HERE'S THE STORY: The D-backs are 9-5 in their last 14 games @ Oracle Park.

- ♦ Arizona starters have given up 2 earned runs or fewer in 9 of their last 12 games (3.30 ERA; 22 ER in 60.0 IP).
 - ❑ D-backs starters have posted a 2.81 ERA (10 ER in 32.0 IP) and a .212 opponent average in their last 6 road games.
- ♦ **Christian Walker** is hitting .333 (16-for-48)/1.039 OPS with 3 doubles, 3 homers and 12 RBI in his last 13 games.
 - ❑ Has homered 4 times in his last 10 games after just once in his first 28.

ROSTER MOVES: Prior to tonight's game, the D-backs reinstated LHP **Madison Bumgarner** from the 10-day injured list (mid-back strain) and optioned INF **Andy Young** to their Alternate Training Site.

BUM IS BACK IN TOWN: **Madison Bumgarner**, who is starting tonight, spent 11 seasons with the Giants and went 119-92 with a 3.13 ERA.

- ♦ His start is nearly 11 years after making his debut on Sept. 8, 2009 vs. Padres.
- ♦ Bumgarner ranks among San Francisco's (since 1958) all-time leaders in strikeouts (2nd, 1,794), ERA (3rd, 3.13), wins (3rd, 119), starts (3rd, 286) and innings (4th, 1846.0).
- ♦ In 140 starts @ Oracle Park, he is 60-40 with a 2.72 ERA (278 ER in 918.2 IP)...is 5-0 with a 2.22 ERA (18 ER in 73.0 IP) and a 0.78 WHIP in his last 11 starts @ Oracle Park.

A GIANT UPTICK IN EXIT VELO: Last night, **Ketel Marte** recorded 3+ hits with an exit velocity over 100.0 mph, the fourth time in his career he accomplished the feat in a single game:

BUMGARNER AT A GLANCE: Is in his first season with Arizona... agreed to a 5-year deal through 2024 on Dec. 17, 2019.

- Is a 4-time NL All-Star (2013-16), 3-time World Series champion ('10, '12, '14) and 2014 World Series MVP.
- Won 2 Louisville Slugger® Silver Slugger Awards™ ('14-15).
- Selected by the Giants in the first round (10th overall) in the 2007 draft.

LAST START: Lasted just 2.0 innings before being removed due to a mid-back strain on Aug. 9 @ Padres (6 ER in 2.0 IP).

VS. GIANTS: Will be making his first start.

OPENING DAY, JULY 24 @ PADRES: Made his D-backs debut on Opening Day, holding the Padres to 2 singles, 1 walk and 4 strikeouts in his first 5.0 innings before a 3-run sixth inning...took the 7-2 loss (3 ER in 5.2 IP).

- Was his sixth career Opening Day start...started 5 openers for the Giants (2014-16, '17, '19).

2019 REVIEW: Went 9-9 with a 3.90 ERA,1.13 WHIP and 203 strikeouts in a career-high-tying 34 starts for the Giants.

- Tied for the NL lead in starts with Aaron Nola/PHI and finished second in innings behind only Stephen Strasburg/WSH (209.0 IP).
- Threw 200.0+ innings for the 11th time and struck out at least 200 for the fourth time.

PLAYOFFS?: Is 8-3 with 3 complete games (all shutouts), a 2.11 ERA, and .201 opponent average in 16 postseason appearances (14 starts), including going 4-0 with a Major-League record 0.25 ERA in 5 World Series outings (4 starts).

- Named the 2014 World Series MVP, the 26th pitcher (28th time) to win the award....also named the NLCS MVP, making him the seventh player (fourth pitcher) ever to be named the LCS MVP and the World Series MVP in the same season.

TOUCHING ALL THE BASES

IN THE SEATS: The Giants have provided visiting teams the opportunity to bring 4 "fans" to each game, so attending this weekend's games at Oracle Park are 4 legends - Hall of Famer **Randy Johnson** (who earned his 300th win with San Francisco on June 4, 2009); **Luis Gonzalez** (who hit .345 with 2 "splash hits" in this ballpark); **Mark Grace** (5 homers and 1 "splash hit"); and Buck O'Neil Award winner **Roland Hemond**. The fourth "racing legend" for the D-backs, **Matt Williams**, is already represented in the stands as a member of the Giants.

LOCAL STREAMING NOW AVAILABLE: For the remainder of the season, fans can not only hear live D-backs games on the radio, but also on their favorite devices, as Greg Schulte, Tom Candiotti and Mike Ferrin will now be streamed on the Arizona Sports app and ArizonaSports.com...previously, this online option was only available via dbacks.com.

IT'S STRIKEOUT SEASON: D-backs pitchers rank third in the NL with 360 strikeouts...only the Reds (399) and Brewers (378) have more.

LOCASTRO A GO-GO: **Tim Locastro** has been successful in his first 23 career stolen base attempts, the fifth-longest stolen base streak to start a career (since 1951 - when steals were tracked) [source: Sportradar].
