TONIGHT'S GAME: Is Game 1 of a 3-game series of night games vs David Ross' Cubs and Game 6 (3-3) of the Redlegs' second consecutive 3-city, 10-day road trip...this jaunt began with a 2-1 series loss at Sea's T-Mobile Park in the fourth of the Redlegs' 4 scheduled visits to the West Coast (0-3 at LAD & 3-1 at SD, 1-2 at Oak & 2-1 at SF, 0-2 at LAA, 1-2 at Sea), followed by the weekend's 2-1 series win at Ari's Chase Field...following this series the Redlegs return to Great American Ball Park for their final homestand (3g vs NYM, off day, 3g vs Mil)...will finish the 2019 championship season with 3 games at Pit's PNC Park...the Reds' elimination number is 2 in the Wild Card...with Sat's 1-0 loss at Ari were eliminated from NL Central **Division** contention.

TRANSACTION: The Reds today selected from Louisville the contract of IF Christian Colón (#29)...the non-roster invitee to spring training camp spent the season with the Bats (136g, .300, 37 2b, 2 3b, 10hr, 70rbi, 24sb)...made his last Major League appearance on 6/20/17 for Mia vs Wsh.

SERIES NOTES: The Reds are 9-7 vs Cubs this season and won or tied 4 of the **5 series**...over the **previous 4 seasons** (2015-2018), the Cubs' **.671 winning percentage** vs the Reds (51-25) was the best by any team against any division opponent...Joey Votto ranks third among all active players with 35 HR and 116 RBI against the Cubs, trailing in both categories only Albert Pujols (57-146) and Ryan Braun (39-137).

<u>THE FRIENDLY CONFINES</u>: The Reds and Cubs are meeting at **Wrigley** Field for the third of this season's 3 meetings...the Reds are **3-3 here** this season but have lost 24 of the last 34 games played in The Friendly Confines...since a 4-1 Reds win on 6/25/14 and beginning 9/15/14, the Cubs have won 22 of the last 26 night games at Wrigley Field between the teams...beginning 6/25/14, Joey Votto had reached base safely in 41 straight games at Wrigley Field until he went 0-for-4 in his last appearance here, a 5-2 Cubs win on 7/17...his 41-game on-base streak was the longest by a visiting player at Wrigley Field since StL/LAD's Wally Moon reached in 47 consecutive apps here from 8/30/1957 - 9/15/1962...was the longest streak ever by a Reds player at **Wrigley Field** and the longest by any player since Chi's own **Mark Grace** reached safely in **45 straight games** here from 9/28/1996 - 7/22/1997...Votto's 119 career hits here are the most by any active opposing player (119-367, .324, 16hr,

57rbi, .997ops).

FIRST WATCH: In the first inning, the Redlegs lead the Major Leagues in runs (120), HR (43), RBI (117) and slugging percentage (.569)...have outscored opponents in the first frame, 120-76, and are 34-13 (.723) when leading after the first inning...6 times this season scored at least 4 runs in the first inning...Eugenio Suárez' leads the Major Leagues with 14 HR

GENO: 3B Eugenio Suárez is tied for the Major League lead with a career-high 47 HR, a modern franchise record for a third baseman and 1 shy of the National League record for HR in a season by a player at that position (48), shared by Phi's Mike Schmidt (1980) & LAD's Adrián Beltré (2004)...Suárez' 47 HR are the most by a third baseman since NYY's Alex Rodriguez in 2007 established the Major League single-season record by hitting 52 of his 54 HR while playing third base.. Suárez' 47 HR are the most by a Reds batter since George Foster established the single-season franchise record with 52 HR in 1977...since the All-Star break **Suárez** leads the Major Leagues with **27 HR**, tying **Ted Klusewski's** 1954 club record for HR in the second half of a season, and in **slugging percentage** (.724)... **Suárez** is trying the become the sixth Reds batter to lead the National League in HR, the first since **Foster** hit 40 HR in 1978...with a club record 52 HR in 1977, **Foster** is the last Reds batter to lead the Major Leagues in HR.

