**TODAY'S GAME:** Is **Game 3** (0-2) of a 3-game series vs **Mike Vassallo's** playoff-bound **Brewers** and **Game 6** (1-4) of a 6-game **final homestand** that included a **2-1 series loss** to the Mets...beginning tomorrow night at **PNC Park**, the Reds will finish the **2019 championship season** with 3 games vs the **Pirates**.

**AND THIS ONE BELONGS TO US:** To conclude the month-long series of special events celebrating his **46-season career**, beloved Hall of Fame radio broadcaster **Marty Brennaman** will work today's game from the usual press box level booth alongside his partner of 13 seasons, **Jeff Brantley**...Senior Director of Ticket Operations **John O'Brien**, also working his last game after 42 seasons here, will announce today's attendance from the press box.

**SERIES NOTES:** The Reds won **2-2-2** in this season's **6 series vs Mil**, including this one...the 5-4 loss on **7/24 at Miller Park** snapped the Reds' **5-game winning streak** vs the Brewers, their longest since **9/27/12 - 6/14/13** and their longest in a single season since they won **7 straight** from **7/27-9/21, 2010**...the Reds' **3-1 series win at Great American Ball Park** from **7/1-7/4** was their first series win vs Mil since **9/4-9/6, 2017** (3-0 at GABP) and their first 4-game series win vs Mil since **4/30-4/23, 2015** (3-1 at Miller Park).

**PIRATES UP NEXT:** The Reds have **lost 10 straight games** at **PNC Park** dating back to an 8-6 win on **6/17/18**, including this season's **7-game losing streak**, and are **2-15 there** over the **last 2 seasons**...the current **losing streaks** are the Reds' longest **overall** and **single-season** losing streaks at **PNC Park**...from **4/4-4/7** the Pirates swept a **4-game series** from the Reds for the first time since **7/11-7/14, 1991** at **Riverfront Stadium** and did it in **Pittsburgh** for the first time since **8/22-8/24, 1969** at **Forbes Field**...from **3/31-4/5** the Reds were shut out by the Pirates in **3 consecutive games** (5-0, 2-0, 2-0) for the first time since **7/31-8/2, 1931** (5-0 & 1-0 losses at Pit, 3-0 loss at Cin).

**FIRST WATCH:** In the first inning, the Redlegs lead the Major Leagues in **runs** (129), **HR** (45, Major League record), **RBI** (126), **bating average** (.300) and **slugging percentage** (.572)...have outscored opponents in the first frame, **129-90**, and are **36-14** (.720) when leading after the first inning...**6 times** this season scored **at least 4 runs** in the first inning...**Eugenio Suárez** leads the Major Leagues with **15 HR** in the first inning, a franchise record, while **José Iglesias** leads the National League in first-inning **bating average** (.448), **on-base percentage** (.467) and **slugging percentage** (.759).

**GENO:** **3B Eugenio Suárez** ranks second in the Major Leagues with a **career-high 49 HR**, a record for a player from Venezuela and the National League record for HR in a season by a player at that position...**Suárez' 49 HR** are the most by a third baseman since NYY's **Alex Rodriguez** in 2007 established the Major League single-season record by hitting 52 of his 54 HR while playing third base...**Suárez' 49 HR** are the most by a Reds batter since **George Foster** established the single-season franchise record with 52 HR in 1977...since the All-Star break **Suárez** leads the Major Leagues with **29 HR**, a new club record for HR in the second half of a season (27, **Ted Kluszewski**, 1954), and leads the National League in **slugging percentage** (.700)...**Suárez** is trying to become the sixth Reds batter to lead the National League in HR, the first since **Foster** hit 40 HR in 1978...with a club record 52 HR in 1977, **Foster** is the last Reds batter to lead the Major Leagues in HR.

