TONIGHT'S GAME: Is **Game 2** (0-1) of a 3-game series vs **Adam Gresch's Mariners** and **Game 2** (0-1) of the Reds' second consecutive **3-city, 10-day road trip**...following this series will visit Ari's **Chase Field** (3g) and Chi's **Wrigley Field** (3g)...the Redlegs flew to **Seattle** following Sunday afternoon's game at **Great American Ball Park** and spent Monday's off day here...this is the fourth of the Redlegs' 4 scheduled visits to the **West Coast** (0-3 at LAD & 3-1 at SD, 1-2 at Oak & 2-1 at SF, 0-2 at LAA)...following this road trip the Reds return to **GABP** for their final homestand (3g vs NYM, off day, 3g vs Mil)...will finish the **2019 championship season** with 3 games at Pit's **PNC Park**.

SERIES NOTES: The Reds and Mariners are meeting for the first time since **2016** and for the first time in **Seattle** since **2010**...the Redlegs are **2-14 all-time vs Sea**, including this series and **0-3 in 2016** at **Great American Ball Park**, **1-2 in 2013** at **GABP**, **0-3 in 2010** at **Safeco Field**, **1-2 in 2007** at **Safeco** and **0-3 in 2002** in the final season of **Cinergy Field**...the Reds won their first game at the ballpark then known as **Safeco Field**, 16-1 on **6/22/07**, but since then have **lost 6 straight games** at what is now named **T-Mobile Park**.

DIAMONDBACKS UP NEXT...: The **Diamondbacks** took **2 of 3 games** last weekend at **Great American Ball Park**...at Ari's **Chase Field**, the Reds are **32-18** with the roof closed and **6-12** with the roof open...Cin won its **first 7 games** there until a 9-6 loss on **7/1/00**.

...FOLLOWED BY THE CUBS: The Reds are **9-7 vs Cubs** this season and won or tied **4 of the 5 series**...over the **previous 4 seasons** (2015-2018), the Cubs' **.671 winning percentage** vs the Reds (51-25) was the best by any team against any division opponent...next week the teams will meet for the third of this season's 3 meetings at **Wrigley Field**, all night games...the Reds are **3-3 there** this season but have lost **24 of the last 34 games** played in **The Friendly Confines**...since a 4-1 Reds win on **6/25/14** and beginning **9/15/14**, the Cubs have won **22 of the last 26 night games** at **Wrigley Field**.

FIRST WATCH: In the first inning, the Redlegs lead the Major Leagues in **runs** (118), **HR** (43, MLB record), **RBI** (115) and **slugging percentage** (.576) while ranking second in the NL in **batting average** (.298, Wsh .303) and third in the NL in **on-base percentage** (.361; NYM .366, Wsh .363)...have outscored opponents in the first frame, **118-76**, and are **33-13** (.717) when leading after the first inning...**6 times** this season scored at **least 4 runs** in the first inning.

PLAYER & ROOKIE OF THE MONTH: **Aristides Aquino** was the National League's **Player of the Month** and **Rookie of the Month** for **August**...led the Major Leagues in **HR** (14) and **RBI** (33) and led the National League in **slugging percentage** (.767)...established a new **National League record for HR by a rookie** in a **calendar month** and tied the **franchise record for HR by any player in any calendar month** (**Frank Robinson**, August 1962 & **Greg Vaughn**, September 1999)...his **33 RBI** are second-most ever by a Reds batter in **August** (**Frank Robinson**, 34 RBI, August 1962).

THE PUNISHER: Rookie **Aristides Aquino** has produced **15 HR** in his **first 40 career games** and **152 plate apps**, including a **3-homer game** on **8/10 vs Cubs** in which he homered in **3 consecutive innings** (2nd, 3rd, 4th)...he played 1 game for the Reds last season.

- Holds modern Major League records for **fewest career games to 14 HR** (28) and **fewest career plate apps to 15 HR** (122).
- Is the only player in modern Major League history with **13 HR** in his **first 100 career plate apps**, the only player with **14 HR** in his **first 108 career plate apps** and the only player with **15 HR** in his **first 122 career plate apps**...Phi's **Rhys Hoskins** (98th PA) and LAD's **Will Smith** (100th PA) are the only other players, since 1900, to produce as many as **12 HR** in their **first 100 career plate apps**...**Hoskins** retains the record since 1900 for **fewest plate apps to 16 HR** (137).
- Holds modern **Major League records for HR** in a player's **first 12 career games** (8), **first 14 career games** (9), **first 16 career games** (10), **first 17 career games** (11), **first 22 career games** (12), **first 27 career games** (13) and **first 28 career games** (14)...**Rhys Hoskins** retains the Major League record since 1900 for **fewest career games to 15 HR** and **16 HR** (32).

RUTHIAN: Per @EliasSports, in **Wed's 8-5 win vs Phi** **Michael Lorenzen** joined **Babe Ruth** (**6/13/1921 vs Det**) as the only Major League players since 1900 to **earn the win, hit a home run and play the outfield** in the same game...entered in the seventh inning as the Reds' third pitcher of the game and suffered a blown save after **Jay Bruce** homered to tie the score at 5-5...in the bottom of the eighth hit his first HR of the season and seventh of his career, a 2-run HR off **Blake Parker** that extended the Reds' lead to 8-5...**played center field** in the top of the ninth...in the bottom of the ninth inning of **Sun's 4-3 walkoff win vs Ari**, **Lorenzen** pinch hit and doubled off **T.J. McFarland** to drive in the game-ending run...was his **fifth career pinch hit**, his first of this season, and his **first career walkoff hit**.

