Beginning 7/22, the Reds are 16-16 and went 5-2-3 in 10 series (2-1 at Mil, 2-1 vs Col, 2-1 vs Pit, $2-2$ at Atl, $2-0$ vs LAA, $2-2$ vs Cubs, $0-3$ at Wsh, $2-2$ vs StL, $2-1$ vs SD, $0-3$ at Pit)...in that span lost 2.0 games in the NL Central standings ( -9.0 to season-high -11.0 )...began this stretch $4-0-2$ in 6 series, the Reds' longest series streak of 2019 without a loss.

FIRST WATCH
In the first inning, the Redlegs lead the Major Leagues in runs (105), HR (37), RBI (102), batting average (.306), slugging percentage (.581) and run differential ( +35 ; Min 2nd, +32 ) while ranking third in the majors in the first frame in on-base percentage (.365)...have outscored opponents in the first frame, 105-69, and are 31-9 (.775) when leading after the first inning... 6 times this season scored at least 4 runs in the first inning.

## DOUBLE DIPPING

Sat's split-squad doubleheader at StL's Busch Stadium will be the Reds' second DH of the year... on Memorial Day at Great American Ball Park earned a split with the Pirates ( 8 -5 loss, $8-1 \mathrm{win}$ )...in their 16 day/night doubleheaders since 1997, the Reds went 2-6 with 8 splits...last swept a day/night doubleheader on 7/8/14 vs Cubs (4-2, 6-5 wins)...last were swept in a day/night DH on 9/17/16 vs Pit (10-4, 7-3 losses).

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is Game 1 of a 4-game series vs Nicholas Alatriste's Marlins and Game 4 (0-3) of the Reds' longest road trip of the season... this 3 -city, 10 -day, 11 -game road trip already included a $3-0$ series sweep loss at Pit's PNC Park and features an upcoming weekend visit to StL's Busch Stadium ( 4 g , day/night DH on Sat)...following this road trip return to Great American Ballpark for a 7 -game homestand vs the Phillies ( 4 g ) and D-Backs (3g)...the Redlegs are 37-31 at home this season.

SERIES NOTES: In 3 games from 4/9-4/11, the Reds swept the Marlins for the first time since 5/14-5/16, 2013 in Miami and for the first time at Great American Ball Park since $8 / 13-8 / 15,2010 \ldots$ went $2-5$ vs the Marlins last season and haven't produced a winning season vs Fla since a 4-3 record in 2014...since then are 13-18 vs Mia (3-4, 3-4, 2-5, 2-5, 3-0 in 2019)...the Reds lost 11 of their last $\mathbf{1 2}$ games at Marlins Park, including 3 of the 4 games here last season, and $\mathbf{1 2}$ of their last $\mathbf{1 5}$ games in Miami...Cin is 3-0 with the Marlins Park roof open and 7-15 with the roof closed.

CARDINALS UP NEXT: The Reds are 6-9 vs StL this season, including 2-3 at Busch Stadium...Cin won 6 of its last 11 games at Busch Stadium... the Reds are $3-2-3$ in their last 8 series vs StL, including a 1-1 series split in April in Mexico at Estadio de Béisbol Monterrey, home of the Sultanes de Monterrey of the Mexican League.

THE PUNISHER: Rookie Aristides Aquino has produced 12 HR in his first 24 career games and 89 plate apps, including a 3 -homer game on $8 / 10$ vs Cubs in which he homered in $\mathbf{3}$ consecutive innings (2nd, 3rd, 4th)...he played 1 game for the Reds last season.

