TONIGHT'S GAME: Is **Game 2** (0-1) of a 3-game series of night games vs **David Ross' Cubs** and **Game 7** (3-4) of the Redlegs' second consecutive **3-city, 10-day road trip**...this jaunt began with an off day in **Seattle** and then a **2-1 series loss at T-Mobile Park** in the fourth of the Redlegs' 4 scheduled visits to the **West Coast** (0-3 at LAD & 3-1 at SD, 1-2 at Oak & 2-1 at SF, 0-2 at LAA, 1-2 at Sea), followed by the weekend's **2-1 series win at Ari's Chase Field**...beginning Friday the Reds return to **Great American Ball Park** for their final homestand (3g vs NYM, off day, 3g vs Mil)...will finish the **2019 championship season** with 3 games at Pit's **PNC Park**.

SERIES NOTES: The Reds are **9-8 vs Cubs** this season and won or tied **4** of the **previous 5 series**...over the **previous 4 seasons** (2015-2018), the Cubs' **.671 winning percentage** vs the Reds (51-25) was the best by any team against any division opponent...**Joey Votto** ranks third among all active players with **35 HR** and **116 RBI** against the Cubs, trailing in both categories only **Albert Pujols** (57-146) and **Ryan Braun** (39-137).

THE FRIENDLY CONFINES: The Reds and Cubs are meeting at **Wrigley Field** for the third of this season's 3 meetings...the Reds are **3-4 here** this season but have lost **25** of the **last 35 games** played in **The Friendly Confines**...since a 4-1 Reds win on **6/25/14** and beginning **9/15/14**, the Cubs have won **23** of the last **27 night games at Wrigley Field** between the teams...beginning **6/25/14**, **Joey Votto** had reached base safely in **41 straight games at Wrigley Field** until he went 0-for-4 in his last appearance here, a 5-2 Cubs win on 7/17...his **41-game on-base streak** was the longest by a visiting player at **Wrigley Field** since StL/LAD's **Wally Moon** reached in **47 consecutive apps** here from **8/30/1957 - 9/15/1962**...was the longest streak ever by a Reds player at **Wrigley Field** and the longest by any player since Chi's own **Mark Grace** reached safely in **45 straight games** here from **9/28/1996 - 7/22/1997**...**Votto's 119 career hits** here are the most by any active opposing player (119-367, .324, 16hr, 57rbi, .997ops).

FIRST WATCH: In the first inning, the Redlegs lead the Major Leagues in **runs** (120), **HR** (43, Major League record), **RBI** (117) and **slugging percentage** (.567)...have outscored opponents in the first frame, **120-79**, and are **34-13** (.723) when leading after the first inning...**6 times** this season scored at **least 4 runs** in the first inning...**Eugenio Suárez'** leads the Major Leagues with **14 HR** in the first inning, a franchise record.

GENO: **3B Eugenio Suárez** is tied for the Major League lead with a **career-high 47 HR**, a modern franchise record for a third baseman and 1 shy of the National League record for HR in a season by a player at that position (48), shared by Phi's **Mike Schmidt** (1980) & LAD's **Adrián Beltré** (2004)...**Suárez' 47 HR** are the most by a third baseman since NYY's **Alex Rodriguez** in 2007 established the Major League single-season record by hitting 52 of his 54 HR while playing third base...**Suárez' 47 HR** are the most by a Reds batter since **George Foster** established the single-season franchise record with 52 HR in 1977...since the All-Star break **Suárez** leads the Major Leagues with **27 HR**, tying **Ted Kluszewski's** 1954 club record for HR in the second half of a season, and in **slugging percentage** (.718)... **Suárez** is trying the become the sixth Reds batter to lead the National League in HR, the first since **Foster** hit 40 HR in 1978...with a club record 52 HR in 1977, **Foster** is the last Reds batter to lead the Major Leagues in HR.

RUTHIAN: In the 8-5 win on 9/4 vs Phi, **Michael Lorenzen** joined **Babe Ruth** (6/13/1921 vs Det) as the only Major League players since 1900 to **earn the win, hit a home run and play the outfield** in the same game...entered in the seventh inning as the Reds' third pitcher of the game and suffered a blown save after **Jay Bruce** homered to tie the score at 5-5...in the bottom of the eighth hit his only HR of the season and seventh of his career, a 2-run HR off **Blake Parker** that extended the Reds' lead to 8-5...**played center field** in the top of the ninth.

