a Red Wing in 2022.
- 🌀 **WELCOME TO ROC, RILEY:** In his first game after being optioned to Rochester on July 1, Wings C **RILEY ADAMS** went 2-for-4 with a homer and RBI-double...the 26-year-old was 0-for-3 in his one game with the Wings last season...despite only appearing in a Red Wings uniform for one game in 2021 following a trade (from TOR, for B. Hand), the California-native is familiar with the friendly confines of Frontier Field, having spent his 2020 summer there at the Blue Jays Alternate site (COVID).
- 🌀 The righty bat would finish the season hitting .224 (24-for-107) with four homers and 17 RBI...16 of Adam's 24 hits came with two out in the inning.
- 🌀 He posted a .286 (14-for-49) clip with three homers, five doubles and eight runs scored in his 13 games in the month of July after being optioned.

2022 TEAM AWARDS

MOST VALUABLE PLAYER & MOST POPULAR PLAYER

ANDREW STEVENSON

Andrew Stevenson led the Red Wings in nearly every offensive category, ranking first in games (135), hits (152), triples (9), doubles (31), walks (46), and ranked second with 16 home runs. The lefty's 152 hits were good enough to lead the International League as well, the first Wing to lead the IL in hits since Matt Hague's 149 hits led the league in 2017. Stevenson is one of only three Red Wings to lead the IL in hits since 1998, and the outfielder's 135 games played are the most since Matt Hague's 136 in 2017.



MOST CIVIC MINDED PLAYER

ADRIAN SANCHEZ

Adrian Sanchez was named the the Red Wings Most Civic Minded Player after the Venezuelan native led the team in community enagment appearences. Sanchez attended numerous meet and greets around the Rochester area and frequently posted his time in the community on his own personal social media channels. For the first time in his career, the infielder read books in English, his second language, to numerous summer camps and schools. He also spent time volunteering his baseball knowledge to various Little Leagues and youth baseball organizations.

On the field, in his 15th year with the Nationals organization, Sanchez recorded 59 hits, 17 doubles, and played six different positions in his 80 games played. The righty hit .353 (6-for-17) in the month of May and his 59 hits in a season were just five knocks off his career-high at the Triple-A level.

HALL OF FAME

RED WINGS HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES

Former first baseman Justin Morneau and long-time beat writer, Jim Mandelaro became the 101st and 102nd members of the Rochester Red Wings Hall of Fame on July 26th, 2022. The two were inducted prior to the Wings' 7:05 matchup against Scranton-W/B.

JUSTIN MORNEAU

One of the first marquee players in the Twins Era of Red Wings Baseball, the Canadian-born first baseman hit 38 home runs in his two seasons in Rochester as one of the most feared sluggers of his time in the International League. In 2003 and 2004, he played 143 games for the Red Wings and hit .288 with 34 doubles and 105 RBI, and was named to the Triple-A All Star team in 2004. Morneau played 14 seasons in the Major leagues for the Twins, Pirates, Rockies and White Sox. A four-time All Star, he won the American League Most Valuable Player Award in 2006 with the Twins and led the National League in batting average with the Rockies in 2014. Morneau also won the 2008 All-Star Game Home Run Derby and was inducted into the Canadian Baseball Hall of Fame in 2022.

JIM MANDELARO

The Webster Schroeder and St. John Fisher graduate spent 24 years as a beat writer (1991-2014) covering the Red Wings for the Democrat and Chronicle. Mandelaro is a three-time winner of the New York State Associated Press award for outstanding sports feature writing, a two-time winner of the Rochester Press-Radio Club Sportswriter of the Year Award and a 2007 Inductee into the Frontier Field Walk of Fame. He and fellow Red Wings Hall of Famer Scott Pitoniak wrote the book *Silver Seasons*, the definitive historical record of the Red Wings.

DEBUTS**

MAJOR LEAGUE DEBUTS

The Washington Nationals promoted four players from Triple-A Rochester to make their Major League Debut this year. A #1 pitching prospect and a 10-year MiLB veteran highlighted the debuts and made for special moments, Red Wings and Nationals fans alike.

CADE CAVALLI

DEBUT: 8/26 VS. CIN, 4.1 IP, 6 H, 7 ER, 6 SO, 2 BB

The Nationals consensus number one pitching prospect made his highly anticipated debut on August 26th after shining for the Red Wings in 2022.

In 20 starts with the Red Wings, Cavalli threw 97 innings and worked to a 3.71 ERA with 104 strikeouts. His four quality starts ranks second among all Wings pitchers.

The 2019 first round selection by the Nationals worked to a 2.10 ERA over his last 13 starts and a 1.47 ERA over his last seven starts with the Wings before being promoted in August.

Cavalli would make one start with the Nationals, (June 26) against the Cincinnati Reds, striking out six in his 4.1 inning of work, before landing on the Injured List for the remainder of the season.



JOEY MENESES

DEBUT: 8/2 at NYM, 1-for-4, HR

After spending 10 years in the minors, the 30-year old broke into the Big Leagues with a blast, homering in his Major League debut against the New York Mets on August 2nd.

Meneses returned to his 2018 IL MVP ways as he logged 107 hits in 96 games played with the Red Wings to begin his 2022 campaign. Among those 107 hits came 20 home runs and 14 doubles from the righty. His 28 multi-hit games ranked second on the Rochester squad.

After ranking at the top of the International League in nearly every offensive category, the slugger would go on to become the 1st Mexican-born player to homer in his Major League debut when he simultaneously collected his first Big League knock off Mets RHP Yoan Lopez.

Meneses would go on to record 72 hits with the Nationals, along with 13 home runs in 56 games played. His 72 hits through his first 56 games are the most by any rookie through his first 52 games in franchise history (MON/WSH). The righty led the Nationals in hits (72), total bases (125), doubles (14), home runs (13), RBI (34), batting average (.324), slugging (.563), and on-base plus slugging .930 after the All-Star break.



