- A.** Nicknamed "The Big Bopper," he led the Reds in HRs in three different seasons and hit 147 longballs in his Cincinnati career.
- B.** He led the National League in fielding percentage three separate times and hit .357 in the 1976 World Series sweep of the New York Yankees.
- C.** A 12-time All-Star, nine-time Silver Slugger, three-time Gold Glove and 1995 National League MVP, he played all 19 of his Major League seasons in a Reds uniform.
- D.** From 1967-68, this pitcher compiled 35 wins, including 23 complete games.
- E.** A 12-time All-Star, two-time MVP and 1966 Triple Crown winner, his 324 HRs as a Red rank second all-time in franchise history.
- F.** This sweet-swinging slugger is a Cincinnati native and his 210 HRs as a Red rank seventh on the club's all-time list.
- G.** This 10-time All-Star, five-time Gold Glove winner and two-time MVP is the Reds' all-time leader in stolen bases with 406.
- H.** In his 10 Reds seasons, he hit .300 and averaged 20 HRs and 84 RBIs each year.
- I.** "The Cobra" won two Silver Sluggers and made two All-Star teams in his four years as a Red, averaging 27 HRs and 108 RBIs during that time.
- J.** This three-time Gold Glove, two-time Silver Slugger and two-time All-Star recorded the first 30 home run/30 stolen base season in Reds history.
- K.** A three-time All-Star, he was a member of the Big Red Machine and hit .305 and .336 in the 1975 and 1976 world championship seasons.
- L.** In his MVP season of 1977, he hit a Reds-record 52 HRs and drove in 149 runs.
