TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners play the finale of a 3-game series against the Washington Nationals (1-1) and the finale of the road trip...Seattle previously saw the Orioles (2-2) and Tigers (1-2) on the trip... following an off day on Monday, the Mariners will return to T-Mobile Park for a 6-game homestand against the Orioles (3 G, June 16-18) and Red Sox (3 G, June 19-21)...today's game against the Nationals will be televised and streamed live on **Mariners.TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** on the call, with **Brad Adam** serving as field reporter...the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Gary Hill Jr.** and **Shannon Drayer** on the call.

ODDS & ENDS...the Mariners dropped yesterday's game by an 8-3 final score...despite the loss, Seattle is 12-6 (.667) since May 25, tied for the 3rd-best record in MLB during that span.

- **Best In The West** - The Mariners (37-35) are in first place in the American League West Division, 1.0 game ahead of the second place Athletics (35-35).
- **Rubber Ducky** - The Mariners are 4-5 in rubber games this season.
- **Bruises on Bruises** - The Mariners are tied for the MLB lead with 47 HBP this season with the St. Louis Cardinals...Seattle has led MLB in HBP in each of the last 3 seasons (2023-25).
- **Naylz** - After **Josh Naylor** started the season batting .118 (9x76) with an .390 OPS over his first 19 games (3/26-4/16), he is batting .300 (58x190) with 7 doubles, 6 home runs, 25 RBI, 13 SB and an .800 OPS over his last 48 games (4/17-c)...during that span he is running a minuscule 11.0% strikeout rate, which is 3rd-lowest in the AL during that span.

★ **BE A STAR: VOTE MARINERS** ★...voting is underway for the 2026 MLB All-Star Game on July 14 at Citizens Bank Park in Philadelphia...fans can submit up to 5 ballots per day until the conclusion of Phase One (June 25)...Phase Two, which takes the finalists at each position, will run from June 29-July 2 before the All-Star rosters are announced on July 4...for more information and to vote, visit Mariners.com/Vote.

DOMINIC CANZONE RAKES...Dominic Canzone reached base 3 times yesterday, going 1-for-2 with a walk and a hit-by-pitch and is now batting .385 (20x52) with 11 runs, 4 doubles, 1 triple, 6 home runs, 10 RBI, a .429 OBP and slugging .846 for an 1.275 OPS over his last 17 games (5/24-c)...during that span he leads MLB in slugging percentage and ranks 2nd in OPS, trailing only Yordan Alvarez-HOU (1.330 OPS) among players with at least 50 plate appearances...since he was recalled from Triple-A Tacoma on June 9, 2025, he is slashing .296/.359/.518 (.877 OPS), ranking 15th in MLB in OPS and 10th in wRC+ (149) among players with at least 400 plate appearances over that span.

FOREVER YOUNG...Cole Young went 2-for-5 last night...over his last 8 games since moving to the leadoff spot in the batting order, he is batting .324 (12x37) with 1 HR and 2 RBI, including the first leadoff home run of his career on June 11 at BAL...he has hit safely in 15 of his last 16 games since May 27, batting .328 (22x67) with 8 runs, 2 home runs, 5 RBI, 2 walks and just 7 strikeouts, reaching base at a .352 clip and slugging .418 (.770 OPS) in 72 plate appearances...he recently recorded a career-high 11-game hitting streak from May 27 to June 8.

RANDY DESERVES YOUR VOTE...Randy Arozarena has produced offensively this season, batting .291 (76x261) with 47 runs, 18 doubles, 1 triple, 7 home runs, 33 RBI, 27 walks and 19 stolen bases, getting on base at a .377 clip and slugging .458 for an .826 OPS in 71 games...Randy leads qualified AL outfielders (min. 50% G as OF) in hits (also: Riley Greene-DET), stolen bases, and doubles (also: Tyler Soderstrom-ATH) and ranks 2nd in batting average, 3rd in fWAR (2.3), 4th in OBP and 6th in OPS... Arozarena is 1 of 4 players with 25+ extra-base hits and 15+ stolen bases this season (26 XBH, 18 SB), joining José Ramírez-CLE (28 XBH, 24 SB), Bobby Witt Jr.-KC (29 XBH, 24 SB) and Pete Crow-Armstrong-CHC (26 XBH, 15 SB).

SMOOTH SAILING...during the Mariners current 12-6 stretch (5/25-c), the pitching staff leads MLB with a 3.40 ERA (61 ER, 161.2 IP)...Seattle pitchers are also tied for the lead MLB with a 1.07 WHIP during that span...also during the span, the Seattle offense ranks 5th in MLB in batting average (.273), 5th in slugging (.469), 7th in OPS (.797) and 2nd in home runs (34).

CAL GETTING CLOSER...Cal Raleigh (right oblique strain) homered twice and caught 9.0 innings last night in his 4th rehab appearance and 3rd with Triple-A Tacoma...in 4 rehab appearances he is 6-for-14 with 5 home runs, 12 RBI and 2 multi-homer games...fans with a **Mariners.TV** subscription have access to **MiLB.TV** and can watch Raleigh, along with Mariners top prospects like **Kade Anderson**, **Ryan Sloan**, **Lazaro Montes**, and others in the farm system.