**RUTHIAN:** In the 8-5 win on 9/4 vs Phi, **Michael Lorenzen** joined **Babe Ruth (6/13/1921 vs Det)** as the only Major League players since 1900 to **earn the win, hit a home run and play the outfield** in the same game...entered in the seventh inning as the Reds' third pitcher of the game and suffered a blown save after **Jay Bruce** homered to tie the score at 5-5...in the bottom of the eighth hit his only HR of the season and seventh of his career, a 2-run HR off **Blake Parker** that extended the Reds' lead to 8-5...**played center field** in the top of the ninth.

**2-WAY PLAYER:** RHP **Michael Lorenzen** has appeared in **101** of the Reds' **158 games** (70g at P, 16g in CF, 8g in LF, 4g in RF, 13g as pinch runner, 6g as a pinch hitter)...in 4 of the last 10 games was the Reds' starting center fielder...he is a **career .232 hitter** (29-125) with 3 doubles, 1 triple, 7 HR, 23 RBI and 5 stolen bases...**this season as a pinch hitter** is 1-6 with 1 RBI...in his **career as a pinch hitter** is 5-for-26 (.192, 7 RBI) with **3 HR**, on 4/6/17 off Phi's **Adam Morgan**, 6/24/18 off Chi's **Mike Montgomery** and 6/30/18 off Mil's **Jacob Barnes** (grand slam)...**9 times** in his career, including twice this season (4/9 vs Mia, 4/15 at LAD), he entered games as a pinch hitter and remained in that game to pitch...**6 times** in his career came off the bench to produce a home run, including 3 times as a reliever and 3 times as a pinch hitter...**Lorenzen** this year became the **first player in Reds history**, whose primary position is pitcher, to appear in **each of the first 6 games of a season** (PR/CF, P, PR, P, PR, P)...is the first Reds player with as many as 406.2 career innings pitched to play center field since **Hal Jeffcoat** (474.1ip) in **1958**...**Ron Mahay** was the last Major League pitcher with at least 400 innings also to play CF at some point in his career...**Mahay** played in 5g in CF for the Red Sox in 1995 and then pitched his 400th inning in 2007 for the Braves.

**AND THIS ONE BELONGS....:** Hall of Fame broadcaster **Marty Brennaman** is retiring after 46 seasons calling Reds games for **700 WLW Radio**...he joined the Reds radio team in **1974** and for **31 seasons** (1974-2004) shared the 700 WLW Radio booth with Reds Hall of Fame pitcher **Joe Nuxhall**, tying LA's **Vin Scully** and **Jerry Doggett** for the longest running broadcast duo in baseball history...**Brennaman** is only the eighth Major League Baseball broadcaster to work for the same team for at least 46 seasons, joining **Scully** (67 seasons, 1950-2016), **Ralph Kiner** of the Mets (52, 1962-2013), KC's **Denny Matthews** (51, 1969-2019), Mil's **Bob Uecker** (49, 1971-2019), **Jack Buck** (48, 1954-2001) & **Mike Shannon** (48, 1972-2019) of the Cardinals and LAD's **Jaime Jarrin** (47, 1973-2019).