ISRAEL PINEDA

DEBUT: 9/11 at PHI, 0-for-3, BB, R

The 22-year old spent only six games in a Red Wings uniform before being called up to the Nationals on September 9th.

Pineda's Triple-A debut was his most memorable game in a Wings uniform, as the Venezuela native went 2-for-3 with a home run, double, five RBI, and two walks in his first game in Triple-A.

The righty would pick up three more RBI in his five other games with the Wings.

In his time with the Nationals, Pineda would appear in four games, picking up his first Big League hit in the season finale on October 5th against the New York Mets off RHP Trevor Williams.

Both Red Wings hitters to make their debut this season picked up their first career hit off the New York Mets.



JACKSON TETREAULT

DEBUT: 6/14 VS. ATL, 4 IP, 9 H, 7 ER, 2 SO, BB

Jackson Tetreault made his Major League debut on June 14th after starting 12 games for the Red Wings, where he worked to a 5-3 record. The 52 strikeouts and 24 walks over his 58 innings pitched in Triple-A helped guide the Wings to a 8-4 team record in games started by the righty. Tetreault recorded two quality starts for the Wings during his time.

Tetreault would go on to start 4 games with the Nationals collecting a 2-2 record with 5.14 ERA in 21 innings pitched. He would land on the Injured List on July 4th, ending his season.

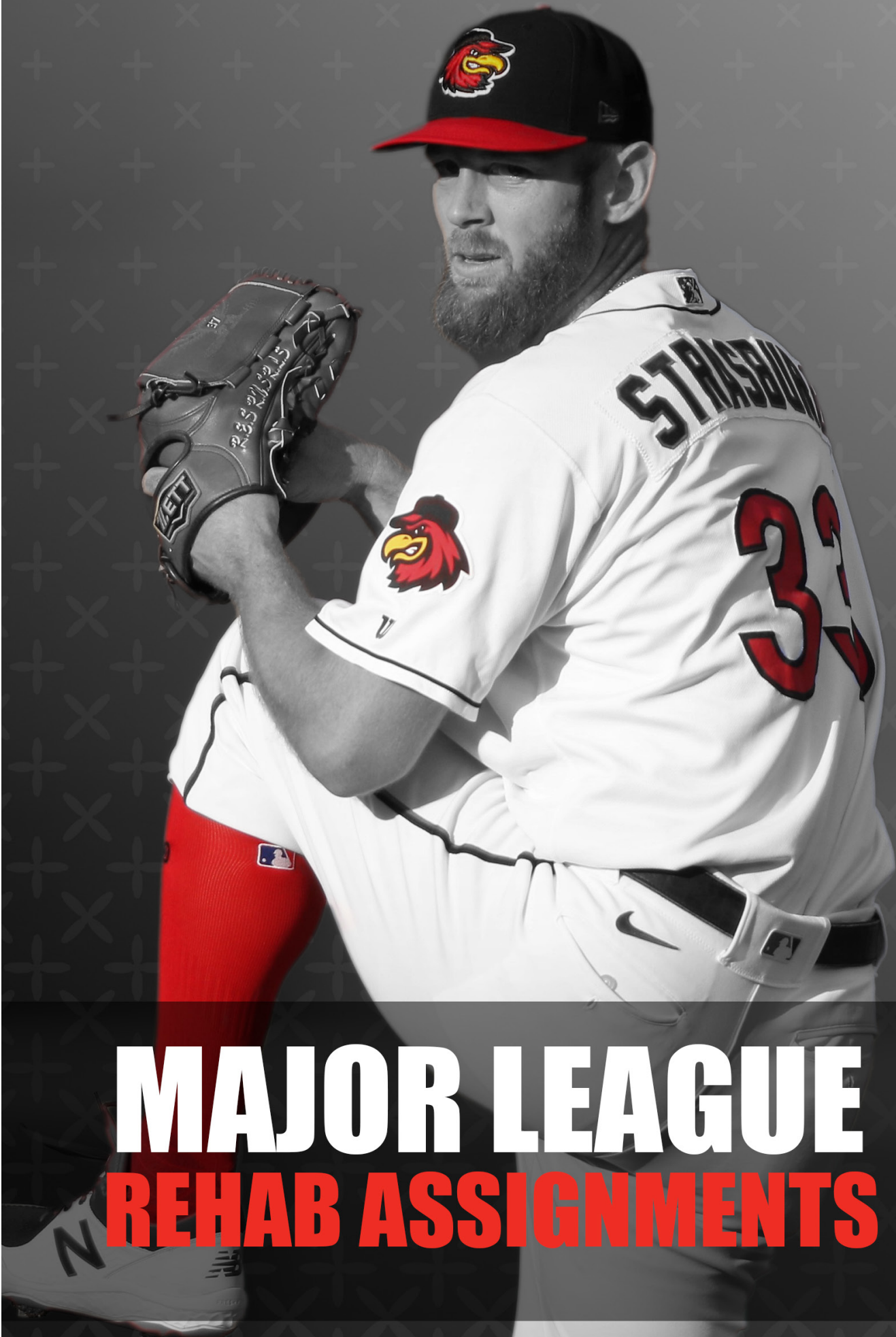

MAJOR LEAGUE REHAB ASSIGNMENTS

The Washington Nationals sent 11 Major League players on Rehab Assignment to Triple-A Rochester. Stephen Strasburg's rehab start highlighted the group as the righty drew a crowd of 10,510 on June 3rd, which marked the first crowd over 10,000 since 2019. Strasburg was joined by Ehire Adrianza, Alcides Escobar, Erick Fedde, Anibal Sanchez, and Will Harris as World Series Champions to appear with the Red Wings via Major League Rehab assignment in 2022.

EHIRE ADRIANZA - INF

Ehire Adrianza appeared in five games for the Red Wings on a Major League Rehab Assignment (5/30 - 6/5). The infielder went 5-for-17 with a homer and double, tallying four RBI during his stint with Rochester.

Adrianza was a familiar face to Rochester fans as he had played in 10 games with the Red Wings in 2017 when the Minnesota Twins affiliation brought him to the friendly confines of Frontier Field.

