TONIGHT'S GAME: Is Game 1 of a 4 -game series vs Melody Yount's first-place Cardinals and Game 8 (3-7) of the Reds' longest road trip of the season...this 3 -city, 10 -day, 11-game road trip began with a 3-0 series sweep loss at Pit's PNC Park followed by a 3-1 series win at Mia's Marlins Park ...following this road trip, the Redlegs return to Great American Ball Park for a 7 -game homestand vs the Phillies ( 4 g ) and D-Backs (3g)...the Reds are 37-31 at home this season.

SERIES NOTES: The Reds won 6 of their last 11 games at Busch Stadium...are 3-2-3 in their last 8 series vs StL, including a 1-1 series split in April in Mexico at Estadio de Béisbol Monterrey, home of the Sultanes de Monterrey of the Mexican League.

## REDS vs CARDINALS:

Joey Votto has 196 career hits vs the Cardinals (196-625, .314), the most among active players...in the live ball era, his career . 437 OBP vs StL ranks second among all players with at least 500 plate apps (Lefty O'Doul 1st, .477; Ralph Kiner 3rd, .424)...in 91 apps over the last 6 seasons vs StL, Votto has produced a 1.034 OPS (.335ba, .571 slg , .463obp)...in his last 60 apps overall vs StL beginning $8 / 2 / 16$ is hitting .339 (75-221, 16 2b, 1 3b, $9 \mathrm{hr}, 36 \mathrm{rbi}, .543 \mathrm{slg}, .449 \mathrm{obp}$ )...in his last 29 apps at Busch beginning 8/9/16 is hitting .348 ( $39-112,102 b, 5 \mathrm{hr}, 16 \mathrm{rbi}$, $.571 \mathrm{slg}, .435 \mathrm{obp})$.
Beginning $8 / 5 / 17$, Eugenio Suárez has reached base safely in 29 of his last 31 apps vs StL ( $31-111, .279,52 \mathrm{~b}, 10 \mathrm{hr}$, 26rbi, .595slg, . 377 obp ), including a 25 -game on-base streak snapped on $7 / 19$ after he was ejected following a called third strike in the first inning.
RHP Raisel Iglesias is 12 -for-12 in save opps vs the Cardinals, joining Bill Landrum (10-for-10) and Jeff Brantley (12-for-12) as the only pitchers, since the save became an official statistic, with a minimum of at least 10 perfect save conversions vs StL...in his last 23 apps vs StL beginning 8/4/16, Raisel Iglesias has posted a 1.57 ERA (12sv, 28.2ip, $15 \mathrm{~h}, 5 \mathrm{er}, 19 \mathrm{bb}, 32 \mathrm{k}, 1 \mathrm{hr}$, .152 baa$)$.

DOUBLE DIPPING: Tomorrow's split-squad doubleheader will be the Reds' second DH of the year....on Memorial Day at Great American Ball Park earned a split with the Pirates ( $8-5$ loss, $8-1$ win)...in their 16 day/ night doubleheaders since 1997, the Reds went 2-6 with 8 splits...last swept a day/night doubleheader on $7 / 8 / 14$ vs Cubs ( $4-2,6-5$ wins)...last were swept in a day/night DH on 9/17/16 vs Pit (10-4, 7-3 losses).

PLAYER \& ROOKIE OF THE MONTH: In August, rookie Aristides Aquino leads all Major League batters in HR (14), RBI (32) and slugging percentage (.804)...Aquino has established a new National League record for HR by a rookie in a calendar month and tied the franchise record for HR by any player in any calendar month.... he was National League Player of the Week for $8 / 5-8 / 11 \ldots$. Wed at Mia he became the first player in Major League history, since 1900 , to produce 13 HR in his first 100 career plate apps...last night at Mia, he hit his 14th HR in his 104th career plate appearance.

PITCHER OF THE MONTH: In August, RHP Sonny Gray is tied for the National League lead in wins (4-0) and ranks among the NL leaders in ERA ( 0.90 , 2nd), strikeouts per 9 innings (12.00, 3rd) and strikeouts (40 in 30ip, T5th)...is 1 of only 6 pitchers in the Major Leagues with as many as 4 wins this month without a loss.

