Tonight: Following a 90-minute drive north (and slightly east), the Lugnuts open a six-game series at Dow Diamond against friendly rival Great Lakes (as opposed to unfriendly rival West Michigan). Lansing is 5-7 vs. the Loons this season, with all games played in Michigan's state capital: losing four of six vs. the Loons in late May before splitting a six-game series in June. Lefty David Leal makes his third start of the season for the Nuts, opposed by Loons right-hander Landon Knack.

On Deck: The Lugnuts play the Loons through Sunday, July 11, before returning home to face the Lake County Captains from July 13-18 at Jackson® Field™.

What's New in 2021: Entering this season, the Lugnuts' stadium name changed from Cooley Law School Stadium to Jackson® Field™, Lansing moved up to the High-A Central and the ballclub accepted an invitation to affiliate with the Oakland A's, the Nuts' fourth MLB partner, following the Kansas City Royals (1996-98), Chicago Cubs (1999-2004) and Blue Jays (2005-2020).

Lug. Notes: Headlines and Points of Interest

Root, Root for the Home Team: Sunday's game drew a season-high attendance of 10,109. That's a larger crowd than any of the Blue Jays' home games this season in Dunedin or Buffalo and it's higher than the average attendance in MLB for the Detroit Tigers (9,717), Baltimore Orioles (8,689), Pittsburgh Pirates (8,175), Tampa Bay Rays (6,953), Oakland Athletics (6,403), Miami Marlins (5,928) and Toronto/Buffalo/Dunedin Blue Jays (3,877). Only eight of the 119 other Minor League teams have drawn a larger crowd to a game this season: Albuquerque, Nashville, Charlotte, Fresno, Indianapolis, Round Rock, Durham and Las Vegas.

Alumni Report: 2017 Lugnut Vladimir Guerrero, Jr., is the youngest player ever to lead Major League Baseball in All-Star voting, elected by the fans to start at first base for the American League All-Star team, his first All-Star nod. Vladdy Jr. currently leads the Majors in OBP (.438), OPS (1.109) and total bases (200); and ranks tied for 2nd in home runs (27), second in RBIs (69), third in runs scored (65); third in slugging percentage (.671), third in batting average (.336), tied for third in extra-base hits (45), and fifth in hits (100). Fellow 2017 Lugnut **Bo Bichette** was named as an A.L. All-Star reserve; Bichette leads the Majors in runs scored (68).

Alumni Report, Part II: Slugging 2019 Lugs outfielder Griffin Conine, traded to Miami in 2020 by Toronto and currently playing for Beloit, leads the High-A Central with 17 home runs (tied for most in MiLB), a .571 slugging percentage and 47 RBIs.

Man of Steal: Infielder Max Schuemann (Portage Northern H.S. / Eastern Michigan University) leads all of Minor League Baseball with 32 stolen bases, nine more than the MLB leader, Kansas City's Whit Merrifield. Schuemann is tied for second in the Minors with 13 HBPs and is tied for third in the High-A Central with 41 runs scored.

Double Your Fun: Corner infielder Jordan Díaz is tied for fourth in the High-A Central with 15 doubles, two behind Lake County's Will Brennan for second and four behind Fort Wayne's Tirso Ornelas for first, and is tied for fifth with 21 extra-base hits. Díaz has doubles in four of his last six games. The Lugnuts as a team have 96 doubles, tied for second best in the league

Starting Strong: Each of the last three games have featured exceptional outings from Lugnuts starters, with the debuting Jack Cushing holding Dayton to one run on three hits in six innings on Friday, striking out six; Reid Birlingmair tossing six innings of one-hit shutout ball Saturday night, notching five strikeouts; and Colin Peluse following with six innings of one-run ball on Sunday, striking out six batters of his own.

Hail to Arms: The Lugnuts' pitching staff ranks first in the High-A Central with a 3.69 earned run average and a 1.28 WHIP, pitching the third most innings in the league (475 2/3), issuing the second fewest walks (174) and recording the fourth most strikeouts (537).

Heavy Workload: Lugs lefty Dalton Sawyer, who missed the 2018-2019 seasons due to Tommy John and so did not pitch in a game between the 2017-2018 offseason this year, is making up for lost time. His appearance on Sunday marked his league-leading 21st relief appearance of the season. He has struck out 37 batters compared to 10 walks in 24 2/3 innings overall. Teammate Charles Hall pitched in his 20th game Sunday night, tied for second-most in the High-A Central.