The Venezuela native would play in 31 games with the Nationals this year before being traded back to his Atlanta Braves team for second baseman Trey Harris.



VICTOR ARANO - RHP

Right-handed pitcher Victor Arano appeared in three games for the Red Wings during his Major League Rehab Assignment. The Mexico native finished with three innings pitched, not surrendering a hit while striking out five.

Arano went on to appear in 43 games for Washington, all in relief, working to a 4.50 ERA, allowing 21 earned runs in 42 innings of work while striking out 44.

ALCIDES ESCOBAR - INF

Alcides Escobar joined the Red Wings via Major League Rehab Assignment in Scranton, PA where he appeared in four games which was kicked off by a home run in his first at-bat.

Escobar would go 3-for-12 with a homer, double, and two RBI during his short stint with Rochester before being recalled on June 21.

Escobar would hit .218 (27-for-124) in 42 games with the Nationals before being released on August 3rd.

MAJOR LEAGUE REHAB ASSIGNMENTS

ERICK FEDDE - RHP

Right-handed pitcher Erick Fedde logged one rehab start with Rochester this year, throwing four innings of scoreless baseball in Worcester, MA on August 17th. The righty logged four strikeouts in his 63 pitch (37 strikes) outing.

Fedde would be activated on 8/23 and return to the Nationals where he would finish his Big League campaign logging 127 innings in 27 starts, working to a 6-13 record and 5.81 ERA.

MACKENZIE GORE - LHP

After being traded to Washington as part of the Juan Soto blockbuster Trade Deadline deal, Mackenzie Gore made his National's organization debut with the Red Wings on September 11th. The lefty logged four starts in a Red Wings uniform, totaling 12 innings pitched, allowing seven earned runs on 16 hits. Gore pitched against four different opponents in his rehab starts before being activated following the conclusion of the Big League season on October 6th.

The former number one pitching prospect finished the year going 4-4 with a 4.50 ERA and 72 strikeouts in 16 starts at the Big League level with the San Diego Padres prior to being acquired by the Nationals.



WILL HARRIS - RHP

World Series Champion Will Harris appeared in six games with the Red Wings via Major League Rehab Assignment working 4.1 innings allowing five runs on eight hits during his July 27 - August 21 assignment.

The 2006 MLB Draft pick pitched 5.1 total innings (1 IP in Single-A, 4.1 in Triple-A) in 2022.

JOSH ROGERS - LHP

Lefty throwing Josh Rogers made two rehab starts with Rochester in 2022, going 8.2 innings allowing nine runs on 10 hits before being optioned to Rochester on July 23.

Rogers would make one additional start for the Red Wings where he allowed six runs on eight hits in 3.2 innings of work and was subsequently designated for assignment on August 2nd.

The Miami Marlins would claim the lefty and option him to Triple-A Jacksonville where he finished the season going 4-4 with a 4.75 in nine starts with his new organization.

Rogers finished the 2022 season going 2-2 with a 5.13 in 16 games in the Big Leagues with the Washington Nationals.

MAJOR LEAGUE REHAB ASSIGNMENTS

ANIBAL SANCHEZ - RHP

Anibal Sanchez made three rehab starts for the Red Wings during his 6/28 - 7/8 stint where he logged 12.2 innings of work allowing six earned runs on 12 hits. The righty struck out 13 and walked eight in his three outings, recording his best outing in the last of his three starts going 5.1 innings surrendering just one earned run on July 8 against Lehigh Valley.

The 16-year MLB veteran finished the season with Washington going 4-6 with a 4.06 ERA and ranked sixth among Nationals pitchers with 69.1 innings pitched.

DEE STRANGE-GORDON - INF

Dee Strange-Gordon joined the Red Wings on April 26th via Major League Rehab Assignment and appeared in five games going 3-for-18 with a double and two RBI.

Dee, the brother of former Red Wings infielder Nick Gordon, rejoined the Nationals on May 3rd before being designated for assignment and released on June 19th. The utility man was then re-signed by Washington to a Minor League deal on July 18th before being released again on August 4 after appearing in just one additional game with Rochester [at SWB on 7/30, 1-for-3, BB].

Strange-Gordon finished the year hitting .305 (18-for-59) in 23 games with the Nationals.

STEPHEN STRASBURG - RHP

Stephen Strasburg made one Major League Rehab-start with the Rochester Red Wings in 2022 which came against the Buffalo Bisons on June 3rd. In front of 10,510 fans at Frontier Field, the 2019 World Series MVP tossed six innings of one-hit ball, striking out four on 83 pitches (50 strikes).

Strasburg's 2022 rehab start marked the second one in as many years with the Red Wings, having pitched against Buffalo in Trenton, NJ on May 16th, 2021.

After being the number one overall pick in the 2009 Draft, Strasburg made a start at Frontier Field on May 19, 2010 as a member of the then-Washington Triple-A affiliate (Syracuse) in front of 12,590 fans. He logged 6.1 innings, scattering three hits while striking out nine Red Wings. Through two starts at Frontier Field, Strasburg has thrown in front of 23,100 fans.

Strasburg would go on to make one start with the Nationals following his June rehab appearance before again landing on the Injured List on June 14th, finishing the season there.

