TONIGHT'S GAME: Is Game $2(0-1)$ of a 3 -game series vs Mike Vassallo's Brewers and Game 5 (1-3) of a 6-game final homestand that included a 2-1 series loss to the Mets....beginning Friday night at PNC Park, the Reds will finish the 2019 championship season with 3 games vs the Pirates.

FINAL GOODBYES: As part of the month-long series of special events celebrating the 46 -season career of Hall of Fame broadcaster Marty Brennaman, tonight's game will be broadcast on 700 WLW Radio by Marty and son Thom from behind Section 119...Marty will broadcast his final game tomorrow afternoon from the press box level radio booth alongside his partner of 13 seasons, Jeff Brantley

SERIES NOTES: The Reds went 2-1-2 in the first 5 series vs Mil and won each of the previous 2 series ( $0-3,1-1,2-2,3-1,2-1$ )...haven't won 3 series in a season vs the Brewers since 2016 (4-1-1)...the 5-4 loss on 7/24 at Miller Park snapped the Reds' 5 -game winning streak vs the Brewers, their longest since $9 / 27 / 12-6 / 14 / 13$ and their longest in a single season since they won 7 straight from 7/27-9/21, 2010...the Reds' $3-1$ series win at Great American Ball Park from 7/1-7/4 was their first series win vs Mil since 9/4-9/6, 2017 (3-0 at GABP) and their first 4-game series win vs Mil since 4/30-4/23, 2015 (3-1 at Miller Park).

PIRATES UP NEXT: The Reds have lost 10 straight games at PNC Park dating back to an $8-6$ win on $6 / 17 / 18$, including this season's 7 -game losing streak, and are 2-15 there over the last 2 seasons...the current losing streaks are the Reds' longest overall and single-season losing streaks at PNC Parkk...from 4/4-4/7 the Pirates swept a 4-game series from the Reds for the first time since 7/11-7/14, 1991 at Riverfront Stadium and did it in Pittsburgh for the first time since 8/22-8/24, 1969 at Forbes Field

FIRST WATCH: In the first inning, the Redlegs lead the Major Leagues in runs (128), HR (44, Major League record), RBI (125) and slugging percentage (.570) and lead the National League in on-base percentage (.366)...have
 outscored opponents in the first frame, 128-84, and are 36-14 (.720) whe first inning. Eugenio Suárez' leads the Major Leagues with 14 HR in the first inning, a franchise record, while José Iglesias leads the National League in first-inning batting Leagues with 14 HR in the first inning, a franchise record, while José Iglesias lead
average (.464), on-base percentage (.483) and slugging percentage (.786)

GENO: 3B Eugenio Suárez ranks second in the Major Leagues with a career-high 48 HR, a record for a player from Venezuela, a modern franchise record for a third baseman and tied for the National League record for HR in a season by a player at that position....he shares the NL record for homers by third basemen with Phi's Mike Schmidt (1980) \& LAD's Adrián Beltré (2004)...Suárez' 48 HR are the most by a third baseman since NYY's Alex Rodriguez in 2007 established the Major League single-season record by hitting 52 of his 54 HR while playing third base...Suárez' 48 HR are the most by a Reds batter since George Foster established the single-season franchise record with 52 HR in 1977...since the All-Star break Suárez leads the Major Leagues with $\mathbf{2 8}$ HR, a new club record for HR in the second half of a season (27, Ted Kluszewski, 1954), and leads the National League in slugging percentage (.688)...Suárez is trying the become the sixth Reds batter to lead the National League in HR, the first since Foster hit 40 HR in 1978... with a club record 52 HR in 1977, Foster is the last Reds batter to lead the Major Leagues in HR.

RUTHIAN: In the $8-5$ win on $9 / 4$ vs Phi, Michael Lorenzen joined Babe Ruth ( $6 / 13 / 1921$ vs Det) as the only Major League players since 1900 to earn the win, hit a home run and play the outfield in the same game...entered in the seventh inning as the Reds' third pitcher of the game and suffered a blown save after Jay Bruce homered to tie the score at $5-5$... in the bottom of the eighth hit his only HR of the season and seventh of his career, a 2 -run HR off Blake Parker that extended the Reds' lead to $8-5$...played center field in the top of the ninth.
 RF, 13 g as pinch runner, 5 g as a pinch hitter)...in 4 of the last 9 games was the Reds' starting center fielder...he is a career .236 hitter (29-123) with 3 doubles, 1 triple, 7 HR, 23 RBI, 5 stolen bases and a . 730 OPS...this season as a pinch hitter is $1-5$ with 1 RBI...in his career as a pinch hitter is 5 -for-25 (.200, 7 RBI) with 3 HR, on 4/6/17 off Phi's Adam Morgan, 6/24/18 off Chi's Mike Montgomery and 6/30/18 off Mil's Jacob Barnes (grand slam)... 9 times in his career, including twice this season ( $4 / 9$ vs Mia, 4/15 at LAD), he entered games as a pinch hitter and remained in that game to pitch... 6 times in his career came off the bench to produce a home run, including 3 times as a reliever and 3 times as a pinch hitter...Lorenzen this year became the first player in Reds history, whose primary position is pitcher, to appear in each of the first 6 games of a season (PR/CF, P, PR, P, PR, P)...is the first Reds player with as many as 406.2 career innings pitched to play center field since Hal Jeffcoat (474.1ip) in 1958...Ron Mahay was the last Major League pitcher with at least 400 innings also to play CF at some point in his career...Mahay played in 5 g in CF for the Red Sox in 1995 and then pitched his 400th inning in 2007 for the Braves.

