



# Tonight's Pitcher - #27 Trevor Bauer, RHP

## RED HOTS

**Trevor Bauer** tonight is making his sixth appearance for the Reds...at the July 31 deadline was acquired as part of a 3-team trade in which the Indians received from the Reds **OF Yasiel Puig** and **LHP Scott Moss** and from the Padres **OF Franmil Reyes**, **LHP Logan Allen** and **IF Victor Nova**, while SD received from the Reds **OF Taylor Trammell** (truh-MELL)...ranks second in the Major Leagues **innings pitched** (182.2, **Justin Verlander** 184.0) and ranks fourth in the majors in **strikeouts** (217)...since the beginning of the 2018 season, among all starting pitchers with at least 300 innings ranks seventh in **strikeouts** (438), 11th in **ERA** (3.29), and 10th in **innings pitched** (358.0)...has produced his second career **200-strikeout season** and is 4 strikeouts shy of his single-season career high (221, 2018).

## RED HOTS

**Tyler Mahle's** last name rhymes with RALLY...at just 24 years old already is in his third Major League season...as the **26th player** for tomorrow's doubleheader, in the day game will make his first appearance for the Reds since **7/19 vs StL**...3 days after that 12-11 loss went on the **10-day injured list** with a **left hamstring strain**...on **8/16** and **8/21** made rehab starts for Louisville before he was reinstated from the IL and optioned to Louisville on **8/22**...made 1 more start for the Bats, a 9-0 Bats win on **Mon vs Columbus** (5ip, 3h, 1bb, 6k, 75 pitches), before he was announced as a starter for tomorrow.

**Sonny Gray** is a **2019 National League All-Star**...in his **last 11 starts** beginning **6/28** is **7-1, 1.70** (68.2ip, 13er) with **9 quality starts**, **3 times** was the victim of **blown saves** and since then ranks second among all Major League starting pitchers in **ERA** (**Jack Flaherty** 1st, 1.48)...in his **5 starts in August** is **4-0, 0.90** (30ip, 3er)...beginning **7/1**, his **1.59 ERA** (62.1ip, 11er) is the second-best in the Major Leagues (**Jack Flaherty**, 1.48).

# REDS BATTERS

## REDS BATTERS

Road Trip: 3-4, .243 (61-251, 13hr, 32r)

- Among the National League team leaders rank ninth in hitting (.250), ninth in slugging percentage (.431) and 12th in on-base percentage (.318).
- Since the All-Star break, rank second in the National League in batting average (.277), on-base percentage (.339) and third in slugging percentage (.476) and runs scored (234, 5.09 r/g)...Reds pitchers rank 12th in the NL in second-half ERA (5.02).

## 44 ARISTIDES AQUINO, of Road Trip: 11-30 (.367), 3 2b, 3hr, 9rbi, 2sb

- Since his 8/1 promotion, leads all Major League batters in HR (14), RBI (32) and slugging percentage (.804).
- Hit safely in 8 of his last 9 apps (13-37, .351, 3 2b, 3hr, 10rbi, 2sb 1.076ops).
- Produced a home run in 12 of his 27 apps and an RBI in 16 of his 27 apps...since his 8/1 promotion, he hit 14 of the team's 45 HR...is hitting .448 with RISP (13-29).
- Was National League Player of the Week for 8/5-8/11, the Reds' only weekly award winner this season...led the Major Leagues in slugging percentage (1.364), tied for the lead in HR (6) and led the National League in hitting (.500) and RBI (11)...is the first Reds rookie to win a Player of the Week award since RHP Chris Reitsma in April 2001 and the first Reds rookie position player since Hal Morris in July 1990.
- During that award-winning week, from 8/3-8/2 hit .517 in a career-high 9-game hitting streak and from 8/5-8/12 produced at least 1 RBI in 7 consecutive apps, the longest RBI streak by a Reds batter this season...his 4-game home run streak from 8/6-8/10 was the longest by a Reds batter in 2019 and 1 game shy of the franchise record for HR in consecutive games.
- Is an International League All-Star and its Rookie of the Year (78g, .299, 28hr, 53rbi, 5sb)...since the Reds became an affiliate in 2000, he is only the second Louisville player ever to win the IL's Rookie of the Year award (Joey Votto, 2007).
- His 2-run HR on 8/8 off Chi's Cole Hamels traveled 118.3 miles per hour, the hardest hit ball by a Reds batter in the Statcast Era and tied for the hardest hit home run in the Major Leagues this season (Gary Sánchez, Pete Alonso).
- On 8/3 at Atl, in his third Major League appearance, produced his first career hit (single off Dallas Keuchel), first career HR (3-run off Keuchel) and first career RBI.