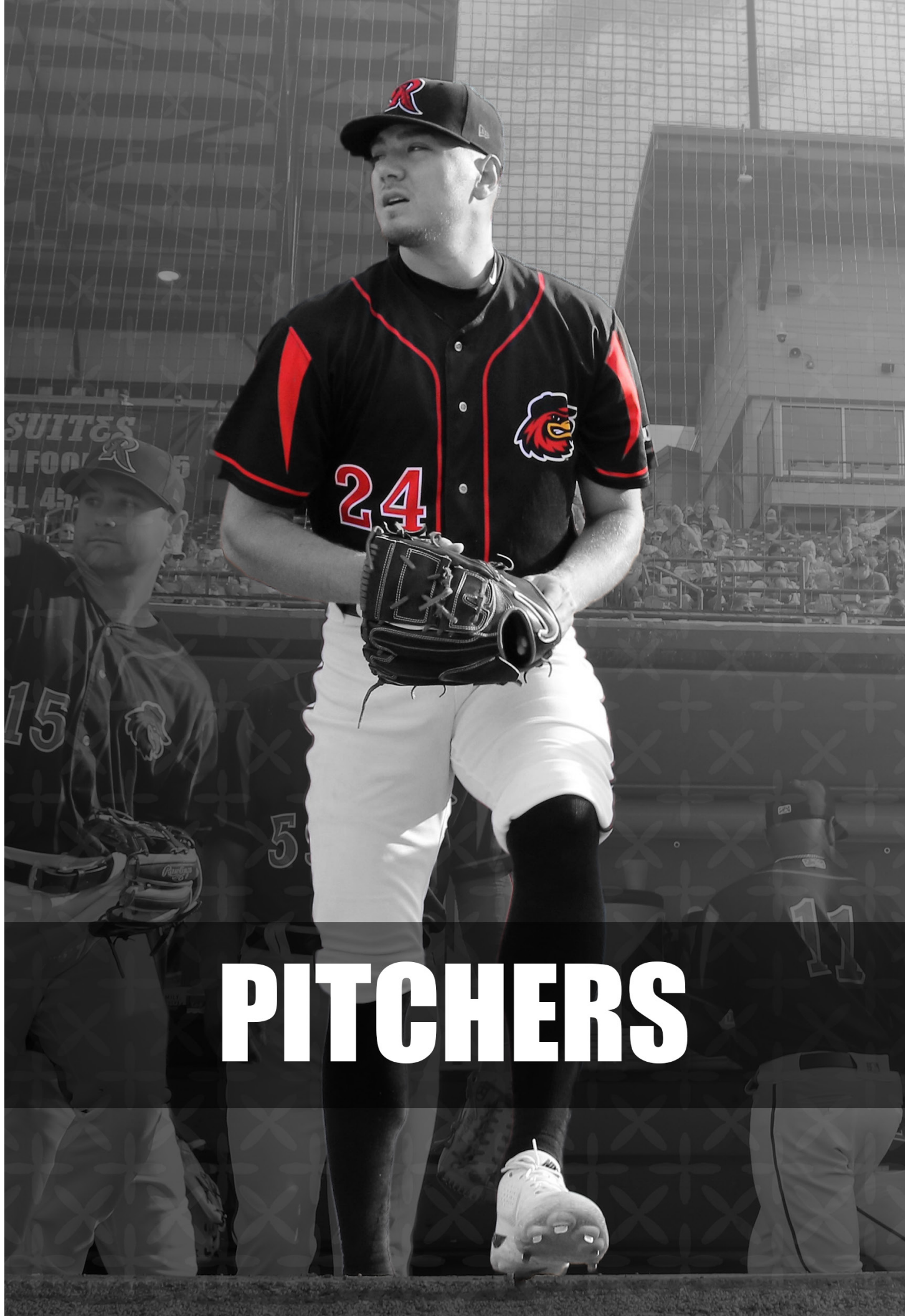

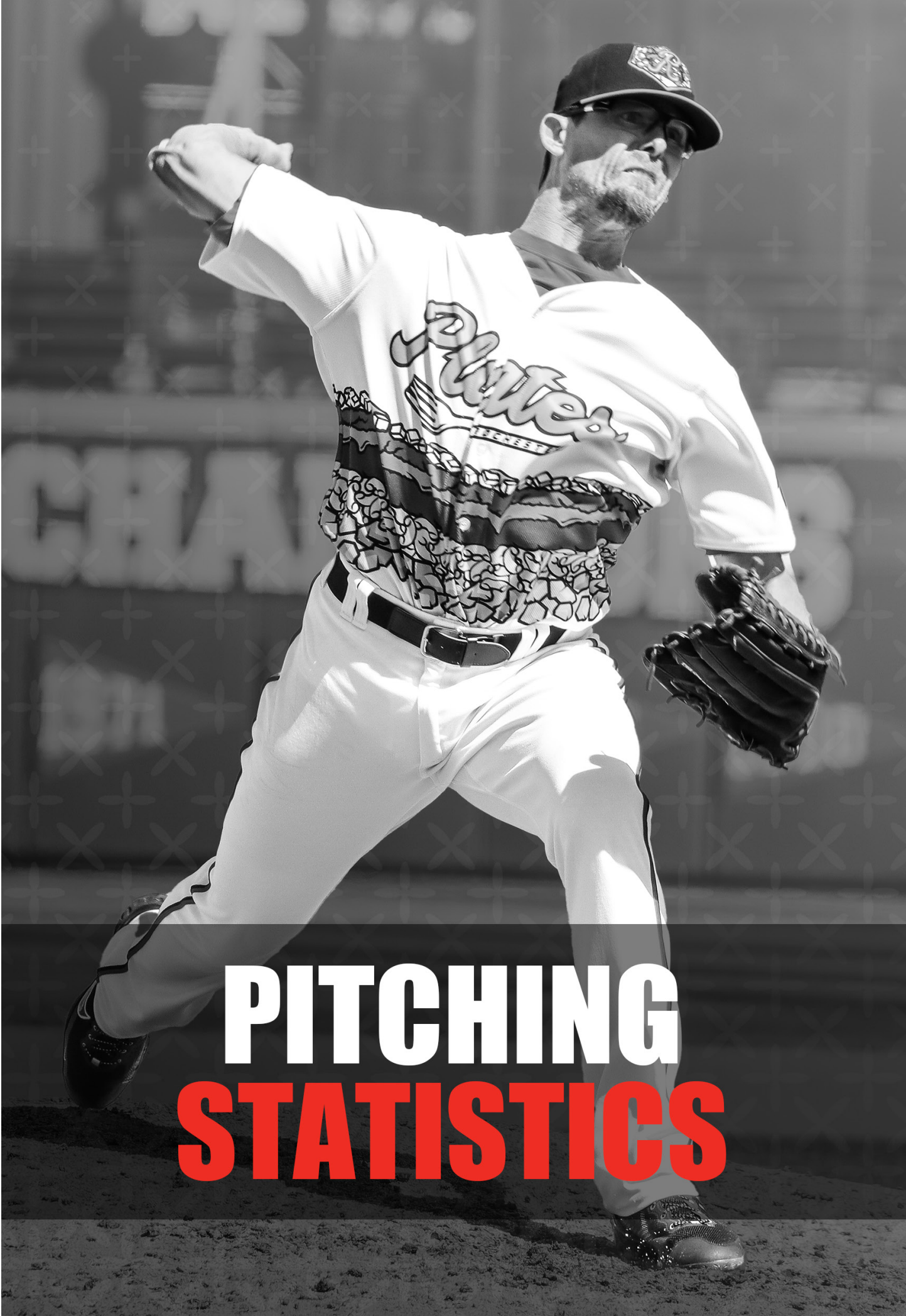

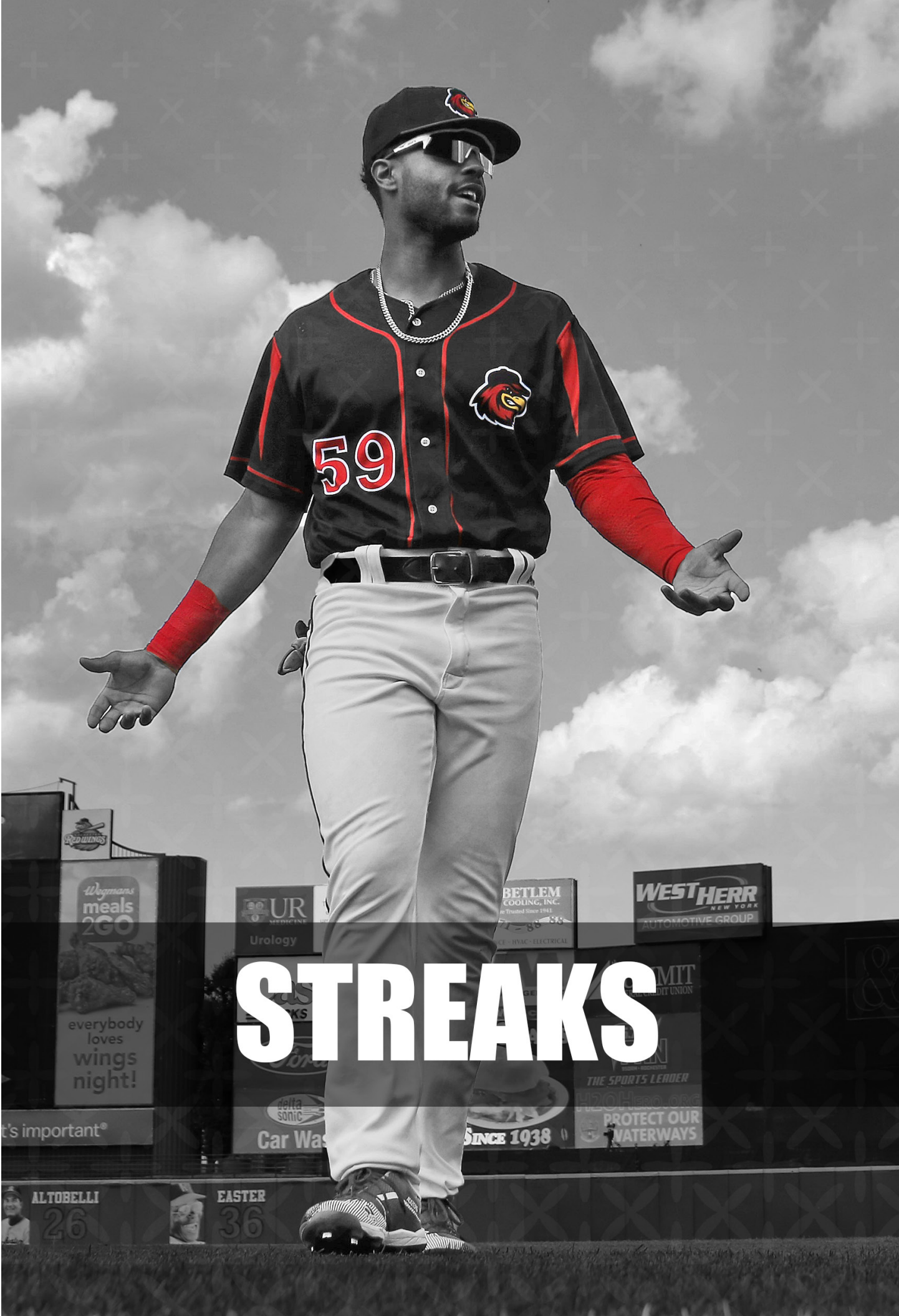

APRIL WINGS: The Wings finished the month of April with a 12-11 record, making this the first time the Wings exit the month of April with a winning record since 2017 when Rochester finished the month going 12-9...

- The Wings bullpen posted a 3.83 ERA which marks the lowest since the 2018 bullpen posted a 2.80 ERA in April...besides 2019, this year's pitching staff has the highest April strikeout total since 2014 when that squad posted 207 in the season's first month...
- the Wings 2022 home opener saw an attendance of 8,170, the largest Opening Day crowd since 2017 when that home opener saw 11,343 pass through the turnstile...the 12-11 Wings find themselves two games back of first-place Buffalo in the International League East.

IL PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Red Wings shortstop **LUIS GARCIA** was named the International League Player of the Week by the league on April 18th for his 4/12 - 17 effort, when he led the IL in hits (14), batting average (.519), and total bases (23) while slashing .519/.519/.852...the 14 hits picked up in the series against Buffalo was good enough to rank first in all of Minor League Baseball... after the shortstop failed to reach base on 4/19 against Lehigh Valley, his streak of reaching base in every game this season ended, along with his hit-streak which was capped at eight games.

