**TODAY'S GAME:** Is **Game 3** (1-1) of a 3-game series vs **Todd Frazier's Mets** and **Game 3** (1-1) of a 6-game **final homestand** that includes an upcoming 3-game series vs the playoff-contending **Brewers**...following this homestand, the Redlegs will finish the **2019 championship season** with 3 games at Pit's **PNC Park**.

**SERIES NOTES:** At **.623** (33-20) the Mets have the highest winning percentage at **Great American Ball Park** of any team in the National League, including the Reds (**703-667-1**, **.513**)...beginning **9/24/13**, the Reds are **11-29 vs NYM** (0-2 in 2013, 2-4 in 2014, 0-7 in 2015, 0-6 in 2016, 3-4 in 2017, 3-3 in 2018, 3-3 in 2019), including a **14-game losing streak** from **9/7/14 - 9/7/16** that ranks as Cin's **longest ever** vs the Mets and its longest vs any team since a **16-game skid vs Ari** from **5/8/01 - 8/13/03**... dating back to **1962**, the **7-0 series win** by the Mets in **2015** was the **first season series sweep** by either team, followed by **NYM's 6-0 series win** in **2016**.

**BREWERS UP NEXT:** The Reds are **8-8 vs Mil** this season, including **3-4** at **Great American Ball Park**...went **2-1-2** in the **first 5 series vs Mil** and won **each of the last 2 series** (0-3, 1-1, 2-2, 3-1, 2-1)...haven't won **3 series** in a season vs the Brewers since **2016** (4-1-1)...the 5-4 loss on **7/24** at **Miller Park** snapped the Reds' **5-game winning streak** vs the Brewers, their longest since **9/27/12 - 6/14/13** and their longest in a single season since they won **7 straight** from **7/27-9/21, 2010**...the Reds' **3-1 series win** at **Great American Ball Park** from **7/1-7/4** was their first series win vs Mil since **9/4-9/6, 2017** (3-0 at GABP) and their first 4-game series win vs Mil since **4/30-4/23, 2015** (3-1 at Miller Park).

**FOLLOWED BY THE PIRATES:** The Reds have **lost 10 straight games** at **PNC Park** dating back to an 8-6 win on **6/17/18**, including this season's **7-game losing streak**, and are **2-15** there over the **last 2 seasons**...the current **losing streaks** are the Reds' longest **overall** and **single-season** losing streaks at **PNC Park**...from **4/4-4/7** the Pirates swept a **4-game series** from the Reds for the first time since **7/11-7/14, 1991** at **Riverfront Stadium** and did it in **Pittsburgh** for the first time since **8/22-8/24, 1969** at **Forbes Field**...from **3/31-4/5** the Reds were shut out by the Pirates in **3 consecutive games** (5-0, 2-0, 2-0) for the first time since **7/31-8/2, 1931** (5-0 & 1-0 losses at Pit, 3-0 loss at Cin).

**GOOD CHANCE FOR A HOMER TODAY...:** Neither team homered in yesterday's **3-2 Reds win**...was the **117th homerless game** in the **17-year** history of **Great American Ball Park**, the **ninth** this season...the single-season record for homerless games at GABP is **14** (2014)...only 5 times in the ballpark's **1,371-game history** were there streaks of at least 2 straight games without a home run by either team: **8/6-8/7, 2005 vs Fla (2g)**, **4/5-4/6, 2011 vs Hou (2g)**, **9/12/12 vs Pit & 9/21/12 vs LAD (2g)**, **7/25-7/27, 2014 vs Wsh (3g)** and **3/31/19 vs Pit & 4/1/19 vs Mil (2g)**.

**FIRST WATCH:** In the first inning, the Redlegs lead the Major Leagues in **runs** (125), **HR** (44, Major League record), **RBI** (122) and **slugging percentage** (.568)...have outscored opponents in the first frame, **125-80**, and are **36-13** (.735) when leading after the first inning...**6 times** this season scored at **least 4 runs** in the first inning...**Eugenio Suárez** leads the Major Leagues with **14 HR** in the first inning, a franchise record.