TODAY IN LUGNUTS HISTORY

2012: The Lugnuts routed the Great Lakes Loons, 15-2, at Cooley Law School Stadium, scoring eight runs in the 1st and rolling onward. Kevin Patterson smashed a pair of three-run homers and Chris Hawkins reached base six times, drawing two walks and going 4-for-4 (two singles, a double, a triple). Aaron Sanchez struck out eight in 5 2/3 innings, allowing just one hit and one run; he improved to 8-0 with a 0.72 ERA.

2017: Bo Bichette (1-for-2, 2 BB, .384) and Vladimir Guerrero, Jr. (1-for-4, HR No. 7, .316), played their final game with the Lugnuts before departing, first to the MLB Futures Game in Miami during MLB All-Star Break, and then to A-Advanced Dunedin with a promotion. The Lugnuts lost at home to West Michigan, 3-2.

Major League Lugnuts: Three former Nuts have made their Major League debuts this season, bringing the total to 157 all-time - pitcher Ty Tice '18, outfielder Josh Palacios '16-'17, and pitcher Tayler Saucedo '16-'17. Tice and Palacios made their first MLB appearance in the same game for the Toronto Blue Jays on April 9th. It was the seventh time in team history that two Lugnuts made their MLB debut in the same game, with the first occurring on September 14, 1998: Carlos Febles and Carlos Beltrán for the Kansas City Royals. Saucedo most recently debuted, tossing a scoreless inning for the Blue Jays on June 17.

Record-Setting, For Better: On June 15, Max Schuemann broke Samad Taylor's franchise single-game record of four steals in a game (set July 1, 2018) with five stolen bases against the Great Lakes Loons.

Record-Setting, For Worse: On June 20, Stevie Emanuels broke the franchise single game record, tied many times before, of three homers served up in a game, giving up four HRs to the Loons - two apiece by Deacon Liput and Andy Pages.

So Many Starters: The Lugnuts have used 14 different starting pitchers this season, namely Brady Basso, Reid Birlingmair, Jeff Criswell, Jack Cushing, David Leal, Stevie Emanuels, Richard Guasch, Rafael Kelly, Bryce Nightengale, Colin Peluse, Leudeny Pineda, Seth Shuman, Shohei Tomioka and Brock Whittlesey.

Roster Index: With his appearance on July 2, Jack Cushing became the 843rd Lugnut all-time and the 39th player used this year, as well as the 26th different pitcher this season. With that, the 2021 Lugnuts have already surpassed the total number of players used in the 1999 and 2008 seasons (38 apiece). The franchise record for most players used in a single year is 54, set in 2017. Currently, about 18.6% of all Lugnuts are reaching the Major Leagues (157 of 843). If that percentage continues to hold true, at least seven of the 39 players to see time this year with the Nuts will reach MLB.

A Pleasant Peninsula Surrounds You: Max Schuemann (Portage Northern H.S.) is the first Lugnut to hail from Eastern Michigan University in Ypsilanti. Earlier this season, the Nuts featured two Michigan Wolverines in Jeff Criswell (injured) and Jack Weisenburger (promoted).

Finally: Pitchers Jeff Criswell, Stevie Emanuels and Shohei Tomioka, catchers Jared McDonald, Drew Millas and William Simoneit, first baseman Patrick McColl, and outfielder Michael Guldberg have all made their pro debut this season with the Lugnuts.

Front Office Connections: Lugnuts pitching coach Don Schulze was drafted 11th overall by the Chicago Cubs in 1980, 12 picks before Oakland Executive Vice President of Baseball Operations Billy Beane was drafted by the New York Mets. Lugnuts first baseman Patrick McColl set a new Harvard baseball single season record with 70 hits in 2019, breaking the previous record held by Athletics General Manager David Forst.

Clubhouse of Higher Learning: The Ivy League is well represented on the Lansing roster. First baseman Patrick McColl played for Harvard University, reliever Michael Danielak was drafted from Dartmouth College and catcher William Simoneit spent four years at Cornell University before grad-transferring to Wake Forest. Speaking of outstanding academic institutions, starter Jack Cushing spent four years at Georgetown University.

Power Five Baseball: The Lugnuts also represent the ACC (Michael Guldberg, Georgia Tech); Big 12 (Brady Basso, Oklahoma State); Big Ten (Dalton Sawyer, Minnesota); the SEC (Cobie Vance, Alabama); and the Pac-12 (Stevie Emanuels, Washington).