## 16 TUCKER BARNHART, c Road Trip: 5gs, 5-18 (.278), 2 2b, 4bb, .409obp

- In his last 14 apps beginning 8/14 is hitting .302 (13-43, 4 2b, 1hr, 5rbi, .412obp).
- Since coming off the IL, Reds are 14-11 in his 25 starts and 11-8 in his last 19 starts.
- Since he came off the injured list on 7/26 has hit safely in 18 of his 25 starts.
- From 6/28-7/25 was on the 10-day IL with a right oblique strain.
- On 8/15 vs StL made his 500th career appearance as a catcher...is approaching 500 career starts at that position (476).

## 12 CURT CASALI, c Road Trip: 2gs at C, 3-9 (.333), 1 2b, 1hr, 5rbi

- Last name is pronounced kuh-SAL-ee.
- Is hitting .333 in 4 apps and 2 starts since he was reinstated from the injured list on Saturday (3-9, 1 2b, 1hr, 5rbi, 1.142ops)...since 7/18 had been on the 10-day IL with a sprained medial collateral ligament in his right knee.
- In the 12th inning last night at Mia pinch hit and P4, snapping his career-high 5-game hitting streak dating back to 7/12 (8-19, .421, 1 2b, 3hr, 9rbi, 6r, .947slg, .409obp).
- Homered in 3 of his last 4 starts and produced an RBI in each of his last 4 starts.
- Has made 44 starts, most recently in Tue's 8-5 win at Mia...the Reds won 17 of his last 28 starts (.607 winning percentage).
- From 6/23-7/1 started 7 consecutive games, the longest streak by a Reds catcher since Tucker Barnhart started 7 straight games from 9/20-9/27, 2017...that streak was snapped on 7/2 vs Mil, when Kyle Farmer made the first start of his career at C.
- Made his second Opening Day roster (2016 Rays).

## 22 DEREK DIETRICH, inf/of Road Trip: 4gs at 1B, 1-11 (.091), 1 2b, 2bb

- Last name is pronounced DEE-trick.
- Has made 5 apps, including 4 starts at 1B, since he came off the injured list last Friday...since 8/5 had been on the 10-day IL with left shoulder inflammation.
- When placed on the injured list led the team with 41 starts at 2B (last, 8/4 at Atl)...has made 13 starts at 1B (last, 8/26 at Mia), 7 starts in LF (last, 7/17 at Chi) and 2 starts at DH...has made 1 appearance at 3B (4/28 at StL, 8th inning).
- Through his 83rd appearance on 7/13 had 19 HR and 43 RBI, a single-season career high for home runs and 10 RBI shy of his career high (53, 2017)...produced his last HR and RBI on 7/13 at Col (3-run HR off Chad Bettis).
- Has been hit by a pitch 25 times, the most in the Major Leagues and second-most in Reds history (Shin-Soo Choo, 26, 2013)...while with the Marlins, established franchise records for HBP in a season (24, 2016) and in a career (93, 2013-2018)...in his career has been hit by a pitch 118 times.
- On 5/28/night vs Pit hit his 17th HR in his 118th at bat of the season...is the fewest number of at bats by any player in Reds history to reach 17 HR.
- On 5/28/night vs Pit (3-4, 3hr, 6rbi) became the 28th Reds batter to hit at least 3 HR in a game, accomplished for the 36th time...also has a pair of 2-homer games, on 4/7 at Pit (4rbi) and 5/3 vs SF (6rbi).
- Was 1 of 2 non-roster invitees to make the Opening Day roster (SS José Iglesias).

## 6 PHILLIP ERVIN, of Road Trip: 2gs in CF, 1gs in LF, 3-18, 1 3b, solo HR

- In his fourth stint with the Reds this season, is hitting .313 in 58 apps since he was promoted on 6/15 (42-134, 6 2b, 5 3b, 4hr, 13rbi, .879ops).
- Has made 30 starts (23gs in LF, 6gs in CF, 1gs in RF), including 9 of the last 14 games (6gs in LF, 3gs in CF)...last started in Tue's 8-5 win at Mia (LF, 1-5, 1 3b).
- In the 17-9 win on 7/13 at Coors Field tied the club record with 6 hits, accomplished for the fourth time (Tony Cuccinello 1931, Ernie Lombardi 1937, Walker Cooper last on 7/6/1949 vs Cubs)...fell a home run shy of the cycle.
- Has 2 career pinch-hit HR, both this season (7/21 vs StL off Andrew Miller, 8/12 at Wsh off Sean Doolittle).
- In 40 apps for Louisville hit .290 (8 2b, 1 3b, 6hr, 26rbi, 6sb, 10g in LF, 25g in CF).