**GENO:** **3B Eugenio Suárez** ranks second in the Major Leagues with a **career-high 48 HR**, a record for a player from Venezuela, a modern franchise record for a third baseman and tied for the National League record for HR in a season by a player at that position...he shares the NL record for third basemen with Phi's **Mike Schmidt** (1980) & LAD's **Adrián Beltré** (2004)...**Suárez' 48 HR** are the most by a third baseman since NY's **Alex Rodriguez** in 2007 established the Major League single-season record by hitting 52 of his 54 HR while playing third base...**Suárez' 48 HR** are the most by a Reds batter since **George Foster** established the single-season franchise record with 52 HR in 1977...since the All-Star break **Suárez** leads the Major Leagues with **28 HR**, a new club record for HR in the second half of a season (27, **Ted Kluszewski**, 1954), and in **slugging percentage** (.707)...**Suárez** is trying to become the sixth Reds batter to lead the National League in HR, the first since **Foster** hit 40 HR in 1978...with a club record 52 HR in 1977, **Foster** is the last Reds batter to lead the Major Leagues in HR.

**RUTHIAN:** In the 8-5 win on 9/4 vs Phi, **Michael Lorenzen** joined **Babe Ruth (6/13/1921 vs Det)** as the only Major League player since 1900 to **earn the win, hit a home run and play the outfield** in the same game...entered in the seventh inning as the Reds' third pitcher of the game and suffered a blown save after **Jay Bruce** homered to tie the score at 5-5...in the bottom of the eighth hit his only HR of the season and seventh of his career, a 2-run HR off **Blake Parker** that extended the Reds' lead to 8-5...**played center field** in the top of the ninth.

**2-WAY PLAYER:** **RHP Michael Lorenzen** has appeared in **100** of the Reds' **155 games** (70g at P, 15g in CF, 8g in LF, 4g in RF, 13g as pinch runner, 5g as a pinch hitter)...in 4 of the last 7 games was the Reds' starting center fielder...he is a **career .236 hitter** (29-123) with 3 doubles, 1 triple, 7 HR, 23 RBI, 5 stolen bases and a **.730 OPS**...**this season as a pinch hitter** is 1-5 with 1 RBI...in his **career as a pinch hitter** is 5-for-25 (.200, 7 RBI) with **3 HR**, on 4/6/17 off Phi's **Adam Morgan**, 6/24/18 off Chi's **Mike Montgomery** and 6/30/18 off Mil's **Jacob Barnes** (grand slam)...**9 times** in his career, including twice this season (4/9 vs Mia, 4/15 at LAD), he entered games as a pinch hitter and remained in that game to pitch.

**150th CELEBRATION:** During the 2019 season the Reds are celebrating the **150th anniversary** of professional baseball, which began with the formation of the **1869 Red Stockings**...this season, the team will wear **15 uniforms** from various periods throughout the team's history...**this afternoon** are wearing replica uniforms of the **1999** team that **won 96 games** but lost a 1-game playoff to the Mets...the Reds are **5-9** wearing **throwback uniforms**...already wore uniforms from **1902, 1911, 1912, 1919, 1935, 1936, 1939, 1956, 1961, 1967, 1969, 1976** 1990 and 1995.

