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PITTSBURGH PIRATES (51-48) vs. CLEVELAND GUARDIANS (52-47)

July 19, 2026 - Progressive Field - Cleveland, OH - 1:40 EDT - Game #100/Road #49

RHP Paul Skenes (8-8, 3.57 ERA) vs. LHP Joey Cantillo (8-4, 3.56 ERA)

THE PIRATES: have split the first two games of this six-game road trip to Cleveland (Saturday-Sunday) and New York-AL (Monday-Wednesday) after splitting a doubleheader on Saturday...Went 4-2 on their six-game homestand leading into the break vs. Atlanta (1-2, July 7-9) and Milwaukee (3-0, July 11-12)...Have hit 128 home runs this season (they hit 117 home runs in 2025)...Have the most hits (903) in all of Major League Baseball...Have scored the second-most runs (526) in all of Major League Baseball, behind Washington (540), after scoring 583 runs in 2025...Have struck out the third-most batters (906) in all of Major League Baseball, behind Philadelphia (968) and Milwaukee (950)...Entered the All-Star break with 50-plus wins for the 10th time in franchise history (the first All-Star Game was held in 1933) and the first time since 2015 (53-35).

THE MAGICIAN: Esmerlyn Valdez connected for his 11th home run in the sixth inning of Pittsburgh's 7-1 win in Game One of Saturday's doubleheader at Cleveland...He also had an RBI double in the third inning of Game Two on Saturday at Progressive Field...Valdez has become one of seven Major Leaguers (since RBI became official in 1920) with at least 11 home runs and 30 RBI through his first 30 career games...He joined Chicago (AL)'s José Abreu (2014), Philadelphia's Rhys Hoskins (2017), Cincinnati's Aristides Aquino (2018-19), Houston's Yordan Alvarez (2019), Atlanta's Austin Riley (2019) and Los Angeles (NL)' Will Smith (2019)...His 18 RBI this month are tied with Colorado's Jake McCarthy for the most in all of Major League Baseball...Valdez' .667 slugging percentage in the month of July is the eighth-best mark across all of Major League Baseball.

NEW YORK STATE OF MIND: The Pirates will head to New York for a three-game series at Yankee Stadium (Monday-Wednesday) following today's series finale at Cleveland...They won two of three games during their last trip to the Bronx (September 27-29, 2024), marking their first-ever road series win vs. the Yankees (it marked their fifth all-time series in the Bronx).

AMERICAN SPIRIT: Pittsburgh has won four straight interleague series...The Pirates swept a three-game series from May 29-31 vs. Minnesota, won two of three games from June 2-4 at Houston, won two of three games from June 15-17 at the Athletics and won two of three games from June 23-25 vs. Seattle...Pittsburgh has only ever won four straight series (within a single season) against American League opponents two other times, coming in 2015 and 2018...The Pirates swept a two-game series from June 15-16, 2015 vs. Chicago, swept a two-game series from June 17-18, 2015 at Chicago, swept a three-game series from June 30-July 2, 2015 at Detroit and won two of three games from July 3-5, 2015 vs. Cleveland...Pittsburgh also won two of three games from April 25-26, 2018 vs. Detroit, swept a two-game series from May 8-9, 2018 at Chicago, swept a two-game series from May 15-16, 2018 vs. Chicago and won two of three games from July 23-25, 2018 at Cleveland...The Pirates' .654 winning percentage (17-9) during interleague play this season is the second-best mark in all of Major League Baseball, trailing only Los Angeles-NL (.676).

K COLLECTORS: Pirates pitchers combined to strike out 13 batters while issuing just one walk on Saturday (G1) at Cleveland, marking their sixth game with at least 13 strikeouts and one or zero walks (also April 5 vs. Baltimore, May 17 vs. Philadelphia, May 31 vs. Minnesota, June 24 vs. Seattle and July 8 vs. Atlanta)...They had not done that in an away game prior to Saturday (G1) since July 6, 2025 at Seattle...Pittsburgh pitchers also struck out 10 batters on Saturday (G2) at Cleveland...The Pirates are looking to have at least 10 strikeouts in three straight games for the third time this year (also April 28-30 [three] and May 27-31 [five]).