WE HOMER, WE WIN: The homering Wings remain perfect when hitting the long ball, going 9-0 when circling the bases...conversely, the Wings struggle when they don't benefit from a homer, going 1-9...10 different Red Wings account for the 25 home runs hit by the squad this year which is good enough to rank them 13th among the 30 Triple-A teams (T-7th in IL).

GAR-SEE-YA: The Nationals' 21-year-old farm hand picked up 30 hits in just 20 games, ranking him second for most knocks in the International League, including five home runs, four doubles, and two triples...the lefty batter slashed .353/.409/.624 and had an OPS of 1.033 over those 20 games...Garcia stands alone atop the league in runs scored, coming across the plate 23 times in April... After Saturday's doubleheader, it was announced Garcia was crowned team's Player of the Month.

THERE'S DUCKS OUT THERE: Despite ranking second among International League teams in hits (200) and being tied for first in batting average (.271, 200-for-739), The Wings are fifth in total bases (327), and rank in the middle of the pack in runs scored, bringing across the seventh most runs (113)...the Wings are tied for third in hits with runners in scoring position, going 56-for-216 for a clip of .259, fifth-best among IL teams...24 of the 56 knocks with runners in scoring position have come with two outs, good enough to tie for fourth in the IL.

PUSHING P[ALACIOS]: In his first at bat as a Red Wing, **JOSH PALACIOS** hit a three-run home run as part of a 3-for-4 day at the plate, including four RBI, two walks and a stolen base against his former squad...Palacios' homer makes him the first player to homer in his first Red Wings AB since Gilbert Lara did it last year on September 23rd at Worchester...the newest Red Wing also earned the walk off hit for the club, hitting a single to right field, driving in the winning run.

MAY FLOWERS: The Rochester Red Wings turned in one of their most impressive offensive months statistically in May...as a team, they ranked second in the International League in batting average (.269, 237-for-881), second in hits (237), third in stolen bases, and tied for first in doubles (51).

BULLY-PEN: The Wings bullpen posted a 2.72 ERA (115.2 IP, 35 ER) in the month of May, the lowest of any calendar month this season...the staff struck out 140 batters while walking just 44, giving them a K/BB ratio of 3.18...their 9-2 record gives them a 19-4 record through the first two months of the season.

- As a pitching staff, Wings starters and relievers combined to post a 3.70 ERA (231.0 IP, 95 ER) in May, their best of the season and third best in the International League.
- Starting pitchers also posted their lowest ERA in a calendar month (4.68), allowing 60 earned runs in 115.1 innings pitched.

MENESES THE MENACE: Rochester 1B **JOEY MENESES** led a potent Red Wings offense that ranked second in the International League in hits (237) in May...the Mexican native played in 24 games, carrying a .358 batting average (34-for-95) with six home runs and 18 RBI, all leading the club.

- In the month of May, Meneses ranked fifth in the IL in batting average, second in hits and extra-base hits (14), third in total bases (6), tied for seventh in slugging percentage (.632) and OPS (1.045)
- He collected a hit in 21 of 24 games in the month, including 12 straight from 5/1-5/17.

JACKED-SON: Red Wings opening day starting pitcher RHP **JACKSON TETREAULT** led a pitching staff that earned a season-high 10 wins in May...the seventh round draft pick in 2017 picked up four of those victories, going a perfect 4-0 in five starts, leading the International League in ERA at 1.40 (25.2 IP, 27 ER)...his 28 strikeouts gives him 9.82 strikeouts per nine.

- The Florida native also tied for first in the IL in wins, ranked ninth in strikeouts, fifth in WHIP (0.97), and led the league in batting average against (.157).

IT'S JUNE ALREADY!?: The Red Wings roll into the third month of the season with a record of 31-18, their best win-loss total since the 2014 squad started the first month of summer with a record of 30-24...no Red Wings team has entered the month of June with 31 wins since at least 1979...out of all 20 International League teams, only Nashville (MIL) has a better record than Rochester.

HIGH STAKES: The Red Wings head into June with just a half game lead over Buffalo for first place...the Wings have held first place in the International League-East since 5/5, 26 days and counting.

SUMMERTIME SADNESS: The Red Wings' -35 run differential and 9-17 record in June, after posting a +35 run differential and 19-7 record in May, marks their first losing record in the month of June since 2018...the Wings failed to pick up double-digit wins in June for just the second time since 1997 (1999, 7-21 in June)...despite only posting losing records in the month nine times in the last 25 seasons, the Wings have a 363-363 record in the inagural month of Summer since Rochester called Frontier Field home.

MULTI-HIT STEVIE: Wings OF **ANDREW STEVENSON** found his groove as the weather warmed, leading the team in batting at .343 (34-for-99) in 25 of 26 games in June...the lefty also led the club in on-base percentage (.393), RBI (17), doubles (8), and tied teammate **JOEY MENESES** with six long-balls.

The LSU alumni recorded multiple hits in 11 games, and his 34 hits was tied for third most in the International League.

MINNESOTA LASTING COLD: Prior to the Wings' trip to Saint Paul on June 7, Rochester was 35-19 (16 games over .500) and led the International League-East by 3.5 games...since going to Minnesota the Wings were 5-16 over their next 21 games and sat in sixth-place in the International League-East with a record of 40-36 (their worst placement in the standing since opening day)...the Red Wings are averaging just 3.1 runs per game since going to Minnesota...prior to the trip, Rochester was averaging one run more per contest (4.1).

WE STAN THE RED WING FAITHFUL: 6,805 fans on June 28 were the most at a Red Wings Tuesday game since opening day (4/12: 8,170)...through 39 home games, the Red Wings have had 195,246 fans in attendance...the month of June has surpassed both April (33,237) and May's (69,109) attendance with 92,900 fans in June, the most in a single month since June 2019 (96,672)...June 2022 included the first time since 2018 that Frontier Field has eclipsed 30,000 fans over a three-game span (June 2-4: 30,093).