RUTHIAN: In the 8-5 win on 9/4 vs Phi, Michael Lorenzen joined Babe Ruth (6/13/1921 vs Det) as the only Major League players since 1900 to earn the win, hit a home run and play the outfield in the same game...entered in the seventh inning as the Reds' third pitcher of the game and suffered a blown save after Jay Bruce homered to tie the score at 5-5...in the bottom of the eighth hit his only HR of the season and seventh of his career, a 2-run HR off Blake Parker that extended the Reds' lead to 8-5...played center field in the top of the ninth.

2-WAY PLAYER: RHP Michael Lorenzen has appeared in 97 of the Reds' 150 games (69g at P, 12g in CF, 8g in LF, 4g in RF, 13g as pinch runner, 5g as a pinch hitter)...tonight's start will be his third straight in center field...he is a career .246 hitter (28-114) with 3 doubles, 1 triple, 7 HR, 23 RBI...this season as a pinch hitter is 1-5 with 1 RBI...in his career as a pinch hitter is 5-for-25 (.200, 7 RBI) with 3 HR, on 4/6/17 off Phi's Adam Morgan, 6/24/18 off Chi's Mike Montgomery and 6/30/18 off Mil's Jacob Barnes (grand slam)...9 times in his career, including twice this season (4/9 vs Mia, 4/15 at LAD), he entered games as a pinch hitter and remained in that game to pitch...6 times in his career came off the bench to produce a home run, including 3 times as a reliever and 3 times as a pinch hitter...Lorenzen this year became the first player in Reds history, whose primary position is pitcher, to appear in each of the first 6 games of a season (PR/CF, P, PR, P, PR, P).

AND THIS ONE BELONGS....: Hall of Fame broadcaster Marty Brennaman is retiring after 46 seasons calling Reds games for 700 WLW Radio...he joined the Reds radio team in 1974 and for 31 seasons (1974-2004) shared the 700 WLW Radio booth with Reds Hall of Fame pitcher Joe Nuxhall, tying LA's Vin Scully and Jerry Doggett for the longest running broadcast duo in baseball history. Brennaman is only the eighth Major League Baseball broadcaster to work for the same team for at least 46 seasons.

RED HOTS

Kevin Gausman's last name is pronounced GAUZE-min...tonight is making his first start for the Reds following 11 relief apps since he was claimed off waivers from the Braves on 8/5...Gausman made his Reds debut on 8/8 vs Cubs...was his first relief appearance since 5/6/15 for Bal at NYM, snapping a streak of 128 consecutive starts...threw more than 1.0 inning in 6 of his 11 relief apps for the Reds and threw 2.0 innings in 5 of his 11 apps...in perfect eighth and ninth innings on 8/18 vs StL struck out all 6 batters, the most strikeouts by a Reds reliever in a game this season...in the ninth became the fifth pitcher in Reds history to throw an Immaculate Inning (3 batters, 3 strikeouts, 9 pitches), the first since Drew Storen did it on 4/18/17 vs Bal and 1 of 6 Major Leaguers to do it this season (Chris Sale twice, Josh Hader, Thomas Pannone, Stephen Strasburg, Chris Martin).

RED HOTS

Sonny Gray is a 2019 National League All-Star...ranks among the National League leaders in ERA (2.80, 5th), strikeouts (190, 11th) and opponents' BA (.198, 1st)...beginning 8/25/18 has made 31 consecutive starts allowing 6 hits or fewer, tying Nolan Ryan's Major League record (5/1/91-6/1/92) and excluding "openers"...in Wed's 5-3 loss at Sea, didn't allow a hit until rookie Kyle Lewis' 3-run HR with 1 out in the bottom of the seventh gave the Mariners a 3-2 lead...was Lewis' second Major League hit, both homers vs the Reds...Gray is trying to become the first Reds pitcher to make at least 30 starts and post an ERA of 2.80 or lower since Johnny Cueto in 2014 (34gs, 2.25)...in his last 14 starts beginning 6/28 is 7-2, 1.75 (87.2ip, 17er) with 12 quality starts, 5 times was the victim of blown saves and since then ranks second among all Major League starting pitchers in ERA (StL's Jack Flaherty, 1.42).