Established modern Major League records for home runs in a player's first 12 career games (8), first 14 career games (9), first 16 career games (10), first 17 career games (11) and first 22 career games (12)... he will share, at least, with LAD's Will Smith and Phi's Rhys Hoskins the first 28 career games (12).
Hit his 12th HR in his 77th plate appearance ( $8 / 23$ at Pit)...Phi's Rhys Hoskins (98th PA) and LAD's Will Smith (100th PA) are the only other players, since 1900, to produce 12 HR in their first 100 career plate apps.
Is the first Major League rookie and first Reds player to homer in 3 consecutive innings (2nd-4th), tying the Major League record for HR in consecutive innings in a game...he was the 13th player to do it, the second this season (Chi's Kris Bryant, $5 / 17$ at Wsh, 7th-9th).
Is the second player in modern Major League history with a 3-homer game within his first 10 career games (Bobby Estalella, 10th game, 9/4/1997).
Is the third rookie batter since 1900 to produce at least 10 HR over an 11-game span (8/6-8/17), joining LAD's Cody Bellinger (2017) and Det's Rudy York (1937).
With 11 HR, all in August, is 3 shy of the club record for home runs in a calendar month...Frank Robinson hit 14 HR in August 1962, and Greg Vaughn had 14 HR in September 1999.
2-WAY PLAYER: RHP Michael Lorenzen has appeared in 80 of the Reds' 129 games so far this season, including 54 times solely as a pitcher, twice as a pinch hitter/pitcher, once solely as a pinch hitter, once as a pitcher/LF/RF (7/22 at Mil), once as a pitcher/LF ( $6 / 2 \mathrm{vs}$ Wsh), twice as a P/RF, 4 times as a CF, 3 times as a LF, 8 times solely as a pinch runner, once as a pinch runner/CF ( $3 / 28 \mathrm{vs}$ Pit, CF), once as a pinch runner/LF ( $5 / 9$ at Oak) and once as a pinch runner/RF (5/24 at Chi) and once as a CF/P ( $7 / 17$ at Chi)...9 times in his career, including twice this season ( $4 / 9 \mathrm{vs}$ Mia, 4/15 at LAD), he entered games as a pinch hitter and remained in that game to pitch... 5 times in his career came off the bench to produce a home run, including twice as a reliever and 3 times as a pinch hitter...Lorenzen this year became the first player in Reds history, whose primary position is pitcher, to appear in each of the first 6 games of a season (PR/CF, P, PR, P, PR, P)...is the first Reds player with as many as 393.1 career innings pitched to play center field since Hal Jeffcoat (474.1ip) in 1958... Ron Mahay was the last Major League pitcher with at least 300 innings also to play CF...Mahay played in 5 g in CF for the Red Sox in 1995 and then pitched his 300th inning in 2006 for the Rangers.

CATCH A BREAK: The Reds have used 5 catchers this season, including Tucker Barnhart, Curt Casali, Kyle Farmer, Juan Graterol and Ryan Lavarnway...the 3 catchers on the club's Opening Day roster - Barnhart (IL), Casali (IL) \& Farmer (concussion) - simultaneously were unable to play for 8 days (7/18-7/25), until Barnhart came off the injured list prior to the game on 7/26...Barnhart, Farmer and Casali have returned to the active roster, Graterol remains in concussion protocol and Lavarnway was outrighted to Louisville...the Reds also used $\mathbf{5}$ catchers in a season last year (Barnhart, Casali, Devin Mesoraco, Tony Cruz, Tim Federowicz)...per @EliasSports, used 6 catchers in a season just 7 times in their history, most recently in 1992 (Troy Afenir, Scott Bradley, Joe Oliver, Jeff Reed, Dan Wilson, Rick Wrona)...also used 6 catchers in 1963, 1961, 1937, 1925 and 1895...the 1909 Reds used a club-record 8 catchers (Tommy Clarke, Tom Downey, Emil Haberer, Mike Konnick, Larry McLean, Si Pauxtis, Duck Pearce, Frank Roth).

150th CELEBRATION: During the 2019 season the Reds are celebrating the 150th anniversary of professional baseball, which began with the formation of the 1869 Red Stockings...this season, the team will wear 15 uniforms from various periods throughout the team's history...on Sun, 9/8 vs Ari will wear replica uniforms of the 1995 NL Central Division championship team...the Reds are 4-9 wearing throwback uniforms...already wore uniforms from 1902, 1911, 1912, 1919, 1935, 1936, 1939, 1956, 1961, 1967, 1969, 1976 and 1990...as part of the season-long celebration, the Reds Hall of Fame and Museum underwent a comprehensive modification, while the 1869 Pavilion at the southwest corner of the ballpark was dedicated on May 4, the 150th anniversary of the Red Stockings' 45-9 win over the Cincinnati Great Westerns in the first professional baseball game...more than 20 anniversary park benches, featuring Reds mascots wearing the 15 throwback uniforms, are on display at locations across Greater Cincinnati and Northern Kentucky