2-WAY PLAYER: RHP **Michael Lorenzen** has appeared in **98** of the Reds' **150 games** (69g at P, 13g in CF, 8g in LF, 4g in RF, 13g as pinch runner, 5g as a pinch hitter)...he is a **career .239 hitter** (28-117) with 3 doubles, 1 triple, 7 HR, 23 RBI and a 7.50 OPS...**this season as a pinch hitter** is 1-5 with 1 RBI...in his **career as a pinch hitter** is 5-for-25 (.200, 7 RBI) with **3 HR**, on 4/6/17 off Phi's **Adam Morgan**, 6/24/18 off Chi's **Mike Montgomery** and 6/30/18 off Mil's **Jacob Barnes** (grand slam)...**9 times** in his career, including twice this season (4/9 vs Mia, 4/15 at LAD), he entered games as a pinch hitter and remained in that game to pitch...**6 times** in his career came off the bench to produce a home run, including 3 times as a reliever and 3 times as a pinch hitter...**Lorenzen** this year became the **first player in Reds history**, whose primary position is pitcher, to appear in **each of the first 6 games of a season**.

AND THIS ONE BELONGS....: Hall of Fame broadcaster **Marty Brennaman** is retiring after 46 seasons calling Reds games for **700 WLW Radio**...he joined the Reds radio team in **1974** and for **31 seasons** (1974-2004) shared the 700 WLW Radio booth with Reds Hall of Fame pitcher **Joe Nuxhall**, tying LA's **Vin Scully** and **Jerry Doggett** for the longest running broadcast duo in baseball history...**Brennaman** is only the eighth Major League Baseball broadcaster to work for the same team for at least 46 seasons, joining **Scully** (67 seasons, 1950-2016), **Ralph Kiner** of the Mets (52, 1962-2013), KC's **Denny Matthews** (51, 1969-2019), Mil's **Bob Uecker** (49, 1971-2019), **Jack Buck** (48, 1954-2001) & **Mike Shannon** (48, 1972-2019) of the Cardinals and LAD's **Jaime Jarrin** (47, 1973-2019).

150th CELEBRATION: During the 2019 season the Reds are celebrating the **150th anniversary** of professional baseball, which began with the formation of the **1869 Red Stockings**...this season, the team will wear **15 uniforms** from various periods throughout the team's history...**Sunday vs NYM** will wear replica uniforms of the **1999** team that **won 96 games** but lost a 1-game playoff to the Mets...already wore uniforms from **1902, 1911, 1912, 1919, 1935, 1936, 1939, 1956, 1961, 1967, 1969, 1976 1990** and **1995**.

Tonight's Pitcher - #54 Sonny Gray, RHP

RED HOTS

Sonny Gray is a **2019 National League All-Star**...ranks among the National League leaders in **ERA** (2.80, 5th), **strikeouts** (190, 11th) and **opponents' BA** (.198, 1st)...beginning 8/25/18 has made 31 consecutive starts allowing **6 hits or fewer**, tying **Nolan Ryan's** Major League record (5/1/91-6/1/92) and excluding "openers"...in Wed's 5-3 loss at Sea, didn't allow a hit until rookie **Kyle Lewis'** 3-run HR with 1 out in the bottom of the seventh gave the Mariners a 3-2 lead... was Lewis' second Major League hit, both homers vs the Reds...**Gray** is trying to become the first Reds pitcher to make at least 30 starts and post an ERA of 2.80 or lower since **Johnny Cueto** in **2014** (34gs, 2.25)...in his **last 14 starts** beginning **6/28** is **7-2, 1.75** (87.2ip, 17er) with **12 quality starts**, **5 times** was the victim of **blown saves** and since then ranks second among all Major League starting pitchers in **ERA** (StL's **Jack Flaherty**, 1.42)...in his 3-2 win on **8/20 vs SD**, **Josh Naylor's** solo HR with 2 outs in the top of the sixth inning snapped his career-high scoreless streak at **23 innings**...in his 3-0 win on 7/3 vs Mil, threw **8.0 shutout innings** and tied his career high with **12 strikeouts**...the **8.0 innings** tie for the most by a Reds pitcher in a game this season (**Trevor Bauer**, Sun at Ari), and his **12 strikeouts** were the most by a Reds pitcher this season until **Luis Castillo** had a career-high **13 strikeouts** on **8/5 vs LAA**...has 10 wins and 6 times was the victim of blown saves...began the season with 9 starts without a win, the longest such streak of his career to begin a season...was bothered in spring training by stiffness in his right elbow and made just 3 exhibition starts, but he started the Reds' second game of the season...hasn't missed a turn since.

RED HOTS

Tyler Mahle's last name rhymes with RALLY...at just 24 years old already is in his third Major League season...tomorrow will make his fourth start for the Reds since he was promoted on **9/1** as 1 of 5 September callups (3gs, 0-1, 6.43)...this season has left **12 runners on base**, and **10 scored**...in his **last 2 starts** allowed **8** of his **9 runs** via **home runs** (Ari's **Nick Ahmed** solo & **Ketel Marte** 3-run, Sea's **Dylan Moore** 2-run & **Omar Narváez**, 2-run)...from **7/22-8/21** was on the **10-day injured list** with a **left hamstring strain**...on **8/16** and **8/21** made rehab starts for Louisville before he was reinstated from the IL and optioned to Louisville on **8/22**...made 1 more start for the Bats before he was promoted on 9/1 to start the day game of the doubleheader at StL
