METSELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Phillies, 5-3, yesterday...The Mets have dropped three straight, six of their last seven games and eight of their last 10...The Mets are the only team in the majors that has not lost four straight games this year... The Mets are 9-14 since the All-Star break...The Mets are currently in the midst of a seven-game road trip (1-5) against Miami (1-3) and Philadelphia (0-2)...The team is off on Monday before they start a six-game homestand against the Nationals (three games) and Dodgers (three games).

BACK-TO-BACK-TO-BACK: Michael Conforto, Jonathan Villar and James McCann hit three consecutive home runs in the ninth inning yesterday...It marked the first time the team accomplished that feat since Carlos Delgado, David Wright and Paul Lo Duca did so on June 7, 2007, also against Philadelphia, off of Cole Hamels in the sixth inning...It was the eighth time in team history that the Mets hit back-to-back-to-back blasts...It was the first time the team did it on the road since May 1, 1988 at Cincinnati when Tim Lincecum, Keith Hernandez and Darryl Strawberry hit three in a row.

THE NL EAST: New York is 22-26 against the NL East this season, posting a 3.67 ERA (164 earned runs/402.1 innings) in those games...The Mets are batting .230/.308/.366 in 48 games against the division this season.

PHILLY: The Mets have lost three straight to the Phillies and dropped four of their last five...New York is looking to avoid its first three-game sweep vs. Philadelphia since August 14-16, 2020 at Citizens Bank Park.

DAY MAN: The Mets are 20-16 in day games this season...The team has posted a 3.71 ERA (125 earned runs/303.0 innings) with 106 walks and 293 strikeouts during the daytime in 2021...The Mets own a .565 winning percentage during the daytime this season, which is ninth in the majors and fifth in the National League.

AW SNAP: Dominic Smith had his hitting streak snapped at nine games...He batted .343 (12-35) with a run, a double, five RBI and a walk in that span...It was the third-longest hitting streak of his career...He had a 10-game streak from August 12-25, 2020 and a career-best 11-game streak from September 4-17, 2020...Since the start of July, Smith is batting .281 (32-114) with 15 runs, five doubles, five home runs, 20 RBI, eight walks, a .331 OBP, a .456 SLG and a .787 OPS.

THE PEN IS MIGHTIER: Since the All-Star break, the Mets bullpen is 7-4 with a 3.86 ERA (41 earned runs/95.2 innings) with 34 walks and 109 strikeouts...The team's 109 strikeouts is the most in the majors in that span, while their seven wins trail only the Giants (nine) as well as the Phillies, Tigers, Yankees, and Rays, who each have eight... Overall, the Mets bullpen is 32-18 this season with a 4.01 ERA (1177 earned runs/397.0 innings) with 166 walks and 440 strikeouts...Their 32 wins are third in the majors and second in the NL...Only the Padres (34) have more in the NL.

THE LEFTOVERS: The Mets left nine men on base yesterday...In six games on this trip, the team has stranded 58 runners...Since the All-Star break, the Mets have left 172 runners on base, tied for the most in the majors...The Mets are batting .235/.320/.393 with runners on base this year...Their .235 average ranks 27th in the majors and 14th in the NL...The team is batting .211/.316/.316 with the bases loaded this season...Their .211 average is tied for 25th in the majors and is 13th in the Senior Circuit...The team's .316 OBP with the bags full is 10th in the NL and 20th overall.

RISPY BUSINESS: The Mets are batting .161 (9-56) with two doubles and nine RBI with runners in scoring position in six games on their current road trip...The team is batting .246/.340/.373 with runners in scoring position overall this year...Their .246 average is 19th in the majors, while their .340 OBP is 13th...The Mets have the fewest RBI (254) with RISP in the majors.

TAKE IT TO THE BANK: Michael Conforto is a lifetime .282/.356/.574 hitter with 12 doubles, 15 home runs and 42 RBI in 52 career games at Citizens Bank Park...His 15 home runs in Philly are his highest total in any ballpark other than Citi Field...Jeff McNeil has slashed .347/.413/.480 with 10 extra-base hits in 28 games at Citizens Bank Park... Javier Báez owns a .333 (20-60) batting average with four extra-base hits and a .483 SLG in 16 games at the ballpark...Dominic Smith is a .320/.376/.620 hitter with 15 extra-base hits and 15 RBI in 31 games at the Bank.