## Tonight's Pitcher - \#54 Sonny Gray, RHP

## RED HOTS

Sonny Gray is a 2019 National League All-Star...in his last 10 starts beginning $\mathbf{6 / 2 8}$ is $\mathbf{6 - 1 , 1 . 5 8}$ with 8 quality starts, 3 times was the victim of blown saves and since then ranks third among all Major League starting pitchers in ERA (Jack Flaherty 1.33, Jacob deGrom 1.52)...in Tue's 3-2 win vs SD, Josh Naylor's solo HR with 2 outs in the top of the sixth inning snapped his career-high scoreless streak at 23 innings...ties for the second-longest scoreless streak in the Major Leagues this season (Hyun-Jin Ryu, 32.0, 5/1-5/25)...is the longest by a Reds pitcher since reliever J.J. Hoover's 26.1 -inning streak from 6/13-8/19, 2013...is the longest by a Reds starter since Tom Browning's 23 -inning streak from $5 / 29-6 / 8,1990 \ldots$ is the longest by a Reds righthanded starter since Tom Seaver's 27 -inning streak from $9 / 15-9 / 30,1977$...the longest scoreless streak of Gray's career had been 14.2 innings ( $4 / 28-5 / 8,2015$ )...in his $3-0$ win on $7 / 3$ vs Mil, threw 8.0 shutout innings and tied his career high with 12 strikeouts...the 8.0 innings are the most by a Reds pitcher in a game this season, and his 12 strikeouts were the most by a Reds pitcher this season until Luis Castillo had a career-high 13 strikeouts on $8 / 5$ vs LAA...has 9 wins and 4 times was the victim of blown saves...began the season with 9 starts without a win, the longest such streak of his career to begin a season...was bothered in spring training by stiffness in his right elbow and made just 3 exhibition starts, but he started the Reds' second game of the season...hasn't missed a turn since.

From 8/9-8/10 and 8/20-8/22 made 5 rehab apps with the Bats ( $3-14, .214$, solo HR). Has made 43 starts, including 13 of the Reds' 17 games and 20 of 29 games before he was injured...the Reds won 16 of his last 27 starts overall ( .593 winning percentage). From 6/23-7/1 started 7 consecutive games, the longest streak by a Reds catcher since Tucker Barnhart started 7 straight games from 9/20-9/27, 2017...that streak was snapped on $7 / 2$ vs Mil, when Kyle Farmer made the first start of his career at C. Made his second Opening Day roster (2016 Rays).

22 DEREK DIETRICH, inf/of
Road Trip: 3gs at 1B, 1-9, 1 2b, 1bb, 1 hbp Last name is pronounced DEE-trick.
Has made 3 starts, all at 1B, since he came off the injured list on Friday....since $8 / 5$ had been on the 10-day IL with left shoulder inflammation...last week for Louisville went 2 -for-11 in 3 rehab starts (DH, 1B, 2B).
When placed on the injured list led the team with 41 starts at $2 B$ (last, $8 / 4$ at AtI)... has made 12 starts at 1B (last, Fri-Sun at Pit), 7 starts in LF (last, $7 / 17$ at Chi) and 2 starts at DH....has made 1 appearance at 3 B ( $4 / 28$ at StL, 8 th inning).
Through his 83 rd appearance on $7 / 13$ had 19 HR and 43 RBI, a single-season career high for home runs and 10 RBI shy of his career high ( 53,2017 )...produced his last HR and RBI on $7 / 13$ at Col (3-run HR off Chad Bettis).