J-ROD'S STAR POWER...in 71 games this season, Julio Rodríguez is batting .252 (73x290) with 14 doubles, 13 home runs, 34 RBI and 9 stolen bases, reaching base at a .314 clip and slugging .434 (.748 OPS)...among AL center fielders (min. 50% G as CF), he ranks T-2nd in doubles, 3rd in home runs, 2nd in extra-base hits (27), 2nd in RBI and 4th in stolen bases...Julio has made the All-Star Game in 3 of his first 4 seasons and has the chance to make it 4 of 5.

MARINERS POST-GAME ALUMNI HOME RUN DERBY SET FOR AUGUST 7...the Mariners announced the club will hold its first ever Alumni Home Run Derby, with participants including Hall of Famer **Ichiro Suzuki**, Mariners legend **Mike Cameron**, broadcasters **Ryan Rowland-Smith** and **Ryon Healy**, Bullpen Coach **Austin Nola**, local radio host **Bucky Jacobsen** and former Mariner **Stefen Romero**...all fans with a ticket to the game on Friday, Aug. 7 will have access to the Alumni Home Run Derby.

ON THE UPCOMING HOMESTAND...following Monday's off day, the Mariners return to T-Mobile Park for a 6-game homestand against the Orioles (3 G, June 16-18) and Red Sox (3 G, June 19-21)...highlights on the homestand include Stars and Stripes Soccer Jersey Day on Thursday, Junteenth Celebration and Fireworks Night on Friday, where Seattle will wear their Steelheads Jerseys, and Father's Day on Sunday.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...Colt Emerson has starred in the first 22 games of his MLB career, batting .233 (17x73) with 12 runs, 5 doubles, 1 triple, 6 home runs, 14 RBI, a .309 OBP and slugging .575 for an .884 OPS, and...**YOU MAY ALSO KNOW**...that his 6 home runs prior to his 21st birthday are the 3rd-most in Mariners history, trailing only all-time greats Ken Griffey Jr. (38 HR from 1989-90) and Alex Rodriguez (26 HR from 1994-96), but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...his 12 extra-base hits in his first 22 MLB games rank T-4th most in MLB history among players 20-or-younger?...he trails only Carlos Correa (14 in 2015), Hall of Famer Orlando Cepeda (13 in 1958), Hall of Famer Joe Medwick (13 in 1932) while equaling the totals of Rafael Devers (2017), Del Ennis (1946) and Hall of Famer Ted Williams (1939)...*H/T to Sarah Langs.*

- **1993** - Randy Johnson fans 15 vs. Kansas City Royals in a 6-3 win.
- **2010** - With the Mariners playing St. Louis, it becomes the first time in 68 years that two players with at least 5,000 career at-bats and a career average of at least .330 faced each other (Ichiro, .333, Albert Pujols .332). The last pair to face off were Hall of Famers Joe Medwick (Dodgers) and Paul Waner (Braves) in 1942.
- **2013** - Mike Zunino hits his first MLB home run for the GWRBI in the Mariners 3-2 win at Oakland.

ABOUT EMERSON HANCOCK...

- The 27-year-old right-handed pitcher is scheduled to make his 14th start of the season... Selected by Seattle in the 1st round (6th overall) of the 2020 MLB First-Year Player Draft... Spent 3 seasons at the University of Georgia, 2018-20... Was named to CoSIDA Academic All-America First Team in 2020.

LAST TIME OUT...W#5 on June 8 at Baltimore, tossing 5.0 innings with 1 run (1 ER) allowed on 3 hits and 2 walks, while striking out 3 batters...threw 92 pitches and 57 strikes...marks his 10th start with 2-or-fewer runs allowed over 5.0+ IP, tied for the 4th most in MLB this season.

ON A HOT STREAK...has thrown 3 consecutive games of 3-or-fewer hits and 2-or-fewer walks allowed over 5.0+ IP...is the 6th pitcher to record a streak of 3+ such games this season and is the 4th Mariners pitcher all-time to do so in a season, joining Luis Castillo (3, 9/12/25-9/24/25), Bryan Woo (3, 9/8/25-9/19/25) and Bryce Miller (3, 5/2/23-5/13/23)...also owns a 5-game streak (5/15-6/8) of 2-or-fewer runs allowed over 5.0+ IP for the longest such streak of his career...is 1-of-6 pitchers with a 5+ game active streak of such games, along with Bryce Miller (5/13-6/6).

THE ROAD SO FAR...in 6 road starts this season, Hancock owns a 1.01 WHIP, ranking 8th in AL (min. 30.0 IP), with a 2.78 ERA, ranking 13th, and a 2.5 K/BB...in all 6 outings on the road he has thrown 5.0+ innings with 5 being for 6.0+ IP...in 5 of the 6 starts he has allowed 2-or-fewer runs and 2-or-fewer walks...has allowed 3-or-fewer runs over 5.0+ IP in 11 of his 14 road starts since 2025.