## Today's Pitcher - #27 Trevor Bauer, RHP

### RED HOTS

**Trevor Bauer** this afternoon is making his 10th appearance for the Reds and his first career start vs the Mets...at the July 31 deadline was acquired as part of a 3-team trade in which the Indians received from the Reds **OF Yasiel Puig** and **LHP Scott Moss** and from the Padres **OF Franmil Reyes**, **LHP Logan Allen** and **IF Victor Nova**, while SD received from the Reds **OF Taylor Trammell** (truh-MELL)...**8 of his last 9 runs allowed** all came via home runs (**Dexter Fowler** solo, **Yadier Molina** solo, **Logan Morrison** 2-run, **J.T. Realmuto** 2-run, **Kyle Lewis** solo in his Major League debut, **Dylan Moore** solo)...has recorded **245 strikeouts** in **206.0 innings** over **33 starts**, all career highs...is his second consecutive **200-strikeout season** and his third career **30-start season**...ranks among the Major League leaders in **innings pitched** (third) and **strikeouts** (5th)...since the beginning of the 2018 season, among all starting pitchers with at least 300 innings ranks sixth in **strikeouts** (466), 14th in **ERA** (3.40), and ninth in **innings pitched** (381.1)...in 2018 was an American League **All-Star**, finished fifth in the **Cy Young Award** voting, ranked second in the AL in **ERA** (2.21) and allowed the fewest **HR per 9 innings** in the league (.0462)...in his 5-2 win on 8/9 vs Cubs, in his **Great American Ball Park** debut as a Red recorded **11 strikeouts**...in his career has 27 apps with at least 10 strikeouts, including 8 this season.

**Sonny Gray** is a **2019 National League All-Star**...his **first strikeout** in Tuesday's start will be his **200th of the season**, extending his career high...ranks among the National League leaders in **ERA** (4th), **strikeouts** (11th) and **opponents' BA** (.196, 1st)...beginning 8/25/18 has made 32 consecutive starts allowing **6 hits or fewer**, a **Major League record** and excluding "openers"...the record was held by **Nolan Ryan** (31gs, 5/1/91-6/1/92)...**Gray** is trying to become the first Reds pitcher to make at least 30 starts and post an ERA of 2.80 or lower since **Johnny Cueto** in **2014** (34gs, 2.25)...in his **last 15 starts** beginning **6/28** is **8-2, 1.81** (94.1ip, 19er) with **13 quality starts**, **5 times** was the victim of **blown saves** and since then ranks third among all Major League starting pitchers in **ERA** (StL's Jack Flaherty 1.39, NYM's Jacob deGrom 1.80)...in his **last 9 starts** beginning **8/4** is **5-1, 1.46** (55.2ip, 9er)...in his **last 8 starts** at **Great American Ball Park** is **7-0, 2.08**, including wins in **7 straight starts** from **6/16-8/20**...is only the second pitcher ever to **win 7 consecutive starts** at **GABP**...**Johnny Cueto** won **7 straight starts** from **6/6-8/18, 2012**...in his 3-2 win on **8/20 vs SD**, **Josh Naylor's** solo HR with 2 outs in the top of the sixth inning snapped his career-high scoreless streak at **23 innings**...ties for the second-longest scoreless streak in the Major Leagues this season (**Hyun-Jin Ryu**, 32.0, 5/1-5/25)...the longest scoreless streak of **Gray's** career had been **14.2 innings** (4/28-5/8, 2015)...in his 3-0 win on 7/3 vs Mil, threw **8.0 shutout innings** and tied his career high with **12 strikeouts**...the **8.0 innings** tie **Trevor Bauer** for the most by a Reds pitcher in a game this season, and his **12 strikeouts** were the most by a Reds pitcher this season until **Luis Castillo** had a career-high **13 strikeouts** on **8/5 vs LAA**...has 11 wins and 6 times was the victim of blown saves...began the season with 9 starts without a win, the longest such streak of his career to begin a season...was bothered in spring training by stiffness in his right elbow and made just 3 exhibition starts, but he started the Reds' second game of the season...hasn't missed a turn since.

- In his first 27 apps through 8/29 hit .330 with 14 HR and 32 RBI (.804slg, .393obp)...in 22 apps since then is hitting .185 (15-81) with 3 HR and 11 RBI (.321slg, .221obp).
- Is a 2019 International League All-Star and the league's Rookie of the Year...since the Reds became an affiliate in 2000, he is only the second Louisville player ever to win the IL's Rookie of the Year award (Joey Votto, 2007).