JEFF McHITS: Jeff McNeil is batting .323 (32-99) with 14 runs, eight doubles, three home runs, 15 RBI, nine walks, a .391 OBP and a .495 SLG in 30 games since the start of July...After batting .196/.397/.339 in 20 games in the first month of the season, McNeil is batting .295/.367/.420 with 23 runs, 10 doubles, four home runs, 20 RBI and a .788 OPS in 53 games since the start of May.

THREW ME FOR A LOUP: In 28 games since May 22, Aaron Loup has allowed only one run, posting a 0.35 ERA (one earned run/25.2 innings) with five walks and 29 strikeouts in that span...Overall in 43 games this year, Loup is 3-0 with a 1.22 ERA (five earned runs/37.0 innings) with seven walks and 42 strikeouts...He is holding left-handed hitters to a .175 (10-57) batting average this season...He has yet to surrender an extra-base hit to a lefty in 2021.

FOUR SCORE AND 44 WINS AGO: The Mets are 44-10 when scoring four or more runs this season...The team is 12-44 when scoring three or fewer runs...The Mets are 44-14 when scoring first this season...The team's .759 winning percentage is the second-best record in the major leagues when scoring first this season.

PHILLIES-METS NOTES: The Mets own an 86-77 record at Citizen Bank Park...The team has hit .266/.332/.449 with 227 home runs since the ballpark opened in 2004.

THE FAST AND THE DRURYOUS: Since he was recalled on July 24, Brandon Drury is 13-25 (.520) with five runs, five doubles, two home runs, seven RBI, a walk, a .556 OBP and a .960 SLG...He leads the majors leagues with a .450 (9-20) average as a pinch-hitter this season...In 21 pinch-hit appearances this year, he has hit three doubles, three homers, eight RBI and drawn a walk...His three pinch-hit homers are the second-most in the majors...He is the first Met with at least three pinch-hit homers in a season since Kelly Johnson (four, 2016) and his three pinch-hit HR are tied for the fifth-most in a season in Mets history.

REPLACE-METS: Entering today, the Mets have used 58 players through 110 games this season...That is a franchise record for most players used in a season, surpassing the 56 used by the 2018 Mets...The MLB record for players used in a season is 67 by the 2019 Mariners...Carlos Carrasco became the 17th pitcher to start a game for the Mets...That is the second most starters the team has used in a season in team history... The team used 16 starters in 1964-66 and used a franchise-record 20 in 1967...The Mets enter the day leading the majors for the most starters used this season at 17.

ROAD SHOW: J.D. Davis is batting .340/.470/.585 in 21 games on the road this season...Alonso has hit .266/.350/.558 with 17 home runs and 41 RBI away from Citi Field...This compares to a .225/.315/.394 in 47 games at home...Alonso's 17 road home runs are lead the major leagues...Dominic Smith is batting .288/.347/.471 with 19 extra-base hits and 25 RBI in 55 games outside of Queens this season...This compares to a .220/.290/.293 slash line in 50 games at home.

MOVIN' ON UP: Michael Conforto has hit 125 home runs, surpassing Todd Hundley for eighth on the team's all-time home run list...He is now tied with Lucas Duda for seventh with 125 blasts...Carlos Beltrán is next with 149 home runs as a Met...Pete Alonso has tied Cleon Jones for 19th on the team's all-time home run list with 93 blasts...John Milner is next with 94...14 players have hit 100 or more home runs with the franchise...Alonso's 93 home runs are the most in the majors since he entered the league in 2019.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets are 23-34 with a 4.41 ERA (232 earned runs/473.1 innings) with 154 walks and 500 strikeouts on the road this year...This compares to a 33-20 record with a 2.95 ERA (149 earned runs/455.0 innings) with 164 walks and 494 strikeouts at home...The team's 2.95 ERA at home is the second-best in the majors and their .623 winning percentage is the fifth-best.

TO THE LEFT, TO THE LEFT: Brandon Nimmo is batting .347 (17-49) with three extra-base hits and a .475 OBP against left-handed pitchers this year...That average ranks second in the majors (min. 50 PA) among lefty hitters...Dominic Smith ranks fourth, batting .327 (33-101) with eight extra-base hits and a .381 OBP...As a team, the Mets are batting .242/.325/.387 vs. southpaws...This compares to a .231/.310/.381 slash line against righties.

IN A PINCH: The Mets pinch-hitters are batting .255/.328/.466 with 13 doubles, seven home runs, 35 RBI and 15 walks...Their .255 batting average is the fourth-best in the majors and the second-best in the NL...Their .794 pinch-hit OPS is the best in the NL and is third in the majors...The team's seven pinch-hit home runs is tied for the third-most in the majors.