2-WAY PLAYER: RHP **Michael Lorenzen** has appeared in **93** of the Reds' **145 games** (68g at P, 8g in LF, 8g in CF, 4g in RF, 13g as pinch runner, 4g as a pinch hitter)...he is a **career .267 hitter** (28-105) with 3 doubles, 1 triple, 7 HR, 23 RBI and an .821 OPS...**this season as a pinch hitter** is 1-4 with 1 RBI...in his **career as a pinch hitter** is 5-for-24 (.208, 7 RBI) with **3 HR**, on 4/6/17 off Phi's **Adam Morgan**, 6/24/18 off Chi's **Mike Montgomery** and 6/30/18 off Mil's **Jacob Barnes** (grand slam)...played CF in the ninth inning of **Wed's 8-5 win vs Phi** and then the next day vs Phi made his first career start at that position (0-3, 1bb)...**9 times** in his career, including twice this season (4/9 vs Mia, 4/15 at LAD), he entered games as a pinch hitter and remained in that game to pitch...**6 times** in his career came off the bench to produce a home run, including 3 times as a reliever and 3 times as a pinch hitter...**Lorenzen** this year became the **first player in Reds history**, whose primary position is pitcher, to appear in **each of the first 6 games of a season** (PR/CF, P, PR, P, PR, P)...is the first Reds player with as many as 403.1 career innings pitched to play center field since **Hal Jeffcoat** (474.1ip) in **1958**...**Ron Mahay** was the last Major League pitcher with at least 400 innings also to play CF at some point in his career...**Mahay** played in 5g in CF for the Red Sox in 1995 and then pitched his 400th inning in 2007 for the Braves.

Tonight's Pitcher - #54 Sonny Gray, RHP

RED HOTS

Sonny Gray is a **2019 National League All-Star**...ranks among the National League leaders in **ERA** (2.75, 5th), **wins** (10, T14th) and **strikeouts** (181, 12th)...is trying to become the first Reds pitcher to make at least 30 starts and post an ERA of 2.75 or lower since **Johnny Cueto** in **2014** (34gs, 2.25)...in his **last 13 starts** beginning **6/28** is **7-1, 1.55** (81.1ip, 14er) with **11 quality starts**, **5** times was the victim of **blown saves** and since then ranks second among all Major League starting pitchers in **ERA** (**John Flaherty**, 1.19)...in his 3-2 win on **8/20 vs SD**, **Josh Naylor's** solo HR with 2 outs in the top of the sixth inning snapped his career-high scoreless streak at **23 innings**...ties for the second-longest scoreless streak in the Major Leagues this season (**Hyun-Jin Ryu** 1st, 32.0, 5/1-5/25)...the longest scoreless streak of **Gray's** career had been **14.2 innings** (4/28-5/8, 2015)...in his 3-0 win on 7/3 vs Mil, threw **8.0 shutout innings** and tied his career high with **12 strikeouts**...the **8.0 innings** are the most by a Reds pitcher in a game this season, and his **12 strikeouts** were the most by a Reds pitcher this season until **Luis Castillo** had a career-high **13 strikeouts** on **8/5 vs LAA**...has 10 wins and 6 times was the victim of blown saves...began the season with 9 starts without a win, the longest such streak of his career to begin a season...was bothered in spring training by stiffness in his right elbow and made just 3 exhibition starts, but he started the Reds' second game of the season...hasn't missed a turn since.

RED HOTS

Tyler Mahle's last name rhymes with RALLY...at just 24 years old already is in his third Major League season...tomorrow will make his third start for the Reds since he was promoted on **9/1** as 1 of 5 September callups...will be his first career appearance vs the **Mariners**...this season has left **10 runners on base**, and **all 10 scored**...in Fri's 7-5 loss vs Ari allowed 4 runs on homers, a solo HR by **Nick Ahmed** in the third inning and a 3-run HR by **Ketel Marte** in the sixth...was charged with another run scored off **Lucas Sims**...from **7/22-8/21** was on the **10-day injured list** with a **left hamstring strain**...on **8/16** and **8/21** made rehab starts for Louisville before he was reinstated from the IL and optioned to Louisville on **8/22**...made 1 more start for the Bats, a 9-0 Bats win on **8/26 vs Columbus** (5ip, 3h, 1bb, 6k, 75 pitches), before he was promoted on 9/1 to start the day game of the doubleheader at StL.

- Is 1 of 6 Major League players with 40 HR (Pete Alonso 47, Mike Trout 45, Suárez, 44, Cody Bellinger 44, Christian Yelich 44, Jorge Soler 41).
- Since the All-Star break leads the Major Leagues in HR (24; Min's Nelson Cruz & Atl's Josh Donaldson T2nd w/ 19) and leads the National League in slugging percentage (.699).
- The team records for HR in a season is 52 (George Foster, 1977) and for HR after the All-Star break is 27 (Ted Kluszewski, 1954).
