HERE'S THE STORY: The D-backs are 7-2 in their last 9 home games, since Aug. 5.

- ♦ The D-backs are 5-3 in their last 8 home games vs. Rockies, since July 5, 2019.
- ♦ Among active players vs. Jon Gray (min. 10 PA), **Christian Walker's** .500 average is tied for second with Andrew McCutchen, **Ketel Marte's** .474 average is fourth and **David Peralta's** .458 average is sixth...Cody Bellinger is tops with a .647 average.
 - Peralta's 11 hits are tied for second-most among active players with Bellinger behind Wil Myers' 14 hits.

PERALTA CLIMBING THE CHARTS: **David Peralta's** 737 hits are 2 shy of passing Justin Upton (739) for seventh on the franchise list...his next triple will tie Tony Womack (37) for second place.

VS. RIGHTIES: Among NL players vs. righties, **David Peralta's** .311 average is 11th and **Christian Walker's** .307 average is 13th while **Kole Calhoun's** .942 OPS is 14th.

- Walker, in his last 14 games vs. righties, is hitting .356 (16-for-45)/1.042 OPS with 5 doubles, 2 homers, 4 RBI, 1 HBP and 6 walks.

VOGT'S FRAMING: **Stephen Vogt** has converted 51.8 percent of non-swing pitches into called strikes in the Shadow Zone, the eighth-best rate in the Majors behind Omar Narváez/MIL (56.7%), Willson Contreras/CHI (53.7), Austin Barnes/LAD (54.5), Curt Casali/CIN (54.2), J.T. Realmuto/PHI (54.0), Manny Piña/MIL (53.6) and James McCann/CWS (52.0) [source: baseballsavant.mlb.com].

- Catcher framing is receiving a pitch in a way that makes it more likely for an umpire to call it a strike...breaks down the catcher's view into 8 zones around the strike zone and shows the called strike percentage of all non-swings in that zone...Strike Rate is the cumulative total of all zones...shadow zone is the edges of the strike zone, roughly one ball width inside and one ball wide outside of the zone.

WITH RISP: **Nick Ahmed**, in his last 13 games with runners in scoring position, is hitting .500 (9-for-18)/1.627 OPS with 1 double, 3 home runs, 15 RBI and 3 walks.

- Among NL players with RISP, **David Peralta's** 19 RBI are the second most while **Nick Ahmed's** 1.308 OPS and .792 SLG are sixth and 15 RBI are tied for seventh.

C-WALK AT THE DISH: **Christian Walker**, in his last 15 games, is hitting .328 (19-for-58) with 5 doubles, 3 homers, 5 RBI, 1 HBP and 7 walks.

RAY NOTES: Need 1 win to tie Ian Kennedy (48) for sixth place on the club's all-time list.

- Is 10 strikeouts shy of becoming the third D-backs pitcher with 1,000 strikeouts (also: Randy Johnson and Brandon Webb).

LAST START: Lost on Aug. 21 vs. Giants (4 ER in 5.0 IP)...walked 5 and struck out 8.

VS. ROCKIES: Will be making his second start vs. Colorado this season...did not factor in the decision on Aug. 10 @ Coors Field (6 ER in 3.2 IP).

- Is 5-5 with a 5.58 ERA (57 ER in 92.0 IP) in 18 career starts.
- Has gone 2-0 in his last 4 starts @ Chase Field.

A GRAND ACHIEVEMENT: Recorded his 1,000th strikeouts (Jorge Mateo) on Aug. 16 vs. Padres and is the second-fastest left-hander since 1913 to reach the milestone (games and innings pitched):

2019 REVIEW: Set career highs in strikeouts (235), strikeouts per 9.0 IP (12.13) and starts (33), going 12-8 with a 4.34 ERA.

- Ranked third in club history with 12.13 strikeouts per 9.0 IP, behind Randy Johnson (13.41 in 2001 & 12.56 in 2000).
- 12.13 strikeouts per 9.0 IP were second in the NL to only Max Scherzer/WSH (12.69)...235 strikeouts ranked fifth.

STARLING IN GOOD COMPANY: **Starling Marte** (200 2B, 42 3B, 110 HR) is 1 of 3 players since 2012 with 195+ doubles, 40+ triples and 100+ home runs along with Mike Trout (247 2B, 47 3B, 290 HR) and Charlie Blackmon (233 2B, 48 3B, 174 HR).

CALHOUN'S HOME RUN POP: **Kole Calhoun's** 40 home runs as an outfielder since 2019 are ninth in the Majors among outfielders behind Bryce Harper (41), Max Kepler (41), Kyle Schwarber (41), Juan Soto (41), Ronald Acuña Jr. (45), Cody Bellinger (47), Christian Yelich (49) and Mike Trout (54).

DEFENSE RULES: The D-backs lead the NL with a .990 fielding pct., ahead of the Cubs (.987), Reds (.986) and Dodgers (.986)...the D-backs are third in the Majors to the Twins (.993) and Astros (.990).

KETEL AT HOME: **Ketel Marte's** .343 home average since 2019 is third in the Majors [leader is Charlie Blackmon/COL (.390)], and his .322 home average since 2018 is eighth in the Majors [leader is Charlie Blackmon/COL (.363)].

LOTS OF RUNS VS. ROCKIES: The D-backs' 2,182 runs all-time vs. Rockies are the second most by a team vs. a single opponent since 1998, behind the Yankees' 2,219 runs vs. Orioles and ahead of the Red Sox' 2,104 runs vs. Orioles, Dodgers' 2,102 runs vs. Rockies and A's' 2,098 runs vs. Rangers.

BETTER LATE THAN NEVER: The D-backs' 57 runs from the seventh inning or later are tied for third in the Majors with the Orioles (57) behind the Dodgers (59) and A's (59).

NEXT STARTER: RHP ZAC GALLEN (0-0, 2.25)

♦ Fourth career start vs. Rockies.

♦ Is tied for the Major League record by allowing 3 or fewer earned runs in his first 21 big league starts (also: Aaron Sele/Red Sox from June 23, 1993-April 19, 1994).

♦ In 8 home starts at Chase Field, is 2-1 with a 2.27 ERA, .187 opponent average and 56 strikeouts...team is 7-1.