- In the fourth inning Wed at Wrigley Field hit his 48th HR of the season (solo off Jon Lester)...established a new record for HR in a season by a player from Venezuela (47, Andrés Galarraga, 1996) and tied the National League single-season record for HR by a third baseman (48, Mike Schmidt 1980, Adrián Beltré 2004).
- Has a 4-game hitting streak (6-16, .375, 1hr, 2rbi, .563slg, .412obp).
- In 25 apps beginning 8/25 is hitting .363 (33-91, 3 2b, 1 3b, 14hr, 24rbi, 1.321ops).
- From 9/2-9/4 missed 3 starts with a bruised left hand suffered on 9/1 at StL when he was hit by a Daniel Ponce de Leon pitch...returned to the starting lineup on 9/5 vs Phi and in 15 apps since then is hitting .375 with four 2-hit games and three 3-hit games (21-56, 1 2b, 1 3b, 8hr, 15rbi, .857slg, .462obp).
- Hit all 48 of his home runs as a third baseman, tying the single-season National League record for that position...Hall of Famer Tony Pérez held the club record for third basemen with 40 HR overall in 1970, including 39 HR while playing third base...Suárez and Pérez are the only third basemen in club history with at least 25 HR in 3 seasons and the only third basemen in club history with at least 30 HR in 2 seasons.
- In the first inning, leads all Major League batters with a club record 14 HR (26rbi).

### 17 JOSH VANMETER, inf/of Trip: 9g, 2gs 1B, 2gs LF, 2gs 2B, 3-21, 2hr, 3rbi

- In his fourth stint with the Reds this season, is hitting .244 in 60 apps and 43 starts since he was promoted from Louisville just after the All-Star break (42-172, 9 2b, 1 3b, 8hr, 19rbi)...was 1 of 7 roster moves that day (7/18).
- Beginning 8/12 has started 31 of the Reds' last 39 games (16gs in LF, 10gs at 1B, 4gs at 2B, 1gs in RF) and played in 7 of the other 8 games.
- Made 50 starts (28gs in LF, 9gs at 1B, 9gs at 2B, 2gs at 3B, 1gs in RF, 1gs at DH).
- From 8/15-8/21, with Joey Votto recovering from a low back strain, started at 1B in 6 of the Reds' 7 games...were his first career starts at that position...hit .350 in those 6 starts (7-20, 1 2b, 2rbi).
- Is a 2019 International League All-Star...in 49 apps for the Bats hit .348 (14 2b, 1 3b, 14hr, 43rbi, 8sb, 1.097ops)...started at 1B (10g), 2B (20g), 3B (10g) and LF (3g).
- In spring training came over from minor league camp to make 10 apps for Reds (1-13).
- Is a native and resident of Ossian (AH-see-in), Indiana, a town of about 3,400 located 3 hours from Cincinnati near Fort Wayne...graduated from Norwell High School.

### 19 JOEY VOTTO, 1b Road Trip: 8-26 (.308), 3 2b, 1hr, 4rbi, .419obp

- Has produced 30 doubles for the 10th time in his career...beginning in 2008, his first full season, only Robinson Cano has as many 30-double seasons (also 10, with 26 doubles this season).
- In his last 14 apps beginning 9/4 is hitting .348 with 5 multi-hit games (16-46, 5 2b, 2hr, 6rbi, .587slg, .474obp).
- In 23 apps since he was reinstated from the injured list on 8/27 is hitting .288 (23-80, 6 2b, 3hr, 8rbi, 17r, .402obp)...from 8/18-8/26 missed 11 games while on the 10-day IL with a low back strain.
- Beginning 5/8 made his last 99 starts batting second in the order...made 15 starts this season batting leadoff (last, 5/7 at Oak)...entered this year with 1 career start batting leadoff (6/18/08 vs LAD).
- In his career has hit 64 HR on the first pitch, most recently on 8/9 off Yu Darvish.
- For the fifth straight season, per *Baseball America* was voted by managers, scouts and executives the batter with the best strike zone judgment in the National League.