SECOND HELPINGS: Brandon Lowe recorded his 60th RBI as a second baseman with his second-inning sacrifice fly in Game Two on Saturday at Cleveland...His 60 RBI as a second baseman are tied with Milwaukee's Brice Turang for the most in Major League Baseball...Lowe's 43 extra-base hits are tied with Tampa Bay's Junior Caminero, Arizona's Corbin Carroll and Chicago (AL)'s Miguel Vargas for the seventh-most in MLB, behind only Washington's James Wood (52), Houston's Yordan Alvarez (50), Atlanta's Matt Olson (50), New York (AL)'s Ben Rice (48), San Francisco's Rafael Devers (46) & Philadelphia's Kyle Schwarber (44).

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

July 19, 2014: Jordy Mercer delivered the second walkoff RBI of his career with a game-ending double in Pittsburgh's 3-2, 11-inning win over Colorado at PNC Park. Neil Walker, who scored the winning run for the Pirates that evening, went 3-for-5 with a double, an RBI and two runs. Pittsburgh's bullpen allowed just two hits and one hit batter while tossing a combined 4.0 scoreless innings in the victory.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the first round (No. 1) of the 2023 Draft.

LAST TIME OUT: Skenes won a 14-5 decision after allowing two runs and striking out seven batters over 5.1 innings on July 12 vs. Milwaukee...He has won back-to-back starts (also July 7 vs. Atlanta) after losing six consecutive decisions from May 17-July 1.

AGAINST THE GUARDIANS: Skenes lost a 3-0 decision after allowing two runs over 7.0 innings of work in his only career start against Cleveland (April 19, 2025 at PNC Park).

INTER-ESTING: Skenes is 5-4 with a 1.86 ERA (101.2ip/21er) and 117 strikeouts across his 18 career interleague starts (his last win came last season on August 29 at Boston).

FOLLOWING THE BREAK: Skenes has a a 1.96 ERA (133.1ip/29er) in 24 career starts after the All-Star break, including a 1.89 ERA (66.2ip/14er) in 12 such starts last season.

SUPPORT SYSTEM: Skenes has received a combined 24 runs of support when he has been in the game during his last two starts (July 7 vs. Atlanta and July 12 vs. Milwaukee)...He received 19 total runs of support over his 11 starts from May 6-July 1.

PAUL-STAR GAME: Skenes was named to his third straight National League All-Star team on July 4...Per Sarah Langs, he is one of eight Major Leaguers to make the All-Star Game in at least each of his first three career seasons, joining Rod Carew (18 straight, 1967-84), Ichiro Suzuki (10 straight, 2001-10), Joe DiMaggio (seven straight, 1936-42), Tom Seaver (seven straight, 1967-73), Dwight Gooden (three straight, 1984-86), Evan Longoria (three straight, 2008-10) and Yu Darvish (three straight, 2012-14)...He became only the third Pittsburgh pitcher to be named to three consecutive All-Star teams, joining Rip Sewell (1943-44, 1946) and Elroy Face (1959-61) on that short list.

THE 500 CLUB: Skenes’ fourth-inning strikeout of Elly De La Cruz during his start on June 26 vs. Cincinnati was the 500th of his Major League career (it came in his 72nd start)...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, he became the fastest Pirates pitcher (by starts) since at least 1893 to reach the mark, surpassing Bob Veale (77 starts, 1962-65).

DON’T WALK HERE: Skenes pitched 39.0 consecutive innings without issuing a walk (the streak began in the fourth inning on April 13 vs. Washington) before allowing a walk to Adolis García in the fifth inning on May 17 vs. Philadelphia...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, that was the second-longest streak without a walk by a Pirates pitcher during the Expansion Era (since 1961), behind only Bob Friend (46.1ip, May 28-June 22, 1963).

CRAZY EIGHTS: Skenes pitched 8.0 scoreless innings while allowing two or fewer hits and issuing zero walks in back-to-back starts on May 6 at Arizona and May 12 vs. Colorado...He joined Bob Veale (Sept. 16-22, 1963) and Steve Blass (Sept. 15-20, 1968) as the only Pirates during the Modern Era (since 1901) to pitch 8.0 scoreless innings and allow two or fewer hits in back-to-back starts...He also became just the fourth Major League pitcher since 1901 to pitch 8.0 scoreless innings while giving up two or fewer hits and issuing zero walks in back-to-back starts, along with Boston (AL)’s Cy Young (1905), Chicago (AL)’s Billy Pierce (1958) and San Diego’s Mat Latos (2010).
