STAY INFORMED

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RAY REPORT—The Rays continue a nine-game, 10-day homestand against the Guardians (3-0), Rangers (2-1), and White Sox (three to play) tonight at Tropicana Field...are a season-high 20 games above .500 for the first time since the conclusion of 2023 (99-63)...marks the sixth time they have reached the mark before the end of July (also: 2023, 2021, 2013, 2010, 2008) and their 10th season achieving the mark at any point in a campaign...have won eight of their last 10 games in the wake of a season-high five-game losing streak (July 12-19)...are currently 8-6 on a stretch of 20 games in 20 days to begin the second half (July 17–Aug. 5)...lead the AL with a 64-44 record, third best in the majors to the Dodgers (69-40/.633) and Brewers (67-41/.620)...have spent 75 days leading the AL East, 39 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth, including 34 consecutive days in first (June 27–pres.), their second-longest stay atop the division this season behind May 9–June 12 (35 days)...the 75 total days leading their division are fifth most in MLB to the Dodgers (122), Braves (120), Guardians (95), and Brewers (90)...marks the latest into a season they have led the AL East since winning the division in 2021...will enter August in first place for the third time (excl. 2020), joining 2021 (63-42) and 2010 (64-39).

- Seven pitchers combined to yield only two hits in yesterday's 3-2, rubber-game win over the Rangers...it was the Rays fourth time permitting two hits or fewer, tied with the Athletics and Guardians for second most in the AL to the Mariners (5G).
- Opposing hitters are batting .126 (19-for-151) against the Rays staff over the last five games, the club's fewest hits permitted over a five-game span in team history and fewest by any staff over a five-game span since the 2024 Padres (15H, July 20-25; excl. multi-season spans).
- The Rays have won three straight series for the second time this season, joining April 24–May 20 (8), and are 7-2-2 in their last 11 sets (June 19–pres)...the club is 12-1-2 in its last 15 series at Tropicana Field (April 24–pres.) and has gone a season-high eight home sets (6-0-2) without a series loss, its longest streak since May 9–June 22, 2025 (7-0-1) at Steinbrenner Field and longest at the Trop since May 2–June 24, 2023 (7-0-2).
- The Rays are an MLB-best 40-16 (.709) at home (14-4 in last 18G), becoming the first club to win 40 of its first 56 home games since the 2022 Dodgers (41-15) and 2022 Yankees (41-15), both of whom won their respective divisions...during the Wild Card era (since 1995), 16 of the previous 18 clubs to turn the trick went on to earn a division title, and seven made the World Series.
- At 23-12, the Rays are tied with the Yankees (23-12) for the majors' second-best record in series openers behind the Brewers (26-9)...they are 18-4-1 in the 23 series they won the opening contest.
- The Rays are 10-0 when donning their throwback Devil Rays uniforms.

RECENT TRANSACTIONS—Today, the Rays placed **LHP Shane McCleanahan** (left mid-back tightness) on the 15-day IL and recalled **RHP Alex Cook** from Triple-A Durham...the 25-year-old Cook has gone 1-2 with a 3.78 ERA (33.1IP, 14ER), a 1.05 WHIP, and a .198 (23-for-116) opp. average with 37 SO against 12 BB in 29 outings (5 starts) for Triple-A Durham...a 12th-round selection by the Rays in the 2022 First-Year Player Draft, he was added to the 40-man roster on Nov. 18, 2025...Cook will wear No. 54.

Cook would become the third player to make his major league debut for the Rays this year, joining **RHP Chase Solesky** (May 18 vs. BAL) and **RHP Trevor Martin** (April 20 vs. CIN)...the club's two debuts thus far are tied with the Dodgers and Royals for the fewest in the majors.

IT TAKES A VILLAGE—Yesterday marked the second time in franchise history the Rays used seven pitchers or more and yielded two hits or fewer, joining April 23, 2022 vs. BOS, (7 pitchers, 2H)...it was just the sixth such performance by any staff in AL history, also joining the Twins on May 9, 2026 at CLE (7P, 2H), the Guardians on April 6, 2024 at MIN (7P, 2H), the Yankees on Sept. 24, 2018 at TB (8P, 2H), and the Angels on Sept. 11, 2018 vs. TEX (8P, 2H), and the 14th by any MLB team in the modern era (since 1900)...the Rays joined the Dodgers (4x) as the only clubs to record multiple such games during the modern era.

