- A. His .349 batting average against lefties in 2019 led the Reds.
- B. His 49 home runs matched Ted Kluszewski for second most in a single season by a Reds player, trailing only George Foster's 52 in 1977.
- C. With 205 strikeouts in 2019, he joined Luis Castillo (226) as the first Reds teammates to have at least 200 strikeouts in the same season.
- D. Is the third Golden Spikes Award winner to play for the Reds, joining Terry Francona and Mike Kelly.
- E. He is the fourth winner of Baseball America's High School Player of the Year Award to play for the Reds, joining Homer Bailey, Josh Hamilton and Darnell McDonald.
- F. His 12 first-inning home runs in 2019 were more than every other Major League player except Eugenio Suárez.
- G. He is the first Reds player to hit three home runs in his first four career games.
- H. His .326 post-All-Star break batting average in 2019 was the highest on the Reds.
- I. On April 15, 2019, he became the first Reds catcher to start a game batting leadoff since 1900.
- J. In 2017 with Double-A Pensacola, he pitched a perfect game against the Mobile BayBears.
- K. He threw two consecutive no-hitters in high school while being named California's high school player of the year by Gatorade.
- L. In 2019, his 17 home runs in his first 118 plate appearances were the fewest needed to reach that mark in franchise history.
