TONIGHT'S GAME: Is Game $2(1-0)$ of a 3-game series vs Justin Gaither's Diamondbacks and Game 5 (2-2) of the Redlegs' second consecutive 3-city, 10-day road trip...this jaunt began with a 2-1 series loss at Sea's T-Mobile Park in the fourth of the Redlegs' 4 scheduled visits to the West Coast ( $0-3$ at LAD \& 3-1 at SD, 1-2 at Oak \& 2-1 at SF, 0-2 at LAA, 1-2 at Sea)...it will conclude with a 3 -game series at Chi's Wrigley Field beginning Monday night...following this road trip the Reds return to GABP beginning Monday night....foliowing NYM, off day, 3 g vs Mil)...will finish the
for their final homestand ( 3 g vs NY, 2019 championship season with 3 games at Pit's PNC Park...the Reds' elimination numbers are 1 in the NL Central and 5 in the Wild Card.

SERIES NOTES: The Reds are $\mathbf{4 - 2}$ in their last 6 games at Chase Field... are 33-18 at Ari with the ballpark roof closed and $\mathbf{6 - 1 2}$ with the roof open... Cin won its first 7 games here until a 9-6 loss on 7/1/00.

CUBS UP NEXT: The Reds are 9-7 vs Cubs this season and won or tied 4 of the 5 series...over the previous 4 seasons (2015-2018), the Cubs' .671 winning percentage vs the Reds (51-25) was the best by any team against any division opponent....next week the teams will meet for the third of this season's 3 meetings at Wrigley Field, all night games...the Reds are 3-3 there this season but have lost 24 of the last 34 games played in The Friendly Confines...since a $4-1$ Reds win on $6 / 25 / 14$ and beginning 9/15/14, the Cubs have won 22 of the last 26 night games at Wrigley Field.

FIRST WATCH: In the first inning, the Redlegs lead the Major Leagues in runs (120), HR (43), RBI (117) and slugging percentage (.574)...have outscored opponents in the first frame, 120-76, and are 34-13 (.723) when leading after the first inning 6 times this season scored at least 4 runs in the first inning...Eugenio Suárez' leads the Major Leagues with 14 HR in the first inning, a franchise record.

PLAYER \& ROOKIE OF THE MONTH: Aristides Aquino was the National League's Player of the Month and Rookie of the Month for August...led the Major Leagues in HR (14) and RBI (33) and led the National League in slugging percentage (.767)...established a new National League record for HR by a rookie in a calendar month and tied the franchise record for HR by any player in any calendar month (Frank Robinson, August 1962 \& Greg Vaughn, September 1999)...his 33 RBI are second-most ever by a Reds batter in August (Frank Robinson, 34 RBI, August 1962).

THE PUNISHER: Rookie Aristides Aquino has produced 15 HR in his first 43 career games and 165 plate apps, including a 3-homer game on $8 / 10$ vs Cubs in which he homered in 3 consecutive innings ( $2 \mathrm{nd}, 3 \mathrm{rd}, 4 \mathrm{th}$ )...he played 1 game for the Reds last season...he last homered on $9 / 2$ vs Phi (solo off Drew Smyly).

Holds modern Major League records for fewest career games to 14 HR (28) and fewest career plate apps to 15 HR (122). Is the only player in modern Major League history with 13 HR in his first 100 career plate apps, the only player with 14 HR in his first 108 career plate apps and the only player with 15 HR in his first 122 career plate apps...Phi's Rhys Hoskins (98th PA) and LAD's Will Smith (100th PA) are the only other players, since 1900, to produce as many as $\mathbf{1 2 \text { HR in their }}$ first 100 career plate apps...Hoskins retains the record since 1900 for fewest plate apps to 16 HR (137).
Holds modern Major League records for HR in a player's first 12 career games (8), first 14 career games (9), first 16 career games (10), first 17 career games (11), first 22 career games (12), first 27 career games (13) and first 28 career games (14)...Rhys Hoskins retains the Major League record since 1900 for fewest career games to 15 HR and 16 HR (32).

RUTHIAN: Per @EliasSports, in the $8-5$ win on $9 / 4$ vs Phi Michael Lorenzen joined Babe Ruth (6/13/1921 vs Det) as the only Major League players since 1900 to earn the win, hit a home run and play the outfield in the same game...entered in the seventh inning as the Reds' third pitcher of the game and suffered a blown save after Jay Bruce homered to tie the score at $5-5$...in the bottom of the eighth hit his first HR of the season and seventh of his career, a 2-run HR off Blake Parker that extended the Reds' lead to 8-5...played center field in the top of the ninth...in the next day's 11 -inning, $4-3$ win vs Phi made his first career start in CF and went 0 -for- 3 with a walk...in the bottom of the ninth inning of Sun's 4-3 walkoff win vs Ari, Lorenzen pinch hit and doubled off T.J. McFarland to drive in the game-ending run...was his fifth career pinch hit, his first of this season, and his first career walkoff hit.