On $5 / 28 /$ night vs Pit ( $3-4,3 \mathrm{hr}$, 6rbi) became the 28th Reds batter to hit at least 3 HR in a game, accomplished for the 36th time...also has a pair of 2-homer games, on $4 / 7$ at Pit ( 4 rbi ) and $5 / 3$ vs SF ( 6 rbi ).
On 2/19/19 was signed by the Reds to a minor league contract.
Was 1 of 2 non-roster invitees to make the Opening Day roster (SS José Iglesias).
6 PHILLIP ERVIN, of
Road Trip: 2gs in CF, 1 g as PH/LF, 0-8 In his fourth stint with the Reds this season, is hitting .315 in 54 apps since he was promoted on 6/15 (39-124, 6 2b, $43 \mathrm{~b}, 3 \mathrm{hr}, 12 \mathrm{rbi}$, 361 obp ).
Has made 29 starts ( 22 gs in LF, 6 gs in CF, 1gs in RF), including 8 of the last 10 games ( 5 gs in LF, 3 gs in CF)
In the 17-9 win on $7 / 13$ at Coors Field tied the club record with 6 hits, accomplished for the fourth time (Tony Cuccinello 1931, Ernie Lombardi 1937, Walker Cooper last on $7 / 6 / 1949$ vs Cubs)...fell a home run shy of the cycle.
Has 2 career pinch-hit HR, both this season (7/21 vs StL off Andrew Miller, 8/12 at Wsh off Sean Doolittle).
In 40 apps for Louisville hit 290 ( $8 \mathrm{2b}, 1$ 3b, 6hr, 26rbi, 6sb, 10 g in LF, 25 g in CF).
52 KYLE FARMER, inf/c Road Trip: 1 g at $3 \mathrm{~B}, 1 \mathrm{~g}$ as PH/2B, 2-4, solo HR Last started last Mon vs SD, caught and went 0 -for- 2 with a walk.
Has 8 HR and 25 RBI....are the first home runs of his career...entered the season with 11 career RBI in 59 apps.
Since he came off the concussion list on $7 / 28$ is hitting .306 (11-36, $12 \mathrm{~b}, 2 \mathrm{hr}, 3 \mathrm{rbi}$ ) in 16 apps and 7 starts ( 5 gs at $\mathrm{C}, 1 \mathrm{gs}$ at 2B, 1 gs at 1B).
This season has made 13 apps and 9 starts at C...are the first starts of his career at that position...entered this season with 4 career apps at $\mathrm{C}(3 \mathrm{~g}$ in $2017,1 \mathrm{~g}$ in 2018)... this spring training caught 36.0 innings.
Has made 29 starts ( 11 gs at $2 \mathrm{~B}, 9 \mathrm{gs}$ at $\mathrm{C}, 6 \mathrm{gs}$ at $1 \mathrm{~B}, 3 \mathrm{gs}$ at 3 B ). In his career has played $1 \mathrm{~B}(15 \mathrm{~g}, 7 \mathrm{gs}), 2 \mathrm{~B}(34 \mathrm{~g}, 11 \mathrm{gs}), 3 \mathrm{~B}(34 \mathrm{~g}, 17 \mathrm{gs}) \& \mathrm{C}(17 \mathrm{~g}, 9 \mathrm{gs})$. Leads Reds pinch hitters in at bats, hits, doubles and RBI (10-34, .294, $32 \mathrm{~b}, 1 \mathrm{hr}$, 6rbi)....hit his only career pinch-hit HR on $5 / 5$ vs SF (solo off Will Smith).
Made his only Major League pitching appearance in a $12-5$ loss on $8 / 8$ vs Cubs (1.1ip, 1h)...became the first Reds player to pitch and catch in the same game since Dee Moore in 1936.

FREDDY GALVIS, inf Blue Jays: 115g, .267, 24 2b, 1 3b, 18hr, 54rbi, 4sb - On $8 / 12$ was claimed off waivers from the Blue Jays.

Has 21 HR, a new single-season career high (20hr, 2016)...with 61 RBI, is 6 shy of his single-season career high $(67,2016,2018)$.
Has hit safely in 9 of his 12 apps for the Reds.
In his last 65 apps beginning $6 / 13$ is hitting .314 ( $80-255,142 \mathrm{~b}, 13 \mathrm{~b}, 12 \mathrm{hr}, 36 \mathrm{rbi}$ ). For the Blue Jays played SS (103g, 102gs) and 2B ( $5 \mathrm{~g}, 4 \mathrm{gs}$ )...has made all 11 of his starts for the Reds at 2B.
Did not play on $4 / 24$, snapping his streak of 349 consecutive games played....was the longest active streak in the Major Leagues (Freddie Freeman 2nd, 194g).
In each of the 2017 and 2018 seasons played in 162 games... his $1,441.0$ innings in the field in 2018 were the most by any player in the Major Leagues.

4 JOSÉ IGLESIAS, ss
Road Trip: 5-12 (.417), 1rbi
Has a 4 -game hitting streak ( $7-16, .438,1 \mathrm{hr}, 2 \mathrm{rbi}, .625 \mathrm{slg}, .438 \mathrm{obp}$ ), including singles in 4 of his last 6 plate apps.