THE PUNISHER: Rookie Aristides Aquino has produced 14 HR in his first 28 career games and 108 plate apps, including a 3-homer game on $8 / 10$ vs Cubs in which he homered in 3 consecutive innings (2nd, 3rd, 4th)...he played 1 game for the Reds last season.

In the first inning Wed at Mia off Sandy Alcantara hit his 13 HR in his 100th career plate appearance... is the only player in modern Major League history with 13 HR in his first $\mathbf{1 0 0}$ career plate apps and the only player with $\mathbf{1 4}$ HR in his first 108 career plate apps...Phi's Rhys Hoskins holds the record for fewest plate apps to 15 HR (135)... Hoskins ( 98 th PA) and LAD's Will Smith (100th PA) are the only other players, since 1900, to produce as many as 12 HR in their first 100 career plate apps.
Established modern Major League records for home runs in a player's first 12 career games (8), first 14 career games (9), first 16 career games (10), first 17 career games (11), first 22 career games (12), first 27 career games (13) and first 28 career games (14)...Rhys Hoskins holds the Major League record since 1900 for fewest career games to 15 HR and 16 HR (32).
With 14 HR in August has established a new National League record for home runs by a rookie in a calendar month...Det's Rudy York holds the Major League record for HR by a rookie in a calendar month with 18 HR in August 1937...Aquino shares with Frank Robinson (August 1962) and Greg Vaughn (September 1999) the franchise record for HR by any player in any calendar month

GENO: Eugenio Suárez leads all Major League third basemen with a career-high 38 HR...Nolan Arenado of the Rockies is second among third basemen with 34 HR.

The modern franchise record for home runs in a season by a third baseman is held by Tony Pérez, who in 1970 hit 40 HR overall and 39 HR while playing that position.
Suárez' 38 HR are the most by a Reds batter since Adam Dunn hit $\mathbf{4 0 H R}$ in 2007 and the most by a Reds righthanded batter since Greg Vaughn had 45 HR in 1999.
Suárez is trying to become only the sixth player from Venezuela to hit $\mathbf{4 0}$ HR in a season (Andres Galarraga 3 times, Miguel Cabrera twice, Richard Hidalgo, Tony Armas, Carlos Gonzalez).

## RED HOTS

Trevor Bauer tonight is making his sixth appearance for the Reds...at the July 31 deadline was acquired as part of a 3-team trade in which the Indians received from the Reds OF Yasiel Puig and LHP Scott Moss and from the Padres OF Franmil Reyes, LHP Logan Allen and IF Victor Nova, while SD received from the Reds OF Taylor Trammell (truh-MELL)...ranks second in the Major Leagues innings pitched (182.2, Justin Verlander 184.0) and ranks fourth in the majors in strikeouts (217)...since the beginning of the 2018 season, among all starting pitchers with at least 300 innings ranks seventh in strikeouts (438), 11th in ERA (3.29), and 10th in innings pitched (358.0)...has produced his second career $\mathbf{2 0 0}$-strikeout season and is 4 strikeouts shy of his single-season career high (221, 2018).

## RED HOTS

Tyler Mahle's last name rhymes with RALLY...at just 24 years old already is in his third Major League season...as the 26th player for tomorrow's doubleheader, in the day game will make his first appearance for the Reds since $\mathbf{7 / 1 9}$ vs StL... 3 days after that 12-11 loss went on the 10-day injured list with a left hamstring strain...on $8 / 16$ and $8 / 21$ made rehab starts for Louisville before he was reinstated from the IL and optioned to Louisville on $8 / 22 \ldots$ made 1 more start for the Bats, a 9-0 Bats win on Mon vs Columbus (5ip, 3h, 1bb, $6 \mathrm{k}, 75$ pitches), before he was announced as a starter for tomorrow.

In his last 3 apps is 0 -for-14, his longest hitless skid since joining the Reds.
In his last 69 apps beginning $6 / 13$ is hitting . 303 ( $83-274,142 \mathrm{~b}, 13 \mathrm{~b}, 13 \mathrm{hr}, 40 \mathrm{rbi}$ ). For the Blue Jays played SS (103g, 102gs) and 2B (5g, 4gs)...has made all 15 of his starts for the Reds at 2B...played SS the last 6 innings of last night's 12-inning, 4-3 loss at Mia...is his only appearance at SS for the Reds.
Did not play on $4 / 24$, snapping his streak of 349 consecutive games played...was the longest active streak in the Major Leagues (Freddie Freeman 2nd, 194g).
In each of the 2017 and 2018 seasons played in 162 games...his 1,441.0 innings in the field in 2018 were the most by any player in the Major Leagues.