SAVED BY THE WEEMS: RHP **JORDAN WEEMS** earned his 11th save of the year on June 26, tying him for the second-most in the International League... Weems is 7-for-7 in save opportunities versus Syracuse this season and went 3-for-3 from 6/22-6/26...the Wings closer heads into a series versus Worcester having gone 2-for-2 in save opportunities against the Woo Sox...he struck out five batters in three appearances while allowing just one run against Worcester earlier this year...

Weems and **CARL EDWARDS JR.** are the only pitchers on the Wings to record three saves in a series this season, with Edwards Jr. notching three in May versus Scranton.

JULY MADE US CRY: Rochester finished the month of July with just seven wins (7-17), the fewest in the International League after dropping the series finale to Scranton Sunday afternoon...the club has lost 11 consecutive games, the longest losing streak in the International League this season...the Wings tie their longest losing streak since last season (8/31-9/11, 2021)...the last time Rochester lost 12-straight was 2010 (8/23-9/03)...the Baby Bombers had 14 homers in the sweep against the Wings, the most home runs Rochester has allowed in a series this year (prev high: 11 at St Paul).

STREAKER HEAD: LF **JOSH PALACIOS** went 1-for-4 with a single in the ninth inning of a July 31 contest against Scranton/WB to extend his hitting streak to an International League-best 18 games (prev high: Nolan Gorman MEM, 16)... Palacios' 18-game hitting streak passes former Red Wing Zack Granite who had a 17-game hit streak in 2017...the former Auburn Tiger also extended his on-base streak to 31 games, the second-longest in the IL this season and the longest on the Wings squad since former Red Wing Drew Maggi reached base in 39 games in 2019 (6/21-8/9/2019).

- The former Big Leaguer collected a .322 batting average in July (26-for-93), leading the club (min. 50 AB)...his 26 hits was tied for sixth best in the International League.

HAPPY CADE DAY: Nationals top prospect and Oklahoma alum RHP **CADE CAVALLI** held the Yankees top affiliate to just three hits through five innings of work in his final start of July on 7/27.

- In three starts this month, Cavalli has not allowed an earned run through 15.2 innings, including seven innings of two-hit ball on 7/6 in Lehigh Valley.
- The 24-year old struck out 16 batters to just three walks over that span, giving him a K/BB of 5.33.
- In 13 starts since 5/22, he posts a 5-1 record with a 2.10 ERA (68.2 IP, 16 ER), after accumulating a 7.62 ERA (28.1 IP, 24 ER) in seven starts to begin the season.

MAMA ROC ME: Rochester lost 11 games in a row entering the month of August...this is the first time the team lost 11 straight since Aug 31 - Sep 11, 2021... the Wings have lost nine consecutive games to Scranton after starting the year 7-3 against the Yankees' top affiliate, with the baby bombers slugging 14 homers in this series alone...the Wings' current losing streak is the longest in the International League this season.

I GOT FIVE 20 ON IT: With his third-inning two-run bomb on 7/27, 1B **JOEY MENESES** became the fastest Red Wing to reach 20 home runs in a season since Chris Colabello did so in 67 games in 2013...the veteran is just three home runs away from his career-high of 23 bombs from his 2018 MVP- season... Meneses ended up finishing last night's game going 2-for-5 with three RBI, marking his 27th multi-hit game this season (second most on club, Stevenson, 30)... the Mexico native now ranks second in the International League in the home run category with 20 shots this season, just one back of League Leader Tristan Gray (21, DUR)...Meneses is the first player in the Nationals' affiliation era to hit 20 homers in a season.

AUG-BUST: The Wings closed up the month of August with an 8-18 record... the eight wins last month are the fewest since at least 1979...in the 42 seasons since then, only two Red Wings teams have failed to reach the 10-win mark in the month (2010, 2011).

- The Wings own a 645-673 record in the month of August since 1979, the second lowest win percentage of a month (.489), behind April's .472 (min. four games played).

WHERE THERE'S A WIL-MER, THERE'S A WAY: **C WILMER PEREZ** picked up his first career Triple-A hit with a triple in the final day of August...coming into the game, Perez had four at-bats as a Red Wing, all coming as a pinch hitter...his three-bagger was his first since 7/12/2017 in the Dominican Summer League.

MONTH IN REVIEW: In August, Wings pitchers posted their lowest ERA (4.69) in a calendar month since May (3.70)...they also posted their highest K/9 in a single month (10.28, 2nd in IL), ranking third in the International League in total punchouts (252).

- They allowed the fourth-fewest hits in the IL
- Starting pitchers posted a season-best 4.57 ERA in 108.1 innings pitched

THE BIG NOGOWSKI: With his fourth-inning single on 8/30, 1B **JOHN NOGOWSKI** extended his hitting streak to six games going into September dating back to 8/25...the righty is 6-for-24 during his streak with a double, two RBI, four runs and two walks...the Florida native also extended his on-base streak to eight games and has reached base safely in 23 of his first 25 games with the Red Wings.

- Since joining the Wings on 8/3 Nogowski led the squad in hits (29), doubles (6), RBI (14), and walks (13) for the month of August.
- In the final full month of Summer, the former Pittsburgh Pirate led the club in batting average (.333, 30-for-90) while posting an on-base percentage of .415.

IT HAS NOT BEEN NICE SINCE 6/9: On June 8th, Rochester found themselves atop the International League-East by three games with the most wins of any Triple-A squad...heading into the final month of the season, the Wings have scored the least amount of runs (271) of any International League team and given up the fourth most runs (370) of any IL team...they own a record of 20-49 which is the fewest wins of any Triple-A team since 6/9 by eight wins.

