RHP SAURYN LAO (0-1, 1.88) vs. RHP TANNER GORDON (1-1, 4.82)

TODAY'S GAME: The Isotopes and Rainiers meet for the first of two series on the year and the only set in Albuquerque ... Tanner Gordon is slated to take the hill for the Isotopes while Sauryn Lao is expected to start for the Rainiers.

LAST WEEK: With the win Sunday, the Isotopes split the six-game series with the Comets, ending a three-series losing streak on the road.

COME-FROM-BEHIND: Sunday marked the fifth time this season Albuquerque has claimed a come-from-behind victory when trailing after the seventh inning or later and the second time in the series against Oklahoma City (also: May 6, 6-2 win).

TOVAR TIME: In his second rehab game with the Isotopes Sunday, Ezequiel Tovar went 1-for-3 with a walk and a run at the plate and played nine innings at shortstop ... Over two rehab games with Albuquerque this season, is 1-for-7 with a walk and strikeout.

MR. FREEMAN: Tyler Freeman, also in his second rehab game with Albuquerque on Sunday, went 0-for-2 with a walk, hit-by-pitch and two runs while playing nine innings in right field ... In two rehab games with the Isotopes is 1-for-5 with a double, two walks and a strikeout.

REAL SLIM SCHUNKY: Aaron Schunk went 1-for-4 with a two-run dinger (off Clayton Kershaw) during his second rehab contest with the Isotopes Sunday ... Over two rehab games with the Isotopes is 2-for-7 with a homer and two RBI.

SERIES FINALE: The club improved to 2-5 in series finales and 2-2 on the road with the triumph Sunday. Albuquerque had dropped five-straight series finales after winning the first finale of the season on March 31 at Sacramento, 2-1.

VS. TACOMA IN 2024: The Isotopes claimed the 2024 season series against the Rainiers, 7-5, including winning four of six in Albuquerque from July 9-14 ... All four of the Isotopes' wins during that set were decided by two runs or fewer.

ISOTOPES RBI RECORD: Sam Hilliard has 231 RBI with Albuquerque, second all-time in Isotopes history ... Jason Wood (2003-06, 08) holds the record with 328 RBI.

BEHIND THE DISH: Albuquerque catchers (Braxton Fulford, Austin Nola and Ronaiker Palma) have combined to slash .373/.426/.604 with 50 hits, 13 doubles, six homers and 23 RBI on the year, leading the PCL in hits, doubles, average, OBP and slugging percentage.

WARMING UP: Warming Bernabel belted his fifth homer of the season Sunday (go-ahead three-run blast in the eighth frame) and first since April 17 when he swatted two (19 games) ... The homer was also his first extra-base hit since April 30 (eight games) ... Over his last nine games is just 4-for-31.

JC: Julio Carreras went 0-for-4 Sunday, ending his 13-game hit streak. It was tied for the longest active streak in Triple-A. Slashed .447/.491/.553 with three doubles, one triple and six RBI during stretch.

BOONIE: Trevor Boone connected on his third clout with the Isotopes in 13 contest this season Sunday to tie the game in the eighth inning.

SAM I AM: Sam Hilliard singled Saturday and has reached base in 27 of 28 games played on the year ... Has doubles in back-to-back games for the second time this year (also: May 3-6) ... Five of his nine doubles have come in his last nine contests.

BRAX: Braxton Fulford has an RBI in three-straight contests for the second time this year (also: April 4-8) ... Eleven of Fulford's 21 hits with Albuquerque this season have gone for extra bases ... Has a hit in 13 of his last 14 contests, including four-straight.

STERLIN: Sterlin Thompson has recorded a hit in three-straight games (5x10 with a double) ... Has just two extra-base hits (double and homer) over his last 10 contests.

VEEN: Zac Veen has not reached base in two-straight games for the second time at the Triple-A level (also: Sept. 15-17, 2024) Since being sent back down to Albuquerque April 24 (11 games), Veen is 13-for-50 with four doubles, one triple, one homer and five RBI.

PCL LEADERBOARD: Ryan Ritter is T-4th in walks (26) and T-9th in runs (24) ... Yanquiel Fernandez is T-9th in homers (7) ... Sam Hilliard is T-1st in triples (4), T-5th in XBH (17) and 8th in slugging (.541).

BIG INNING: Albuquerque plated four runs in the eighth inning Sunday, the third time in the series against Oklahoma City scoring four-plus runs in a frame ... It's also the third time in 2025 with four runs in the eighth inning (also: May 6 at OKC and May 2 vs. Salt Lake).

THREE OR FEWER: The Isotopes relented three runs or fewer Sunday for the 14th time this season, third-straight and fifth time in the club's last eight contests.

NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 21st year as a minor league manager and third guiding the Isotopes. He is the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1 ... Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his third season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five seasons with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins from 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his second year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... The former outfielder played in 33 games for the Isotopes and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the third-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 22) will host the second half winner (beginning June 24) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, on September 27.

BALLS AND STRIKES: The Challenge System, in it's third full year in the PCL, will be used exclusively for every game this season. Under this system, the home plate umpire will call balls or strikes while each team has the opportunity to challenge the umpire's call with two challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.

Marked the 11th time in Isotopes history a pitcher finished a start with at least 8.0 scoreless innings (last: Sam Howard - July 4, 2017 vs. Sacramento) ... It was the second occurrence against Tacoma, as Sean Bergman hurled a nine-inning shutout on July 18, 2003, the first shutout recorded by Albuquerque at Isotopes Park.

- ♦ Has walked just six batters on the year, one of which was an intentional free pass (April 4 vs. Salt Lake ... Prior to April 23 at Reno, his only other walk was the first batter he faced on the year (March 29 at Sacramento, Grant McCray) ... Has walked two in last two starts
- ♦ Has completed at least 5.0 frames four times on the year and three-straight

- Was on Albuquerque's Opening Day roster, but immediately placed on the Injured List
- Made his season debut May 9, the first of two rehab starts in the Arizona Complex League
- Rejoined the Isotopes on May 23, allowing five runs in 3.2 innings at Salt Lake
- Had his contract purchased and made his MLB debut July 7 vs. Kansas City, allowing eight hits and five earned runs in 6.1 innings ... Did not walk a batter
- Struck out the first two batters he faced (Frazier, Witt Jr.), the first Rockies starter in franchise history to strikeout the first two batters he faced in his Major League debut
- Was the longest outing by a Rockies pitcher in their first Major League start since Peter Lambert June 16, 2019 at Chicago-NL (7.0 IP)