4 JOSÉ IGLESIAS, ss
Road Trip: 8-26 (.308), 1rbi In August is hitting .368, fourth-best batting average in the National League...for the season on the road is hitting .329, fifth-best in the NL.
In August has hit safely in 20 of his 23 apps (32-87, .381, 5 2b, 1 3b, 2hr, 9rbi), including a team-high 14-game hitting streak from 8/1-8/19...was the longest active streak in the Major Leagues when snapped and the longest by a Reds batter since Joey Votto's 17-game hitting streak from 7/26-8/12, 2017.
In the first inning, leads the National League in hitting (.480) and slugging percentage (.840) while ranking T1st in on-base percentage (.500).

After missing 3 games with soreness in his right biceps, returned to the lineup on $8 / 12$ and in 17 games since then is hitting .344 (22-64, $32 \mathrm{~b}, 13 \mathrm{~b}, 1 \mathrm{hr}, 6 \mathrm{rbi}$ ).
With 125 hits is just 1 behind team leader Eugenio Suárez...is trying to become the second straight shortstop to lead the team in hits...SS José Peraza last year led the team with 182 hits.
With 9 HR has established a new single-season high (6hr, 2017)...has 2 grand slams in his career, both this season vs Pit (5/27/night off Mitch Keller, 7/29 off Montana DuRapau)...with 49 RBI is 5 shy of his single-season career high $(54,2017)$.
After Scooter Gennett suffered a right groin injury in spring training became the team's starting SS, with José Peraza moving primarily to 2B.

15 NICK SENZEL, cf
Road Trip: 4-20 (.200), 1hr, 3rbi, 2sb
Last name is pronounced sen-ZELL.
His .285 batting average through $8 / 2$ is a season high.
Has 3 leadoff HR ( $5 / 6$ vs SF off Drew Pomeranz, 6/12 at Cle off Zach Plesac, 8/17 vs StL off Miles Mikolas)...Zack Cozart (4 in 2012) and Drew Stubbs (3 in 2009) are the only other Reds rookies with at least 3 leadoff HR in a season.
Is the only player in franchise history, and 1 of only 21 players in Major League history, to produce 3 HR in his first 4 Major League apps.
Began the season on Louisville's injured list with a right ankle sprain suffered on $3 / 25$ during a spring training game in Goodyear...came off the IL on 4/23 and in 8 apps for the Bats prior to his $5 / 3$ promotion hit .257 (1 2b, 1hr, 2rbi).