## 52 KYLE FARMER, inf/c Road Trip: 4g, 0gs, 2-6 (.333), solo HR

- Since he came off the concussion list on 7/28 is hitting .289 (11-38, 1 2b, 2hr, 3rbi) in 18 apps and 7 starts (5gs at C, 1gs at 2B, 1gs at 1B).
- Last started on 8/19 vs SD, played 1B and went 0-for-2 with a walk.
- Last started behind the plate on 8/18 vs StL...this season has made 13 apps and 9 starts at C...are the first starts of his career at that position...entered this season with 4 career apps at C (3g in 2017, 1g in 2018)...this spring training caught 36.0 innings.
- Has made 29 starts (11gs at 2B, 9gs at C, 6gs at 1B, 3gs at 3B).
- In his career has played 1B (16g, 7gs), 2B (35g, 11gs), 3B (34g, 17gs) & C (17g, 9gs).
- Leads Reds pinch hitters in at bats, hits, doubles and RBI (10-35, .286, 3 2b, 1hr, 6rbi)...hit his only career pinch-hit HR on 5/5 vs SF (solo off Will Smith).
- Has 8 HR and 25 RBI...are the first home runs of his career...entered the season with 11 career RBI in 59 apps.
- Made his only Major League pitching appearance in a 12-5 loss on 8/8 vs Cubs (1.1ip, 1h)...became the first Reds player to pitch and catch in the same game since Dee Moore in 1936.

## 3 FREDDY GALVIS, inf Blue Jays: 115g, .267, 24 2b, 1 3b, 18hr, 54rbi, 4sb

- On 8/12 was claimed off waivers from the Blue Jays.
- Has 22 HR, a new single-season career high (20hr, 2016)...his 65 RBI are 2 shy of his single-season career high (67, 2016 & 2018).
- In his last 3 apps is 0-for-14, his longest hitless skid since joining the Reds.
- In his last 69 apps beginning 6/13 is hitting .303 (83-274, 14 2b, 1 3b, 13hr, 40rbi).
- For the Blue Jays played SS (103g, 102gs) and 2B (5g, 4gs)...has made all 15 of his starts for the Reds at 2B...played SS the last 6 innings of last night's 12-inning, 4-3 loss at Mia...is his only appearance at SS for the Reds.
- Did not play on 4/24, snapping his streak of 349 consecutive games played...was the longest active streak in the Major Leagues (Freddie Freeman 2nd, 194g).
- In each of the 2017 and 2018 seasons played in 162 games...his 1,441.0 innings in the field in 2018 were the most by any player in the Major Leagues.

## 4 JOSÉ IGLESIAS, ss Road Trip: 8-26 (.308), 1rbi

- In August is hitting .368, fourth-best batting average in the National League...for the season on the road is hitting .329, fifth-best in the NL.
- In August has hit safely in 20 of his 23 apps (32-87, .381, 5 2b, 1 3b, 2hr, 9rbi), including a team-high 14-game hitting streak from 8/1-8/19...was the longest active streak in the Major Leagues when snapped and the longest by a Reds batter since Joey Votto's 17-game hitting streak from 7/26-8/12, 2017.
- In the first inning, leads the National League in hitting (.480) and slugging percentage (.840) while ranking T1st in on-base percentage (.500).
- After missing 3 games with soreness in his right biceps, returned to the lineup on 8/12 and in 17 games since then is hitting .344 (22-64, 3 2b, 1 3b, 1hr, 6rbi).
- With 125 hits is just 1 behind team leader Eugenio Suárez...is trying to become the second straight shortstop to lead the team in hits...SS José Peraza last year led the team with 182 hits.
- With 9 HR has established a new single-season high (6hr, 2017)...has 2 grand slams in his career, both this season vs Pit (5/27/night off Mitch Keller, 7/29 off Montana DuRapau)...with 49 RBI is 5 shy of his single-season career high (54, 2017).
- After Scooter Gennett suffered a right groin injury in spring training became the team's starting SS, with José Peraza moving primarily to 2B.

## 15 NICK SENZEL, cf Road Trip: 4-20 (.200), 1hr, 3rbi, 2sb

- Last name is pronounced sen-ZELL.
- His .285 batting average through 8/2 is a season high.
- Has 3 leadoff HR (5/6 vs SF off Drew Pomeranz, 6/12 at Cle off Zach Plesac, 8/17 vs StL off Miles Mikolas)...Zack Cozart (4 in 2012) and Drew Stubbs (3 in 2009) are the only other Reds rookies with at least 3 leadoff HR in a season.
- Is the only player in franchise history, and 1 of only 21 players in Major League history, to produce 3 HR in his first 4 Major League apps.
- Began the season on Louisville's injured list with a right ankle sprain suffered on 3/25 during a spring training game in Goodyear...came off the IL on 4/23 and in 8 apps for the Bats prior to his 5/3 promotion hit .257 (1 2b, 1hr, 2rbi).