- The Rays totaled 13 strikeouts—it marked the modern era's fifth instance of a club using seven pitchers or more while yielding two hits or fewer, and tallying 13 SO or more, joining the aforementioned performances by the Guardians (April 6, 2024 at MIN – 14SO) and Yankees (Sept. 24, 2018 at TB – 13 SO) as well as the Pirates on April 1, 2021 at CHC (7P, 2H, 13SO) and the Mets on Oct. 4, 2015 vs. WSH (7P, 2H, 14SO).
- Rays starting pitchers have permitted two runs or fewer in 10 straight games, their longest single-season streak since a 12-game span between Sept. 11-24, 2024...the rotation has pitched to a 1.52 ERA (47.1IP, 8ER) and 0.93 WHIP during the streak while limiting opponents to a .186/.250/.228 (31-for-167) clip—all marks lead the majors during that span (July 20–pres.).
- The Rays have won each of **Nick Martinez's** last six outings (June 21–pres.), tied with White Sox starter **Erick Fedde** for the longest active streak among AL pitchers...it marks the Rays longest streak in a pitcher's starts since claiming seven straight **Shane Baz** outings from May 24–June 26, 2025.

TO BE THE BEST—Paired with last series vs. Texas, this marks the Rays second consecutive matchup against a team that entered the set atop its division, the club's first time this season facing back-to-back division leaders...the Rays have split their six series against first-place teams in 2026 (3-3-0)...they faced four division-leading clubs in April and, prior to last series, had faced only one since (June 15-17 at LAD)...this marks the Rays season-high third straight set against an opponent with a winning record—dating back to the aforementioned Dodgers series and including the current series, eight of the Rays last 13 sets have come vs. opponents with a .500 record or better entering the opener.

- The Rays are an AL-best 38-26 (.593) against clubs that currently hold a .500 record or better, third in the majors to the Braves (39-22/.639) and Dodgers (41-24/.631)...they are 5-0-1 in their last six series against clubs that held a .500 or better record entering the series (June 19–pres.) and 7-4-1 overall.

LIVE BY THE LONG BALL—The Rays are an MLB-best 31-1 when out-homering their opponent, 18-10 when home runs are even, and 15-33 when being out-homered...per Stats Perform, the Rays are the seventh team in the modern era (since 1900) to win 31 of the first 32 games of a season in which they out-homered their opponent, first since the 2022 Yankees (31-1)...only the 2010 Padres (32-0) have won all 32 of those games...the Rays' 969 winning pct. when out-homering opponents is on pace to be the second best in the modern era, trailing the undefeated 1903 New York Highlanders (.66-0), and the best by any team with at least 30 such games, outpacing the 1994 Montreal Expos (.64-2/.947)...the Rays have won 18 consecutive games when out-homering the opposition since their lone loss on May 25 vs. BAL (13 inn.), dropping 21 of the 25 contests they were out-homered during that span, including eight straight losses (July 5–pres.)...on the season, they have not lost a nine-inning game in which they tallied more home runs than their opponent (29-0)...after going without a long ball in five of six games from July 22-28, the Rays have plated five of their six runs over the last two games via 4 HR.

- They are 26-5 in multi-homer games, including five straight wins (July 20–pres.), and 17-1 when recording multiple long balls at Tropicana Field, with the only loss coming on June 1 vs. DET (10-9).
- The Rays lead the AL in home runs (46) and multi-homer efforts (16) in their last 31 games since June 25, trailing only the Nationals (54HR, 17G) in both categories across all of MLB...they entered that span with the majors' fewest long balls (63) and were tied for the fewest multi-homer games (15, also: BOS & CLE) through their first 77 contests (Opening Day–June 24).

THE BAK3 SHOW—Yesterday, **Bryan Baker** joined CLE **Cade Smith** (30) as the majors' only hurlers to reach the 30-save mark...he tied **Alex Colomé** (2017) and **Fernando Rodney** (2012) for the most saves before the calendar flips to August in franchise history...it marked his 19th consecutive successful save opportunity, tied for the third-longest streak in team history (see table on the right) and the majors' third-longest active streak behind SD **Mason Miller** (28) and TOR **Louis Varland** (23)...Baker has earned saves in each of the Rays last four victories and five of their last six.

