

ARIZONA DIAMONDBACKS (15-26) at SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (20-21)

HERE'S THE STORY: The D-backs are 9-7 in their last 16 games @ Oracle Park.

- ◆ Arizona starters have given up 2 earned runs or fewer in 10 of their last 14 games (3.50 ERA; 27 ER in 69.1 IP).
 □ D-backs starters have posted a 3.27 ERA (15 ER in 41.1 IP) and a .227 opponent average in their last 8 road games.
- ◆ Zac Gallen is 1-0 with a 1.00 ERA (3 ER in 27.0 IP) and .132 opponent average over his last 4 starts.

LABOR DAY: The D-backs have won 3 of their last 5 games on Labor Day and are 6-11 all-time on the holiday.

◆ Arizona is facing San Francisco on Labor Day for the fifth time and first since 2015 (W, 6-1).

MLB RECORD AND COUNTING: Zac Gallen has allowed 3 or fewer earned runs in all 23 games to begin his career, a Major League record (all starts - no relief appearances).

♦ His 23-game streak is tied for the fifth longest in the Majors since 2010 (excludes "openers"):

GALLEN DELIVERS: Zac Gallen's 1.80 ERA is the third lowest in club history through 8 starts, behind Randy Johnson's 0.95 ERA in 2000 and Patrick Corbin's 1.52 ERA in 2013 [source: Elias Sports Bureau].

♦ The lowest D-backs ERA through 9 starts: 0.97 - Johnson (2000); 1.44 - Corbin (2013); 1.67 - Daniel Hudson (2010); 1.88 - Johnson (2002); 2.29 - Robbie Ray (2015).

HITTING AT THE PARK ON THE BAY: Ketel Marte is a career .340 hitter (34-for-100) with 12 doubles, 1 triple, 5 home runs and 14 RBI in 26 games @ Oracle Park.

TOUCHING ALL THE BASES

IN THE SEATS: The Giants have provided visiting teams the opportunity to bring 4 "fans" to each game, so attending this weekend's games at Oracle Park are 4 legends - Hall of Famer Randy Johnson (who earned his 300th win with San Francisco on June 4, 2009); Luis Gonzalez (who hit .345 with 2 "splash hits" in this ballpark); Mark Grace (5 homers and 1 "splash hit"); and Buck O'Neil Award winner Roland Hemond. The fourth "racing legend" for the Dbacks, Matt Williams, is already represented in the stands as a member of the Giants.

CENTER OF ATTENTION: Ketel Marte is expected to make his second start this season in center field tonight.

♦ Marte played in 96 games in center field in 2019 and hit .361 AVG/1.095 OPS with 24 doubles, 7 triples, 23 home runs and 64 RBI.

FIRST-INNING FUN: The D-backs have scored in the first inning in 3 consecutive games for the first time since Aug. 16-18, 2019 vs. Giants.

♦ The last time they scored in the first inning in 4 games in a row was Aug. 12-16, 2018.

SPLASH-DOWN STATS: On Saturday, **Daulton Varsho** became the first visiting player to hit his first Major League home run directly into McCovey Cove ("splash down" home run).

♦ Varsho's home run was the 51st "splash down" home run by an opponent and first by a D-back since Ender Inciarte on Sept. 9, 2014 (off Yusmeiro Petit).

ON DECK - LOS ANGELES DODGERS: Arizona is 7-5 in its last 12 games vs. Los Angeles.

- ♦ The D-backs are 1-6 vs. Dodgers this season, most recently losing all 3 games in Los Angeles from Sept. 1-3.
- ◆ Ketel Marte is hitting .349 (15-for-43) in his last 11 game vs. Dodgers.

NEXT STARTER: RHP LUKE WEAVER (1-6, 7.44)

- ♦ Lost his third straight start on Sept. 3 @ Dodgers, allowing 2 runs on 4 hits over 5.1 innings.
- ♦ Has walked 5 batters in his last 6 starts.
- ♦ Is 1-2 with a 7.85 ERA (16 ER in 18.1 IP) in 5 career games (3 starts) vs. Dodgers.

AT A GLANCE: Second season with the D-backs.

- Acquired on July 31, 2019 from the Marlins for INF Jazz Chisholm.
- Selected by the Cardinals' in the third round of the 2016 draft...traded to the Marlins as part of a deal that included Marcell Ozuna on Dec. 14, 2017.
- Nicknamed "The Milkman" by a University of North Carolina broadcaster (up for debate why because of his last name or because he "always delivered").

GALLEN LATELY: Is looking for first road win since July 24, 2019 @ White Sox.

- His streak of 8 consecutive games with 2 or fewer runs allowed is the longest by a D-back since Robbie Ray (8 from Aug. 25-Sept. 30. 2018).
 - ☐ The last 9-game streak was by Zack Greinke from June 23-Aug. 7, 2018.

LAST START: Received a no decision on Sept. 2 @ Dodgers, allowing 1 hit over a career-high-tying 7.0 scoreless innings.

- Was the first D-back with at least 7.0 innings pitched and no more than 1 hit allowed @ Dodger Stadium.
- 23 & COUNTING: Owns the Major League record with 23 games allowing 3 or fewer earned runs to begin a career (all starts), surpassing the 21-game stretch by Aaron Sele/BOS, June 23, 1993-April 19, 1994.

VS. GIANTS: Is 1-0 with a 1.38 ERA (2 ER in 13.0 IP) in 2 career starts (both in 2020).

ON THE LEADERBOARD: Ranks among the NL leaders in quality starts (T-1st, 7), ERA (3rd, 1.80), innings (T-2nd, 50.0), opponent average (4th, .182) and WHIP (9th, 0.94).

TROUBLE WITH THE CURVE: Opponents are hitting .036 (1-for-28) off his curveball (.203 in 2019).