RAKE ALU: Wings 2B **JAKE ALU** continued his scorching hot September, going 2-for-5 with an RBI and a run scored in the final contest of the season...the lefty has now reached base safely in 20-straight games dating back to 9/4 and has picked up multiple hits in 12 of those 20 games, including a hit in 13 straight...during this streak, Alu lead the team in hits (32), home runs (7), RBI (23), and runs scored (18)

- Through 23 games in September, Alu is hitting .409 (36-for-88) with 7 homers, 25 RBI, and a 1.203 OPS, good enough to name him International League Player of the Month.

STILL A LOT OF W'S...KINDA: After the season finale was cancelled due to inclement weather condition, the Red Wings finished the 2022 season with a record of 67-81...this is the first time since 1994 Rochester picked up exactly 67 wins in a season when they 67-74 under manager Bob Miscik.

- The Wings 67 wins are the most since 2019 when Joel Skinner's squad collected 70 wins.
- Since moving into Frontier Field, the Wings have posted 13 seasons with records .500 or better and will log their 12th losing season upon completion of today's game.

HIT MACHINE: CF **ANDREW STEVENSON** added to his career-high hit total with a first-inning single on 9/27 to bring his mark to 152, the most by a Red Wing since James Beresford collected 153 in 2015...in 135 games with Rochester this season, the lefty slashed .279/.344/.456, leading the club in hits, doubles (31), triples (9), walks (46), and ranks second in homers (16).

- His 152 hits are tied for first in the International League, just one behind Durham's Miles Mastrobuoni...he is the first Wing to do so since Matt Hague's 149 hits led the IL in 2017
- Only two Wings have led the IL in hits since 19989, Jose Herrera's 163 hits in 2000, and Hague in 2017.

ANOTHER ONE IN THE BOOKS: The Red Wings wrapped up the 2022 season a day early due to rain, finishing the season with 148 games played and a 67-81 record...over the course of the season, the Red Wings have...

- Set a franchise record for number of players to appear in a game (81)
- Had 36 players play for both the Red Wings and Nationals with four making their Major League debut
- Made a franchise-record 195 player transactions
- Struck out a franchise-record 1,341 batters
- Recorded the second most stolen bases as a team in franchise history
- Had a player and pitcher of the week, (Luis Garcia - 2x, Cade Cavalli)
- Spent 41 days in first place in the International League-East.

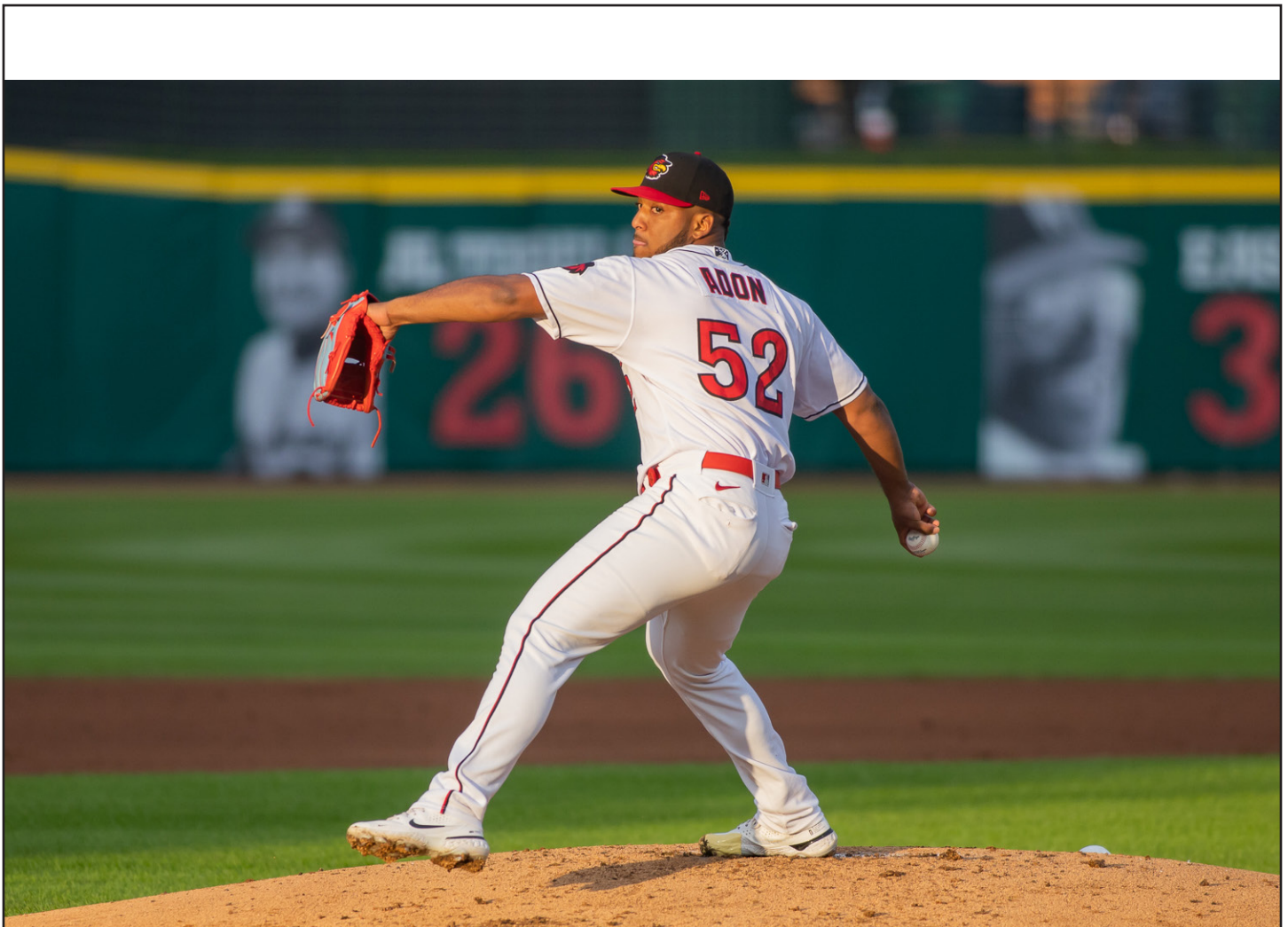