AND THIS ONE BELONGS....: Hall of Fame broadcaster Marty Brennaman is retiring after 46 seasons calling Reds games for 700 WLW Radio...he joined the Reds radio team in 1974 and for 31 seasons (1974-2004) shared the 700 WLW Radio booth with Reds Hall of Fame pitcher Joe Nuxhall, tying LA's Vin Scully and Jerry Doggett for the longest running broadcast duo in baseball history...Brennaman is only the eighth Major League Basebal broadcaster to work for the same team for at least 46 seasons, joining Scully (67 seasons, 1950-2016), Ralph Kiner of the Mets (52, 1962-2013), KC's Denny Matthews (51, 1969-2019), Mil's Bob Uecker (49, 1971-2019), Jack Buck (48, 1954-2001) \& Mike Shannon (48, 1972-2019) of the Cardinals and LAD's Jaime Jarrín (47, 1973-2019)

## RED HOTS

Tyler Mahle's last name rhymes with RALLY...at just 24 years old already is in his third Major League season...tonight is making his fifrth start for the Reds since he was promoted on $9 / 1$ as 1 of 5 September callups ( $4 \mathrm{gs}, 0-1,4.95$ )...this season has left 12 runners on base, and 10 scored...in his last 3 starts allowed 8 of his 10 runs via home runs (Ari's Nick Ahmed solo \& Ketel Marte 3-run, Sea's Dylan Moore 2-run \& Omar Narváez, 2-run)...from 7/22-8/21 was on the 10day injured list with a left hamstring strain...on $8 / 16$ and $8 / 21$ made rehab starts for Louisville before he was reinstated from the IL and optioned to Louisville on 8/22...made 1 more start for the Bats before he was promoted on $9 / 1$ to start the day game of the doubleheader at StL...in consecutive starts on $5 / \mathbf{2}$ and $\mathbf{5 / 7}$, suffered the $1-0$ loss at NYM in which Noah Syndergaard became just the seventh pitcher in Major League history to homer in a 1-0 complete game and then 2-0 loss at Oak in which Mike Fiers threw his second career no-hitter...in those 2 games, Reds batters combined to go 4-for-57 (.070)...made his second straight Opening Day roster...started the Reds' sixth game of the season.

## Tomorrow's Pitcher - \#58 Luis Castillo, RHP

## RED HOTS

Luis Castillo in his third Major League season at just 26 years old, was the Reds' Opening Day starter and is a 2019 National League All-Star...per Baseball America, his changeup was voted by managers, scouts and executives the best in the National League...tomorrow afternoon will make his team-high 32nd start, a new career high...already has established new career highs in wins, innings pitched and strikeouts...is the first Reds pitcher with 15 wins in a season since Johnny Cueto (20-9) and Alfredo Simon (15-10) each did it in 2014...in the second inning on 9/7 vs Ari recorded his 200th strikeout of the season (Josh Rojas)...in his last 36 apps beginning $9 / 1 / 18$ is $18-8$ and in that span ranks fourth among all Major League starting pitchers with an ERA of 2.92 (Justin Verlander 2.34, Jacob deGrom 2.41, Gerrit Cole 2.58)...this season ranks among the National League leaders in wins (T4th), ERA (9th), strikeouts (9th), strikeouts per 9 innings (7th, 10.57) and opponents' BA (3rd, .200)...in his career has allowed 13 HR in the first inning, his highest total in any inning and including $\mathbf{3}$ HR in the first frame this year...in his $7-4$ win on $8 / 5$ vs LAA, his career-high 13 strikeouts are the most by a Reds pitcher since Raisel Iglesias had 13 strikeouts on $8 / 23 / 15$ vs Ari...produced 8 starts in which he threw at least 5.0 innings while allowing 2 hits or fewer and 2 runs or fewer, a single-season franchise record...was the National League's Pitcher of the Month for March/April (7gs, 3-1, 1.45)...since his Major League debut in 2017, leads the Reds' pitching staff in almost every statistical category, including wins, starts, innings pitched and strikeouts.

Is trying to become the fourth Reds player to produce 20 HR after July 31 (Greg Vaughn, 20 in 1999; George Foster, 20 in 1977; Frank Robinson, 20 in 1962; Ted Kluszewski, 21 in 1956).
Produced an RBI in each of his last 4 apps (4rbi) and in 5 of his last 6 apps ( 6 rbi ). Beginning 5/8 made his last 101 starts batting second in the order...made 15 starts this season batting leadoff (last, 5/7 at Oak)...entered this year with 1 career start batting leadoff ( $6 / 18 / 08$ vs LAD).
For the fifth straight season, per Baseball America was voted by managers, scouts and executives the batter with the best strike zone judgment in the National League.
