TONIGHT'S GAME: The Braves and Mets finish a three-game series tonight with the 13th of 19 match-ups between the teams this season...The teams will meet for another three games next week, August 23-25, at Citi Field for Players' Weekend and then finish the regular season with three games in New York, September 27-29.

A With last night's win, the Braves took this series, and Atlanta has not lost a series to the Mets at SunTrust Park over the last two years...They are 4-0-2 in series play against the Mets here over this stretch.

A After dropping their first two games to the Mets this season, the Braves have won eight of 10 with New York, while averaging 6.6 runs (66 total runs) against the NL-East rival.

A RH Julio Teheran is set to face the Mets for the 29th time in his career, for the 28th time as a starter and for the fourth time this season...The righty is 10-8 with a 2.68 ERA (50 ER/168.0 IP) against the Mets, including 1-1 with a 6.08 ERA (9 ER/13.1 IP) this season...Teheran has won just one time in his last nine starts against the Mets in Atlanta, despite compiling a 3.21 ERA (20 ER/56.0 IP) in this stretch.

A RH Marcus Stroman has won both of his career appearances against the Braves, compiling a 0.71 ERA (1 ER/12.2 IP) in the starts...Both of the games were here at SunTrust Park.

22 OVER: The Braves moved a season-high 22 games over .500 tonight, establishing the club's high-water mark for the last six years...The last time the Braves were 22 games or better over .500 was 2013, when that club finished the season 96-66 (30 games over)... Their high-water mark that season was 32 games over after September 3.

SERIES PLAY: With last night's win, the Braves have taken this series, and the club is now 24-9-6 in series play this year...Atlanta has matched their win total in series play from last season, when the club won 90 games on their way to a NL East division title.

A This series marks the first the Braves have won a at SunTrust Park since the All-Star break...They went 0-1-2 in three sets against Washington, Kansas City and Cincinnati.

A Overall, the Braves are 11-4-4 in series play here this season.

JULIO STARTS: With his 219th career start tonight, RHP Julio Teheran will pass Rick Mahler for the sixth most in Atlanta franchise history...Only Phil Niekro (594), Tom Glavine (518), John Smoltz (466), Greg Maddux (363) and Tim Hudson (243) have started more games for Atlanta.

A Teheran is one win shy of 75 for his career, which would tie Kevin Millwood for the 9th most in Atlanta franchise history.

BIG INNING: The Braves used six singles and a walk to score five times in the seventh inning last night, marking the first time this season the club scored as many runs in an inning without an extra-base hit...The last time they scored five or more runs in an inning without an extra-base hit was May 20, 2018, when they rallied for six runs in the bottom of the ninth inning to beat Miami, 10-9.

A Last night was the Braves' 13th inning with at least five runs this season...Atlanta is now a perfect 13-0 in these games.

A Last night's game was the third time that Atlanta scored five runs in a single frame in the seventh inning or later, also doing so on June 16 vs. Philadelphia (7th) and April 20th at Cleveland (9th).

LOOKING FOR 30/30: OF Ronald Acuña Jr. enters tonight's game with a National League-most 28 stolen bases this season, leaving him two shy of the fifth 30 home run/30 stolen base season in Braves franchise history...The Mets have allowed 102 stolen bases this season, the most in the majors by far...The next closest team is Los Angeles (AL) with 78 allowed.

A Acuña Jr. is also looking to become the second player in baseball history to have at least 30 home runs and 30 stolen bases in a season prior to his 22nd birthday...The only player to do so was Mike Trout, who had 30 home runs and 49 stolen bases as a 20-year-old in 2012.

A Only three Braves have gone 30/30 at any age, with OF Ron Gant doing it last in 1990 and 1991.

A OF Hank Aaron was the first to do so, accomplishing the feat in 1963, while OF Dale Murphy also did it in 1983.

SAVES: LHP Jerry Blevins struck out Michael Conforto with the bases loaded last night to earn his first save of the season and the seventh of his career.

A Blevins became the 10th Atlanta pitcher to record a save this season, most on a single team in the majors...Blevins, Luke Jackson, Mark Melancon, A.J. Minter, Sean Newcomb, Anthony Swarzak, Josh Tomlin, Jonny Venters, Arodys Vizcaíno and Jacob Webb have all earned at least one save for the Braves.

A The Braves single-season franchise record for individual players with a save is 11, set by the 1973 club.

