QUERIES ABOUT SERIES

Beginning **7/22**, the Reds are **20-20** and went **6-3-3** in the **12 series**...despite the **20-20 record** have lost **3.5 games** in the **NL Central standings** (-9.0 to season-high -12.5)...began this stretch **4-0-2 in 6 series**, the Reds' longest **series streak** of 2019 without a loss.

FIRST WATCH

In the first inning, the Redlegs lead the Major Leagues in **runs** (115), **HR** (42), **RBI** (112), **batting average** (.304) and **slugging percentage** (.589) while ranking third in the majors in **on-base percentage** (.364)...have outscored opponents in the first frame, **115-76**, and are **32-11** (.744) when leading after the first inning...**6 times** this season scored at **least 4 runs** in the first inning.

TODAY'S GAME: Is **Game 1** of a 4-game series vs **Jay Bruce's Phillies** and **Game 1** of a 7-game homestand that includes an upcoming weekend series vs the **Diamondbacks** (3g)...the Redlegs are coming off their longest road trip of the season (4-7)...that **3-city, 10-day, 11-game** road trip began with a **3-0 series sweep loss** at Pit's **PNC Park**, was followed by a **3-1 series win** at Mia's **Marlins Park** and concluded with consecutive day/night doubleheaders and a **3-1 series loss** at StL's **Busch Stadium**...Saturday, the Redlegs **were swept in a doubleheader** (10-6, 3-2 walkoff loss) for the first time since since **9/17/16 vs Pit**...yesterday's doubleheader split (4-3 walkoff loss, 5-3 win) prevented the Reds from losing **4 games in 2 days** for the first time since **doubleheader sweep losses** on **7/19-7/20, 1955 at Phi** (7-3, 6-2 & 6-0, 4-2 losses).

DOUBLE DIPPING: Over the weekend at StL's **Busch Stadium**, the Reds played consecutive doubleheaders for the first time since **7/29 & 7/31, 1973** and played doubleheaders on consecutive days for the first time since **9/10 & 9/11, 1968**...were **swept Saturday** (10-6, 3-2 losses), their first **doubleheader sweep loss** since **9/17/16 vs Pit**, but **split yesterday** (4-3 loss, 5-3 win)...were the Redlegs' second and third doubleheaders of the season...on **Memorial Day** at **Great American Ball Park** earned a split with the **Pirates** (8-5 loss, 8-1 win)...in their **18 day/night doubleheaders** since **1997**, the Reds went **2-7** with **9 splits**.

SERIES NOTES: The Phillies earned a **2-1 series win in June** at **Citizens Bank Park**, where the Reds are **2-12-2 in 16 series**...last season, from **4/9-4/11** at **Citizens Bank Park** the Reds were swept in a 3-game series in **Philadelphia** for the first time since **4/12-4/14, 1993**, while from **7/26-7/29** at **Great American Ball Park** the Reds won a **4-game series vs Phi** (3-1) for the first time since **9/12-9/14, 1997**.

WE MEET AGAIN: During his time in Cincinnati (**5/27/08 - 7/31/16**), among all Reds players **Jay Bruce** ranked **first** in games, HR, RBI, extra-base hits and triples; ranked **second** in doubles, slugging percentage, walks, total bases and runs; and ranked **third** in hits, game-winning RBI and times on base...was selected by the Reds in the first round (12th overall) of the **June 2005** first-year player draft out of **West Brook High School in Beaumont, Texas**...in 8 career apps vs his former team, including 5 games as a Met and 3 games as a Phillie, **Bruce** is 5-for-28 (.179, 2hr, 6rbi)...2018 Most Outstanding Pitcher **Jared Hughes** became the first Reds pitcher to produce an **ERA below 2.00** while making **more than 70 apps**.

DIAMONDBACKS UP NEXT: From **8/10-8/12** of last season the Reds won a series vs the Diamondbacks at **Great American Ball Park** (2-1) for the first time since a **2-1 series win** here from **7/22-7/24, 2016**...the Reds have won **6 of the last 11 games vs Ari**...the Reds are **38-30** at **Chase Field**, including **21-13** there the last 10 seasons...are **32-18** with the roof closed and **6-12** with the roof open...Cin won its first 7g at **Bank One Ballpark** until a 9-6 loss on **7/1/00**.

PLAYER & ROOKIE OF THE MONTH: In **August**, rookie **Aristides Aquino** led all Major League batters in **HR** (14) and **RBI** (33) and led the National League while ranking second in the majors in **slugging percentage** (.767, Bos' **J.D. Martinez** .768)...also ranked among the NL leaders last month in **extra-base hits** (18, T3rd), **on-base percentage** (.391, T16th) and **batting average** (.320, 20th)...established a new **National League record for HR by a rookie in a calendar month** and tied the **franchise record for HR by any player in any calendar month** (**Frank Robinson**, August 1962 & **Greg Vaughn**, September 1999)...was **National League Player of the Week for 8/5-8/11**...Wed at Mia he became the first player in **Major League history**, since 1900, to produce **13 HR** in his first **100 career plate apps**...Thu at Mia, he hit his **14th HR** in his **104th career plate appearance**...his **33 RBI** are second-most ever by a Reds batter in August (**Frank Robinson**, 34 RBI, August 1962) and the most by a Reds batter in any month since **Jay Bruce** had **33 RBI** in **May 2011**...the club record for RBI in any calendar month remains **45**, held by **Gus Bell** (**June 1953**).