- In the first inning, leads the National League in hitting (.480) and slugging percentage (.840) while ranking second in on-base percentage (also .480 ).

In August is hitting .397, second-best in the National League...on the road is hitting .336 , third-best in the NL.

- In August has hit safely in 18 of his 19 apps (29-73, .397, 5 2b, 13 b , 2hr, 9 rbi , .575 slg , .400obp), including a season-high 14-game hitting streak snapped Tue vs SD... was the longest active streak in the Major Leagues when snapped and the longest by a Reds batter since Joey Votto's 17-game hitting streak from 7/26-8/12, 2017. After missing 3 games with soreness in his right biceps, returned to the lineup on $8 / 12$ and in 13 games since then is hitting .380 ( $19-50,32 \mathrm{~b}, 13 \mathrm{~b}, 1 \mathrm{hr}$, 6 rbi , 385 obp ). Leads the team with 122 hits...is trying to become the second straight shortstop to lead the team in hits...SS José Peraza last year led the team with 182 hits.
With 9 HR has established a new single-season high (6hr, 2017)...has 2 grand slams in his career, both this season vs Pit (5/27/night off Mitch Keller, 7/29 off Montana DuRapau)...with 49 RBI is 5 shy of his single-season career high ( 54,2017 ). After Scooter Gennett suffered a right groin injury in spring training became the team's starting SS, with José Peraza moving primarily to 2B.

9 JOSÉ PERAZA, inf
Road Trip: 1 g at $\mathrm{SS}, 2 \mathrm{~g}$ as PH, 0-3 In 66 apps beginning $5 / 31$ is hitting 276 (43-156, 8 2b, 2 3b, 1hr, 21 rbi, 1sb), raising his season batting average from . 199 .
Leads the team with 42 starts at $2 B$ (last, $8 / 8 \mathrm{vs}$ Cubs)...made 18 starts at SS, secondmost on the team behind José Iglesias and most recently in 3 straight games from 8/9-8/11 while Iglesias recovered from soreness in his right biceps.
Made 1 start at 3 B ( $8 / 17 \mathrm{vs} \mathrm{StL}$ ), his only career start at that position, and 11 starts in the outfield, including 9 starts in LF (last, $8 / 19 \mathrm{vs}$ SD) and 2 starts in CF ( $6 / 9$ at Phi, $6 / 22$ at Mil).
Has played $2 \mathrm{~B}(67 \mathrm{~g})$, $\mathrm{SS}(34 \mathrm{~g})$, $3 \mathrm{~B}(5 \mathrm{~g})$, LF $(24 \mathrm{~g}), \mathrm{CF}(5 \mathrm{~g})$ and $\mathrm{P}(2 \mathrm{~g})$.
Made the first 2 pitching apps of his career...with 2 outs in the ninth inning of the 11-4 loss on $7 / 30$ vs Pit, in a game that featured 9 ejections, threw 4 pitches and induced Jacob Stallings to F8...in the 13-4 loss on $8 / 16$ vs StL threw a scoreless ninth inning, allowed only an infield single to Kolten Wong.
Because of Scooter Gennett's injury in spring training, spent most of this season playing primarily 2B and occasionally CF or LF, while José Iglesias has been the team's starting SS.... has made 5 apps and 1 start at 3B.

15 NICK SENZEL, cf
Road Trip: 1 gs in CF, 1 g as PH, $0-5$
Last name is pronounced sen-ZELL.
Has been bothered by a sore right thumb.
Hasn't started since Fri at Pit...didn't play Sat....pinch hit yesterday and struck out. His .285 batting average through $8 / 2$ is a season high.
Has 3 leadoff HR ( $5 / 6$ vs SF off Drew Pomeranz, $6 / 12$ at Cle off Zach Plesac, 8/17 vs StL off Miles Mikolas)...Zack Cozart (4 in 2012) and Drew Stubbs (3 in 2009) are the only other Reds rookies with at least 3 leadoff HR in a season.
Is the only player in franchise history, and 1 of only 21 players in Major League history, to produce 3 HR in his first 4 Major League apps.
Began the season on Louisville's injured list with a right ankle sprain suffered on $3 / 25$ during a spring training game in Goodyear...came off the IL on $4 / 23$ and in 8 apps for the Bats prior to his $5 / 3$ promotion hit 257 ( $12 \mathrm{~b}, 1 \mathrm{hr}$, 2rbi).