36 DAYS OF NO. 36: There are 20 days until the Mets retire Jerry Koosman's number 36 in a pregame ceremony on August 28...In honor of the event, the team is on a 36-day countdown noting the most memorable moments of his historic career...On this day in 1969, Koos tossed a complete game as the Mets defeated the Braves, 4-1, at Atlanta Stadium...He allowed one run on seven hits with three walks and struck out five as he improved to 9-7 on the season...Koos was one out away from a complete game shutout until Bob Tillman hit a solo home run...The Mets collected 10 hits in the win including two from Tommie Agee as he went 2-4 with a run...For cool photos and interactive history information on the Mets, please visit the Mets Virtual Vault at metsheritage.com.

WALKER NEWS & NOTES

LAST OUTING: In his last start, Walker and the Amazins faced a division rival, the Miami Marlins...The Marlin defeated the Mets 5-3 in this affair...Walker pitched five and two-thirds innings, surrendered eight hits, two long balls and let up four runs, earned...He had four punch outs and two free passes on 93 pitches thrown...The last time he threw over 93 pitches in any outing was over a month ago against his crosstown rival, the Yankees.

EXTRA-ORDINARY: Walker has surrendered just 29 extra base hits to 390 batters faced in his 105.0 innings pitched this season...Only ten pitchers in the NL have allowed fewer XBH (min. 80.0 innings)...Walker also has three pickoffs in his 20 outings this season, which is third in the NL.

FAST AND FURIOUS: The four-seam fastball is Walker's most utilized pitch in his arsenal this season...He is throwing the four-seamer about 32.5% of the time, averaging at 94.4 MPH...Opponents are batting a combined .200 and slugging .357 against Walker's heater...The pitch has produced 51 punchouts over the course of the 2021 season...Walker is generating a 27.5% whiff rate and a 25.6% put away rate on the four seamer.

HIT ME WITH YOUR BEST SHOT: In 15 career starts against the Mets' NL East rivals, Walker has a 3.50 ERA (31 earned runs/79.2 innings)...He has struck out 81 batters and allowed 26 free passes...Five of those starts were quality starts... This season, the Amazin's are 7-3 against NL East opponents when Walker takes the mound.

VS. PHILLY: Has made four career appearances against the Phillies, three of which have come this season with the Mets...Walker's teams are undefeated against Philadelphia, and the Mets are 3-0 when Walker takes the mound against Philadelphia this season, with all three wins coming in one-run affairs... In his last outing vs. the Phils, June 25 at Citi Field, Walker pitched 5.0 innings, and let up one earned run.

LEFT HANDS FREE: Walker is holding left handed batters to a .191 BAA (31-162), which ranks eighth in the majors (min. 150 LHB faced) this season...He has only surrendered four homers in those 162 at bats...Over the course of his career Walker owns a .233 (298-1279) BAA against lefties.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Amazins are 6-4 in Walker's outings on the road... Walker has a 3-4 record and owns a 4.53 ERA (25 earned runs/49.2 innings) on the road in 2021...Opponents have hit .244 (47-193) off Walker on the road.

LOOK OUT FOR THE LONG BALL: Walker has allowed seven home runs in his last three starts after allowing six in his first 16 starts combined...This is the first time in his career that Walker has allowed multiple homers in three straight starts.

LIFE ON THE ROAD: Has a lifetime 23-22 record with a 3.78 ERA (148 earned runs/352.0 innings) in 67 road outings (65 starts)...Last season, his record was 1-2 with a 3.57 ERA (nine earned runs/22.2 innings) in five starts on the road... He struck out 20 and walked only five across those five outings.

WALKER THE PURPLE CARPET: Walker made his first career All-Star roster... He appeared in the Midsummer Classic at Coors Field, tossing one inning...He allowed a solo homer to Mike Zunino and struck out one...Walker was chosen as a replacement for teammate Jacob deGrom.

TUESDAY'S STARTER: RHP CARLOS CARRASCO (0-0, 3.24 ERA)

LAST OUTING: Faced the Marlins in Miami on August 4...He pitched 4.1 innings and let up two runs, earned, on five hits...Finished the day with five punch outs and zero walks, the Amazins won this affair 5-3...Threw 62 pitches.

WELCOME TO THE METS: Carlos Carrasco, a 34 year old from Venezuela was acquired by the Mets this offseason...In 2020 with Cleveland, Carrasco finished the year with a 3-4 record and a 2.91 ERA (22 earned runs/68.0 innings) in 12 games started...He has a lifetime 88-73 record and a 3.77 ERA with 1,305 strikeouts.