# Today's Pitcher - #58 Luis Castillo, RHP

## RED HOTS

**Luis Castillo** in his third **Major League** season at just **26 years old**, was the Reds' **Opening Day** starter and is a **2019 National League All-Star**...per *Baseball America*, his **changeup** was voted by managers, scouts and executives the **best in the National League**...this afternoon is making his team-high **32nd start**, a new career high...already has established new **career highs** in **wins, innings pitched** and **strikeouts**...is the first Reds pitcher with **15 wins** in a season since **Johnny Cueto** (20-9) and **Alfredo Simon** (15-10) each did it in **2014**...in the second inning on 9/7 vs Ari recorded his **200th** **strikeout** of the season (Josh Rojas)...in his **last 36 apps** beginning 9/1/18 is **18-8** and in that span ranks fourth among all Major League starting pitchers with an ERA of **2.92** (**Jacob deGrom** 2.33, **Justin Verlander** 2.34, **Gerrit Cole** 2.58)...this season ranks among the National League leaders in **wins** (T4th), **ERA** (9th), **strikeouts** (9th), **strikeouts per 9 innings** (7th, 10.57) and **opponents' BA** (3rd, .200)...in his career has allowed **13 HR** in the **first inning**, his highest total in any inning and including **3 HR** in the **first frame** this year...in his 7-4 win on **8/5 vs LAA**, his career-high **13 strikeouts** are the most by a Reds pitcher since **Raisel Iglesias** had 13 strikeouts on **8/23/15 vs Ari**...produced 8 starts in which he threw at least 5.0 innings while allowing 2 hits or fewer and 2 runs or fewer, a single-season franchise record...was the National League's **Pitcher of the Month** for **March/April** (7gs, 3-1, 1.45)...since his **Major League debut** in 2017, leads the Reds' pitching staff in almost every statistical category, including **wins, starts, innings pitched** and **strikeouts**.

**Homestand: 4-18 (.222), 1 HR, 4 RBI, 2 SB**

- Was the National League Player of the Month and Rookie of the Month for August.
- Was National League Player of the Week for 8/5-8/11.
- Holds modern Major League records for fewest career games to 14 HR (28) and fewest career plate apps to 15 HR (122).
- Since his promotion on 8/1, among all Major League batters ranks T4th in HR (17) and third in RBI (45)...Eugenio Suárez is first in HR in that span (20).
- Is trying to become the fourth Reds player to produce 20 HR after July 31 (Greg Vaughn, 20 in 1999; George Foster, 20 in 1977; Frank Robinson, 20 in 1962; Ted Kluszewski, 21 in 1956).
- Produced an RBI in 4 of his last 5 apps (4rbi) and in 5 of his last 7 apps (6rbi).
- In his first 27 apps through 8/29 hit .330 with 14 HR and 32 RBI (.804slg, .393obp)...in 25 apps since then is hitting .176 (16-91) with 3 HR and 13 RBI (.308slg, .214obp).
- Is a 2019 International League All-Star and the league's Rookie of the Year...since the Reds became an affiliate in 2000, he is only the second Louisville player ever to win the IL's Rookie of the Year award (Joey Votto, 2007).
- Shared with OF Brian O'Grady the 2019 Mary E. Barney Award as Louisville's co-Most Valuable Players (78g, .299, 28hr, 53rbi, 5sb).
- On 8/3 at Atl, in his third Major League appearance, produced his first career hit (single off Dallas Keuchel), first career HR (3-run off Keuchel) and first career RBI.

## 16 TUCKER BARNHART, c

**Homestand: 7-16 (.438), 2 2B, solo HR, 3 RBI**

- Has tied his career high in HR.
- Has a 5-game hitting streak (7-16, .438, 2 2b, 1hr, 3rbi), raising his season BA from .223.
- Hit safely in each of his last 6 starts (8-20, .400, 2 2b, 1hr, 3rbi).
- From 6/28-7/25 missed 22 games while on the 10-day IL with a right oblique strain.
- In the 8-5 win on 9/4 vs Phi made his first career start batting cleanup in the order...was his 486th career start (480gs at C, 6gs at 1B)...batted fourth again in the 4-3 walkoff win on 9/8 vs Ari.
- On 8/15 vs StL made his 500th career appearance as a catcher...is approaching 500 career starts at that position (491).

## 2 ALEX BLANDINO, inf

**Homestand: 3g as PH, 1g as PH/3B, 1-3, 1 walk**

- Has made 8 starts (5gs at 2B, 2gs at 3B, 1gs at DH), most recently at 2B in the 10-inning, 3-2 win on 9/18 at Wrigley Field (1-3, sac fly).

- In 28 apps beginning 8/25 is hitting .353 (36-102, 3 2b, 1 3b, 15hr, 25rbi).