## 7 EUGENIO SUÁREZ, inf Road Trip: 9-29 (.310), 1 2b, 4hr, 5rbi

- First name is pronounced AY-you-hay-nee-oh...more notes on Page 1.
- Since the All-Star break leads the Major Leagues in HR (18) while ranking second in the National League in slugging percentage (.644, Justin Turner .652).
- In last night's 12-inning, 4-3 loss at Mia went 0-for-4 (1bb), snapping a 5-game hitting streak during which he hit .429 (9-21, 1 2b, 4hr, 5rbi, 1.048slg, .455obp) and a 4-game home run streak that fell 1 shy of his shared club record for HR in consecutive apps.
- Has a career-high 38 HR...his career high for RBI in a season is 104 (2018).
- In the first inning, leads all Major League batters in HR (13, club record) and ranks among the NL leaders in RBI (24, T3rd), slugging (.722, 2nd) and hitting (.333, T11th).
- Beginning 6/30, homered in 20 of his last 52 apps (22hr), including a pair of 2-homer games (7/1 vs Mil, 7/22 at Mil).
- Suárez and Tony Pérez are the only third basemen in club history with 25 HR in 3 seasons and the only third basemen in club history with 30 HR in 2 seasons.

## 17 JOSH VANMETER, inf/of Road Trip: 6gs in LF, 3-22 (.136), 1 3b, 1hr, 2rbi

- In his fourth stint with the Reds this season, is hitting .295 in 39 apps and 27 starts since he was promoted from Louisville just after the All-Star break (33-112, 7 2b, 1 3b, 5hr, 13rbi)...was 1 of 7 roster moves that day (7/18).
- Beginning 8/12 has started 15 of the Reds' last 17 games (6gs at 1B, 2gs at 2B, 7gs in LF) and played in the other 2 games (PH/LF, PH)...in those 17 apps overall beginning 8/12 hit .268 (15-56, 2 2b, 1 3b, 1hr, 5rbi).
- Has made 34 starts (19gs in LF, 6gs at 1B, 6gs at 2B, 2gs at 3B, 1gs at DH)...also made 1 appearance in RF (7/22 at Mil).
- From 8/15-8/21, with Joey Votto recovering from a low back strain, started at 1B in 6 of the Reds' 7 games...are his first career starts at that position...hit .350 in those 6 starts (7-20, 1 2b, 2rbi).
- In the eighth inning of the 9-8 loss on 8/25 at Pit became the 36th player to homer into the Allegheny River (2-run off Kyle Crick)...was accomplished for the 54th time.
- His solo HR off RHP Jhoulys Chacín on 7/24 at Mil traveled 463 feet per Statcast, the longest by a Reds batter this season and the second-longest by any player at Miller Park in 2019 (Travis Shaw, 465 feet, 6/23 vs Cin)...was the longest home run by a visiting player at Miller Park since StL's Marcell Ozuna hit a 479-foot HR on 4/3/18.
- Is a 2019 International League All-Star...in 49 apps for the Bats hit .348 (14 2b, 1 3b, 14hr, 43rbi, 8sb, 1.097ops)...started at 1B (10g), 2B (20g), 3B (10g) and LF (3g).
- In April was the organization's Minor League Player of the Month and the International League's Player of the Month (.358, 11hr, 28rbi).
- In spring training came over from minor league camp to make 10 apps for Reds (1-13).
- Is a native and resident of Ossian (AH-see-in), Indiana, a town of about 3,400 located 3 hours from Cincinnati near Fort Wayne...graduated from Norwell High School.

## 19 JOEY VOTTO, 1b Road Trip: 3gs, 2-13 (.154), 1bb

- Is 2-for-13 in 3 apps since he was reinstated from the injured list on Wednesday... since 8/18 had been on the 10-day IL with a low back strain...missed 11 games while injured, and the Reds went 5-6.
- In his return to the lineup on Wed at Mia went 0-for-5, snapping his 6-game hitting streak (8-22, .364, 3 2b, 1hr, 3rbi, .636slg, .440obp) and his 13-game on-base streak (.261ba, .386obp).
- From 5/8-6/4 reached base safely in 20 consecutive games, a season-high that ties Nick Senzel's (5/10-6/1) for the longest by a Reds batter this season.
- Beginning 5/8 made his last 80 starts batting second in the order...made 15 starts this season batting leadoff (last, 5/7 at Oak)...entered this year with 1 career start batting leadoff (6/18/08 vs LAD).
- In his career has hit 64 HR on the first pitch, most recently on 8/9 off Yu Darvish.
- His first-inning double on 8/10 off Chi's Kyle Hendricks was his 865th career hit at Great American Ball Park, the most by any player at GABP (Brandon Phillips, 864).
- For the fifth straight season, per *Baseball America* was voted by managers, scouts and executives the batter with the best strike zone judgment in the National League.