7 EUGENIO SUÁREZ, inf
Road Trip: 2-12 (.167), solo HR
First name is pronounced AY-you-hay-nee-oh.
Leads all Major League third basemen with a career-high 35 HR (34hr, 2018)...Col's Nolan Arenado is second among third basemen with 33 HR....the club record for HR in a season by a third baseman is held by Tony Pérez, who in 1970 hit 40 HR overall and 39 HR while playing that position.
In the first inning, leads the Major Leagues in HR (12) and ranks among the leaders in RBI ( $22, \mathrm{~T} 5$ th $)$, slugging percentage ( $.702,2 \mathrm{nd}$ ) and batting average (. $327,16 \mathrm{th}$ ). Beginning $6 / 30$, homered in 17 of his last 48 apps (19hr), including a pair of 2 -homer games ( $7 / 1$ vs Mil, $7 / 22$ at Mil).
Twice this season homered in 3 consecutive plate apps (7/1-7/12, 7/22-7/23). Suárez and Tony Pérez are the only third basemen in club history with 25 HR in 3 seasons and the only third basemen in club history with 30 HR in 2 seasons.

17 JOSH VANMETER, inf/of Road Trip: 3gs in LF, 2-12 (.167), 2-run HR, 1sb In the eighth inning of yesterday's 9-8 loss at Pit became the 36th player to homer into the Allegheny River (2-run off Kyle Crick)...was accomplished for the 54th time. In his fourth stint with the Reds this season, is hitting .314 in 35 apps and 24 starts since he was promoted from Louisville just after the All-Star break (32-102, 7 2b, $5 \mathrm{hr}, 13 \mathrm{rbi}, .529 \mathrm{slg}, .386 \mathrm{obp}) \ldots$ was 1 of 7 roster moves that day (7/18).
Started 12 of the Reds' last 13 games and PH/LF in the other ( 6 gs at $1 \mathrm{~B}, 2 \mathrm{gs}$ at 2B, 4gs in LF)...in those 13 apps overall hit . 304 (14-46, 2 2b, 1hr, 5rbi, .360obp). In his last 16 apps beginning $8 / 9$ is hitting .304 ( $17-56,52 \mathrm{~b}, 1 \mathrm{hr}$, 6 rbi , .350 obp ), raising his season BA from . 275 .
Has made 31 starts ( 16 gss in LF, 6 gs at $1 \mathrm{~B}, 6 \mathrm{gs}$ at $2 \mathrm{~B}, 2 \mathrm{gs}$ at $3 \mathrm{~B}, 1 \mathrm{gs}$ at DH)...also made 1 appearance in RF ( $7 / 22$ at Mil).
From 8/15-8/21, with Joey Votto recovering from a low back strain, started at 1 B in 6 of the Reds' 7 games....are his first career starts at that position...hit 350 in those 6 starts ( $7-20,12 \mathrm{~b}, 2 \mathrm{rbi}$ ).
His solo HR off RHP Jhoulys Chacín on 7/24 at Mil traveled 463 feet per Statcast, the longest by a Reds batter this season and the second-longest by any player at Miller Park in 2019 (Travis Shaw, 465 feet, $6 / 23$ vs Cin)...was the longest home run by a visiting player at Miller Park since StL's Marcell Ozuna hit a 479 -foot HR on 4/3/18. Is a 2019 International League All-Star...in 49 apps for the Bats hit . 348 (14 2b, 1 3b, $14 \mathrm{hr}, 43 \mathrm{rbi}, 8 \mathrm{sb}, 1.097 \mathrm{ops})$...started at $1 \mathrm{~B}(10 \mathrm{~g})$, $2 \mathrm{~B}(20 \mathrm{~g}), 3 \mathrm{~B}(10 \mathrm{~g})$ and LF $(3 \mathrm{~g})$. In April was the organization's Minor League Player of the Month and the International League's Player of the Month ( $.358,11 \mathrm{hr}$, 28rbi).
Is a native and resident of Ossian (AH-see-in), Indiana, a town of about 3,400 located 3 hours from Cincinnati near Fort Wayne...graduated from Norwell High School.
