RECENT REDBIRDS: The Cardinals open their penultimate homestand tonight, a six-gamer against the division-rival Milwaukee Brewers and Washington Nationals. St. Louis recently split a six-game, seven-day road trip through Pittsburgh (2-1) and Colorado (1-2). The Cardinals enter today in first place in the National League Central, 4.0 games ahead of Chicago (vs. Pittsburgh) and Milwaukee.

TIME TO FLY: After a five-game losing streak on a West Coast trip to Oakland and Los Angeles (NL), the Cardinals are 24-9 since August 9, holding the most wins in MLB over that period while boasting a MLB-best 2.86 ERA.

SECOND HALF SHILDT: Since taking over the reigns as manager last July, **Mike Shildt** is tied with Oakland's **Bob Melvin** and the Yankees' **Aaron Boone** for the most Post All-Star Break wins (78) in Major League Baseball (2018-19).

THE HUNT FOR A RED OCTOBER: The Cardinals' 16 remaining games are against teams with winning records in contention for playoff positions (.534 combined win percentage). 10 games come against the NL Central (CHI 7; MIL 3), where the Cardinals are a division-leading 40-26 (.606) in 2019, including a 25-9 record since the All-Star Break. St. Louis and Chicago face off in seven of the final 10 games, scheduled for the final two weekends of the season.

FRIDAY THE 13TH: The Cardinals are 3-3 all-time on Friday the 13th at Busch Stadium III, with their most recent game coming last season in a spooky 9-1 defeat to the Reds on Fri., July 13, 2018. Their most horrifying game was Friday, June 13, 2008 in a 20-2 loss to Philadelphia. One notable Cardinals game was Fri., October 13, 2006 in Game 2 of the NLCS at New York, as **So Taguchi**'s homer off **Billy Wagner** sparked a three-run 9th inning in a 9-6 win over the Mets.

A WINNING TRADITION: At 82-64, the Cardinals have clinched a .500 or better record for the 12th consecutive season since current President of Baseball Operations **John Mozeliak** took the post of GM in 2008. Over that timespan, St. Louis has compiled a 1,067-861 (.553) record (3rd-best in MLB), with the Cardinals and Yankees being the only MLB organizations without a losing season. St. Louis' 12 consecutive seasons is its second longest stretch of winning seasons in franchise history, trailing a 15-season winning span from 1939-53 (1382-926, .599) that culminated in three World Series Championships in four appearances.

BEER WARS: The Cardinals are 5-1 (.833) at home over the Brewers this season, currently their best single-season win pct. vs. Milwaukee in Busch Std III history, and trailing only the 2003 Cardinals (6-1, .857 at Busch Std II). St. Louis' most home wins over the Brewers in a season came in 2002 and 2016 (7-3, .700).

HOME SWEET HOME: Since August 1, the Cardinals are 16-3 at home to sport MLB's highest home win pct (.842). Overall this season, St. Louis is 46-26 at Busch Stadium with a .639 home win pct. (3rd in NL).

RUNNIN' REDBIRDS: The Cardinals (102-for-127) rank 2nd in the NL this season in stolen bases (Washington 103), while their 80.3% SB success rate ranks 4th in the NL and currently stands as their highest all-time in franchise history since 1951 (*STATS LLC*)... **2004:** For the first time since 2004 (111), the Cardinals have stolen 100 or more bases in a season, while **Kolten Wong**'s career high 22 stolen bases (7th in NL) are the most by a Cardinals second baseman since **Tony Womack** (26) in 2004. Wong (22-24, 91.7) trails only **Christian Yelich** (93.8, 30-32) in MLB in SB%... **YOU GET A SB & YOU GET A SB:** 19 different Cardinals have stolen at least one base this season, most in MLB and T5th-most in franchise history (record held by 1906 club with 21 Cardinals)... **IN BUNCH-ES:** Yesterday (4 SB) marked St. Louis' 28th game in 2019 with multiple stolen bases (T1st in MLB, Texas) and 5th with 4+ steals (2nd in MLB to Texas-6).

BEER TRIFECTA: With home runs yesterday in Colorado, **Harrison Bader**, **Kolten Wong** and **Marcell Ozuna** became the only Cardinals to each homer at Busch Stadium, Miller Park and Coors Field this season.

Paul DeJong graduated from nearby Antioch (Ill.) High School...resides in Hazelhurst, Wisc.

Dexter Fowler and **Jordan Lyles** were traded for each other during the 2013-14 offseason (Dec. 3, 2013)...Colorado sent Fowler to Houston for Lyles and outfielder **Brandon Barnes**.

Yadier Molina hit his first Major League home run off Milwaukee's **Matt Wise** (Sept. 23, 2004).

Tyler Webb pitched for Brewers in two games in 2017...claimed off waivers by San Diego (April 2018).