LA MAXIMA—**Junior Caminero** needs 1 HR to become the fourth player in Rays history with multiple 30-HR seasons, joining **Evan Longoria** (4), **Carlos Peña** (3), and **Brandon Lowe** (2)...he would join Peña (3 straight, 2007-09) as the only Rays to reach the mark in back-to-back seasons and **José Canseco** (31HR, 1999) as the only Rays to tally 30 HR before August...he currently has 74 HR between his age-21 and age-22 seasons (2025-26; age as of June 30), third most in the modern era (since 1900) behind MLN **Eddie Mathews** (87) and NYY **Joe DiMaggio** (75)...Caminero could become the 11th player in the modern era with multiple 30-HR campaigns before his age-23 season (age as of June 30), joining LAA **Mike Trout** (2012-2014), FLA **Giancarlo Stanton** (2011-12), FLA **Miguel Cabrera** (2004-05), STL **Albert Pujols** (2001-02), SEA **Alex Rodriguez** (1996, 1998), OAK **Jose Canseco** (1986-87), A.T.T. **Bob Horner** (1978-80), CIN **Frank Robinson** (1956-1958), Mathews (1953-54), BOS **Ted Williams** (1939, 1941), and PHA **Jimmie Foxx** (1929-30).

- Caminero has gone 12 games since his last homer on July 17 at BOS (G2), the second-longest drought of his career behind Sept. 1-15, 2024 (15G)...according to Statcast, his 407-foot fly out in the opening frame yesterday would have been a home run in 24 of the 30 major league ballparks...during the 12-game drought (July 18–pres.), he still leads the Rays with 17 hard-hit balls.

GOOD, BETTER, BEST—The Rays and White Sox continue a six-game season series tonight after the Rays swept a three-game series on the South Side from April 14-16, which was their second of an MLB-leading 10 sweeps on the year...with a win tonight, they Rays would clinch their first season series over the Sox since 2023 (6-1) and just their second since 2021 (currently 1-3-1)...they lost four of their six matchups with Chicago in 2025...the Rays have won eight straight games against clubs from the AL Central dating back to June 24 vs. KC and are an AL-best 18-7 against the division this season.

- In his last 28 games vs. the White Sox since 2021, **Yandy Diaz** is batting .324/.445/.524 (34-for-105) with 6 2B, 5 HR, 14 RBI, 21 BB, and 21 SO.

TONIGHT'S START—Nick Martinez will make his 21st start with the Rays and 12th at home...marks his 150th career start (301G) and sixth start (9G) opposite the White Sox...signed as a free agent on Feb. 10, 2026.

- ★ Ranks second among AL qualifiers with a 2.45 ERA (117.1IP, 32ER) behind NYY **Cam Schlichtler** (2.04), fifth in the majors...his .833 winning pct. this year is sixth among MLB qualifiers and second in the AL behind BOS **Sonny Gray** (.867).
- ★ 11 of his 20 starts this season have been quality...with a quality start tonight, he would surpass **Drew Rasmussen** for the club lead and record his second most in a single season, behind 2015 (13QS).
- ★ Is one of five AL pitchers with double-digit wins this season, alongside Gray (13), TEX **Nathan Eovaldi** (10), Schlichtler (10), and CLE **Gavin Williams** (10).

LAST TIME OUT—Earned his 10th win of the season after tossing his 11th quality start on July 25 vs. CLE (W, 6.OIP, 4H, OR, 5SO)...marked his second scoreless outing of the season (also: April 28 at CLE)...after a leadoff single by **Steven Kwan** to begin the game, he retired each of the next five batters, nine of 10, and 16 of 18 batters faced...he did not yield an extra-base hit for the second consecutive outing.

- ★ Marked his seventh start of 6.0 innings or more with one or zero earned runs allowed and second consecutive (July 20-pres.)...has allowed one or zero walks in each of those seven outings...his teams are 25-6 over his career in 31 starts in which he goes 6.0 innings or more with one or zero runs allowed, including 9-2 over his last 11 dating back to June 7, 2025 vs. AZ.
- ★ Has allowed three runs or fewer in 19 of his 20 starts, second most among AL hurlers behind NYY **Cam Schlichtler** (20).

