TONIGHT'S GAME: Is Game 2 (0-1) of a 3-game series of night games vs David Ross' Cubs and Game 7 (3-4) of the Redlegs' second consecutive 3-city, 10-day road trip...this jaunt began with an off day in Seattle and then a 2-1 series loss at T-Mobile Park in the fourth of the Redlegs' 4 scheduled visits to the West Coast ( $0-3$ at LAD \& $3-1$ at SD, $1-2$ at Oak \& 2-1 at SF, 0-2 at LAA, 1-2 at Sea), followed by the weekend's 2-1 series win at Ari's Chase Field...beginning Friday the Reds return to Great American Ball Park for their final homestand ( 3 g vs NYM, off day, 3 g vs Mil)...will finish the 2019 championship season with 3 games at Pit's PNC Park.

SERIES NOTES: The Reds are 9-8 vs Cubs this season and won or tied 4 of the previous 5 series...over the previous 4 seasons (2015-2018), the Cubs' .671 winning percentage vs the Reds ( $51-25$ ) was the best by any team against any division opponent...Joey Votto ranks third among all active players with $\mathbf{3 5}$ HR and 116 RBI against the Cubs, trailing in both categories only Albert Pujols (57-146) and Ryan Braun (39-137).

THE FRIENDLY CONFINES: The Reds and Cubs are meeting at Wrigley Field for the third of this season's 3 meetings...the Reds are 3-4 here this season but have lost 25 of the last 35 games played in The Friendly Confines...since a $4-1$ Reds win on $6 / 25 / 14$ and beginning $9 / 15 / 14$, the Cubs have won 23 of the last 27 night games at Wrigley Field between the teams...beginning $6 / 25 / 14$, Joey Votto had reached base safely in 41 straight games at Wrigley Field until he went 0-for-4 in his last appearance here, a 5-2 Cubs win on 7/17...his 41-game on-base streak was the longest by a visiting player at Wrigley Field since StL/LAD's Wally Moon reached in 47 consecutive apps here from 8/30/1957-9/15/1962...was the longest streak ever by a Reds player at Wrigley Field and the longest by any player since Chi's own Mark Grace reached safely in 45 straight games here from 9/28/1996-7/22/1997...Votto's 119 career hits here are the most by any active opposing player (119-367, .324, 16hr, 57rbi, .997ops).

FIRST WATCH: In the first inning, the Redlegs lead the Major Leagues in runs (120), HR (43, Major League record), RBI (117) and slugging percentage (.567)... have outscored opponents in the first frame, 120-79, and are 34-13 (.723) when leading after the first inning... 6 times this season scored at least 4 runs in the first inning...Eugenio Suárez' leads the Major Leagues w

ENO: 3B Eugenio Suárez is tied for the Major League lead with a career-high 47 HR, a modern franchise record for a third baseman and 1 shy of the National League record for HR in a season by a player at that position (48), shared by Phi's Mike Schmidt (1980) \& LAD's Adrián Beltré (2004)...Suárez' 47 HR are the most by a third baseman since NYY's Alex Rodriguez in 2007 established the Major League single-season record by hitting 52 of his 54 HR while playing third base... Suárez' 47 HR are the most by a Reds batter since George Foster established the single-season franchise record with 52 HR in 1977 ...since the All-Star break Suárez leads the Major Leagues with $\mathbf{2 7}$ HR, tying Ted Klusewski's 1954 club record for HR in the second half of a season, and in slugging percentage (.718)... Suárez is trying the become the sixth Reds batter to lead the National League in HR, the first since Foster hit 40 HR in 1978...with a club record 52 HR in 1977, Foster is the last Reds batter to lead the Major Leagues in HR.

RUTHIAN: In the $8-5$ win on $9 / 4$ vs Phi, Michael Lorenzen joined Babe Ruth ( $6 / 13 / 1921$ vs Det) as the only Major League players since 1900 to earn the win, hit a home run and play the outfield in the same game...entered in the seventh inning as the Reds' third pitcher of the game and suffered a blown save after Jay Bruce homered to tie the score at $5-5 \ldots$ in the bottom of the eighth hit his only HR of the season and seventh of his career, a 2-run HR off Blake Parker that extended the Reds' lead to 8-5...played center field in the top of the ninth.