International Appeal: In addition to 17 different states (Arizona, California, Delaware, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Louisiana, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, Nevada (Connor Hughes), North Carolina, Ohio (Scott Steinmann), Texas, Virginia, Washington) represented by Lugnuts players and coaching staff, seven nations are represented: USA, Colombia, Cuba, Dominican Republic, Japan, South Africa (Anthony Phillips) and Venezuela (Javier Godard).

Representing His Country: 1B/3B Jordan Díaz played for Colombia in Olympic Baseball Qualifying play, blasting a game-tying home run in the 9th against Venezuela, but Colombia lost all three games in opening pool play and was eliminated. Team USA won the tournament, punching a ticket to Japan.





2021:

- Began the season with Stockton, appearing in relief on Opening Day, May 4 at Modesto, and tossing three scoreless innings.
- First three appearances with the Ports were all in relief, totaling 7 IP, 4 H, 2 R, 1 BB, 12 K.
- Received first start in series opener at Visalia, May 18: 4 IP, 4 H, 3 R (2 ER), 0 BB, 4 K.
- Worked six innings apiece in final two starts with Stockton, June 1 vs. Lake Elsinore (3 H, 0 R, 1 HBP, 0 BB, 5 K) and June 8 vs. San Jose (8 H, 3 R, 2 HR, 0 BB, 3 K.
- In all, walked just 1 batter of 106 total batters faced in the High-A West, spanning 26 2/3 innings
- Joined the Lugnuts on June 15 with relief ace Jack Weisenburger's promotion to Double-A Midland.
- Made Lugnuts debut on June 15, starting the series opener vs. Great Lakes... gave up a second-inning two-run double to Justin Yurchak but that was it: 4 1/3 IP, 7 H, 2 R, 1 BB, 5 K... removed after walking James Outman, yielding to Brady Basso with runners at 1st and 2nd and one out... Basso stranded the runners... Lugnuts went on to win, 9-7, with two runs in the bottom of the 7th.
- Originally slated to start opener on June 22 at Cedar Rapids, but game was postponed due to rain... moved into piggybacking on opener Bryce Nightengale's start in Game 1 of June 23 doubleheader... held the Kernels to only one hit (Trey Cabbage double) and no walks in first four innings of relief... in bottom of the 7th inning with the game tied 0-0, allowed a second double to Cabbage, who moved to third on a Jair Camargo flyout to right... issued a pair of intentional walks to load the bases, then struck out Michael Helman for the second out... got in front of No. 9 batter Gabriel Maciel 1-and-2, but served up walk-off grand slam in 4-0 Lugnuts loss... struck out seven batters in 4 2/3 innings in defeat.

School Days: Attended MacArthur High School, where he was named 2015 Pitcher of the Year... attended Wharton County Junior College (the Pioneers; Wharton, TX) in 2016-2017... as a freshman: 71 1/3 IP, 60 K, 18 BB, 5.17 ERA... as a sophomore: 76 1/3 IP, 75 K, 5.07 ERA... as a junior, transferred to Louisian Tech and was named 2018 Second Team All-Louisiana honors and ABCA/Rawlings Second Team All-Region, leading Bulldogs in innings (87 1/3) and ranking second in Conference USA in WHIP (0.90), 14th in the nation... scheduled to be Tech's Saturday starter as a senior, but underwent foot surgery a week before the season was scheduled to start... finished as No. 2 in Division 1 among active players in lowest walks per nine innings (1.20)... posted career K/BB ratio of 135 K / 19 BB in 142 2/3 innings.

Draft Day: Taken 1154th overall in the 38th round, 2019, and signed for \$1,000... scout: Kelcey Mucker... after David was drafted by Oakland, Bulldogs head coach Lane Burroughs said, "He is the epitome of what hard work and dedication to one's craft looks like. This young man came into our program and changed his body, overcame a significant foot injury and absolutely attacked the game with a relentless work ethic. He found a way to get better every day, and is one of the best I've ever seen at commanding the baseball. He is what our program is all about. Tremendous character and makeup, great student, selfless and just a wonderful teammate. He is the ultimate competitor and undoubtedly will go down as one of the best to ever step foot on the mound for the Bulldogs."

Pro Debut 2019: Debut in A's system on June 27 in AZL... did not walk his first batter until 10th appearance, 20 innings in... promoted to Stockton for final appearance of the year, August 31 at San Jose... base stealers went just 2-for-4 in attempts against him... left-handed batters hit 3-for-44 (.068) with 0 walks and 19 K's... right-handers batted 22-for-102 (.216) with 4 walks and 32 K.
