HERE'S THE STORY: The D-backs most recently faced the Angels in 2018, winning 3 of 4 games, and are 7-6 all-time @ Angel Stadium...the D-backs are 5-3 in their last 8 games vs. Angels since June 15, 2015.

- ◆ **Madison Bumgarner** is making his first start against the Angels, the only team he has never faced...it's his 17th career road start vs. AL West: 6-5 with a 3.91 ERA (45 ER in 103.2 IP), .220 opponent average and 97 strikeouts.
- ◆ **Nick Ahmed** is hitting .375 (12-for-32)/.882 OPS with 2 doubles, 2 RBI and 4 walks in his last 9 games.
- ◆ **Josh Rojas** is hitting .300 (6-for-20)/.391 OBP with 8 runs scored and 3 walks in his last 5 games.
- ◆ **Christian Walker's** 20 RBI since Aug. 24 are fourth in the NL behind Freddie Freeman/ATL (27); Marcell Ozuna/ATL (24); and Eugenio Suarez/CIN (21).
- ◆ **David Peralta**, in 11 games vs. AL West this season, is hitting .316 (12-for-38)/.992 OPS with 3 doubles, 1 triple, 2 homers, 10 RBI and 5 walks.

CALHOUN BACK WHERE IT ALL BEGAN: **Kole Calhoun**, who was the Angels' eighth-round pick in the 2010 draft out of Arizona State University, spent his first 8 years with the Angels (2012-19) and hit .249 with 140 home runs and 451 RBI in 966 games.

- ◆ In 474 games at Angel Stadium, he hit .241 (418-for-1737)/.726 OPS with 89 doubles, 5 triples, 68 home runs, 209 RBI and 168 walks.

INTERLEAGUE INSIGHT: Arizona is 15-8 (.652) in its last 23 games vs. AL opponents and is 20-12 (.625) since 2019.

- ◆ The D-backs' .625 interleague winning pct. since 2019 is fourth in the Majors, behind the Rays (.656; 21-11), Braves (.647; 22-12) and Padres (.629, 22-13).

LOCASTRO BASEBALL'S FASTEST MAN: **Tim Llocastro** leads the Majors with an average sprint speed of 30.8 ft/sec, ahead of Roman Quinn/PHI (30.3) and Trea Turner/WSH (30.0)...in 2019, Llocastro also led the Majors in 2019 at 30.8 ft/sec.

- ◆ Llocastro has been successful in his first 25 career stolen base attempts, tied for the third-longest stolen base streak to start a career (since 1951 - when steals were tracked)...he is tied with Quintin Berry/DET-BOS-BAL (2012-14) and Jacoby Ellsbury/BOS (2007-08) behind Tim Raines/MON (27, 1979-81) and Mitchell Page/OAK (26, 1977) [source: Sportradar].

BUMGARNER AT A GLANCE: Is in his first season with Arizona... agreed to a 5-year deal through 2024 on Dec. 17, 2019.

- Is a 4-time NL All-Star (2013-16), 3-time World Series champion ('10, '12, '14) and 2014 World Series MVP.
- Won 2 Louisville Slugger® Silver Slugger Awards™ ('14-15).
- Selected by Giants in the first round (10th overall) in 2007.

LAST START: Did not factor in the decision on Sept. 10 vs. Dodgers (2 ER in 5.0 IP).

VS. ANGELS: Will be making his first career start...the Giants played the Angels 12 times from 2009-19.

- Is the final team for Bumgarner to face.

SINCE HIS RETURN: Owns a 4.00 ERA (4 ER in 9.0 IP) in 2 starts since being reinstated from the 10-day injured list (mid-back strain).

- Posted a 9.35 ERA (18 ER in 17.1 IP) in his first 4 outings.

RISPY BUSINESS: Has limited opponents to a .176 average with RISP (3-for-17) and .143 with RISP/2 outs (1-for-7).

2019 REVIEW: Went 9-9 with a 3.90 ERA, 1.13 WHIP and 203 strikeouts in a career-high-tying 34 starts for the Giants.

- Tied for the NL lead in starts with Aaron Nola/PHI and was second in innings to Stephen Strasburg/WSH (209.0 IP).
- Threw 200.0+ innings for the 11th time and struck out at least 200 for the fourth time.

PLAYOFF PROWESS: Is 8-3 with 3 complete games (all shutouts), a 2.11 ERA, and .201 opponent average in 16 postseason appearances (14 starts), including going 4-0 with a Major-League record 0.25 ERA in 5 World Series outings (4 starts).
• Named the 2014 World Series MVP, the 26th pitcher (28th time) to win the award...also named the NLCS MVP, making him the seventh player (fourth pitcher) ever to be named the LCS MVP and the World Series MVP in the same season.

TOUCHING ALL THE BASES

ESCOBAR'S COMMUNITY IMPACT: Eduardo Escobar is the D-backs' 2020 Roberto Clemente Award nominee and

- ◆ Yesterday, prior to the team's departure, he did a socially-distanced congratulatory surprise for Summer Palacios from Madrid Neighborhood School, the 2020 D-backs Most Valuable Teachers Award "Teacher of the Year" winner, as recognized by the Arizona Diamondbacks Foundation and Raytheon Missiles & Defense...to learn more about the program: dbacks.com/mvt.
- ◆ Earlier today, in conjunction with Hispanic Heritage Month, he did a virtual meet-and-greet with students at Valencia Newcomer School, visiting with 3 classrooms and giving the students an opportunity to practice their speaking skills.

DEFENSE RULES: The D-backs lead the NL with a .986 fielding pct. ahead of the Cubs (.985), Reds (.985) and Brewers (.985) and are third in the NL with 43 double plays behind the Rockies (59) and Phillies (44).

THE PEN: The D-backs' bullpen has a 3.27 ERA (8 ER in 22.0 IP) and .197 opponent average in its last 5 games.

NOTABLE RECENT NOTES: **Travis Bergen** recorded his first Major League save on Sept. 10 vs. Dodgers and **Stefan Crichton** notched his first save on Sept. 11 vs. Mariners, the first time in club history that 2 relievers earned their first career saves in consecutive games [source: Elias Sports Bureau].

- ◆ **Wyatt Mathisen**, on Sept. 12 vs. Mariners, retired Dylan Moore in the fourth inning with an 89.7 mph throw to first base, the hardest by a D-backs third baseman since Statcast started tracking in 2015...the previous hardest was by Adam Rosales on Sept. 11, 2017 vs. Rockies (88.8).
- ◆ The D-backs have 2 signees from their 2017 draft class on the current roster: first-round pick **Pavin Smith** (seventh overall) and second-rounder **Daulton Varsho**.

NEXT STARTER: LHP CALEB SMITH (0-0, 3.00)

- ◆ Third start of 2020 (1 with Marlins, 1 with D-backs).
- ◆ Made his D-backs debut on Sept. 11 vs. Mariners (ND)...in 3.0 innings, allowed 1 run on 1 hit (home run) with 1 walk and 3 strikeouts.
- ◆ Acquired on Aug. 31 from Marlins.
- ◆ In 2019, went 10-11 with a 4.52 ERA (77 ER in 153.1 IP), .223 opponent average and 168 strikeouts in 28 starts.