QUALITY CONTROL...has recorded a quality start in 8 of his 13 starts this season...is 1-of-4 pitchers in 2026 to have 6 quality starts with 1-or-fewer walks and 5+ strikeouts...the Mariners are 11-6 when Hancock logs a quality start since 2023 and are 9-4 since the start of 2025...4-of-6 road starts this season have been quality starts with 2-or-fewer walks.

CAREER STRETCH...over his last 5 starts (5/15-6/8) he owns a 1.93 ERA and has allowed 26 base runners, 16 hits, and 6 runs (6 ER) in 28.0 innigs pitched...his ERA and hits, runs, and base runners allowed over the span represent career best marks over a 5 game stretch...is 1-of-6 pitchers this season to have 73+ strikeouts, 17-or-fewer walks and 55-or-fewer hits through their first 13 starts of the season...among those 6 pitchers has the 2nd most innings pitched (75.2), trailing Cam Schlitler-NYY (76.1).

CHECKING THE BOXES...is 1-of-5 AL pitchers (min. 50.0 IP) with a sub-1.00 WHIP and a strikeout rate greater than 25.0 while being 1-of-3 AL pitchers (min. 50.0 IP) with a sub-3.00 ERA and a sub-1.00 WHIP (also: Cam Schlitler-NYY, and Drew Rasmussen-TB).

EARLY BIRD...throws a first pitch strike 64.8% of the time, 9th highest among qualified AL pitchers...earns a first pitch swing from the batter 37.2% of the time for 10th highest in the league...in at-bats where the 1st pitch is swung at, Hancock has 28 strikeouts to 2 walks (14.00 K/BB) with a 0.733 WHIP.

CROSS FIRE...owns a 0.93 WHIP against left-handed batters, ranking 6th best in MLB (min. 30.0 IP) while ranking T-10th in K/BB (4.2) and 16th in K% (26.1)...has thrown his cutter the 2nd most against left-handers (117 times) behind his 4-seam, owning a .071 (1x14) opponent batting average on the pitch to rank 4th lowest among pitchers with at least 50 cutters thrown to lefty batters...is also the 10th lowest opponent average on any single type of pitch thrown by pitchers in MLB this season to lefties (min. 100 pitches)...his whiff rate (36.2) on his cutter to LHB ranks 2nd and his K% (24.0) ranks 4th best (min. 100 pitches).

SWITCHING UP THE MIX...over his first 13 starts of the season, Hancock has increased his 4-seam usage by 10.8 percentage points since 2025 and increased his sweeper usage by 16...his cutter usage increased 11.7 points from his 0.1% use last season...he owns a 32.2 whiff rate and a .136 opponent batting average (3x22), the lowest of any of his pitches thrown, on his cutter...his 33.7 whiff rate on the sweeper, now his 3rd most used pitch, ranks 11th highest in AL (min. 150 sweepers thrown)...owns a .172 opponent batting average or better on his 4-seam (.165), cutter (.136), and sweeper (.143)...is 1-of-2 AL starting pitchers to have a .165 avg or better on 3 different pitches (min. 100 pitches of each pitch type).

TRAFFIC CONTROL...his 76 base runners allowed over 75.2 innings in his first 13 starts, are 3rd fewest among pitchers in 2026 through their first 13 games (min. 75.0 IP)...owns a baserunners-per-9 of 9.04, ranking 8th in MLB in 2026, (min. 70.0 IP)...ranks T-11th in WHIP (1.04) with runners on base in the AL in 2026 (min. 25.0 IP) while being tied for the 6th fewest runs (14) allowed in runners on situations in MLB (min. 25.0 IP).

NO FREE PASSES...is 1-of-2 pitchers this season to have allowed 3-or-fewer walks over 5.0+ IP in each of their first 13 starts (also: Parker Messick-CLE)...his 2.0 BB/9 is T-12th best in the MLB (min. 70.0 IP)...has contributed 8 starts with 6.0+ IP and 2-or-fewer walks to a Mariners pitching staff that has the 2nd most such games (34) in 2026.

CAN'T TOUCH THIS...has thrown 6.0+ innings with 1-or-fewer hits in 2 starts this season (5/26 at ATH and 3/29 vs. CLE)...is 1 of 9 players with multiple such starts this season, joining teammate Bryan Woo (5/6 vs. ATL, 4/3 at LAA)...the Mariners have combined for 6 such starts this season, most in MLB...his 3 games with 6.0+ IP and 2-or-fewer hits (last: 6/1 vs. NYM) are tied for 3rd most in MLB this season, along with Woo...is 1-of-9 pitchers to have recorded back-to-back starts of 6.0+ IP with 2-or-fewer walks and 2-or-fewer hits allowed (5/26-6/1).

UP TO BIG UNIT STANDARDS...on May 2, followed up Mariners legend Randy Johnson's Number Retirement Ceremony with a performance of his own, setting the MLB single-game high in strikeouts this season with 14 Ks, tied by Reid Detmers-LAA (5/24/26 vs. TEX), and becoming the 4th player with 14+ strikeouts and no walks allowed in Mariners franchise history, joining Randy Johnson (done 2x), George Kirby (done 2x) and Mark Langston.