Cardinals Pitching Coach **Mike Maddux** previously served as the Brewers Pitching Coach from 2003-08...oversaw Brewers staff that ranked 2nd in the NL with a 3.85 ERA in 2008, lowest mark by a Milwaukee club in 16 years, en-route to securing the Brewers' first postseason berth in 26 years.

Devin Williams was born in Florissant, Mo. and resides in Maryland Heights...was First Team Rawlings/Perfect Game Preseason High School All-American as a senior at Hazelwood West High School in 2013...committed to the University of Missouri before being selected by Milwaukee in the 2nd round of the 2013 MLB Draft.

Cardinals Hall of Famer, broadcaster and Special Assistant **Jim Edmonds** played in 73 games for Milwaukee in 2010.

Cardinals Director of Medical Operations/Head Athletic Trainer **Adam Olsen** is a native of Green Bay, Wisc...earned his Master's in Physical Therapy from The University of Wisconsin-Madison.

Cardinals Special Asst. to the GM, Player Procurement **Matt Slater** is a Marquette Univ. graduate...started in pro baseball as the Brewers' Scouting and Player Development Assistant (1991).

MILWAUKEE CONNECTIONS

Cardinals Hall of Fame catcher **Ted Simmons** played 13 seasons with St. Louis (1968-80), where he was a six-time NL All-Star and won 1980 Silver Slugger Award...traded by St. Louis with pitchers **Rollie Fingers** and **Pete Vuckovich** to Milwaukee for outfielders **David Green** and **Sixto Lezcano** and pitchers **Dave LaPoint** and **Lary Sorensen**...played five seasons with the Brewers (1981-85), where he was a two-time AL All-Star and faced off against the Cardinals in the 1982 World Series.

Brewers broadcaster **Bob Uecker** played two seasons (1964-65) with St. Louis...won the 1964 World Series...originally traded by the Milwaukee Braves to St. Louis for catcher **Jimmie Coker** and outfielder **Gary Kolb** (April 9, 1964).

Brewers broadcaster **Jeff Levering** previously worked three seasons (2010-12) as broadcaster for the Springfield Cardinals (AA).

TONIGHT’S GAME

- Makes his 28th start of the season (313th career start) and his 380th career appearance tonight, facing the Brewers for the fourth time this season.
- His .725 career win pt. (29-11) in September is tops in Cardinals history (min. 40 decisions) and he ranks 3rd all-time in MLB behind Randy Johnson (.750; 45-15) & Clayton Kershaw (.750, 30-10).
- Only four Cardinals have 30+ career September wins, led by Bob Gibson (44). The others include Bill Sherdel (35), Jesse Haines (33) & Bob Forsch (32).
- Is first Cardinal since Bob Gibson (11 wins in 1974 at age 38) to post 11+ wins at age 38 or older. The last Cardinal to win more was Murry Dickson (13-8) at age 39 in 1956.
- He and Yadier Molina have been a starting battery for 261 games, 8th-most all-time in MLB history since 1908 (3 shy of T7th - Cleveland’s Bob Lemon & Jim Hegan, 264).
- Ranks 9th among active pitchers with a 3.38 ERA (min. 1,500 IP) and 14th in starts.
- Has a 64-35 (.646) career mark in post All-Star break games with a 3.40 ERA. He ranks 4th among active NL pitchers in career post All-Star winning pct.
- Passed Bill Sherdel (1918-30, ‘32) for 4th all-time in wins in franchise history in his 7/14 start vs. ARI & is just four wins (159) back of Bob Forsch (163) for 3rd all-time.
- Is one of five Cardinal pitchers to make 300 or more career starts, joining Bob Gibson (482), Bob Forsch (401), Jesse Haines (387), and Bill Doak (320).
- Since 2016, St. Louis sports a 56-35 record (.615 win pct) in his games pitched.
- Has reached the 100 inning threshold in a season for first time since 2017 (123.1) and 100 strikeouts for first time since 2016 (161).

LAST TIME OUT

- Beat the Pirates 10-1 last Sat. (9/7) at PNC Park with 7.0 solid IP, allowing just one run. Also had a pair of hits, including a double, and a run scored. The win was the Cardinals first Saturday road win since May 18 at Texas.

- Posted his 10th career double-digit win season on 9/2 vs. SF, tying Bob Forsch for 3rd all-time among Cardinals, and becoming the lone active pitcher to do so in the N.L.
- Received one run of support or fewer in 12 starts and zero runs in six outings.
- Has thrown his curve ball 34.6% of his total pitches (865 of 2,498) this season, with the opposition batting .245 (49-1200 with three home runs and 62 strikeouts. Only Yankees RHP Domingo German (36.2%) & Rays RHP Charlie Morton (36.9%) throw a higher pct. of curve balls in MLB (min. 2,000 total pitches) (*Statcast*).