PITCHER OF THE MONTH: In **August**, RHP **Sonny Gray** ranked T2nd the National League lead in **wins** (4-0) and ranked among the NL leaders in **ERA** (0.74, 2nd), **strikeouts** (44 in 36.2ip, 5th) and **strikeouts per 9 innings** (10.80, 12th)...is **1 of only 7 pitchers** in the Major Leagues with as many as **4 wins** this month **without a loss**.

THE PUNISHER: Rookie **Aristides Aquino** has produced **14 HR** in his **first 32 career games** and **121 plate apps**, including a **3-homer game on 8/10 vs Cubs** in which he homered in **3 consecutive innings** (2nd, 3rd, 4th)...he played 1 game for the Reds last season.

- In the first inning Wed at Mia off **Sandy Alcantara** hit his **13 HR** in his **100th career plate appearance**...is the only player in modern Major League history with **13 HR** in his first **100 career plate apps** and the only player with **14 HR** in his first **108 career plate apps**...Phi's **Rhys Hoskins** holds the record for **fewest plate apps to 15 HR** (135)...**Hoskins** (98th player) and LAD's **Will Smith** (100th PA) are the only other players, since 1900, to produce as many as **12 HR** in their first **100 career plate apps**.
- Established modern **Major League records for home runs** in a player's **first 12 career games** (8), **first 14 career games** (9), **first 16 career games** (10), **first 17 career games** (11), **first 22 career games** (12), **first 27 career games** (13) and **first 28 career games** (14)...**Rhys Hoskins** holds the Major League record since 1900 for **fewest career games to 15 HR** and **16 HR** (32).
- With **14 HR in August** has established a new **National League record for home runs by a rookie** in a **calendar month**...Det's **Rudy York** holds the Major League record for **HR by a rookie in a calendar month with 18 HR in August 1937**...**Aquino** shares with **Frank Robinson** (**August 1962**) and **Greg Vaughn** (**September 1999**) the franchise record for **HR by any player in any calendar month**.

Today's Pitcher - #28 Anthony DeSclafani, RHP

RED HOTS

Anthony DeSclafani's last name is pronounced DEE-sclafani...in his **last 3 starts** is **2-0, 1.00** (18ip, 2er)...has allowed **3 leadoff HR** (Pit's **Adam Frazier**, Chi's **Kyle Schwarber**, Cle's **Francisco Lindor**)...in the 7-5 loss on 6/23 at Mil, became the second Major League pitcher this season to record **9 strikeouts** through the first **3 innings** of a game (Mil's **Corbin Burnes**, 3/31 vs StL) and the only Reds pitcher to do it since at least the 1920s, since such research is available...retired his first 6 batters via strikeout, tying the **franchise record** for strikeouts to begin a game (**Robert Stephenson**, 8/25/17 vs Pit)...that streak was snapped by **Travis Shaw's** HR leading off the third inning...missed the entire 2017 season with a **sprained ulnar collateral ligament** in his right elbow and the first 2 months of the 2018 campaign with a left oblique strain suffered in his third spring training appearance...in 47 starts since he returned from those injuries is 16-15, 4.45.

Alex Wood tomorrow will make his eighth appearance of the season...in Thu's 12-inning, 4-3 loss at Mia allowed all 3 runs on solo HR, to **Jon Berti** leading off the first inning, to **Austin Dean** with 1 out in the fifth and to **Starlin Castro** with 1 out in the sixth...the Marlins won it in the 12th inning on **Harold Ramirez'** leadoff HR off **Raisel Iglesias**...began this season on the Reds' injured list because of a **lower back injury**, including a stint on the **60-day IL** beginning **5/31**...made 1 start for the Reds in spring training, on **2/25 at Sea** (1ip, 2h, 3er, 1bb, 0k, 1hr)...from **7/6-7/22** went **1-1, 3.18** in **4 rehab starts** for Class AAA Louisville (3gs) and Class AA Chattanooga (1gs)...in December was acquired from the Dodgers, along with **C/IF Kyle Farmer**, **OF Matt Kemp**, **OF Yasiel Puig** and **cash**, for **RHP Homer Bailey**, **IF Jeter Downs** and **RHP Josiah Gray**.

 - Is 1 of 5 Major League players with 40 HR (Mike Trout 43, Cody Bellinger 43, Pete Alonso 43, Christian Yelich 42)...Suárez homered in 5 of his last 7 apps.
 - Since the All-Star break leads the Major Leagues in HR (20) while ranking second in the National League in slugging percentage (.659, Anthony Rendon .683).
 - In the first inning, leads all Major League batters in HR (14, club record) and ranks among the NL leaders in RBI (26, 2nd), slugging (.741, 2nd) and hitting (.339, 11th).

- 17 JOSH VANMETER, inf/of** **Trip: 10gs in LF, 5-36 (.139), 1 2b, 1 3b, 2hr, 4rbi**