EUGENIO SUÁREZ, inf
Road Trip: 9-29 (.310), 1 2b, $4 \mathrm{hr}, 5 \mathrm{rbi}$
First name is pronounced AY-you-hay-nee-oh...more notes on Page 1.
Since the All-Star break leads the Major Leagues in HR (18) while ranking second in the National League in slugging percentage (.644, Justin Turner .652).
In last night's 12-inning, 4-3 loss at Mia went 0-for-4 (1bb), snapping a 5-game hitting streak during which he hit . 429 ( $9-21,12 \mathrm{~b}, 4 \mathrm{hr}, 5 \mathrm{rbi}, 1.048 \mathrm{sig}, .455 \mathrm{obp}$ ) and a 4 -game home run streak that fell 1 shy of his shared club record for HR in consecutive apps. Has a career-high 38 HR...his career high for RBI in a season is 104 (2018).
In the first inning, leads all Major League batters in HR (13, club record) and ranks among the NL leaders in RBI (24, T3rd), slugging (.722, 2nd) and hitting (.333, T11th). Beginning $6 / 30$, homered in 20 of his last 52 apps ( 22 hr ), including a pair of 2 -homer games ( $7 / 1$ vs Mil, $7 / 22$ at Mil).
Suárez and Tony Pérez are the only third basemen in club history with 25 HR in 3 seasons and the only third basemen in club history with 30 HR in 2 seasons.
17 JOSH VANMETER, inf/of Road Trip: 6gs in LF, 3-22 (.136), 1 3b, 1hr, 2rbi In his fourth stint with the Reds this season, is hitting . 295 in 39 apps and 27 starts since he was promoted from Louisville just after the All-Star break (33-112, 7 2b, 1 $3 \mathrm{~b}, 5 \mathrm{hr}, 13 \mathrm{rbi})$... was 1 of 7 roster moves that day ( $7 / 18$ ).
Beginning $8 / 12$ has started 15 of the Reds' last 17 games ( 6 gs at $1 \mathrm{~B}, 2 \mathrm{gs}$ at 2 B , 7 gs in LF) and played in the other 2 games (PH/LF, PH)...in those 17 apps overall beginning $8 / 12$ hit .268 (15-56, 2 2b, $13 \mathrm{~b}, 1 \mathrm{hr}, 5 \mathrm{rbi}$ ).
Has made 34 starts (19gs in LF, 6 gs at 1B, 6 gs at $2 \mathrm{~B}, 2 \mathrm{gs}$ at $3 \mathrm{~B}, 1 \mathrm{gs}$ at DH)...also made 1 appearance in RF ( $7 / 22$ at Mil).
From 8/15-8/21, with Joey Votto recovering from a low back strain, started at 1B in 6 of the Reds' 7 games....are his first career starts at that position...hit . 350 in those 6 starts (7-20, 1 2b, 2rbi).
In the eighth inning of the 9-8 loss on $8 / 25$ at Pit became the 36 th player to homer into the Allegheny River (2-run off Kyle Crick)...was accomplished for the 54th time. His solo HR off RHP Jhoulys Chacín on $7 / 24$ at Mil traveled 463 feet per Statcast, the longest by a Reds batter this season and the second-longest by any player at Miller Park in 2019 (Travis Shaw, 465 feet, 6/23 vs Cin)...was the longest home run by a visiting player at Miller Park since StL's Marcell Ozuna hit a 479-foot HR on 4/3/18. Is a 2019 International League All-Star...in 49 apps for the Bats hit . 348 (14 2b, 1 $3 \mathrm{~b}, 14 \mathrm{hr}, 43 \mathrm{rbi}, 8 \mathrm{sb}, 1.097 \mathrm{ops}) \ldots$...started at $1 \mathrm{~B}(10 \mathrm{~g})$, 2B $(20 \mathrm{~g}), 3 \mathrm{~B}(10 \mathrm{~g})$ and LF $(3 \mathrm{~g})$. In April was the organization's Minor League Player of the Month and the International League's Player of the Month (.358, $11 \mathrm{hr}, 28 \mathrm{rbi}$ ).
In spring training came over from minor league camp to make 10 apps for Reds (1-13). Is a native and resident of Ossian (AH-see-in), Indiana, a town of about 3,400 located 3 hours from Cincinnati near Fort Wayne...graduated from Norwell High School.

19 JOEY VOTTO, 1b Road Trip: 3gs, 2-13 (.154), 1bb
Is 2 -for-13 in 3 apps since he was reinstated from the injured list on Wednesday... since $8 / 18$ had been on the 10-day IL with a low back strain... missed 11 games while injured, and the Reds went 5-6.
In his return to the lineup on Wed at Mia went 0-for-5, snapping his 6-game hitting streak ( $8-22, .364,32 \mathrm{~b}, 1 \mathrm{hr}$, 3rbi, .636slg, . 440 obp ) and his 13 -game on-base streak (.261ba, .386obp).
From 5/8-6/4 reached base safely in 20 consecutive games, a season-high that ties Nick Senzel's (5/10-6/1) for the longest by a Reds batter this season.
Beginning $5 / 8$ made his last 80 starts batting second in the order...made 15 starts this season batting leadoff (last, 5/7 at Oak)...entered this year with 1 career start batting leadoff ( $6 / 18 / 08$ vs LAD).
In his career has hit 64 HR on the first pitch, most recently on 8/9 off Yu Darvish. His first-inning double on $8 / 10$ off Chi's Kyle Hendricks was his 865 th career hit at Great American Ball Park, the most by any player at GABP (Brandon Phillips, 864). For the fifth straight season, per Baseball America was voted by managers, scouts and executives the batter with the best strike zone judgment in the National League.