A Five different pitchers have combined to convert Atlanta's last six saves, dating to July 14 at San Diego...Jackson has converted a pair, while Blevins, Melancon, Minter and Tomlin each have one.

STARTERS LENGTH: LHP Dallas Keuchel went 6.0 scoreless innings last night, the fifth consecutive game a Braves starter has covered at least the first six innings... That is the longest such streak by the Braves rotation this season...The starters are 3-0 with a 1.69 ERA (6 ER/32.0 IP) over this stretch, with just one home run allowed.

- A** Makes his 26th start of 2019...Is the 222nd appearance of his career, and his 219th start.
- A** With his 219th career start tonight, will pass Rick Mahler for sixth most in Atlanta franchise history...Only Phil Niekro (594), Tom Glavine (518), John Smoltz (466), Greg Maddux (363) and Tim Hudson (243) have started more games for Atlanta.
- A** Set for his 29th career game and 28th career start against the Mets, and his fourth this season...Is 10-8 with a 2.68 ERA (50 ER/168.0 IP) over his first 28 games.
- A** In three starts this season, is 1-1 with a 6.08 ERA (9 ER/13.1 IP).
- A** In 27 career starts against them has allowed two earned runs or less 22 times, including eight of his last 10 turns...Has 20 quality starts.
- A** Among all active pitchers to pitch at least 100 innings against the Mets, Teheran's 2.68 ERA is second lowest in the majors...Only Max Scherzer, with a 2.47 mark, has been better.
- A** Last started on August 9 at Miami, and held the Marlins to five hits and one run over 7.0 innings.
- A** The start was his 14th of the season allowing one earned run or fewer, tied for second most in the majors among traditional starters...Only the Dodgers' Hyun-Jin Ryu (16) has more.
- A** Ryne Stanek had 25 such starts while opening for the Rays.
- A** The Atlanta-franchise record for such starts is 20, set by Greg Maddux in 2002.
- A** Makes his 11th intradivision start of the season, and is 4-2 with a 2.59 ERA (16 ER/55.2 IP) against the NL East this season.
- A** Among pitchers with as many starts against the East, Teheran's 2.59 ERA is third lowest...Only Mike Soroka (2.45) and Jacob deGrom (2.54) have been better against their own division.

2019 Recap

- A** Started against the Marlins, 8/9, and allowed five hits and one run over 7.0 innings.
- A** Allowed a home run leading off the seventh inning to snap a 24-inning scoreless streak against Miami to open the season.
- A** Pitched exactly 6.0 scoreless innings in each of his three starts against the Marlins to open the season...Teheran's run was just the fourth time since 1908 that a Braves starter had three straight such starts against one opponent in a single season...Warren Spahn first did so against Cincinnati in 1947, before Pete Smith did it against the Cubs in 1988...John Smoltz matched them in 2006 with three straight such starts against San Diego.
- A** Beat Washington, July 30, for his 73rd career win...Moved into sole possession of 10th place in Atlanta franchise history, passing Steve Avery (72).
- A** Since Teheran's first full season in 2013, no pitcher has made more starts for a single team than he has for Atlanta.
- A** Made his first start after the All-Star break, 7/13 at SD...Allowed three hits and three runs (two earned) over 6.0 innings in Atlanta's 7-5 win.
- A** Went 5-6 with a 3.75 ERA (42 ER/100.2 IP) in 19 starts before the break.
- A** For his career, is 29-27 with a 3.47 ERA (197 ER/511.0 IP) in 86 appearances, 83 starts, after the break...Is 44-42 with a 3.72 ERA in 133 games before the break.
- A** Made his third start of the season against Miami, 7/5 and fired 6.0 scoreless innings...Took a no-decision in Atlanta's walkoff win, 1-0.
- A** Atlanta has two wins this season by a 1-0 score, and both have come in Teheran's starts against Miami.
- A** Allowed eight hits and six earned runs, 6/18 vs. NYM...The outing stopped a streak of eight straight starts in which he allowed one earned run or less.
- A** His run of one-run starts spanned from May 5 to June 13, during which he ranked second in the majors with a 0.81 ERA (4 ER/44.2 IP)...Trailed just Hyun-Jin Ryu of the Dodgers (0.53 ERA).
- A** Teheran's eight-game streak was tied for the longest in the majors by a traditional starter this season, matching a run by his rotation-mate Mike Soroka...TB's Ryne Stanek has a 14-game run while opening for the Rays.
- A** Made his 200th career start, 4/30 vs. SD...Allowed five hits and four runs over a season-most 7.0 innings.
- A** Became the ninth Braves pitcher to make 200 starts for the club since the team moved to Atlanta in 1966...Joins Phil Niekro (594), Tom Glavine (518), John Smoltz (466), Greg Maddux (363), Tim Hudson (243), Rick Mahler (218), Ron Reed (203) and Steve Avery (201).