DAAAA SOX—The veteran right-hander is slated to make his first start against the White Sox since May 15, 2025 vs. CWS (W, 7.OIP, 2H, OR, 3SO)...in eight career games (five starts) against the club, Martinez is 2-4 with a 4.82 ERA (28.OIP, 15ER) and 23 strikeouts...he has not allowed a run in each of his last four outings against Chicago-AL (Sept. 30, 2022-pres.), including two starts of 5.0 innings or more...in those last two starts, he has spun 12.0 innings with four hits and two walks allowed compared to 23 hits and eight walks in his first three career starts against the club (14.1IP)...he carries a 13.1 scoreless inning streak against the Sox into tonight's outing.

- ★ Martinez is 9-12 with a 4.91 ERA (148.1IP, 81ER) and 109 strikeouts in 40 career appearances (25 starts) vs. AL Central foes...is 9-10 with a 5.05 ERA (130.OIP, 73ER) and 93 strikeouts as a starter...is 2-1 with a 2.74 ERA (23.OIP, 7ER) in four starts against the division this season, allowing one or zero runs in three of those outings.
- ★ Martinez has fashioned a 2.40 ERA (75.OIP, 20ER) in games against AL opponents, the second-lowest mark among major league pitchers (NYY **Cam Schlichtler**, 2.39) in 2026 (min. 70.OIP)...is 7-1 in 12 starts against the AL, with the Rays winning all but one of those games.

HOME COOKIN'—In 11 starts at home this season, Martinez is 7-1 with a 2.78 ERA (64.2IP, 20ER) and 40 strikeouts...he has allowed three runs or fewer in 10 of his 11 home starts in 2026...the Rays are 9-2 when he starts at Tropicana Field.

- ★ Martinez held a 1.47 ERA (30.2IP, 5ER) through his first five home starts as a Ray, lowest in franchise history by a traditional starter over such a span (min. 25.OIP)...he has a 3.97 ERA (34.OIP, 15ER) in his last six home starts since that stretch (June 3-pres.).
- ★ Among pitchers with 60.0 innings or more at home this year, his 2.78 ERA is the lowest in the AL and fifth lowest in the majors...under the same parameter, he is tied for the second-fewest walks allowed (11) among AL pitchers and is one of five AL arms with six home runs or fewer allowed at home.

START ME UP—When pitching in the 1st inning this season, Martinez has logged a 0.90 ERA (20.OIP, 2ER) with 13 strikeouts and a .194 opp. average (14-for-72)...his ERA in the opening frame is the fourth-lowest mark in the AL (min. 15.OIP).

- ★ In his career, he has turned in a 3.13 ERA (149.1IP, 52ER) with 109 strikeouts and a .233 opp. average (132-for-566) in the 1st inning...marks his lowest ERA and opp. batting average of any of the first seven frames.

A CHANGE OF HEART—Martinez has the second-lowest opp. average (.143/17-for-124) on changeups among MLB pitchers (min. 100AB), behind teammate **Shane McClanahan's** .137 clip (17-for-124)...Martinez's .182 opp. OBP also paces the majors, ahead of teammates **Ian Seymour** (.182; by pct. points) and McClanahan (.183)...under the same parameters, Martinez leads major league pitchers in changeup hard-hit rate (18.9%)...min. 1,000 total pitches, his 27.3 pct. usage rate on the pitch is seventh in the AL.

- ★ Has allowed extra-base hits on the changeup in four of his last seven starts (1 2B, 1 3B, 3HR; June 15-pres.) after allowing just one in his first 13 starts prior to that span (2B - April 11 vs. NYY).

HE'S A SAVANT—Martinez ranks highly in multiple MLB pitching rankings, according to Baseball Savant...his Offspeed Run Value (8) is in the 97th percentile and his Pitching Run Value (15) is in the 93rd percentile, an improvement from his -2 Pitching Run Value and -2 Offspeed Run Value in 2025.

- ★ Since the start of 2023, Martinez's 32.1 pct. hard-hit rate is fourth lowest in the majors (min. 1,000BF) behind NYY **Ryan Yarbrough** (29.3), TOR **Tyler Rogers** (30.1), and LAA **Brent Suter** (30.2).
- ★ Opposing hitters have an average exit velocity of 86.8 mph since the beginning of 2023, fourth lowest in the majors during that span (min. 1,000BF) behind LAA **Kyle Hendricks** (85.8), NYY **Max Fried** (86.7), and SD **Michael King** (86.7).