2-WAY PLAYER: RHP Michael Lorenzen has appeared in 98 of the Reds' $\mathbf{1 5 0}$ games ( 69 g at $\mathrm{P}, 13 \mathrm{~g}$ in CF, 8 g in LF, $\mathbf{4 g}$ in RF, 13 g as pinch runner, 5 g as a pinch hitter)...he is a career .239 hitter (28-117) with 3 doubles, 1 triple, $7 \mathrm{HR}, 23 \mathrm{RBI}$ and a 7.50 OPS...this season as a pinch hitter is $1-5$ with 1 RBI...in his career as a pinch hitter is 5 -for- $25(.200,7$ RBI) with 3 HR, on 4/6/17 off Phi's Adam Morgan, 6/24/18 off Chi's Mike Montgomery and 6/30/18 off Mil's Jacob Barnes (grand slam)... 9 times in his career, including twice this season ( $4 / 9$ vs Mia, $4 / 15$ at LAD), he entered games as a pinch hitter and remained in that game to pitch... 6 times in his career came off the bench to produce a home run, including 3 times as a reliever and 3 times as a pinch hitter...Lorenzen this year became the first player in Reds history, whose primary position is pitcher, to appear in each of the first 6 games of a season.

AND THIS ONE BELONGS....: Hall of Fame broadcaster Marty Brennaman is retiring after 46 seasons calling Reds games for 700 WLW Radio...he joined the Reds radio team in 1974 and for 31 seasons (1974-2004) shared the 700 WLW Radio booth with Reds Hall of Fame pitcher Joe Nuxhall, tying LA's Vin Scully and Jerry Doggett for the longest running broadcast duo in baseball history...Brennaman is only the eighth Major League Baseball broadcaster to work for the same team for at least 46 seasons, joining Scully ( 67 seasons, 1950-2016), Ralph Kiner of the Mets (52, 1962-2013), KC's Denny Matthews (51, 1969-2019), Mil's Bob Uecker (49, 1971-2019), Jack Buck (48, 1954-2001) \& Mike Shannon (48, 1972-2019) of the Cardinals and LAD's Jaime Jarrín (47, 1973-2019).

150th CELEBRATION: During the 2019 season the Reds are celebrating the 150th anniversary of professional baseball, which began with the formation of the 1869 Red Stockings...this season the team will wear 15 uniforms from various periods throughout the team's history...Sunday vs NYM will wear replica uniforms of the 1999 team that won 96 games but lost a 1-game playoff to the Mets...already wore uniforms from 1902, 1911, 1912, 1919 1935, 1936, 1939, 1956, 1961, 1967, 1969, 19761990 and 1995

## RED HOTS

Sonny Gray is a 2019 National League All-Star...ranks among the National League leaders in ERA (2.80, 5th), strikeouts (190, 11th) and opponents' BA (.198, 1st)...beginning 8/25/18 has made 31 consecutive starts allowing 6 hits or fewer, tying Nolan Ryan's Major League record (5/1/91-6/1/92) and excluding "openers"...in Wed's $5-3$ loss at Sea, didn't allow a hit until rookie Kyle Lewis' 3 -run HR with 1 out in the bottom of the seventh gave the Mariners a 3-2 lead... was Lewis' second Major League hit, both homers vs the Reds...Gray is trying to become the first Reds pitcher to make at least 30 starts and post an ERA of 2.80 or lower since Johnny Cueto in 2014 ( $34 \mathrm{gs}, 2.25$ )...in his last 14 starts beginning $\mathbf{6 / 2 8}$ is $\mathbf{7 - 2 , 1 . 7 5}$ (87.2ip, 17er) with 12 quality starts, $\mathbf{5}$ times was the victim of blown saves and since then ranks second among all Major League starting pitchers in ERA (StL's Jack Flaherty, 1.42)...in his 3-2 win on 8/20 vs SD, Josh Naylor's solo HR with 2 outs in the top of the sixth inning snapped his career-high scoreless streak at 23 innings...in his $3-0$ win on $7 / 3$ vs Mil, threw 8.0 shutout innings and tied his career high with 12 strikeouts...the 8.0 innings tie for the most by a Reds pitcher in a game this season (Trevor Bauer, Sun at Ari), and his 12 strikeouts were the most by a Reds pitcher this season until Luis Castillo had a career-high 13 strikeouts on $8 / 5$ vs LAA...has 10 wins and 6 times was the victim of blown saves...began the season with 9 starts without a win, the longest such streak of his career to begin a season...was bothered in spring training by stiffness in his right elbow and made just 3 exhibition starts, but he started the Reds' second game of the season... hasn't missed a turn since.

From 9/2-9/4 missed 3 starts with a bruised left hand suffered on $9 / 1$ at StL when he was hit by a Daniel Ponce de Leon pitch...returned to the starting lineup on 9/5 vs Phi and in 11 apps since then is hitting .375 with two 2 -hit games and three 3 -hit games ( $15-40,1$ 2b, 1 3b, 7 hr , $13 \mathrm{rbi}, .975 \mathrm{slg}$, 479 obp ).