Saves/Opp: 1/1 **Holds:** 8 **1st Batter/Retired:** 33/26 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 19/5

- Is 1-0 with 3.33 ERA (9 ER/24.1 IP) in 33 games with Atlanta...Twenty-eight of his 33 appearances have been scoreless, including 15 of his last 17.
- Converted his first save chance of the season, 8/14 vs. NYM...Was the seventh save of his career.
- Celebrated 10 years of major league service time on July 27.
- Allowed four earned runs in 1.0 inning, 5/7 at LAD...Has a 1.93 ERA (5 ER/23.1 IP) in his other 32 games.
- Nineteen of his 33 appearances have been less than 1.0 inning.
- Holding left-handed batters to a .146 (6-for-41) average with 13 strikeouts...Righties are 12-for-49 (.245).
- Atlanta acquired him from the Oakland A's on 4/28 in exchange for cash considerations...Was designated for assignment by Atlanta on 5/14 and re-signed to a major league contract on 5/18.

- Is 0-1 with an 11.81 ERA (7 ER/5.1 IP) in seven games with the Braves, and 0-3 with a 2.49 ERA (12 ER/43.1 IP) in 45 games on the season...He has converted 22 of 27 save opportunities.
- Retired all three batters he faced, 8/14 vs. NYM, for his first clean inning with Atlanta...Allowed runs in four of his first six appearances with the Braves, and also allowed all four of his inherited runners to score.
- Made his Braves debut on 8/3 vs. CIN, allowing a run in the ninth inning to blow a save.
- Acquired from Detroit on 7/31 in exchange for LHP Joey Wentz and OF Travis Demeritte...Prior to joining the Braves ranked fourth in the American League with his 22 saves, while his 1.18 ERA was the second lowest in baseball to San Diego's Kirby Yates among qualifying relievers.
- Was 0-2 with 22 saves and a 1.18 ERA (5 ER/38.0 IP) with 43 strikeouts and 12 walks in 38 games out of the bullpen for the Tigers this season.

Luke Jackson • RHP • 6-2 • 210 • 27 yrs • #77

- Is 6-2 with a 3.60 ERA (22 ER/55.0 IP) in 53 games this season...Has converted 18 of his 25 save chances after logging just one career save prior to 2019...His seven blown saves are tied for second most in the majors.
- Per Statcast, has an expected batting average of just .209 and an average exit velocity of 86.9 mph...Opponents are officially batting .267 (58-for-217).
- Logged his fourth hold of the season on 8/8 at MIA, his first since 4/27 vs. COL.
- Earned his 18th save, 8/11 at Miami...Has four saves of at least 1.1 innings.
- Left-handers have just 15 hits in 80 at-bats (.188) against him...Righties are hitting .314 (43-for-137).
- Has fanned 73 batters in 55.0 innings for a career-best 11.95 SO/9.0 IP ratio.
- Recorded his second consecutive two-inning save, 5/15 vs. STL, to become the first Braves closer with back-to-back two-inning saves since Hall of Famer John Smoltz in 2002

- Is 1-3 with a 4.01 ERA (19 ER/42.2 IP) in 44 games on the season, including an 11.57 ERA (6 ER/4.2 IP) in six games with Atlanta.
- Earned his first hold with the Braves, 8/11 at MIA...Fanned two in a scoreless inning.
- Acquired from Texas on 7/30 in exchange for LHP Kolby Allard...Made his Braves debut on 8/2 vs. CIN with a perfect eighth inning.
- Went 0-2 with a 3.08 ERA (13 ER/38.0 IP) in 38 games out of the bullpen for Texas this season with 43 strikeouts and just four walks.
- Before joining Atlanta, had a rate of 0.95 BB/9 which ranked fifth best among qualifying relievers in the majors.