2-WAY PLAYER: RHP Michael Lorenzen has appeared in 95 of the Reds' 148 games ( 69 g at $\mathrm{P}, 10 \mathrm{~g}$ in CF, 8 g in LF, 4 g in RF, 13 g as pinch runner, 5 g as a pinch hitter)...he is a career .259 hitter (28-108) with 3 doubles, 1 triple, $7 \mathrm{HR}, 23 \mathrm{RBI}$ and a . 798 OPS...this season as a pinch hitter is $1-5$ with 1 RBI...in his career as a pinch hitter is 5 -for- 25 (.200, 7 RBI) with 3 HR, on $4 / 6 / 17$ off Phi's Adam Morgan, 6/24/18 off Chi's Mike Montgomery and 6/30/18 off Mil's Jacob Barnes (grand slam)... 9 times in his career, including twice this season ( $4 / 9 \mathrm{vs}$ Mia, $4 / 15$ at LAD), he entered games as a pinch hitter and remained in that game to pitch... 6 times in his career came off the bench to produce a home run, including 3 times as a reliever and 3 times as a pinch hitter...Lorenzen this year became the first player in Reds history, whose primary position is pitcher, to appear in each of the first 6 games of a season (PR/CF, P, PR $\mathrm{P}, \mathrm{PR}, \mathrm{P})$...is the first Reds player with as many as 405.1 career innings pitched to play center field since Hal Jeffcoat (474.1ip) in 1958.

150th CELEBRATION: During the 2019 season the Reds are celebrating the 150th anniversary of professional baseball, which began with the formation of the 1869 Red Stockings...this season the team will wear 15 uniforms from various periods throughout the team's history...on Sun, 9/22 vs NYM will wear replica uniforms of the 1999 team that won 96 games but lost a 1-game playoff to the Mets...the Reds are 5-9 wearing throwback uniforms. already wore uniforms from 1902, 1911, 1912, 1919, 1935, 1936, 1939, 1956, 1961, 1967, 1969, 19761990 and 1995...as part of the season-long celebration, the Reds Hall of Fame and Museum underwent a comprehensive modification, while the 1869 Pavilion at the southwest corner of the ballpark was dedicated on May 4, the 150th anniversary of the Red Stockings' $45-9$ win over the Cincinnati Great Westerns in the first professional baseball game.

## RED HOTS

Anthony DeSclafani's last name is pronounced DEE-sclafani...in his last 5 starts is 2-1, 2.32 (31ip, 8er)...has allowed 3 leadoff HR (Pit's Adam Frazier, Chi's Kyle Schwarber, Cle's Francisco Lindor)...in the $7-5$ loss on $6 / 23$ at Mil, became the second Major League pitcher this season to record 9 strikeouts through the first 3 innings of a game (Mil's Corbin Burnes, $3 / 31 \mathrm{vs}$ StL) and the only Reds pitcher to do it since at least the 1920 s, since such research is available.. retired his first 6 batters via strikeout, tying the franchise record for strikeouts to begin a game (Robert Stephenson, $8 / 25 / 17$ vs Pit)...that streak was snapped by Travis Shaw's HR leading off the third inning...missed the entire 2017 season with a sprained ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow and the first 2 months of the 2018 campaign with a left oblique strain suffered in his third spring training appearance...in 49 starts since he returned from those injuries is $16-16,4.44$.

## Tomorrow's Pitcher - \#27 Trevor Bauer, RHP

## RED HOTS

Trevor Bauer tomorrow will make his ninth appearance for the Reds...at the July 31 deadline was acquired as part of a 3-team trade in which the Indians received from the Reds OF Yasiel Puig and LHP Scott Moss and from the Padres OF Franmil Reyes, LHP Logan Allen and IF Victor Nova, while SD received from the Reds OF Taylor Trammell (truh-MELL)...in Tue's 4-3 loss at Sea didn't allow a hit until Kyle Lewis, making his Major League debut, homered with 1 out in the fifth inning...was Lewis' first career hit and second plate appearance...left leading, 3-2, but was the victim of a blown save when Kyle Seager's 2 -run HR off Amir Garrett gave the Mariners their 4-3 lead...his last 8 runs allowed all came via home runs (Dexter Fowler solo, Yadier Molina solo, Logan Morrison 2-run, J.T. Realmuto 2-run, Kyle Lewis solo in his Major League debut, Dylan Moore solo)...has recorded $\mathbf{2 3 6}$ strikeouts in 198.0 innings over 32 starts, all career highs...is his second consecutive $\mathbf{2 0 0}$-strikeout season and his third career $\mathbf{3 0}$-start season...ranks among the Major League leaders in innings pitched (198.0, 2nd; Justin Verlander, 206.0) and strikeouts (236, 4th)...since the beginning of the 2018 season, among all starting pitchers with at least 300 innings ranks sixth in strikeouts (457), 14th in ERA (3.45) and T8th in innings pitched (373.1)...in 2018 was an American League All-Star, finished fifth in the Cy Young Award voting, ranked second in the AL in ERA (2.21) and allowed the fewest HR per 9 innings in the league (.0462)...in his $5-2$ win on $8 / 9 \mathrm{vs}$ Cubs, in his Great American Ball Park debut as a Red recorded 11 strikeouts...in his career has 27 apps with at least 10 strikeouts, including 8 this season.
