



# ARIZONA DIAMONDBACKS (17-29) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (19-25)

**HERE'S THE STORY:** The D-backs are hosting the Mariners for the first time since Aug. 25-26, 2018 and sixth time overall.

- ♦ Arizona is 7-3 in its last 10 games vs. Seattle, outscoring the Mariners, 65-47.
- ♦ **Christian Walker's** 19 RBI since Aug. 24 are tied for third most in the NL:
  - ☐ **NL RBI LEADERS SINCE AUG. 24:** 26 - Freddie Freeman/ATL; 22 - Marcell Ozuna/ATL; 19 - **Christian Walker/ARI** and Eugenio Suarez/CIN; 18 - Michael Conforto/NYM.

**FELICITACIONES SEÑOR COMISIONADO! Junior Noboa,** D-backs Vice President, Latin Operations, was recently appointed baseball commissioner of the Dominican Republic.

- ♦ Noboa is in his 25th year with the organization, and currently oversees the D-backs' baseball academy in Boca Chica, D.R. and serves as the team's liaison to its Latin American prospects.
- ♦ He was the D-backs' first international hire in Aug. 1995.

**PAVIN(G) A WAY TO THE MAJORS: Pavin Smith,** the D-backs' first round pick in the 2017 draft (seventh overall), is expected to make his Major League debut tonight vs. Mariners.

- ♦ He is the second signee of Arizona's 2017 draft class to reach the Majors (also: Daulton Varsho).
- ♦ Smith will be the first D-backs first rounder to make his Major League debut with Arizona since Braden Shipley (2013 draft/2016 debut) and first by a position player to do so since A.J. Pollock (2009 draft/2012 debut).

**BACK-TO-BACK FIRSTS: Travis Bergen** recorded his first Major League save on Thursday and **Stefan Crichton** notched his first save last night, marking the first time in club history that 2 relievers earned their first career saves in consecutive games [source: Elias Sports Bureau].

**ZAC ATTACK: Zac Gallen's** 2.29 ERA is tied for the fifth lowest in club history through 9 starts (also: Robbie Ray in 2015), behind Randy Johnson's 0.97 ERA in 2000, Patrick Corbin's 1.44 ERA in 2013, Daniel Hudson's 1.67 ERA in 2010 and Johnson's 1.88 ERA in 2002 [source: Elias Sports Bureau].

- ♦ The lowest D-backs ERA through 10 starts: 1.44 - Johnson (2000); 1.71 - Corbin (2013); 2.07 - Johnson (2002); 2.29 - Miguel Batista (2003); 2.30 - Wade Miley (2012).

**THE PEN HAS BEEN MIGHTY:** The D-backs' bullpen has posted a 1.93 ERA (3 ER in 14.0 IP) in its last 3 games.

## RHP ZAC GALLEN ♦ #23 ♦ R/R ♦ 6-2/198 ♦ 25 (AUG. 3, 1995)

- AT A GLANCE:** Second season with the D-backs.
- Acquired on July 31, 2019 from the Marlins for INF Jazz Chisholm.
  - Selected by the Cardinals' in the third round of the 2016 draft...traded to the Marlins as part of a deal that included Marcell Ozuna on Dec. 14, 2017.
  - Nicknamed "The Milkman" by a University of North Carolina broadcaster (up for debate why - because of his last name or because he "always delivered").

**GALLEN LATELY:** Is 1-0 with a 2.08 ERA (6 ER in 26.0 IP) in 4 starts @ Chase Field this season.

- Has surrendered just 1 home run in his last 4 start after 1 in each of his first 5.
- In 4 interleague starts, has gone 1-1 with a 1.67 ERA (5 ER in 27.0 IP) and a 0.78 WHIP.

**LAST START:** Suffered his first loss on Sept. 7 @ Giants (4 ER in 5.0 IP), ending his record streak of 3 or fewer earned runs to start his career.

- All 4 runs and 4 of 5 hits allowed came in the sixth inning.

**QUITE A STREAK TO START:** Set the Major League record with 23 games allowing 3 or fewer earned runs to begin a career (all starts), surpassing the 21-game stretch by Aaron Sele/BOS, June 23, 1993-April 19, 1994.

**VS. MARINERS:** Is making his first career start.

**ON THE LEADERBOARD:** Ranks among the NL leaders in quality starts (T-2nd, 7), innings (5th, 55.0), opponent average (6th, .190), ERA (7th, 2.29) and WHIP (8th, 0.98).

**TROUBLE WITH THE CURVE:** Opponents are hitting .063 (2-for-32) off his curveball (.203 in 2019).

### TOUCHING ALL THE BASES

**OUR NEWEST FANS:** Each series, the D-backs will highlight a charitable cause or team initiative with cardboard cutouts in the Batter's Box:

- ♦ For this series, first responders and military members are featured behind home plate in honor of 9/11.
- ♦ Among those behind home plate is the late Phoenix Police Commander Greg Carnicle, a D-backs season ticket holder who was killed in the line of duty on March 29... Commander Carnicle is survived by his wife, Ann and children, Rachel, Veronica, CiCi and John.
- ♦ Also featured is Phoenix Police Chief Jeri Williams, Phoenix Police Officer Tanner Johnson (son of D-backs legend Randy Johnson), Phoenix Fire Chief Kara Kalkbrenner, military service members from the USO and first responders from American Medical Response.

**INTERLEAGUE INSIGHT:** Arizona is 15-6 in its last 21 games vs. AL opponents and is 20-10 (.667) since 2019.

- ♦ The D-backs' .667 interleague winning pct. is the best in the Majors during that span, ahead of the Mets (.657; 23-12) and Rays (.656; 21-11).

**DOUBLE YOUR FUN:** The D-backs are tied for second in the NL with 40 double plays (also: Phillies)...only the Rockies (57) have more.

**LOCASTRO A GO-GO: Tim Locastro** has been successful in his first 25 career stolen base attempts, tied for the third-longest stolen base streak to start a career (since 1951 - when steals were tracked) [source: Sportradar].
