TODAY'S GAME: The Isotopes dropped last night's contest, 4-3, and have lost both series to begin the season ... Albuquerque hasn't lost two-straight sets to start a season since 2021 (also: Sugar Land, 1-5, and El Paso, 1-5) ... Thomas Ponticelli, who started game one of the series, is expected to take the hill while Oklahoma City is still TBD.

SWIPIN' BAGS: Albuquerque did not steal a base yesterday for the first time in eight contests this season. Additionally, it snapped their streak of 15 straight road games with at least one theft, dating back to Aug. 31, 2023, at SAC. The club's 13 stolen bags (one caught stealing) are tied for the fourth-most in Triple-A.

BY WAY OF THE K: Isotopes hitters struck out 16 times last night, their most since July 7, 2023, also at Oklahoma City. They have reached double-digits in punchouts in five of eight games in 2024 ... The team's 89 punchouts are the third-most in Triple-A.

SIX-GAME SET: Albuquerque has lost a six-game series for the first time since Sept. 5-10, 2023, vs. Reno after splitting and winning its final two sets of 2023.

WINNING RUNS: For the second time in the series, Matt Koch entered in the eighth inning and allowed the eventual gamewinning runs to score. All three runs in the frame were charged to Evan Justice (unearned), as Koch entered when it was 2-2.

THREE-BAGGERS: Albuquerque has a Triple-A-leading eight triples on the year ... They have a three-bagger in four of the eight games played this season.

CLOSE CALLS: Albuquerque's first eight games have all been decided by either one or two runs, the first occurrence of this ever taking place. Six contests have been decided by one run.

DEFICIT: Albuquerque (2-6) has lost six games this season by a combined eight runs.

RISP: Last night, the Isotopes went 2-for-7 with runners in scoring position. Additionally, the club is just 8-for-52 with RISP over the last five games.

EXIT VELO: Of the three batted balls registered at 100 MPH-plus yesterday, the Isotopes recorded one of them, Sean Bouchard's fourth-inning double (100.7 MPH), the third-highest of the game ... The three batted balls at 100-plus MPH were the fewest combined in a game this season.

ERROR 404: After committing just one error over their first four games, the Isotopes have made nine over their last four contests.

BOUCHIE THE BRUIN: Sean Bouchard recorded a double yesterday and has tallied an extra-base hit in all seven games he's played to begin the year (four triples and five doubles). It's the longest such streak for an Isotope since Sam Hilliard also tallied an XBH in seven-straight from April 18-27, 2019. Bouchard batted leadoff for the first time in 492 games as a professional.

TOTAL BASES: Bouchard's 26 total bases are tied for the fifthmost in Triple-A (leader: Heston Kjerstad, 40). He is also one of nine Triple-A players to have an active hit streak of at least seven games to begin the season.

MR. VOLUNTEER: Jordan Beck went 1-for-4 yesterday and has reached base in all seven contests he's played this year. He also struckout twice last night, giving him five games with

BECK EXIT VELO: Out of the 15 batted balls in play, nine have been over 100-MPH

IT'S ALL GOOD, MAN: Hunter Goodman went 0-for-4 last night. Has reached base in 18 of the 22 Triple-A games he's played while tallying a hit in 16. Of Goodman's 19 batted balls hit into play this year, seven have an exit velocity over 100-MPH ... In eight career games at Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark, he is 15for-36 with nine-extra base hits and 14 RBI.

SAM I AM: Sam Hilliard went 2-for-4 last night, tallying his second multi-hit game of the year. He has hit safely in five of his last six games, while reaching base in all of them.

ROMO: Drew Romo's RBI single in the ninth snapped an 0-for-15 drought, dating back to Opening Night.

REAL SLIM SCHUNKY: Aaron Schunk went 0-for-3 yesterday, dropping him to 3-for-27 on the season. He has only walked twice, giving him an on-base percentage of.167.

THREE PUNCHOUTS: Julio Carreras struck out three times last night, becoming the second Isotope this season to suffer the fate (Greg Jones, March 30 vs. El Paso).

TAKE YOUR BASE: Josh Rogers issued Albuquerque's first bases-loaded walk of the season yesterday, after the club relented 27 last year. Rogers also gave up the most recent: a free pass to Jonny DeLuca on Sept. 23 vs. Oklahoma City.

2024 FIRST-HALF SCHEDULE: The Isotopes will face six teams over the 75 games in the first half, which ends June 23, with 45 contests against Oklahoma City (24) and El Paso (21).

NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 20th year as a minor league manager and second guiding the Isotopes, the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1. Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

HOMETOWN KID: Jordan Pacheco begins his third season as the Isotopes hitting coach ... An Albuquerque native and 2004 graduate of La Cueva High School, Pacheco then attended the University of New Mexico (2005-07), where he was one of the most prolific offensive players in school history (.384, 59 2B, 25 HR, 145 RBI) ... Drafted by Rockies in the 9th round in 2007 and made his MLB debut with Colorado in 2011.

CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his second season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five season with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins form 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his first year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... It's his second stop in Albuquerque after the former outfielder played in 33 games for the club and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the second-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 23) will host the second half winner (beginning June 25) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, Sept. 28.

BALLS AND STRIKES: The Automated Ball-Strike System (ABS), now in its third year in the Pacific Coast League, will be used for all Monday-Thursday games while the Challenge System, second year in the PCL, will be used for all Friday-Sunday contests. Each team has three challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.
